They hold firmly to their orthodox, what they count scriptural, view of what they think possible for a Christian, and never seek for the Spirit's revelation of God's thoughts concerning the standard of a Christian life. They know very little of giving God his glory and worshipping him as the all in all; they know still less about his working all in all; no wonder they have never understood the claim – all things to him. They, therefore, cannot say: To him be glory.
