I was challenged last night in Mark 1:35 by the example of our Lord who rose early in them morning before sunrise after a busy night of ministry to go to a solitary place to pray. It struck me that prayer is more important than reading the bible. And i mean prayer where we just seek to be with God and know His smile and nearness (not talking about supplication o r intercession). I noticed that it doesn't say that our Lord went to read the scrolls, but that he went to pray. He went to draw near to His Father and be with Him.

I am not saying we shouldn't be reading the Bible, not at all (I know that our Lord had it all in His memory from a young a ge, and we should love and study the scriptures too), but just that i feel dry this month because i have been getting to kn ow my Bible better but not taking time to draw near to God.

Can anyone sympathize with that? Can anyone give me some godly advice on how to truly set about seeking God?

Yes, I can totally relate to what you are saying. The dryness you are feeling is God's way of creating thirst for Life--Jesu s Himself. I've been a Christian now for nearly 18 years and have studying the Bible in many different ways. It has not b een until the last couple years (especially last year) that I have begun to realize that my focus was on doctrines of the Bi ble more than the Lord Himself.

A great help to me in seeing this so crystally clear now is a Bible teacher by the name of Ed Miller. He has a number of sermons here on SermonIndex (under Other Speakers). I would highly recommend a listen to "The Revelation Of Christ Within Scripture" and "Christ is Everything". These messages really underscore anything I would say to develop such a rich and inviting prospect of using the Bible to see a living Lord and feasting upon what He shows about Himself.

The key, I find, to enjoying the Lord is seeing Him by total reliance upon God's Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit greatly delight s to show me Christ (that is, the glory of the Lord, as 2 Cor. 3:18 says). But I must first turn with all my heart to the Holy Spirit (as it says there in the preceding verses) and the veil will be lifted and I will see Christ in a transforming way.

Jesus in John 5 contrasted the Scriptures to Himself. The problem is when we see the Bible as the source of life, when in reality, God intended it to be an instrument to testify to the Lord Jesus and we MIGHT COME TO HIM TO FIND LIFE.

In any study of the Bible, if we do not come to the Lord Jesus, we will not have life. Life is not a thing, but a Person--Jes us Christ. "I am the way, the truth, and the LIFE" (John 14:6). There is a freshness of the written word that excites my h eart and enlivens my righteousness, peace and joy in the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit fills my heart with a fervent love for God (Rom. 5:5).

One last thing that has aided me greatly in coming and seeing the Lord Jesus in Scripture. Our attitude in which we come is extremely important. The pure in heart are the ones that shall see (a word in the Greek which means not casual observance but wide-eyed wonder) God (Matt. 5:8). When Jesus healed the blind physically, there are also principles of seeing Him spiritually. The story of the healing of the blind man in Mark 8 is an excellent illustration of how we are to be in coming to the Lord. If I see myself as a blind man, begging the Lord (as this crowd did on his behalf) for a need to see Him, He will respond the same way--eyesight will be granted. Our God is very gracious and DELIGHTS to open our eyes to see Him. Jesus rejoices in the Spirit when the Father reveals the Son to babes (Luke 10:21). I can testify that each day as I have come in this needy, dependent attitude to see the Lord, God has met me and shown me Himself in a transforming way. Thank God for His grace. I pray you may allow this dryness and thirst to come to none other than Christ Himself for a drink (John 7:37-39).

I believe I may understand but want to share my own heart, as to how the Lord has been dealing with me about this.

I am not by nature a disciplined man, not by any stretch of one's imagination but the Lord is making me into a disciplined man bit by bit. It's a rather painful process. I didn't realize my heart has been so resistant to this.

The sin that the Holy Spirit has put His finger on is using reading the word as an excuse not to do something else the Lo rd has asked me to do. For example, I hear help your wife with the dishes or some other chore around the house and I use to say is that the Holy Spirit? Call your brother or your sister and pray with them and my heart's response was well Lord I've got to read the scriptures.

The Lord has a place for each of us to read his word and meditate on it. However we can't (or I should just say I can't) s ubstitute what God has asked for with something that is more comfortable to me. The Holy Spirit asked me this morning on my way to work "Is substitutional obedience really obedience?" and I had to say to no Lord it's not, it's really disobedience. Once we are no longer walking in the Spirit, the scriptures are no longer quickened to us and they become like cardboard.

At one time, I used to substitute obedience by listening to sermon after sermon sometimes as many as 8-10 a day. I can't get away with that any longer.

I would encourage you to press in and ask Jesus what He wants you to do and then simply do it. There's no real substit ute for reading the scriptures and private times of prayer but the Lord has other things for you to do as well and as you do those things the joy of the Lord will well up in your heart. Here is an unheard of challenge: Stop reading the bible and do nothing but seek the Lord's Will for an entire week. Inste ad, do these exact things:

- 1) Pray often throughout each day. Pray in devotion by delegating time to prayer quietly. Then pray as if Jesus is always near you, by talking to Jesus quietly in your mind in every situation. Tell Jesus everything and be honest, just as if He wa s your best friend. Admit your weaknesses and confess your sins. In your prayers, give up everything to Jesus as an off ering. Give your life, your money, your time...and believe that Christ owns all of it. This means that you do not control it. Sacrifice your will to God. Awake each morning and offer your day to Him. Say in your heart, "This day is yours. Whatev er happens is in your control. May your will be done."
- 2) Fast anything that keeps your mind away from the Lord. You know what keeps you away from God. Fast it. And this is important: Fast because you are seeking Jesus, and not because you are seeking God's gifts like righteousness.
- 3) Do everything as if you are doing it for the Lord. This means that any task, anything you do, imagine that it was comm anded by the Lord. If you are doing laundry, imagine you are washing God's clothes. If you doing school work, imagine God is your teacher. If you are at work, imagine that God is your boss.
- 4) If anyone asks you for anything, give it to that person regardless of who they are even if they are a huge sinner. Yes, i

f on the way to the store, you have \$20 in your pocket (the last \$20 you have) and a drunk asks you for it, give it to him. I f you are fasting television, but a friend or spouse asks you to watch a movie with them, do it. Do everything a person as ks of you and trust that Jesus will keep you from sin. Be a servant to all and give freely.

- 5) Acknowledge the presence of Jesus at all times. He is with you 100% of the time. Acknowledge this. Talk to Him in yo ur mind. Imagine He is standing next to you. Remember that He is watching you at every minute of every day. Acknowle dge His presence. Invite Him into your life always.
- 6) Do not worry about anything!!! Don't worry about money. Do not worry about sin. Do not worry about what you are su pposed to do. Just do what feels natural to your heart. If your nature has truly been changed by Jesus, then it is your nature to do God's Will. You will know when you are acting according to the flesh and not of the Spirit when you lack peace. The Spirit brings peace. If you have any anxiety about anything, then crucify that thing on the cross. Sacrifice it to Jesus.
- 7) Be Thankful!! Thank Jesus for what you have. Do not worry about what you don't have. Ask Jesus for what you need and trust that He will provide in His time. Leave everything in His hands and in His control. When Christ is in total control of you, you will naturally know what to do. There will be no struggle over what you should do. You will feel united with the Lord. You will have an internal peace and confidence about it.
- 8) Be willing to suffer for God's glory, and do not take control of yourself during trials. Bad things will happen. God will let them happen. These are done for you benefit. When a person is truly seeking the Lord, faith will be challenged. So when bad things happen, embrace this fact: God is in control. Let God care for you. Be careful not to take control of the situation.

Do these things an entire week without reading your bible. Instead, be controlled by the Spirit. Renew your mind by givin g up and letting go of everything you know. Empty yourself, and let Christ fill you. Desire nothing for yourself but only Go d's Will.

This is my challenge for you. After the week is up, come back and tell us what happened. Have you grown closer to God? Did He speak to you at all? How was your life different?

There's this "religious" fear that paralyzes me, it keeps me from facing these concerns:

- 1. If the Bible is God somehow, then there is something fishy going on, given the discrepancies between translations an d even in the Bible itself. 
The greatest problem with the Church in America is that she made the bible equal with Christ, and used her own interpretation to control other men. This is why her womb will be made barren, and her light will go out.

You say this, because you are deceived. Are you going to condemn the apostle Paul also, for giving such advice? Paul s aid scripture was "profitable", not necessary. In Romans 12:1-2, Paul says we will be able to test and approve what God's Will is by offering our bodies as living sacrifices and being transformed by the renewing of our mind. Are we to condem n Paul for such advice?

What man can transform Himself? Only Jesus, who is the true Word of God, can divide soul and spirit. Only Christ can r enew the mind of any man.

When scripture speaks of the word, it is speaking about Christ (not scripture). The bible has been greatly misinterpreted because of this. I preach Christ, the true Word of God, and no other.



Yes indeed, the words that proceeded out of the mouth of Jesus were the very Word of God. However, the bible was not written by Jesus. The bible is a recording of those words. They are not the actual words.

Would you say the audio recording of a music performance (CD) is equal to the actual event (concert)?

The bible is a testimony of Jesus Christ as given by the Holy Spirit through men. It is not Christ Himself.

In John 5:39-40 (NIV), Jesus was quoted as saying "You diligently study the Scriptures because you think that by the m you possess eternal life. These are the Scriptures that testify about me, yet you refuse to come to me to have life."

Has the Church become so much like the Pharisees that they cannot see the truth? Will she not goto Christ for truth?

The Church in America has become dependent on the bible, claiming to know Christ because of the bible. This is false. No man can know Jesus from reading the bible. We can only know Christ by going to Him, the real and living Christ in H eaven, and by being transformed.

However, this lie has propagated largely because in academia, we think of knowledge as information. To "know" something is to have information about it. However, this is far from true knowledge. True knowledge is intimate. The greek word for "know" is "Ginosko" which was a "Jewish idiom for sexual intercourse between a man and a woman." This word was used in Matthew 7:23, where Jesus was quoted as saying, "I never knew you." True knowledge of Christ comes by being controlled by the Holy Spirit. When a person gives themselves to Jesus as a sacrifice, Christ is then free to enter in an d transform them. By this, their mind is renewed and they have true knowledge that impacts not only the mind but a person's actions as well.

But the Church has sinned by teaching lies. The Church teaches that a person may know Christ by reading the bible. Ch ristians in America are dependent on the bible. They do not understand the bible, but have turned it into absolute law. Th ey have become like the Pharisees seeking truth apart from God. The bible is not the Word of God. Jesus Christ is the Word of God. Jesus Christ is the truth, and the only way to the Father.

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Are you going to condemn also those who have not had access to a bible? Before the protestant reformation, the comm on Christian did not have access to the bible. They had to rely heavily on the Spirit.

And what of those in other countries who worship Christ without ever having read a bible? There are active Churches in countries like Madagascar who have yet to have a bible translated into their language? What of them?

I tell Christians to fast their bible, in the name of Jesus Christ, because they have become too dependent on scripture. They rely so heavily on external knowledge and laws that they have lost touch with the Spirit and do not know Jesus in truth. In such a case, the only way to bring them out of the darkness of their own mind is to fast the bible and seek the truth of Christ.

But you would prefer that they remain in slavery to their own understanding of the bible. The only way anyone can truly u nderstand scripture is by Jesus Christ opening the mind of a person (Luke 24:25). But if that person is not sacrificing everything to Christ, He cannot do this.

Instead, many in the Church has become a slave to their own interpretation of the bible. She has given the bible all auth ority and made it the Word of God. Blake,

I hear what you are saying. It is true that we cannot know the Lord simply by reading the Bible. Your advice to fast the Bible for a temporary amount of time may indeed be helpful to someone who has gotten all tangled up with the letter of Bible study and missed the spirit of coming to Christ for life. For example, if someone spends all their time studying the t elescope and can tell you everything about the lenses, the tripod, the distance between lenses, and can give you a three -point homiletic sermon about how to adjust the lenses to come up with the various magnifications, but then never uses i t to view the starry heavens, they've missed something! The Bible is like that telescope to show us more clearly what G od is like. But if we get all caught up with dissecting the "telescope" we see nothing but the telescope, not the glorious c reation it was designed for. In John 5 Jesus warned about the very real possibility of searching the Scriptures in and of t hemselves for life and not at all coming to the Everliving One to whom those very words testify of. Blake, this may have been something the Lord used in your life and really set you free, and praise God for it! But please do be careful not thin k that the Holy Spirit will always use this method to arrive at focusing on Christ as He did for you. I know for me, the Lord got my attention to the same truth of what you're saying in a different way.

Ron, your choice of words from the "pit of hell" are a big strong and conclude that what Blake said was of the devil. I gu ess your understanding of God now is that He would NEVER take away someone's Bible (either voluntarily or involuntarily) to know the Him. Richard Wurmbrand was tortured for Christ for 14 years in communist prison for his faith. He had no Bible, only what he had put into his heart before his confinement. The Lord revealed Himself in some marvelous ways under these times of duress. Certainly this is an extreme case, but the Lord was faithful to supply Richard's need of Him (without a Bible, no less) those torturous years. We sometimes forget that in our printing press age when we may have 7 or 8 Bibles laying around our house.

The only command Jesus gave to do daily was to take up the cross (Luke 9:23). There is no commandment to read the Bible daily. I do read and study the Scriptures daily. It is a commendable noble-minded Berean habit we are encourage d to do, but it is not simply reading. What happens many times unwittingly is failing to put total reliance upon God's Holy Spirit to take away the veil to see the Lord Jesus (2 Cor. 3:14-18). The root problem is not in the reading but a heart attit ude that fails to see our need for the Spirit of God to open our blind eyes. Only God can reveal God. This He does by the Spirit AND the Word (just as it was in the beginning in Genesis 1), not just either or. We absolutely must rely upon God to reveal Himself, or we end up with a cold, academic approach of Bible knowledge that simply puffs up.

The "deception" word I feel gets thrown around a little too freely in Christendom. True, deception is rampant today in the Body of Christ, but is every time I perceive that another member in Christ's Body misunderstands God's ways or heart re ally deception? My three-year-old daughter may think her father goes to work and watches movies. At 18 or 20 years old, as she has matured and better understands life, she know her daddy is a systems analyst doing work to help the telep hone network. Was she "deceived" at 3 years old when she thought I watched movies (which I don't do, by the way:-))? We ought to bear with one another when someone does not see eye-to-eye with us. It may be deception, but it may n

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I'd hate to see a wonderful thread that was intended to focus our attention upon our wonderful, marvelous Lord Jesus Ch rist degenerate. I'm glad to read Ken's latest post on this topic, which I've been following from its inception. I much appreciate the grace in which he is seeking to turn this thread again in the direction Here4Him has reached out for. I've been a little surprised in fact to see it hasn't received more attention considering knowing our Lord Jesus Christ is the one supreme prize the apostle Paul had in his sights. (You know the passage, "I count all things but loss for the excellency of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord..." (Ph. 3.8).

To know Him in truth is to be like Him. To know Him, those who come to know Him find in that knowledge a vital power that enables them to cease from sin. "Whosoever abideth in Him sinneth not: whosoever sinneth hath not seen Him, neither known Him" (1 Jn. 3.6). To know Him is eternal life...

And many other passages of Scripture show that knowing God with a New Covenant kind of knowledge, it ia a knowledge with such LIFE in it that it actually CHANGES us into the SAME IMAGE. And that is God's intent in giving the Scriptures: that by them we might (as with the telescope Ken spoke of)pursue the Knowledge of HIM. Daniel prophesied of days (clearly coming upon us) in which the men of value are going to be the ones who "do know their God."

And so I would like to encourage Here4Him. The way you are feeling in the dry times... don't give up. Don't draw back. Don't be discouraged. This is part of the Way. God is seeking to draw you deeper. He is seeking; YOU keep seeking. He just wants to know (and wants you yourself to discover) that you love Him utterly. Many people these days are drawing back. Turning to other things. Filling their souls with a lot of worldly (and even spiritual) junk food. But keep seeking HIM. "Blessed are those who do hunger and thirst after Righteousness, for they shall be FILLED."

And, "Give attention to reading," as Paul exhorted Timothy. But let your goal in it be the pursuit of knowing HIM. Earnestly seek that the Holy Spirit unveil Christ in your reading (as someone earlier has mentioned).
