I remember speaking once with a small group of men about the Law and the Gospel and taking them through some of the commandments. When we had looked at the 7th commandment and how that you can break it by looking upon someone to lust, one of them said something to the effect of 'you watch, now that you've brought this up, I'm going to be doing it all the time.'

You know, in his own words, I think he had described what Paul was talking about here.

Look at how some other translations render this verse

-- American Standard

Romans 7:8 but sin, finding occasion, wrought in me through the commandment all manner of coveting: for apart from the law sin is dead.

-- Living Bible

Romans 7:8 But sin used this law against evil desires by reminding me that such desires are wrong and arousing all kin ds of forbidden desires within me! Only if there were no laws to break would there be no sinning.

-- Revised Standard

Romans 7:8 But sin, finding opportunity in the commandment, wrought in me all kinds of covetousness. Apart from the I aw sin lies dead.

-- Simple English

Romans 7:8 Sin took the chance to use the command to make me want all kinds of things which didn't belong to me, be cause without law, sin is dead.

- Young's Bible

Romans 7:8 'Thou shalt not covet;' and the sin having received an opportunity, through the command, did work in me all covetousness - for apart from law sin is dead.

-- Darby's Bible

Romans 7:8 but sin, getting a point of attack by the commandment, wrought in me every lust; for without law sin was de ad.

-- Weymouth's New Testament

Romans 7:8 Sin took advantage of this, and by means of the Commandment stirred up within me every kind of coveting ; for apart from Law sin would be dead.
