Here is the most concise summary I can give to you. May it aid you in understanding and communicating God's truth.

The Gospel:

God is holy. Whatever is unholy is punished by God in hell forever. Yet God has graciously made a way through Jesus Christ for unholy things to become holy and go to heaven.

Here is a slightly longer explanation:

Background:

God is unimaginably holy and pure. The slightest disobedience to His commands is called sin. Every sin ever committed is viewed by God as a crime against His perfect holiness. By nature God hates all sin with infinite hatred. All sinners and every sin will be judged by God and compared to the infinite righteousness of Himself. He will destroy whatever comes short.

The Problem Brought Closer:

God made man for the purpose of worshiping and serving Him, but all men have sinned and fall short of the glorious standard of God. God keeps His word - He has promised prove His justice by destroying anyone and everything that is not perfectly righteous and pure. For this purpose God has made a place called hell where He will isolate sinners from all goodness forever.

The absence of goodness is deeper than you or I can fathom. A place without goodness is a place without hope, joy, peace, and love. The absence of hope is total despair. A place without joy is a place of wailing misery. A place of no peace is a place of unending, agonizing torment. God describes hell as a lake of fire that never ceases to burn. It will make men weep and gnash their teeth, and they will hate God forever in this place because they honored themselves and their sin more than Him.

God is just and fair, thus the severity of this punishment shows us how holy God must be, and how sinful our sins are.

The Problem Made Worse:

On the Day of Judgment God will not accept bribes or excuses. No amount of so-called good works will make up for the slightest sin. God is disgusted that a you would dare to consider your heart pure enough to approach the holiness of God. He is not satisfied that you think (wrongly) that He is a loving father-figure waiting to bandage your ruined soul at death. (At this point you must keep in mind that God is not evil because He wants to destroy you, but rather you are so blinded and corrupted by the sins that you are an addict of that you cannot see how deserving of death you are. This God truly is right, and you are bitterly wrong and deceived by sin.) In short, all men are utterly hopeless in themselves because they have sinned against the holiness of God and will be judged, found guilty, and damned.

The Gospel:

God was willing to make His love and forgiveness known by providing a way of salvation for a people He would save by grace through faith. For this reason God the Son came in the humble form of a man, named Jesus. He lived perfectly and sinlessly and was persecuted by self-righteous men. According to the will of God, He offered His life as a sacrifice for sins and paid the ransom of the debt owed by sinners. He was brutally beaten and hung on a painful cross. Then the full wrath of God the Father was poured on Jesus as He bore the eternal penalty that you and I deserve. "Christ was once offered to bear the sins of many." Three days later God raised Jesus from the dead to prove His victory over dea th. He appeared to hundreds of witnesses and then ascended into heaven. He now sits at the throne of God the Father, ready to forgive all who repent and believe on Him.

How to be saved:

You cannot save yourself by any amount of self-guilt or promises to live better. God alone saves and He does not have to save you. He saves only those He chooses to save, and He saves them only because He has chosen to show grace to

o some. No one deserves grace or else it would not be grace. However, God promises that all who repent and believe o n Christ shall be saved.

This means that if you are willing to forsake your life of sin, forsake control of your earthly destiny, and willing to surrend er yourself to the commands and will of God; and if you believe that Christ was a worthy sacrifice for your and all sins, th en you may have confidence that God is saving you. But do not stop here. Many people come this far and then stop bec ause they think they have repented but in their heart they were satisfied to hold on to certain sins. You must be born aga in of God's Spirit. Do not cease to repent and believe and to pray for forgiveness until He very clearly and undeniably ch anges your heart and mind. By the grace of God get rid of and destroy every known sin in your life. Pray night and day a nd shake heaven until He saves you from the old life you lived.

What then?

All who are saved by God love and grow in holiness. If after time you do not love and grow in holiness, you were not and will not be saved by God. You must repent and believe. You must be born again.

If one studies what Solomon wrote in Pr overbs chapter 2 we find that through God's intervention in man's life each is given the opportunity to be adopted by God and removed from the world which is evil.

Thanks for the clarification Jeff.

The reason why I asked the question in my first post "What is the gospel?" is because I've been wondering if we miss it when we think of the gospel as Jesus died to save you. (I agree that Jesus died to save men btw)

In other words, the gospel is not "Jesus died to save you" though that's a part of it. More specifically I believe the gospel is defined and proclaimed in Acts ch2 culminating in verse 36, "Therefore let all the house of Israel know assuredly that God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified both Lord and Christ."

This is the Gospel proclaimed. To this point in Peter's sermon there was no call to repentance, only a proclamation that

Jesus is Lord. The call to repent and believe came after and as a result of the proclamation of the gospel.

In other words, believe, repent and be saved because Jesus died for the sin of the world is a fruit of gospel preaching, rather than being the gospel its self.

I know this is subtle but it contains great implications especially in evangelism. There's no more convincing, there's only knowing Christ and Him crucified. It explains the revelation of the Righteousness of God revealed in the gospel manifesting faith and also the wrath of God revealed from heaven manifesting ungodliness and unrighteousness. To explain: Why are lives set right and sins forgiven? Because Jesus Christ is Lord. So also: Why is there no peace in the world, rather it's filled with hatred and violence? Because Jesus Christ is also Lord over those who do not believe and is actively resisting them resulting in ungodliness and unrighteousness in men who do not lack the truth, but suppress it in unrighteousness. (Rom. 1:16-18, Psalm ch2)

Proclaiming "Jesus is Lord" if I'm correct then should always proceed "Repent and believe."

Cain cannot save you, either can anything in the old testament except Law. All the commandments in the old testament have a consequence, if you don't do them you are condemned. None of the commandments in the new testament have condemnation. In Paul's epistles alone there are over 355 commandments to to do good and none of them carry condemnation. They are done out of Love for the Work God has done in us. When we believe we receive not only the Holy Spirit of God in us, but we receive the Life and New Nature of being birthed by God with the Incorruptable Seed of Christ born again in us. Cain was not born again or Able or even Moses, Abraham, David or Nicodemus, the highest Israel had to offer when it came to the Keeping of the Law God had commanded them to keep, and even Nicodemus did not understand. How can Cain and Able be expected to understand the Mystery Paul reveals to us in all his epistles.

Grace and mercy in the old testament must be different, they did not have the Holy Spirit in them or The Birth of The Son of God in them.

For it is now by Grace you are save through Faith, not of the Law or Works which no man can be saved by. Christ in you, The Holy Spirit, not just on you or with you, but in you, this is the Mystery Paul speaks about always in all his epistles, given him direct by Jesus Christ Himself, if it were not a new way of salvation, it would not have been a Mystery hidden from all generations. It is God who made this Mystery, that is Christ in you the Hope of Glory in His plan for before He ever planned the earth and man. "The Lamb slain from the foundation of the World" and Man "chosen in Christ before that foundation".

THE FAITH FACTOR

If we are justified by faith, it should come as no surprise that the devil would attempt to redefine "faith." As this conference opens, I want to give an overview of our concerns. I am concerned that saving faith is being redefined in three major areas.

1. Saving faith is a present tense faith.

The Greek verb occurs 248 times in the New Testament. Many references in the Gospels and Acts are a matter of histor ical record. I am particularly interested in 90 usages which state general commands or promises.(1)

Participles

In each of the six instances of the aeorist participle, the action of the participle occurs prior to the action of the main verb . In these instances they first believed and then received. However, none of these passages can be used to teach that a one-time act of faith is all that God requires.

There is one perfect participle used in Titus 3:8 andrefers to action which has come to be a state of being.

The present participle is used 48 times which denotes continuous action. This accounts for over half of all the usages we are considering.

The Imperative Mood

The imperative mood occurs in only two tenses - present tense and aeorist tense. There is one aeorist infinitive construction in Hebrews 11:6 which has the force of an imperative, but it refers to the initial act of coming to God. The other six times the imperative is present continuous action.

The Indicative Mood

The perfect tense indicates a past action with a continuing result. Certainly this emphasis is present in the five perfect in dicatives which are used.

The present indicative is used six times and indicates continuous action.

However there are two aeorist indicatives found. The use of the aeorist in Gal 2:16 refers to the crisis act of faith necess ary in order that we might be justified. However, this verse could not be interpreted as meaning a single act of faith would guarantee final salvation. 1 Cor 15:2 refers to those who believed in vain.

The Subjunctive Mood

The subjunctive mood describes that which is potential. Often it carries the idea of "if." Mildred Wynkoop observed that the Greek subjunctive indicates not only possibility, but also condition. It stands between predestination and moral choice s. It opens up possibility, but does not determine result. (2)

There are thirteen subjunctives and about an equal number of present subjunctives and aeorist subjunctives. All refer to contingent action. Present subjunctives refer to continuous action while aeorist subjunctives refer to a crisis act. None of the aeorist subjunctives indicate that a crisis act will insure eternal salvation, but that a crisis act is necessary to besaved

Summary

While there are a few instances of commands which emphasize the crisis moment of faith, we can say that every stated promise of eternal life or eternal reward to those who believe is based on a present tense continuous faith.

It is ironic that the popular gospel teaching today proclaims that a sinner is free to choose or reject Christ, but once becoming a Christian he then loses the power of contrary choice. That momentary decision can never be reversed. This misc onception is based upon a static and unscriptural understanding of faith. True faith is like breathing; we have to keep on.

Joseph Benson, an early Methodist commentator, preached on the text from 2 Peter 3:17-18, "Beware, lest ye also, bein g led away with the error of the wicked, fall from your own steadfastness. But grow in grace." The title of his message sa ys it all, "Growth in Grace the Only Security Against Falling From It." (3)

2. Saving faith produces good works.

James tells us that the demons have an intellectual faith. They believe that there is one God, yet this knowledge has not converted them. Therefore, James concludes that faith which does not produce works is a dead faith (2:18-26). There is a difference between a "decision for Christ" and saving faith; true faith includes repentance.

As we live by faith Romans 1:17 also teaches that we grow in faith. Saving faith produces the fruit of the Spirit (Gal 5:22-23). Those who are born again do not walk after the flesh, but after the Spirit (Rom 8:4).

However, if faith is reduced to a momentary decision and our theology teaches that once having made that decision we can never perish, what will we do with those who have made a profession of faith but exhibit no fruit?

Lewis Sperry Chafer wrote that a believer could be a new creation and yet remain a carnal Christian without any change in character. He stated that the carnal Christian is also characterized by a walk that is on the same plane as that of the n atural man. (4)

When Chafer's book He That Is Spiritual was first published in 1918 it was extremely controversial. John MacArthur wrot e, "Prior to this century, no serious theologian would have entertained the notion that it is possible to be saved yet see n othing of the outworking of regeneration in one's life-style or behavior." MacArthur went on to say that Chafer's concept of two classes of Christians, carnal and spiritual, "was a foreign concept to most Christians in Dr. Chafer's generation, but it has become a central premise for a large segment of the church today." It "became the basis for a whole new way of I ooking at the gospel." (5)

Modern dispensationalists have carried their doctrine of the carnal Christian to such absurdities as claiming that you can't tell a carnal believer from a lost man because they both act the same way. This explains how Christians can steal, lie, commit adultery or suicide and still go to heaven. It has even been taught that a carnal Christian can fall away from the faith, cease believing, and still be eternally secure.(6) John MacArthur also documents the teaching of some that believers out of fellowship may be "unbelieving believers," even agnostics or atheists, yet even those who deny God are still etern ally secure. (7)

Yet Romans 6 asserts that justification and initial sanctification are bound together and we cannot have the one without having the other. Randall Gleason wrote that Chafer over emphasized the discontinuity between justification and sanctification and underestimated the transforming power of regeneration. "To imagine that a person can be justified without an y change for the better in his condition demonstrates a deficient view of both justification and sanctification." (8)

The term "old man" occurs three times in Paul's writings. In Romans 6:6 Paul states that our old man was crucified with Christ. Colossians 3:9 declares that believers have put off their old way of life. Ephesians 4:22 is an imperative for Christ ians to put it off. (9) It is both an inconsistency to teach that one can become born again without any change and an inconsistency to teach that a believer can switch back and forth between the old lifestyle and the new.

Anthony Hoekema said the basic problem with the two natures position, as stated by John Walvoord, was that

he fails to do full justice to the fact that a decisive break with sin was brought about by Christ for believers - so that sin, t hough still present in the believer, no longer has dominion - and to the amazing truth that the believer is now indeed, a n ew creature, old things having passed away. . . . He gives the impression that the Christian is something like a spiritual s eesaw with two contradictory types of inner tendencies. With both tugging at one's heart, a believer can go either way. (1 0)

Therefore, we have today people who are making a momentary decision for Christ, who produce no evidence of salvation and yet are told daily by radio preachers that they cannot lose this salvation. But there are no unconditional covenants in Scripture.(11) While certain verses taken out of context may appear to offer unconditional security, they must be reconciled with the many conditions stated. (12)

Furthermore, every passage which describes the final judgment states that we will be judged in that day on the basis of our works.(13) It is ironic that the sinner is held morally responsible to obey God, but when he becomes a Christian faithfulness is not required. The Christian, according to popular teaching, is judged at a lower standard.

3. Saving faith brings assurance.

The third deficiency in the false faith promoted today is that it produces no divine assurance. According to Hebrews 11:1, true faith produces assurance or confidence. This word hupostasis was found in papyri sources to denote a title deed. (14) William Lane translates this opening phrase in Hebrews 11:1, "Now faith celebrates the objective reality of the blessings for which we hope." (15)

Faith is also the evidence or proof of things not seen. John Wesley preached that

faith is a divine evidence and conviction, not only that 'God was in Christ, reconciling the world unto himself,' but also th at Christ 'loved me and gave himself for me.' And it is certain this faith necessarily implies an assurance . . . that 'Ch rist loved me, and gave himself for me.' For 'he that believeth' with the true, living faith 'hath the witness in himself.' The Spirit witnesseth with his spirit that he is a child of God. Because he is a son, God hath sent forth the Spirit of His Son int o his heart, crying, Abba, Father; giving him an assurance that he is so, and a childlike confidence in him. (16)

A false faith produces no assurance. However, the Holy Spirit still convicts of sin (John 16:8). This conviction creates an xiety and secular psychology complains that religion upsets people.

Recently a psychiatrist told a woman who had attended our services that she was too religious. She was so upset by his advice that she quit him and started back to church. The Lord has helped her greatly.

But the "carnal Christian" should be upset. Ten percent of the total Christian population is sexually addicted. (17) The "c arnal Christian" should be anxious because the Scripture teaches that sexual immorality, impurity and debauchery; idola tryand witchcraft; hatred, discord, jealousy, fits of rage, selfish ambition, dissension, factions and envy; drunkenness, org ies, and the like are acts of the sinful nature and those who live like this will not inherit the kingdom of God (Gal 5:19-21).

So, the Holy Spirit convicts, but He is not bringing assurance to the "carnal Christian." The right kind of preaching would produce more conviction! The popular preachers teach a false assurance based on their rationalistic doctrine of "once s aved, always saved." They teach I can have it and not feel it, but I can never lose it if I ever get it! I would rather know th at I am saved and yet know that salvation could be forfeited than to be talked into a profession that I did not possess, but told I could not lose.

While the Holy Spirit convicts the nominal Christian that they are not ready to meet God, these preachers misapply the Word of God by teaching a false security while the Holy Spirit calls for surrender. Yet the logic of their teaching cannot c ompete with the gentle whisper of the Holy Spirit. The mind of the nominal Christian may accept the logic of the smooth t eacher, but in his heart he knows something is not right.

Let me offer some sound psychological advice. Quit trying to justify what God's Word condemns. Agree with the voice of the Holy Spirit and surrender to the lordship of Christ. God will then enable you to believe and when you trust in Christ wi th all your heart, He will come through His Spirit and make a new person out of you. You will know that you are truly sav ed because the Holy Spirit will bring peace and because you see the indirect evidence of a changed life.

But some might object that this Wesleyan-Arminian emphasis is conditional. This salvation may be forfeited. Apostasy is a real possibility. They often scoff that we have no assurance. They caricature us as believing that "every other day with Jesus is sweeter than the day before." That we have be born again and again and again. On the other hand, they are et ernally secure.

I am arguing that we offer more actual security than they do. John Wesley did preach that salvation is conditional. But he also preached

that the Spirit of God does give a believer such a testimony of his adoption that while it is present to the soul he can no more doubt the reality of his sonship than he can doubt of the shining of the sun while he stands full blaze of his beams. (18)

A present tense faith produces a present tense assurance.

CONCLUSION

We protest this false faith which does not require any commitment or obedience beyond an initial decision. It is a dead fa ith which produces no spiritual fruit and brings no divine assurance. If a church member exercises no faith, gives no evid ence of having been saved, and has no supernatural assurance that he is saved - it should be obvious that he is not saved!

Before the modern teaching of the dispensationalists confused the issue, in little towns and villages acrossthis nation the re was a time when the Baptists had revival and the Methodists would join them. When the Methodists had their camp m eeting the Baptists came. If the Presbyterians scheduled a protracted meeting, the other denominations came to fellows hip. But if a seeker came forward, it did not matter which denominational he preferred, it was expected that when he real ly got saved there would be a change in his life. Yes, there were differences between the denominations. They had differ ent traditions and there were variations in their rituals of worship, but they all believed that salvation did something for a man. If a man or woman professed to get religion and their life did not change, it was generally agreed that the religion d id not "take."

We preach a free gospel for all men and a full gospel from all sin. It is based upon a present tense faith which produces good works and brings assurance. We believe that if we keep ourselves in the love of God he is able to keep us from fall ing (Jude 21-24) and that he will appear a second time to bring final salvation to those who are believing (Heb 9:28). This is the faith which saves.

APPENDIX B

All Scripture is inspired by God and is profitable for doctrine (2 Tim 3:16). Some Scriptures apparently teach uncondition al eternal security; other Scriptures seem to deny that our security is unconditional. God has not contradicted himself. O ur doctrine of assurance must take seriously both columns of texts. These passages, taken from the NIV, should be studied within their context.

Both positions have a doctrine of assurance. The unconditional position teaches that once we are saved we can never lo se salvation, but relies on a logical deduction from Scripture to assure us of when we received that salvation.

The conditional position teaches that we have divine assurance through the Holy Spirit that we have been saved, but that we can be sure of salvation only as we continue to be assured by the Spirit. Deliberate sin which remains unconfessed grieves the Holy Spirit, resulting in a loss of assurance and jeopardizing the salvation covenant.

Passages apparently teaching conditional security

Ezek 18:24 If a righteous man turns from his righteousness and commits sin and does the same detestable things the wi cked man does, will he live? None of the righteous things he has done will be remembered . . . he will die (see also v 26; 33:12-18).

John 8:31 If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples; 15:6 If anyone does not remain in me, he is like a bran ch that is . . . thrown into the fire and burned.

1 Cor 15:2 By this gospel you are saved, if you hold firmly to the word I preached to you. Otherwise, your have believed in vain.

2 Cor 13:5 Examine yourselves to see whether you are in the faith; test yourselves. Do you not realize that Christ Jesus is in you - unless, of course, you fail the test?

Gal 5:4 You have fallen away from grace.

Col 1:23 If you continue in your faith, established and firm, not moved from the hope held out in the gospel; 2:19 He has lost connection with the Head.

- 1Cr 4:15 For though you might have ten thousand instructors in Christ, yet you do not have many fathers; for in Christ J esus I have begotten you through the gospel.

Here again we see that Paul is writing to the children of the congregation. Paul points out that thought there might be 10 000 instructors yet there are few fathers...

What seperates a "babe in Christ" a "child" who may even teach the word of God from a "father in Christ?"

The Final Gospel by Warren Litzman:

There are great numbers of believers who do not know there is a final gospel. For centuries theologians have erroneously maintained that there is only one gospel in the Bible. This is grave error but worse is the fact that such untruth has kept multitudes unaware that Christ lives in them and is their only life to God (Gal. 2:20). Why would anyone maintain such a n idea when the Scriptures are so clear? I see that there are at least five reasons for this grave oversight and confusion of interpretation.

1) When believers are denied the facts of the seven dispensations in the Bible, they can never know who God is talkin g to or why. The study of the different dispensations open up the fact that God had a different message in each one of the

e dispensations. When you see this it becomes simple to see that God had a different message for the Gentiles. While God has but one plan it is broken into many different parts. Seeing this difference is knowing your Bible.

- 2) Unless you know the difference between the ministries of Jesus of Nazareth and Jesus our Lord, you can never und erstand the final gospel. When Jesus of Nazareth was sent to Israel He came to His own, but His own received Him not. The facts concerning His coming to Israel is one great truth, but Jesus, the Lord of our life, was sent to live in believers, whether Jews or Gentiles. Such an idea as this is not an extension of the work or words of Jesus of Nazareth. While it is the same Jesus that healed the sick, raised the dead, cast out devils and performed miracles and is the same Jesus that lives in believers today, the gospel for these two different works of God require two different messages.
- 3) This confusion over the final gospel exists because of the denial, by many, of the Apostle PaulÂ's message which he called my gospel. Paul must be accepted as GodÂ's last voice for the ultimate truth. He is the last God appointed Apostle, he is the final teacher of grace and his words alone set the pattern for modern believers Â"Follow me as I follow Christ (I Cor. 11:1).Â" Unless you follow Paul it will be difficult to know Christ in His fullness as Paul says three different times, Â"God gave the final gospel to me to give to youÂ" (Eph. 3:17, Col. 1:25, I Cor. 9:16-17).
- 4) Most believers do not know the radical division there is in the Scriptures. That is the difference between prophecy a nd the mystery. Prophecy occupies at least 4/5 of the Bible and is based on law and legalism. PaulÂ's teaching on grace is the message to the born-again and only occupies 1/5 of the Bible. The final gospel, the mystery, is to be found mostly in the 1/5. This by no means nullifies the 4/5 of the Bible.
- 5) The misplacement and the misuse of the Holy Spirit has kept many from the final truth. Most have erroneously taug ht the Holy Spirit is Christ. They teach that the believer is only "in Christ" when the believer receives the Holy Spirit. However, the life is only in the Son, ChristÂ's Spirit is joined to our spirit, and the Holy Spirit is joined to our soulish part (the mind) and is the teacher of the Christ-life.

Paul speaks of the Gospel that God allowed him to call "his Gospel, or My Gospel", This is the Gospel that Jesus Christ Gave to Paul personally and only to him that are Born Again and live our life by the Christ that is birthed in us.

Colossians 1:20-29 And, having made peace through the blood of his cross, by him to reconcile all things unto himself; by him, I say, whether they be things in earth, or things in heaven. And you, that were sometime alienated and enemies in your mind by wicked works, yet now hath he reconciled In the body of his flesh through death, to present you holy an d unblameable and unreproveable in his sight: If ye continue in the faith grounded and settled, and be not moved away f rom the hope of the gospel, which ye have heard, and which was preached to every creature which is under heaven; wh ereof I Paul am made a minister; Who now rejoice in my sufferings for you, and fill up that which is behind of the afflictions of Christ in my flesh for his body's sake, which is the church: Whereof I am made a minister, according to the dispensation of God which is given to me for you, to fulfil the word of God; Even the mystery which hath been hid from ages and from generations, but now is made manifest to his saints: To whom God would make known what is the riches of the glory of this mystery among the Gentiles; which is Christ in you, the hope of glory: Whom we preach, warning every man, and teaching every man in all wisdom; that we may present every man perfect in Christ Jesus: Whereunto I also labour, striving according to his working, which worketh in me mightily.

He Received it not of Man, but of Jesus Christ Himself.

This is the "final Gospel" We had the Gospel of Moses by God Himself. We had the Gospel of Jesus Christ to Israel.

Now the Final Gospel: Galatians 1:10-24 For do I now persuade men, or God? or do I seek to please men? for if I yet p leased men, I should not be the servant of Christ. But I certify you, brethren, that the gospel which was preached of me is not after man. For I neither received it of man, neither was I taught it, but by the revelation of Jesus Christ. For ye have heard of my conversation in time past in the Jews' religion, how that beyond measure I persecuted the church of God, a nd wasted it: And profited in the Jews' religion above many my equals in mine own nation, being more exceedingly zealo

us of the traditions of my fathers. But when it pleased God, who separated me from my mother's womb, and called me by his grace, To reveal his Son in me, that I might preach him among the heathen; immediately I conferred not with flesh and blood: Neither went I up to Jerusalem to them which were apostles before me; but I went into Arabia, and returned a gain unto Damascus. Then after three years I went up to Jerusalem to see Peter, and abode with him fifteen days. But other of the apostles saw I none, save James the Lord's brother. Now the things which I write unto you, behold, before G od, I lie not. Afterwards I came into the regions of Syria and Cilicia; And was unknown by face unto the churches of Juda ea which were in Christ: But they had heard only, That he which persecuted us in times past now preacheth the faith whi ch once he destroyed. And they glorified God in me.

Why follow Paul?

There are many religionists who believe following Paul is heresy. I would have felt the same way many years ago. But by the Holy SpiritÂ's leading I came to see that the Scriptures are plain. The only way that a born-again believer can follow Christ is by first following Paul. This is not a mere idea of my own. It is a truth that is firmly stated many times in the Scriptures (I Cor. 4:16, I Cor. 11:1, Phil. 3:17, Phil. 4:9, Gal. 4:12, II Thes. 3:7, II Thes. 3:9, II Thes. 3:4). These 8 Scriptures give a heavy weight of truth to the fact that Paul received something special from Christ: something that belonged only to the born-again and the Gentiles. Look at the special things Christ gave only to Paul.

- 1) Paul alone gave us pure grace. In the Old Testament, the word "grace" is usually translated to be "mercy." Mercy is good, but not pure grace. Mercy is contingent on the recipient doing something to make it possible. This is the opposite of grace. Sadly, too many believers today are being taught mercy instead of grace. In Christianity, grace alone is sufficient (II Cor. 12:9).
- 2) Paul alone was given the message that the law of Moses and the laws of the Old Testament are abolished at the cro ss (Eph. 2:15, Col. 2:14). Most believers today are not taught this because modern religion cannot operate without law. Most born-again believers without the fullness of PaulÂ's revelation will live and die always worried about their law keeping.
- 3) Paul alone gives to the born-again their final gospel. He received from Christ a message that was strictly to the Gentil es (Acts 28:28), and was not a part of, or even a shadow of the Old Testament or prophecy. It begins in the latter part of Jesus of NazarethÂ's ministry in Gethsemane and ends with the rapture of the church (I Thes. 4:15-17). The key to the final gospel is the in-Christ position. The first aspect of in-Christ position was when the sin of the world went into His body as He drank the cup in Gethsemane. From then on everything Paul writes about is contingent on being in-Christ.
- 4) Paul alone is the one to whom the revelation came that Christ lived in Him (Gal. 1:16-17). The revelation did not come to Peter or James or John or anyone else. Christ in the believer is strictly a Pauline truth. It is truth that was never known by mortals until it was given to Paul (Eph. 3:3-6). It is not only the final gospel, but it is the only workable gospel for to dayÂ's believers. Yet most believers know little of nothing about it as they are fed man-made religion daily¾devoid of PaulÂ's revelation.
- 5) Paul is the only one in the Scriptures that had a right to say the revelation Christ had given him was "my gospel" (Rom. 16:25, Rom. 2:16, II Tim. 2:8). This is important to our understanding. Since no one in the Old Testament knew this final gospel and since Jesus of Nazareth did not teach this gospel (He taught Moses law) and since no other disciple or Apostle preached this message, it is well that Paul called it his gospel. It is sad that modern religion has not picked up PaulÂ's gospel. Multitudes could be blessed if they did.

About this book Matthew Henry writes as an introduction...here is part of what he writes...

This song might easily be taken in a spiritual sense by the Jewish church, for whose use it was first composed, and was so taken, as appears by the Chaldee-Paraphrase and the most ancient Jewish expositors. God betrothed the people of I srael to himself; he entered into covenant with them, and it was a marriage-covenant. He had given abundant proofs of h is love to them, and required of them that they should love him with all their heart and soul. Idolatry was often spoken of as spiritual adultery, and doting upon idols, to prevent which this song was penned, representing the complacency which God took in Israel and which Israel ought to take in God, and encouraging them to continue faithful to him, though he mi ght seem sometimes to withdraw and hide himself from them, and to wait for the further manifestation of himself in the pr omised Messiah. 2. It may more easily be taken in a spiritual sense by the Christian church, because the condescension s and communications of divine love appear more rich and free under the gospel than they did under the law, and the co mmunion between heaven and earth more familiar. God sometimes spoke of himself as the husband of the Jewish chur ch (Isa. 64:5, Hos. 2:16, 19), and rejoiced in it as his bride, Isa. 62:4, 5. But more frequently is Christ represented as the bridegroom of his church (Mt. 25:1; Rom. 7:4; 2 Co. 11:2; Eph. 5:32), and the church as the bride, the LambÂ's wife, Re v. 19:7; 21:2, 9. Pursuant to this metaphor Christ and the church in general, Christ and particular believers, are here disc oursing with abundance of mutual esteem and endearment. The best key to this book is the 45th Psalm, which we find a pplied to Christ in the New Testament, and therefore this ought to be so too. It requires some pains to find out what may, probably, be the meaning of the Holy Spirit in the several parts of this book; as DavidÂ's songs are many of them level t o the capacity of the meanest, and there are shallows in them learned, and there are depths in it in which an elephant m ay swim. But, when the meaning is found out, it will be of admirable use to excite pious and devout affections in us; and t he same truths which are plainly laid down in other scriptures when they are extracted out of this come to the soul with a more pleasing power. When we apply ourselves to the study of this book we must not only, with Moses and Joshua, put off our shoe from off our foot, and even forget that we have bodies, because the place where we stand is holy ground, b ut we must, with John, come up hither, must spread our wings, take a noble flight, and soar upwards, till by faith and hol y love we enter into the holiest, for this is no other than the house of God and this is the gate of heaven."

Christ is the Old Testament. The way we receive Him is different in the New Testament or we would still be under the L aw and sacrificing in the Temple. We are now the temple and the sacrifice is Christ in us.

The spiritual drink they drank from was not Christ but the miracle of God in providing them with water from the rock.

And that Rock was Christ. This cannot be intended to be understood literally, for it was not literally true. The rock from w hich the water flowed was evidently an ordinary rock, a part of Mount Horeb; and all that this can mean is, that that rock, with the stream of water thus gushing from it, was a representation of the Messiah. The word was is thus often used to d enote similarity or representation, and is not to be taken literally. Thus, in the institution of the Lord's Supper, the Saviour says of the bread, "This is my body," that is, it represents my body. Thus also of the cup, "This cup is the new testament in my blood," that is, it represents my blood, 1Co 11:24-25. Thus the gushing fountain of water might be regarded as a r epresentation of the Messiah, and of the blessings which result from him. The apostle does not say that the Israelites kn ew that this was designed to be a representation of the Messiah, and of the blessings which flow from him, though there is nothing improbable in the supposition that they so understood and regarded it, since all their institutions were probably regarded as typical. But he evidently does mean to say that the rock was a vivid and affecting representation of the Messiah; that the Jews did partake of the mercies that flow from him; and that even in the desert they were under his care, a nd had in fact among them a vivid representation of him, in some sense corresponding with the emblematic representation of the Supper. This representation of the M essiah, was understood by Paul to consist in the following things:

You must be born again of water and the spirit. I will give you living water.

John 3:5 Jesus answered, Verily, Verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot ent er into the kingdom of God.

The water in the desert from the rock, they had to continually drink. The living water that Christ in us gives we will never need again.

John 4:10-14 Jesus answered and said unto her, If thou knewest the gift of God, and who it is that saith to thee, Give me to drink; thou wouldest have asked of him, and he would have given thee living water. The woman saith unto him, Sir, thou hast nothing to draw with, and the well is deep: from whence then hast thou that living water? Art thou greater than our father Jacob, which gave us the well, and drank thereof himself, and his children, and his cattle? Jesus answered an

d said unto her, Whosoever drinketh of this water shall thirst again: But whosoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall never thirst; but the water that I shall give him shall be in him a well of water springing up into everlasting life.

Again and again and again, the old testament is earthly as the millennial kingdom will be on this earth, which we are the heavenly dwellers in the Father's House that Christ prepared and is preparing for us. The Gospel

"There is no greater message to be heard than that which we call the Gospel. But as important as that is, it is often given to massive distortions or over simplifications. People think theyÂ're preaching the Gospel to you when they tell you, 'you can have a purpose to your life', or that 'you can have meaning to your life', or that 'you can have a personal relationship with Jesus.' All of those things are true, and theyÂ're all important, but they donÂ't get to the heart of the Gospel.

The Gospel is called the 'good news' because it addresses the most serious problem that you and I have as human bein gs, and that problem is simply this: God is holy and He is just, and IÂ'm not. And at the end of my life, IÂ'm going to stan d before a just and holy God, and IÂ'll be judged. And IÂ'll be judged either on the basis of my own righteousness — or I ack of it — or the righteousness of another. The good news of the Gospel is that Jesus lived a life of perfect righteousne ss, of perfect obedience to God, not for His own well being but for His people. He has done for me what I couldnÂ't possi bly do for myself. But not only has He lived that life of perfect obedience, He offered Himself as a perfect sacrifice to sati sfy the justice and the righteousness of God.

The great misconception in our day is this: that God isnÂ't concerned to protect His own integrity. HeÂ's a kind of wishywashy deity, who just waves a wand of forgiveness over everybody. No. For God to forgive you is a very costly matter. It cost the sacrifice of His own Son. So valuable was that sacrifice that God pronounced it valuable by raising Him from the dead \hat{A} — so that Christ died for us, He was raised for our justification. So the Gospel is something objective. It is the mes sage of who Jesus is and what He did. And it also has a subjective dimension. How are the benefits of Jesus subjectively appropriated to us? How do I get it? The Bible makes it clear that we are justified not by our works, not by our efforts, not by our deeds, but by faith \hat{A} — and by faith alone. The only way you can receive the benefit of ChristÂ's life and death is by putting your trust in Him \hat{A} — and in Him alone. You do that, youÂ're declared just by God, youÂ're adopted into His f amily, youÂ're forgiven of all of your sins, and you have begun your pilgrimage for eternity."

All that fol lows are because God in Christ Jesus was reconciling the world to Himself. Let our works reflect and be the works of G od in Christ Jesus through our bodies presented to God, which is only our spiritual service. In other words, the least we can do. I am His, He is mine.

For if the casting away of them be the reconciling of the world, what shall the receiving of them be, but life from the dead? For if the firstfruit be hol y, the lump is also holy: and if the root be holy, so are the branches. And if some of the branches be broken off, and thou , being a wild olive tree, wert graffed in among them, and with them partakest of the root and fatness of the olive tree: B oast not against the branches. But if thou boast, thou bearest not the root, but the root thee. Thou wilt say then, The bra nches were broken off, that I might be graffed in. Well; because of unbelief they were broken off, and thou standest by fa ith. Be not highminded, but fear: For if God spared not the natural branches, take heed lest he also spare not thee. Beho ld therefore the goodness and severity of God: on them which fell, severity; but toward thee, goodness, if thou continue i n his goodness: otherwise thou also shalt be cut off. And they also, if they abide not still in unbelief, shall be graffed in: f or God is able to graff them in again. For if thou wert cut out of the olive tree which is wild by nature, and wert graffed co ntrary to nature into a good olive tree: how much more shall these, which be the natural branches, be graffed into their o wn olive tree? For I would not, brethren, that ye should be ignorant of this mystery, lest ye should be wise in your own co

nceits; that blindness in part is happened to Israel, until the fulness of the Gentiles be come in. Paul exhorts all of us that "we should no longer be children..." who are "tossed to and fro and carried about with every w ind of doctrine, by the trickery of men, in the cunning craftiness of deceitful plotting."

Again we find Paul teaching and exhorting the Ephesian church to grow in as you wrote, to take advantage of the "bucke t of grace" that is freely given to all who are born again. Yet Paul continues to make the distinction that those who remain "children" are easily "tossed to and fro and carried about with every wind of doctrine."

Today is no different than it was in Paul's day. We see the doctrines of men causing confusion and strife amongst the p eople...we see people barking, we see people laughing, we see preachers fleecing the flocks for wages. We see the ch urch divided.

For ye have heard of my conversation in time past in the Jews' religion, how that beyond measure I persecuted the church of God, and wasted it: And profited in the Jews' religion above many my e quals in mine own nation, being more exceedingly zealous of the traditions of my fathers. But when it pleased God, who separated me from my mother's womb, and called me by his grace, To reveal his Son in me, that I might preach him am ong the heathen; immediately I conferred not with flesh and blood:

By trying to make the Jewish religion the reason that a Christian would be accepted as a religious person, that is by circ umcission and the Law. This is what Paul fought his whole ministry of his Gospel, which is "Christ in you the Hope of Gl ory".

Again speaking of the Jerusalem Church, specifically Peter James and John, who changed his mind when he wrote John's epistle, and his gospel, which is completely different than the three History Gospels.

Galatians 2:3-10 But neither Titus, who was with me, being a Greek, was compelled to be circumcised: And that becaus e of false brethren unawares brought in, who came in privily to spy out our liberty which we have in Christ Jesus, that the y might bring us into bondage: To whom we gave place by subjection, no, not for an hour; that the truth of the gospel mi ght continue with you. But of these who seemed to be somewhat, (whatsoever they were, it maketh no matter to me: Go d accepteth no man's person:) for they who seemed to be somewhat in conference added nothing to me: But contrariwis e, when they saw that the gospel of the uncircumcision was committed unto me, as the gospel of the circumcision was u nto Peter; (For he that wrought effectually in Peter to the apostleship of the circumcision, the same was mighty in me to ward the Gentiles:) And when James, Cephas, and John, who seemed to be pillars, perceived the grace that was given unto me, they gave to me and Barnabas the right hands of fellowship; that we should go unto the heathen, and they unto the circumcision. Only they would that we should remember the poor; the same which I also was forward to do.

Then the strongest correction:

Galatians 3:1-9 O foolish Galatians, who hath bewitched you, that ye should not obey the truth, before whose eyes Jesu s Christ hath been evidently set forth, crucified among you? This only would I learn of you, Received ye the Spirit by the works of the law, or by the hearing of faith? Are ye so foolish? having begun in the Spirit, are ye now made perfect by the eflesh? Have ye suffered so many things in vain? if it be yet in vain. He therefore that ministereth to you the Spirit, and worketh miracles among you, doeth he it by the works of the law, or by the hearing of faith? Even as Abraham believed God, and it was accounted to him for righteousness. Know ye therefore that they which are of faith, the same are the children of Abraham. And the scripture, foreseeing that God would justify the heathen through faith, preached before the gospel unto Abraham, saying, In thee shall all nations be blessed. So then they which be of faith are blessed with faithful Abraham.

By faith Abraham was saved by God's mercy, not believing on the Name of Jesus Christ His Son and receiving the Faith of Christ not Abraham, we are blessed in Abraham but we are saved by the Faith of Jesus Christ.

1John 1:5 This is the message which we have heard from Him and declare to you, that God is light and in Him is no dark ness at all. 6 If we say that we have fellowship with Him, and walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth.

When Apostle John writes, "if we say that we have fellowship with Him," he is pointing to every man or woman who m akes the claim that they are Christians. John declares that these who claim the name of Jesus, but "walk in darkness, " are deceiving themselves, because they "do not practice the truth." If we look around us, in our community, in our nation, we see this precept manifesting itself in many people. Many claim Jesus as their Savior, but the fruit of their wal k becomes evident. The motivations of their hearts speak of the things that are of darkness. The evidence of their lives more closely resemble the fruit of those who walk in the ways of this world.

So then it is of the utmost importance to discover what John means when he says of these people, they who deceive the mselves, they "do not practice the truth." In 1 John 2:

3 Now by this we know that we know Him, if we keep His commandments. 4 He who says, "I know Him," and does n ot keep His commandments, is a liar, and the truth is not in him. 5 But whoever keeps His word, truly the love of God is perfected in him. By this we know that we are in Him.

In verse 4 we are given the answer to what John means when he speaks of those who "do not practice the truth." John equates "not practice (ing) the truth" with "not keep (ing) His commandments." In verse 5 we are told that those who "keeps His word, truly the love of God is perfected in him." So then, what do we make of these words and ideas found in Scripture? What does John really mean when he states that those who "keep His word, who walk in the light, who keep His commandment, the "love of God is perfected in him."

Throughout the entirety of GodÂ's word, we find that God requires this of men and women who say they are followers of Christ. In Deuteronomy 6 we hear thisÂ...

4 Â"Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one! 5 You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength.Â"

Jesus declares this in Mark 12:

Mark 12:29 Jesus answered him, "The first of all the commandments is: 'Hear, O Israel, the LORD our God, the LORD is one. 30 And you shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength.Â' This is the first commandment. 31 And the second, like it, is this: "You shall love your neighbor as your self.Â' There is no other commandment greater than these."

I submit to you that this is the will of God for all that proclaim Jesus as their Savior. And we know according to what Joh n has written, that "the love of God is perfected" in those who "keep His word", "who walk in the light," and "who keep His commandments." I want to make this very important distinction here. John is not saying that God loves us when we obey His commandments, but that our love for God is perfected by Him in us as we walk in the light as He is in the light. John writes, 7" But if we walk in the light as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanses us from all sin. " (1 John 1) And then, "6 "He who says he abides in Him ough t himself also to walk just as He walked." (1 John 2)

For those who walk in the light as He is in the light, the 'love of God" is implanted and nurtured in us by Him. This is the good news. Are you experiencing the power of the gospel?
