-----Nobody has yet resigned from the Order of Canada. However, in July 2008, Roman Catholic priest Lucien LarrÃ©, former police detective Frank Chauvin, and Gilbert Finn, former Lieutenant Governor of New Brunswick, indicated their intentions to return their insignia of the Order of Canada in protest against abortion activist Henry Morgentaler's appointment earlier that month. Similarly, members of the Madonna House Apostolate, an Ontario Catholic organization, indicated their intention to return the insignia of Catherine Doherty, the Madonna House's late founder, who was inducted into the order in 1976.

Abortion remains a hotly-debated issue in Canada despite the picture the liberal politicians are trying to portray.
