DANIEL—A MAN OF ANOTHER SORT! by David Wilkerson

Daniel was a Â"man of another sortÂ" who speaks of being broken: Â"I set my face unto the Lord God, to seek by prayer and supplications, with fasting, and sackcloth, and ashes: and I prayed unto the Lord my God, and made my confession Â" (Daniel 9:3Â-4). In turn, Daniel was able to discern the times, because he knew GodÂ's heart. Â"I Daniel understood by books the number of the years, whereof the word of the Lord came to JeremiahÂ" (Daniel 9:2).

How did Daniel come to this path of brokenness, knowledge and discernment? It began with his study of GodÂ's Word. Daniel allowed the Scriptures to lay hold of him fully. And he quoted them often and at length, because heÂ'd hidden the m away in his heart: Â"As it is written in the lawÂ...Â" (Daniel 9:13).

In chapter 10, this godly prophet was given a vision of Christ, Â"I lifted up mine eyesÂ...and behold a certain man clothe d in linen, whose loins were girded with fine gold of UphazÂ...and his face as the appearance of lightning, and his eyes as lamps of fireÂ...and the voice of his words like the voice of a multitudeÂ" (10:5Â-6).

I urge you, set your heart today to seek God with all diligence and determination. Then go to his Word with ever-increasi ng love and desire. Pray with fasting for brokenness, to receive his burden. Finally, confess and forsake everything that hinders the Holy Spirit from opening heavenÂ's blessings to you. The path of Â"men of another sortÂ" is open to everyo ne. Will you walk in it?

Such a walk brings the touch of God. Daniel testified, Â"Behold, an hand touched me, which set me upon my knees and upon the palms of my handsÂ" (Daniel 10:10). The word for touched here means Â"to violently seize upon.Â" Daniel was saying, Â"When God placed his hand upon me, it put me on my face. His touch gave me an urgency to seek him with all thatÂ's in me.Â"

This happens anytime God touches someoneÂ's life. That person falls to his knees and becomes a man or woman of pr ayer, driven to seek the Lord.

IÂ've often wondered why God touches only certain people with this urgency. Why do some servants become hungry se ekers after him, while other faithful people go their way? God-touched servants have an intimate relationship with the Lo rd. They receive revelations from heaven. And they enjoy a walk with Christ that few others do.

Why did God lay his hand on Daniel and touch him as he did? Why was this one man able to see and hear things no on e else could? He declares, Â"I Daniel alone saw the vision: for the men that were with me saw not the visionÂ" (Daniel 1 0:7).

God needed a voice to speak his message. He wanted a praying servant, someone who would respond faithfully to his c alling. Daniel was that man. HeÂ'd been praying devoutly three times a day. And now, as he walked along the river, Chri st revealed himself to him (see Daniel 10:7Â-9).

God made Daniel his oracle because:

- 1. Daniel never let up in prayer (see Daniel 10:2Â-3).
- 2. Daniel grieved over the spiritual decline in society and the church (see Daniel chapter 9).
- 3. Daniel refused to harbor or hide sin (Daniel 9:4Â-5).
