It is talking about how we pass through degrees of faith. When we first come to God, our faith in a sense is full, but is of course young and untried. In this faith the righteousness of God has been revealed, because we have understood being justified by faith through Jesus Christ.

As we move on in our faith, we begin to be tested by doubts, temptations, and other challenges. Perhaps we fall into sin. All of this strikes at our sense of being justified and at our living by faith. When we pass these trials, we do not pass from faith to something else, but to more faith, a tried faith, a more mature faith, and in a sense a greater faith.

Whatever stage of faith we are in, Paul says we shall live by that faith.
