For a married woman is bound by law to her husband while he lives, but if her husband di es she is released from the law of marriage. Accordingly, she will be called an adulteress if she lives with another man w hile her husband is alive. But if her husband dies, she is free from that law, and if she marries another man she is not an adulteress. Likewise, my brothers, you also have died to the law through the body of Christ, so that you may belong to a nother, to him who has been raised from the dead, in order that we may bear fruit for God.

If I carry guil t and condemnation when God has forgiven me, I am working on the Sabbath — carrying a load on the day of rest. Apa rt from resting in him, my use of GodÂ's name over my life is merely in vain — and I fail to love him. My self-efforts be come my idol. And I designate myself as my own god - master of my own redemption. This is a serious affront to Christ Â's sacrifice; but it is also damaging to my faith and freedom in Christ. It is a violation of the great commandment of love towards myself. Living by law instead of Spirit is, really, no less than self- abuse. It harms me spiritually, emotionally, a nd psychologically. It also keeps me from truly loving others with ChristÂ's mercy. You see, it is really a violation of ALL the commandments.

Paul writes: Ä"Live by the Spirit and you will not gratify the desires of the sinful natureÂ".

This truly is the way to keep from sin! Guilt is never the way to keep from sin, though the church has had a tendency to e xploit guilt  $\hat{A}$ — to keep the masses in control and forever needing the church to absolve the guilt. Unrelenting guilt prod uces endless temptations to seek law of some kind  $\hat{A}$ — some way to take away the nagging sense of condemnation. Th is was formerly a sad realty in my life  $\hat{A}$ — till it capsized me. Now I can appreciate why it doesn $\hat{A}$ 't work; but instead, livin g by the Spirit can keep me desiring what the Spirit desires.

Ephah,

How do you interpret these writings of Paul?

Galatians 3:15-21

- 15 Brethren, I speak in terms of human relations: even though it is only a manÂ's covenant, yet when it has been ratified, no one sets it aside or adds conditions to it.
- 16 Now the promises were spoken to Abraham and to his seed. He does not say, Â"And to seeds,Â" as referring to man y, but rather to one, Â"And to your seed,Â" that is, Christ.
- 17 What I am saying is this: the Law, which came four hundred and thirty years later, does not invalidate a covenant pre viously ratified by God, so as to nullify the promise.
- 18 For if the inheritance is based on law, it is no longer based on a promise; but God has granted it to Abraham by means of a promise.

I understand this to say that the Law does not replace the promise given to Abraham, is different from the promise given to Abraham (different in purpose), and is less powerful than and subordinate to the promise given to Abraham.

- 19 Why the Law then? It was added because of transgressions, having been ordained through angels by the agenc y of a mediator, until the seed would come to whom the promise had been made.
- 20 Now a mediator is not for one party only; whereas God is only one.
- 21 Is the Law then contrary to the promises of God? May it never be! For if a law had been given which was able to impart life, then righteousness would indeed have been based on law.

The Law is only contrary to the promise if it too can make someone righteous. But righteousness, while demanded by the Law, is not a promise of the Law. If the Law can do that then the promise is of no use.

- 24 Therefore the Law has become our tutor to lead us to Christ, so that we may be justified by faith.
- 25 But now that faith has come, we are no longer under a tutor.

Christ did say that if we loved Him we would keep His commands. But He also said that He was a Â'greater than Moses Â'. The commands that Christ Himself gave; love one another are higher than the Law of Commandments given by Mos es. Christ too was a Law Giver.

How do you interpret this passage from Galatians?

Galatians 4:8,9

- 8 However at that time, when you did not know God, you were slaves to those which by nature are no gods.
- 9 But now that you have come to know God, or rather to be known by God, how is it that you turn back again to the we ak and worthless elemental things, to which you desire to be enslaved all over again?

These were Gentiles who had become Christians. They were being taught that they had to keep the Law of Moses in or der to be Christians. The way I understand these verses, Paul is saying a Gentile who leaves idolatry to become a Christ ian is turning to something as weak as the idolatry he left if he begins to keep the Law as though it were necessary for hi s salvation. Paul calls the Law "weak and worthless" for making someone righteous.

ItÂ's an impossibility, isnÂ't it! The challenge (which seems to reflect your struggle Ephah) is in judging what is deemed Â"obedienceÂ". LetÂ's admit, there are numerous biblical laws you can follow without being obedient to God at all. Yo

u can do it in your own powers, and you can do it for faulty reasons – such as the older brother in the parable. And her e lÂ'm not merely speaking theoretically, lÂ'm speaking from a personal awareness.

Praise God for Galatians – such as 5:16-18 which helps set this issue straight! But even here, I realize one may ima gine they are following the Spirit when they are following their own "spirit". But conversely, one might judge another as "doing their own thing" when they are truthfully following the Spirit (many great saints have been accused of that).

In a sense we merely work ourselves into a futile frenzy when we try to dissect another personÂ's motives or their degre e of obedience Â- even our own. After all, even if you and I are doing okay, God may very well be calling us to a costlier obedience. And God doesnÂ't give you or me that call for another person. He gives that person the call directly Â- by his Spirit. And if one does not have the Spirit because they have not been born from above Â- then what good is it to fi II the void by merely trying to follow manageable commandments (as one understands them)? Now that doesn't make sense, does it!?

There are two general uses to the word, Law:

- 1) a principle
- 2) a command

Law can refer to a generalization based on a recurring fact or event  $\hat{A}$ – like the law of thermodynamics. God set natural laws in motion. But God also set in motion laws that apply to ourselves spiritually  $\hat{A}$ – and determine our relationship with him and one another. Here $\hat{A}$ 's an example:

"The only thing that counts is faith expressing itself through LOVE." Gal. 5:6 This law is based on ChristÂ's death and resurrection. It determines how we follow the commands – like this:

"You, my brothers and sisters, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the flesh; rather, serve one another humbly in LOVE. 14 For the entire law is fulfilled in keeping this one command: "LOVE your neighbor as yourself." 15 If you bite and devour each other, watch out or you will be destroyed by each other.

HereÂ's another law of God - BOTH as a command and as a law of nature (the spiritual nature, that is):

Å"So I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh. Gal. 5:16

The following verse is law too. ItÂ's a predictable principle- the certain outcome of obedience to the one grand, glorious law which is repeated over and over in scripture, and in all kinds of ways Â- including the fourth comm andments (which Hebrews lifts out of the shadows: Entering GodÂ's rest).

Â"But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, 23 gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law.Â" Gal. 5:22

There you have it! If these nine signs of obedience (life in the Spirit) are not present, then it will do no good to a pply the letter of the law to improve people.  $It\hat{A}$ 's better to go back to the foundational laws  $\hat{A}$ — that is the princip les set in motion through Christ $\hat{A}$ 's death and resurrection:

Â"Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. 25 Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit.Â"

And the outcome is LOVE: love for God, others, and ourselves Â- the grand commandment of God.
