The Charismatic movement; God's blessing and gifts without Repentance., on: 2012/5/30 9:47

In the mid 1960's, a strange phenomena swept the World. Roman Catholics began to speak in tongues. Large extra-church meetings were charged with sweeping worship in other tongues. It seemed pervasive, and in America, it took hold from coast to coast.

The "Charismatic" revival was born. Charismatic simply means "Gifts of Grace", and speaking in other tongues is one of them. Out of this movement the great TV ministries were born; TBN, and CBN the foremost, publicizing in real time this exciting force.

Everyone was accepted, and this was the first time in church History that EXPERIENCE was the fulcrum of orthodox acceptance. EXPERIENCE TRUMPED HOLY DOCTRINE. If you spoke with other tongues, you were accepted into the brotherhood of Christ Jesus. The Pentecostal churches had backed themselves into a corner by proclaiming that Speaking in tongues was THE sign that you were of the one and only true gospel, and could not backtrack; Everyone was "IN" who did.

One Pentecostal leader, quipped; "What the Church held sacred for 1900 years, HOLY DOCTRINE, was annihilated in one generation, by the Charismatic Ecumenical Renewal!"; which is generally simply understood as The Charismatic Movement.

Ecumenical means that all religions lead to the same God; Allah is Jehovah is Buddha is Hindu is Mormon; Rick Warren's gospel. There are some in Roman Catholic bondage who did "Come out of Her!", and clung to the Word, as Luther and company....but many, many did not, and ideologically accepted never-the-less as a valid arm of the holy Church of Christ.

Hagin says:

Many Word of Faith teachers have sought to emphasize the full meaning of the believer's status as a child of God (through Christ) by using phrases such as "little gods" to describe them, a practice that has garnered some criticism from some other segments of the Christian community.

Kenneth Hagin wrote that God "made us in the same class of being that he is himself," and that the believer is "called Christ" because "that's who we are, we're Christ!"

According to Hagin, by being "born again", the believer becomes "as much an incarnation as Jesus of Nazareth". Hagin like Kenyon reasons that that humans are made in God's image. Since God is spirit, then humans must essentially be spirit as well and 'in God's class', and thereby 'gods'.

Kenneth Copeland says Adam was "not a little like God ... not almost like God ...", and has told believers that "You don't

have a God in you. You are one." ..".Wiki.."

This attack has cost possibly tens of millions their souls, and yet today does it reap. The prophetic movement, a gaggle of liars, the Apostles and just plain old money grubbing liars have emerged to clean up, providing sensationalism and the Experience of the exciting experiences of THE GIFTS OF GRACE.

There may be a faulty assumption. The Charismatic Movement was not established in tongues as initial evidence. That would be classic Pentecostal teaching. The early Charismatic leaders tended to rather reject the doctrine of initial evidence although they accepted tongues as a gift. Men like Dennis Bennett innovated further by expressing the baptism as a "release" of the Holy Spirit; a teaching that many (especially Catholics) bought into. It is this stream that seems to have born questionable fruit. But this was never true Pentecostal teaching. A good example of the gold standard of Pentecostal doctrine can be found in the articles written by William Durham in his Pentecostal Testimony (1910-1913) available on the web.

We know that God does not hear sinners; but if anyone is God- fearing and does His will, He hears him. Since the beginning of time it has never been heard that anyone opened the eyes of a person born blind. If this man were not from God, He could do nothing. They answered him, you were born entirely in sins, and are you teaching us? So they put him out.

Jesus heard that they had put him out, and finding him, He said, Do you believe in the Son of Man? He answered, Who is He, Lord, that I may believe in Him? Jesus said to him, You have both seen Him, and He is the one who is talking with you. And he said, Lord, I believe. And he worshiped Him. And Jesus said, For judgment I came into this world, so that those who do not see may see, and that those who see may become blind. Those of the Pharisees who were with Him heard these things and said to Him, We are not blind too, are we? Jesus said to them, If you were blind, you would have no sin; but since you say, We see, your sin remains.

All the miracles of Jesus had two purposes according to this Scripture above. They are both revelations:

The first was to reveal judgment of God to men. The blind man had done nothing wrong. Yet he was blind. In restoring his sight Jesus showed that God is a just God. Before this miracle the blind in sight were simply blind without hope or understanding. The Pharisees taught that illness and blindness, as well as misfortune were evidence of sin. They burdened their hearers with the belief that their sicknesses were proof of their sinfulness. This is what today's "healers" teach! On the one hand they say "I have a ministry of healings" and when men don't get healed they say "your sin has robbed you of faith to believe". This is the Lord's meaning of being a Pharisee. Burdening other men rather than judging rightly. Healing is an evidence of God's judgement in Christ own body. This judgement is the only basis for healing others.

The second revelation given in this Scripture above has to do with the "revealing" that Jesus was divine. To the Pharisees this healing should have given them all the proof they needed that this Jesus was indeed the Christ of God. Only Jesus Himself and those He empowered could heal men of their affliction ahead of the cross. After the cross, healing is on the same basis, but it is realised after true repentance. If miracles replace true repentance then you have what we see today. Only the Son of God could forgive sins and heal men of their weaknesses and afflictions. The Pharisees DID understand this because when Jesus forgave men their sins and healed them, they accused Him of blasphemy. Being like God.

The word which Jesus spoke in contrast was to Peter "the word of Life" became to the Pharisees a hidden thing. Jesus

s began speaking in parables in order to hide this Word from the Pharisees, because in knowing who Christ was, yet they accused Him of labouring in the power and authority of Satan. It is only after this blasphemy of the Holy Spirit that the keys of the Kingdom of Heaven are given. These keys are the preaching of the gospel unto life, and baptism, which is burial unto resurrection and the walking in newness of life.

What constitutes a Pharisee today may be more subtle than we imagine. It may not simply be a walking about in public places to be seen. It may be a burdening other men with the grievous knowledge of sin; yet without lifting a finger to bear the burden. Or it may be a failure to come to true repentance so that we are able to bear one another's sins, in love. The mercy of God for this man was not only that he was once blind, and could see. It was that having been blind of sight he was able to see Jesus and hearing the words "Do you believe in the Son of Man? He answered, Who is He, Lord, that I may believe in Him? Jesus said to him, You have both seen Him, and He is the one who is talking with you." Thereby he worshiped the Son of Man: even Christ.

In contrast the Pharisees asked "are we blind also" to which Jesus answered "If you were blind, you would have no sin; but since you say, We see, your sin remains".

Your summary concerning the misuse/abuse of heavenly gifts is undeniable.

Moreover, it points to an increasing urgency for Christians needing a better scriptural understanding about, for instance, speaking in tongues and related gifts of the Spirit.

You will note that between the list of genealogies in Genesis 10 and that of Shem's descendents in the second half of chapter 11, there is a rather surprisingly story about the building of the Tower of Babel and its confusion of tongues. A famous archaeologist once said the following about the Tower of Babel: "The story in Genesis 11 would not present any difficulties for us if it ended at verse 5". Of course, this was because verses 6-9 can only be understood with knowledge and insight into the Kingdom of Heaven.

The second age of mankind began when the descendants of Noah left the highlands of Armenia, (Mount Ararat), and descended from the East via Persia to the Plain of Shinar. This region became the second land which comprised the origin of the nations. By settling there, the people refused to obey God's instruction to spread across the earth and they began to build a city with a tower, the top of which was said to reach up into 'heaven'.

They met in a city which was to become their religious centre. The Tower of Babel was intended to be the great meeting place where man could satisfy his spiritual longings and work his way up higher into the spiritual world. The tower became a religious monument and a place of pilgrimage by which man made a name for himself not only on earth but also in heaven.

Archaeologists have discovered the ruins of at least thirty three of these terraced towers in ancient Babylonia. Nearly all these "high temples" had seven storeys. At one point, the king of Babel, Nabopolassar, the father of Nebuchadnezzar, gave orders for the following text (among others) to be recorded in cuneiform writing on clay tablets: "Marduk, the lord, ordered me to rebuild Etemenanki, the multi-storey tower of Babel, which had fallen into ruins before my time, to fasten its

foundations in the heart of the underworld and to make it as high as the heaven. I forced all the people of many nations to work on the building of Etemenanki and the exalted dwelling of my lord, Marduk, I built right at the top"

The multi-storey tower was a heavenly ladder; in the language of the Sumerians, Babel (bab-ilu) means "Gate of God". Jacob later also saw a ladder in his dream and called the place where he had slept "gate of heaven" (Genesis 28:17). The narrator in Genesis 11, however, translated the word 'Babel' from the Hebrew word 'balal' which means 'confuse' or 'mix up'. The tower of Babel, therefore, was not a city tower; certainly not a lighthouse tower. It was a tower which we might compare to what we know today as cathedral spires which reach high up into the sky portraying man's search for the spiritual world.

With the Tower of Babel we are introduced to a second instance of the Fall of mankind. In this instance the Fall was caused by occultism by which man prematurely sought to satisfy his deep inner longing to enter into the Kingdom of Heaven

Some might ask the question: Did not God plant a curiosity about eternity in every man? The answer of course, is yes. But God never intended that this need was to be satisfied by through the occult practices found in Babylon. Moreover, it was not yet God's appointed time to address the spiritual development of man. Man was preparing to unveil the mysteries of the Kingdom of Heaven, but the way there was not yet open. Consequently, man inadvertently came into contact with evil angels. When man attempted to enter the heavenly places through occult means, he unwittingly descended into the spiritual realm/kingdom of death. It could be said that he laid a foundation of faith "in the heart of the underworld", that is, in the pit.

The world population, which had one tongue and one language, had found a means of communication between earth and heaven through spiritism and, later, through other occult practices. Their religion was soon supported by a wisdom which was not "such as comes from above, but is earthly, unspiritual and devilish", (James 3:15).

While the Bible records that Eve was brought into temptation, the people who built the Tower of Babel were activated by their own irresistible desire to penetrate the dark regions of the unseen world. Afterwards, man sought fellowship with the spirits of dead people and through that paganism and idolatry began taking shape. The people were misled because it was not their dead relatives or friends who began to speak; rather it was the demons. Not surprisingly, the unwise heart of the people of Babel became darkened.

The people of Babylon transferred their vision from the heavenly regions to the earth and gave visible form to this vision. This was counterfeit to a later incident when the Lord gave orders for a tabernacle to be built according to the vision given to Moses from the Kingdom of God.

For instance, the people of Babylon said, "Come, let us make bricks and burn them thoroughly. And they had brick for stone and bitumen for mortar". The brick and bitumen were symbols of the deceitful philosophy which they taught and against which the Apostle Paul so often warned.

Brick and bitumen are materials which are a poor substitute for the gold, diamonds and precious stones which are mentioned for the building of the city of God in Revelation 21:18-21. This portrayed their spiritual vision which was contrary to the truth that Jesus Christ is the foundation through Whom we can learn to understand the mysteries of the Kingdom of Heaven.

There were also priests who systematically noted down and classified their knowledge of the heavenly realms and passed this on to the generations to come - the magicians, the enchanters, the Chaldeans and the astrologers, (Daniel 4:7).

The time was to come when our Lord would say to a semi heathen Samaritan woman: "Believe me, the hour is coming when neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem will you worship the Father. But the hour is coming and now is, when the true worshippers will worship the Father in spirit and in truth, for such the Father seeks to worship Him. God is spirit and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth", John 4:21-24).

It was in Babel that religious man entered the heavenly regions for the first time in history. But it was from 'elsewhere' and not after the plan and purposes of God. So, it's not surprising that the Lord had to search for a faithful obedient man and eventually found what He sought in Abraham.

Abraham lived at the end of the period of Genesis 11, in South Babylonia, in the city of Ur, where there was also an occult

ult Tower which was dedicated to Sin and Ningal. Abraham left this religious center "For he looked forward to the city which has foundations, whose builder and maker is God!", (Hebrews 11:10), "But as it is, they desire a better country that is, a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God for He has prepared for them a city", (Hebrews 11:16).

God Himself builds the city and Abraham's seed builds the temple, the City of God in the spiritual world, that is the Church. It can be said of this heavenly Jerusalem that Jesus Christ gathers His people together there as a hen gathers her brood under her wings. Therefore, the earthly Babel is therefore in opposition to the plan of God for the salvation and restoration of man.

After the Fall of Man in the Garden of Eden, God barred the entrance to the Kingdom of God. Adam and Eve were driven away from their meeting place with God at the Tree of Life, where they ate and drank at His table in His Kingdom. After this, there was no possibility of a man developing through a process of metamorphosis into a true spiritual person.

Man had now to wait for the coming of Christ Jesus Who would unlock the "narrow gate" of Heaven. He would open the way for many to enter through the preaching of the gospel of the Kingdom of Heaven.

It is good for Christians to know the background to the story of the building of the tower of Babel and the confusion of tongues in the light of the gospel of the Kingdom of Heaven. With the building of the Tower of Babel, the great schism and confusion which had begun in the heavenly places was now able to influence the inhabitants of the earth. Man was conducting an attachment for the first time with the evil spiritual world and with the fallen angels who had origin there.

In Mark 3:26 the Lord said, "If Satan has risen up against himself and is divided, he cannot stand, but is coming to an end". The evil spirits are united only in their opposition to God and mankind. They bring their discord to everyone with whom they have fellowship and to all who open the door to their inspiration. They are guided by spirits who are now at work in the sons of disobedience.

So, now we also know now why it is that evil people dislike one another. For instance, the example of Herod and Pilate, who were enemies but became friends in one day through their aversion to the Son of Man. While each evil angel has a purpose of its own, the holy angels all cherish the same godly thoughts. Therefore, those who insist to be guided by evil spirits are compelled to admit, "We have turned every one to our own way", (Isaiah 53:6).

The fact that the kingdom of darkness still exists and is so powerful is because Satan rules over his angels with force. He is full of violence, (Ezekiel 28:16). This is also true of the princes of the fallen angels, each of whom has his own area. The same truth applies to their warriors who fight against the city of God and who "March, each on his own way", (Joel 2:7b). It is the same for them as is for an earthly army: the soldiers are forced to march in time and are ordered to perform violent deeds.

The Bible says that in the final war against the beloved city and the camp of the saints and, therefore, against the heavenly Jerusalem and the Church, Gog and Magog will perish in a struggle between themselves. Then every man's sword "Will be against his brother". This can also be compared with the victory of Jehoshaphat over the Moabites and Ammonites who, in their fight against Jerusalem, "All helped to destroy one another", (2 Chron 20:23). When Paul stood before the High Council he made good use of their differences when he called out, "I am on trial because of the hope and resurrection of the dead", (Acts 23:6). Paul knew that this was a bone of contention among them.

At the end of the Millennium, Satan will still be able to mislead people but will no longer be able to use force, for he will have had to relinquish his power and throne to the Beast that comes up from the pit. After the Battle of Armageddon, this devilish power will be thrown into the Lake of Fire, together with the Antichrist.

It then becomes possible for Satan to be bound for a thousand years because he will also have lost the power of death, (Acts 2:14). However, I should hasten to add that when Satan is let loose again, he will still be able to mislead people but he will no longer have the power to control his mutinous troops.

Originally, mankind had only one language and one tongue. For God "Made from one, every nation of men to live on all the face of the earth", (Acts 17:26).

Don't you find it remarkable that the same sort of confusion did not occur in the animal world: dogs bark but do not moo like cows or roar like lions?

The language barrier which came about after the building of the tower of Babel separated the people and now continues to remain a great problem in the preaching of the gospel. However, God created in each person the ability to learn to speak several languages. With much practice and perseverance the natural man can develop this ability to speak another language.

When a person enters the heavenly places this ability to speak another language begins to work spontaneously in him. This is why Paul wrote that he spoke the language of men and angels. He did this when he was in the spirit. However, in the Church he spoke the normal language that everyone knew.

Therefore, speaking in Tongues is something spiritual. It is of no use at all on earth because "who speaks in a Tongue speaks not to men but to God; for no one understands him, but he utters mysteries in the Spirit", (1Cor 14:2). When we speak in Tongues we are not addressing people but we are letting our voices be heard on high.

It is possible, of course, that a listener recognises the spoken language, just as at Pentecost. After all, a New Covenant Christian does not rise above his earthly constraints by natural methods but by spiritual means - by the Glossolalia which he has at his disposal at any desired moment. Equipped with this gift, he can converse and communicate in the New Jerusalem and can even use it during his activities in the heavenly places.

The spiritual world is a multilingual creation. We know that angels are spiritual beings which were each individually created as fully developed, (Ezekiel 28:13). The high princes among the angels each have their own language territory which is limited by the language which God has given them. In the infinite space of the heavenly places, each group of angels proclaimed in their own tongue the greatness of the Creator.

This is why we read in Job 38:7 about "The morning stars sang together and all the sons of God shouted for joy". The morning stars or the sons of God are the princes among the angels. They stand before the throne of God, (Job 1:6; 2:1; Luke 1:19). When people become "sons of God", then they are not sons of God on the earth but in heavenly places where they stand before the throne of God and of the Lamb.

Written by a young believer:

Dear Brian

Billy Smith asked the question "what was the evidence of a believer having received the Holy Spirit." He answered the question himself by saying "it is the gift of tongues". He said "that a believer could not know that they had received the baptism of the Holy Spirit except by speaking in tongues." Yet it seems to me that Paul when asking the rhetorical question "all do not speak with tongues do they?" made it implicit that all do not speak in tongues, even as "all are not apostles are they? (1 Corinthians 12:29-30).

Concerning the baptism of the Holy Spirit, there are more gifts than speaking in tongues. There is the gift of interpretation of tongues as well the gift of prophecy. Does a person who prophecies not do so by the same Spirit? It is true that speaking in tongues is an evidence of the baptism of the Holy Spirit. But it is not an evidence required by the church as though to test everyone who so seeks to be baptised. Rather it is evidence which results from the exercise of a true gift. If there is any testing to be done it is the testing of content and not the gift itself.

The reason why I object to this kind of reasoning is because the one hearing such words are in danger of entering into bondage because they are no longer free to receive from God as He wills, according to 1 Corinthians 12:11. Such bondage may also cause a believer to lie against the Holy Ghost, in that they simply utter noises out of fear of being rejected by men and God. For the one who is receiving ministry, if tongues are the only evidence of baptism in the Holy Spirit, then there is no freedom for that person. Likewise for the one who babbles in the desperate hope that it may be tongues, not only lies against the Holy Ghost, but in their consciences they carry about knowledge of doubt which can and does lead to fear and thereby even greater bondage.

I am personally in no doubt as to where this teaching comes from, because the fruit is evident thereof. It is a doctrine which divides the saints because they cannot agree together about it, and crushes saints because some are left burdened by doubt and fear, wondering why they are not so blessed. In the face of such brash assurances by men of God, who in other ways show great knowledge and wisdom, the poor in spirit remain poor.

You have brought out many of the excesses of the Charismatic Renewal, and I think that it is only right to present the move of God that took place at this time.

For one thing, many Catholics were saved as a result of this move of God. It wasn't all about speaking in tongues and the gifts of the Spirit, but it was about Jesus being lifted up. I have to admit that what you have said is true, because many groups made it about tongues and the gifts, and this took priority over a Christ centered gospel.

I came to the Lord as a result of a Charismatic Catholic prayer meeting in 1972. There was a priest there that was sharing Jesus, and it was through what He was sharing that the Holy Spirit brought me to a place of repentance and I was born again. Yes, the gifts were in operation during these prayer meetings, but those Catholic people including myself that were truly saved fell in love with Jesus.

In the late 60's and early 70'S the Full Gospel Businessmen had meetings and these men would give testimonies about being radically saved. These testimonies resulted in the salvation of many people that would not normally attend any church.

The Jesus movement was also taking place at this time and many young people were being saved and delivered from drugs. This was the Woodstock generation that was being delivered from the counterfeit to find that Jesus is the only answer, the way, the truth, and the life. I was one of those young people, and I can tell you this, that we didn't sit around spending all of our time seeking the gifts, we sought the Lord. Thank-you AbideinHim. You are right, there was a lot of good that came out of that time. I too was saved in that time, in the Jesus People Revival. I had a powerful Baptism of the Holy Spirit occur on a street corner, in 1972. I have known many friends who were former Catholics who were saved in the revival, as yourself.

But, there was a revival within a revival so to speak, and both seeds grew up together. One was a tare seed, one the holy grain.

What I am addressing here, is not those who came out of Mystery Babylon to cling to the Lord, but those who remained and were endorsed AS part of the holy body, because they manifested a particular gift; speaking with other tongues. The difference can be subtle.

This led to a breakdown in what holy Doctrine really was, ending up in heresy. Billy Graham, Campus crusade for Christ and Youth with a Mission ALL refer their Catholic converts back to the Roman Church and the Pope to disciple them. Do you condone this? Should this practice alone in the folds of Protestantism not be confronted?, and condemned?

It always find it interesting when any of us think we have the entire picture on a topic or history.

This thread is a great example of hyper generalization based on isolated incidents, in my humble opinion.

Full Disclosure - I am what would be considered "Spirit Filled/ Charismatic/Pentecostal" ,or something within that framework, as I have received the baptism of the Holy Spirit, pray in tongues and exercise several of the Gifts of the Spirit as He wills.

Another way to consider the Charismatic Renewal is this.... the "Pentecostals" had the feeling that they were the only ones embracing the Full Gospel message (and largely were) and that the mainline denominations were twice dead, plucked up by the root and finished. They believed they were pretty much all that God was doing on the earth. They believed that the Holy Spirit was simply working within their box..... then a peculiar thing happened... The Holy spirit jumped out of their box and started making His own box by His own designs. He would not be contained within the Pentecostals box.

It was found that although there may not have been a lot of them there were still God fearing born again remnants in the Methodist, Presbyterian, Lutheran, and even at times a few Episcopal churches! Again, I think to be fair they would have to be called a remnant as they were still the decided minority... but they were a born again remnant that had been praying for God to visit their churches and revive them from deadness... and He mercifully did for many of them!

There have been some quotes in previous posts on this thread about a few specific persons that I know from first hand account (I was actually there) those quotes are untrue. Hagin's quotes in particular are not accurate at all as to the implied meaning... again, nothing is cited so only those of us who know where to look know they are false.. others just swallow that false accusation hook, line, and deception. The ladies own mother (grandmother of the children) and her own sister(the children's aunt) did this. It is not isolated. Many folks have been told they are "dead" to the family for coming out of the Catholic Church and worshipping with us.. a "Spirit Filled Protestant" fellowship. They no longer can go to Christmas dinner at their folks house or Thanksgiving at aunt Jennie's... they are no longer welcome. I get it... oh believe me, I do understand it.

That being said...I also had an grandmotherly secretary for a few years. She was in her early 60's and widely admired in the community with her husband for their christian testimony of many years. A few of the Catholic people asked if they would lead them through a verse by verse study of the Bible.. in particular The Gospels..AT THE CATHOLIC CHURCH! The catholics said they didn't want, "A doctrine or your particular beliefs... just go through the Bible verse by verse, book by book together". They agreed and did so for the next 5 years..IN THE CATHOLIC CHURCH! They pulled no punches...they dealt with being born again ,, Spirit filled, trusting in faith not works (Galatians was a great book there!). As a result

many of those catholics came to faith in Christ as opposed to their "works salvation", had a born again experience, were filled with the Holy Spirit and developed lives of character, holiness and devotion to Christ.

Some of them have chosen to stay in the Catholic Church almost as "missionaries" if you will. They speak the truth in love and share truth at the available opportunities. Why in the world would I tell them to leave?!?!? They are being light in a dark place. The sick need the doctor.. not the well. I see no error in telling them to win as many in that place as they can. If I wasn't well known in the community I would do so as well. To win sinners you have to go where they are! Well.... I can tell you that the Catholic Church is full of people trusting in the eucharist (communion) to save them.. confessional to save them... or eating fish on Friday instead of red meat to save them. Not to many.. although a few well placed agents from God are.. trust in Christ and His blood by faith. Yep.. if you want to be a witness to those who are in "religion" as opposed to relationship with Christ then the catholic church is prime ground to evangelize in.

I know there are folks in many catholic Churches.. they would even call themselves Catholic...that are certainly in a place of repenting of sin, placing faith in Christ, having been born again, and received the baptism of the Holy Spirit... and yeah, when they received that experience they spoke in tongues... and still pray in tongues to this very day.

There is also the issue about "tongues". I can write a small outline of the scriptural times it occurs if it is helpful. However, in brief there are 5 examples of people being baptized in the Holy spirit in scripture. In EVERY SINGLE ONE of those instances it states specifically that they spoke in tongues or that there was an immediate physical sign that was so impressive that it was clearly known by the natural senses. Tongues is the only sign given as a way of knowing someone had received the baptism of the Holy Spirit in scripture. Peter himself shares that tongues it is how he knew people had received the gift of the Holy Spirit. In scriptural accounts of Holy Spirit baptisms EVERY SINGLE TIME it appears that tongues was immediately evidenced and taken as proof of one having received it. Other than tongues there is no initial and immediate evidence listed in scripture at all to verify that one has received the baptism of the Holy Spirit. I know that rocks a few folks boats... but I can certainly write a brief outline that clearly shows that to be the truth from a scriptural perspective.

We then have a dilemma....what of folks that seem to have possibly received the baptism of the Holy Spirit, speak in tongues, and yet are in the Catholic Church... a few options there...

1. They are truly born again and have found faith in Christ in spite of where they are attending "church". They have also received the legitimate baptism of the Holy Spirit. (As I said earlier... I know several of these that are there to be a light). They are few in number... but they are there.
2. They are simply making it up mentally or soulically.
3. They are yielding to demon entities. Perhaps on purpose.. perhaps by ignorance.
4. In short...it is either God, themselves, or the demons.

The key is this. You, and I, can not make an accurate judgement of another's salvation unless we have had time near them to see the fruit up close and personal over time. You can't say all the Catholics are not legit... I know some who are. They are missionaries in that world. You should just as well say that the missionaries in Pakistan are not authentic or they would "come out of her". They do not come out because they are called to be light there and not abandon those people to the darkness.

Ken Hagin, I can say with first hand knowledge, did not pray with anyone to receive the baptism of the Holy Spirit unless they could first give a clear testimony to their repentance from sin and faith in Christ resulting in a salvation experience. That was also how he trained other ministers.

Same advice today. You can not judge entire people groups. You are not God and do not have the ability to see all men's hearts and condition before Him. However, if we are good leaders we will clarify their personal standing before God and then pray accordingly. If there are those God is placing as "spiritual special agents, and time bombs" inside the darkness of "religion" then I want them to have all the power they can get! It is very simple. The legitimate baptism of the Holy Spirit only falls on those who are truly born again and ask Him for it. If they are not born again it is not the real deal. However, you, and I, can not judge a group's status with God. He may have 1000's of covert prayer warriors in their midst praying down the strongholds they are under. God forbid you, or I, be caught saying those folks are not His children and are full of demons and idolatry.

In a sermon preached six months ago and circulated widely on cassette tapes, New York pastor David Wilkerson blasts prosperity doctrines, "holy laughter", and the flamboyance of Evangelist Benny Hinn.

In Wilkerson's April 11 sermon titled "Reproach of the Solemn Assembly", Wilkerson warned his 7,000 member Times Square Church to burn books written by any propagators of these doctrines. He also told his parishioners to stay away from Evangelist Rodney Howard-Browne's Good News New York crusades that ran from July 7 to August 14...

In his sermon, Wilkerson leveled blasphemy charges at the prosperity doctrine of Bible Teacher Kenneth Copeland with one mention of Word-Faith preacher Kenneth Hagin Sr. "It's an American Gospel invented and spread by rich, American evangelists and pastors," Wilkerson said.

Wilkerson described how one of the speakers at a Copeland conference bragged about owning a \$15,000 dog, a \$32,000 ring and was selling his 8,000-square-foot house to buy a larger home. Wilkerson says he takes issue with the notion that "the Holy Spirit cannot be poured out until you first are in the money flow."

Wilkerson also attacked manifestations common to modern revivals: "I weep when I see these videos that are sent to me from all over the country. Whole groups of bodies jerking out of control, falling on the floor, laughing hysterically, staggering around like drunkards ... Anything that cannot be found in Scripture has to be rejected outright -- totally rejected," Wilkerson said.

He (Wilkerson) listed Benny Hinn and Rodney Howard-Browne as examples of those who have perpetrated misrepresentations of the Holy Spirit's manifestations..."

I did not check this thread out until now because I always felt like I would be the odd one on this issue.

Based on other posts here, I would like to share an observation of what has happened among many Mennonites.

When the charismatic movement 'hit' many fell for it, "hook, line and sinker". Others viewed it with caution but embraced parts of it. Even we were taken in with their literature, mainly the magazine "New Wine". Derek Prince, Bob Mumford, ? Simpson, and others (among them Don Bashan), were its primary promoters/writers. They printed articles by others who toed their theological line. There was a lot of good in it but we never did go to any of their meetings. Somehow it never worked out for us to do so.

Some people we knew embraced it wholeheartedly. Where are they today? They have all apostatized, embrace a relative theology/doctrine, are ignorant of Bible doctrine. Experience trumps Biblical directives. Worldliness has overwhelmed their churches where there is no difference between them and the other liberal churches in their neighborhoods. The only difference between them is the Mennonites are strong on helping the poor, assisting the victims of natural disasters.

We do believe the gifts of the spirit are still operational today but they are just that: gifts. They are not entitlements, just g

ifts. They are given to the church to edify. What masquerades as gifts of the Holy Spirit are little more than deceiving spirits. These spirits look so attractive, so appealing. To speak out against these trends will invite the scorn of their supporters.

This apostasy follows on the heels of great evangelists like Andrew Jantzi, George R. Brunk, II and others. Not only this, we have been educated by great Bible teachers. Ern Baxter, Derek Prince, Bob Mumford, Don Bashan, and Charles Simpson

It began when four well-known Charismatic teachers, Bob Mumford, Derek Prince, Charles Simpson, and Don Basham, responded to a moral failure in a charismatic ministry in South Florida. Witnessing this failure, the four men felt mutually vulnerable without greater accountability structures in their lives.

They also felt the charismatic movement was becoming individualistic and subjective. These realizations, led them to mutually submit their lives and ministries to one another. Ern Baxter* was later added to the core leadership of the group, and they became known as the "Fort Lauderdale Five."

Their relationships, and the doctrines which they began to emphasize in support and definition of these relationships, gained wide approval, as they addressed a strongly felt three-fold need of many in the burgeoning charismatic movement: greater accountability, stronger character development, and deeper relationships. Other Charismatic ministers and some Pentecostal began to submit to the authority of the Ft. Lauderdale Five. The vertical, descending, "chain-of-command" the five ministers were successful in establishing —

"was a pyramid-shaped, multi-tiered organizational structure, which had at the top echelon of the pyramid (it just so happened) none other than the Fab Five themselves, who claimed (conveniently) to be in "submission" to each other, which arrangement, they purported, acted as a fail-safe "checks and balance" system to totally preclude them from falling prey to the corruptive properties of absolute power to which, historically, so many others (albeit, less spiritual than they, of course) succumbed."

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group, and they became known as the "Fort Lauderdale Five."

"A less known sixth associate was John Poole. Together these individuals formed the organization that would be 'the center of one of the most violent controversies (i.e., the Discipleship/Shepherding controversy) in Protestant charismatic history,' Christian Growth Ministries (CGM), headquartered in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida."

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The nightmare began, in which I too had a personal handle on. It very nearly cost me my soul, and it did many others. I was deeply involved in the shepherding movement, in the early to mid 70s and it was filled with pride, and submission to men as unto the Lord, but of course this was never stated.

In it you transferred your faith, tithe, and control of your life to a man, in a pyramidal system, that in effect, stole your faith away from yourself. I did so, though I did not know the immediate effects til much later.
