Kol of India

In the colonial period, the word kol acquired a pejorative connotation. It became a synonym for the savage, the lowly, tho se performing menial jobs, the militant and the aggressive. In some regions, their traditional and present-day occupation is the collecting and selling fuel of wood and leaves from forest and wage labor. They worship family deities like Birmide vi and Simoridevi, village deities, and regional deities.

Ministry Obstacles

An animistic, polytheistic worldview is an obstacle to faith in Christ, but not an insurmountable obstacle.
