sorry for my failure to update. it has been a roller coaster, most of the time downhill. My husband is stable but still needs constant hydration by IV and is not eating much. That is the next battle. He is crying out to God for healing so that he c an truly live for Christ to glorify His name and preach his word. I have been reading the Psalms to him out loud and ther e are so many promises there that God hears our humble prayers and that He answers them. It is hard to know this and still be so sick. It is also humbling to know that the Father did not choose to heal our dear Brother Jennings or Brother K enanston, both of whom lived for Christ always, unlike my husband and I who have been very worldly until a few years a go. It makes me think that I am much more unworthy than they to be blessed by God with healing. But I will continue to pray.

My husband has been confessing daily things that lay hidden in his heart, even from him. He is holding fast to 2 Cor 4:2 : "Having renounced the hidden things of shame." Having gone through this experience has given him a perspective of s in closer to that of the Father, who despises even the appearance of sin and any entanglement with the world. He has n ot been speaking much lately other than to pray.

Please pray that God will raise him up healthy and strong to lead our family in Christ and to serve Christ with all his heart, all his soul, all his mind, and all his strength. Thank you all for praying. I am sorry I have not updated more regularly. I have been soooo busy. We came home from the hospital last Saturday. Fortunately, we were able to come home with a service that offers IV fluids and pain managament via a patient controlled analgesia (PCA) pump at home, so my husband has not detriorated as he did other times. The kids are glad to have me home (finally!!!) as well as to be abe to see their Dad. He isvery weak. Still not eating, but he is drinking freshly exracted vegetable juices three times a day. That is great progress. He is still fighting nausea. I a m praying for a remedy to that.

We have him camped out in our living room, since our bedrooms are upstairs and there is no way he could walk up or d own the stairs. He can barely make the effort to move around in bed to adjust himself. It is frustrating to him to be so w eak.

He had a new feeling yesterday that concerned me. Twice he had a pain in his chest which felt also like a burning sensa tion. This could be his heart or his stomach. He said it took away all his energy to deal with the pain. Eventually the pain goes away. Please also keep this in your prayers.

It is amazing how similar my husband's illness is to my Dad's-who just passed away in August. They have said the same e things and had the same complaints. Having taken care of my Dad has prepared me somewhat to take care of my hu sband, although my husband is a lot sicker than my Dad ever was.

Fiat: When I first read your post I thought you did not understand my husband's situation. But now I think maybe you un derstand it better than many. I keep weeping about him because it APPEARS to me that he does not make the effort to make himself better. I know that I am not the one who is sick, so I don't know what he is feeling, but every time I suggest he drink something he just says I don't understand or he makes a face at me. It seems that he is just letting himself die, and is content to just let me watch him do it. I may be judging him incorrectly, but that is just how I feel.

He will not let me push him (I am just his wife!- he has always been like that). He has a friend that can make him do thin gs that I can't, but he is unable to come to see him until Wed. I am not sure my husband will be alert enough on Wed. to even listen. (It is also possible that this friend will not come; he offered to come last Friday and was unable to make it).

Somehow I think that if it was me on that bed that I would do whatever it took to get out of it, for my children's sake. He is so confident (and rightly so) that God will take care of us, that I don't think he considers that we need him.

Again, I am speaking from what I perceive externally. He does not speak much anymore so I don't really know what he is thinking.

You posted, on Oct 20th on your other thread:

The results of the biopsy and the bone scan have come back. My husband has been diagnosed with adenocarcinoma in its most aggressive form. There is also some cancer already spread to his ribs and perhaps the femur. You may remem ber that the PET scan showed also all the abdominal lymph nodes already with cancer.

This is a diagnosis of death. However, we are trusting God for His Healing hand to touch my husband. We had already d ecided we were not going accept chemotherapy because even the oncologist told us it is not going to cure him. I am res earching alternative ways of treating him, but it is be up to God if he gets healed."

I understand you are frustrated but if he does not want an offered drink, or food, you can not force him. Remember God is in control and in His wisdom, He may have removed your husband's appetite. Rereading the diagnoses it is apparent to me your husband must be in agony from the pain. It is understandable that he is not able to behave as you expect/want him to behave. You are distraught and may not understand that what you are expecting of him is not in him to give you.

"Somehow I think that if it was me on that bed that I would do whatever it took to get out of it, for my children's sake." Yo u forgot to add, God willing to that proclamation. Please do not blame your husband for not doing something that God wil I not allow him to do. You will live to regret expressing these sentiments. I forgive you. I hope you ask your husband to do so before it is too late.

You need rest, I'm sure you are overwrought and not thinking clearly, I know I most likely would be in that situation. Rem ember, your husband is not laying in bed in that condition because it is his choice. If you don't know what he is thinking, consider perhaps he is praying for strength to get through the next hour. If you have never experienced pain as he is having you can not know how it consumes a person. He is not speaking because he is exhausted from this struggle.

You may want to tell him you love him and understand he may not be able to stay with you and do not blame him for it. Worry over that can only add to his suffering.

In the meantime, I suggest you prepare for death. Talk this over with him, be honest, open, cry your eyes out if needs be , but do it! Plan his funeral - ask him what he wants done, make notes. Tell him your 'sorrys' 'I love yous' NOW. You may not have much time left. But if he recovers you did not lose anything. :-)

You said you have children...have him write out or make recordings of admonitions for his children. What trials does he expect his children to face in the future - address them and his advice on how to deal with them.

Natalie, too many people are in denial when a loved one is terminal. Doing so will enhance the grief that is sure to come once this person passes. (Trust me.) To have a hope of healing is fine, but you must also realize the Scriptures promise us that death will come to all UNLESS the LORD appears before this happens. To acknowledge that death is imminent i s not a sign of lack of faith - it is being realistic and that is there where you will find God.

Natalie, there are worse things in life then dying and that is to see your loved ones straying away from God. Now that is worse then burying a loved one who was ready to go.
