But the output is, in at least some cases, equal to ESV (which is for mal/word-for-word) or even NIV ("functional translation"/thought-for-thought). I am also jaundiced on Charisma House, the MEV publisher, for so much of their other publishing. They will publish a lot of pure mess.
