Gather into your arms all the peoples of the world, so that in your embrace we may find blessing, peace, and the fullness of our inheritance as your daughters and sons. Amen.

Isaiah 9:2-7

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darknessâ€" on them light has shined. You have multiplied the nation, you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest, as people exult when dividing plunder. For the voke of their burden, and the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor, you have broken as on the day of Midian. The Birth of Jesus

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethleh em and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us.†So they went with haste and foun d Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them a bout this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words a nd pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.
