Whether we agree with them or not, what Witness Lee says here in the current featured word on their website is true:

"The time is short. By studying the prophecies in the Bible and checking with the world situation today, we know that the day of the Lord's coming is very near and that the last week is approaching. The crucial question today is this: Do we want to bury ourselves in the world or put ourselves in the Lord's hand? We should know that once we bury ourselves in the world and become rooted in it, it will not be easy to be uprooted. In the few remaining days, we should get ourselves ready. Let us be those who love and serve the Lord, who are revived and are overcoming every day, and who let the world go and are waiting with all our heart for the Lord's coming."

Have you asked other information re the absence of a pastor? On leave, schooling probably, furlough, etc? Any idea of any leaders, deacons, or elders in substitute perhaps? Not necessarily a pastor should be there for the meeting or gathering, albeit the work and ministry is still going-on and it sounds encouraging despite w/o any pastor/s.

Our local church can still carry any Bible study, prayer meetings, Sunday service even w/o our senior and delegated pastors, let's say they are invited to another church. Our fellow deacons or elders are glad to be appointed to share the Word in their behalf. And it is a good indicator of a maturing Church.

What phrases did you hear? Is it just because they pray aloud, raise their hands, raise their voices, and the likes? How about the wordings perhaps, context? Individual local churches have their own uniqueness, no two churches are the same. You cannot discount the history, experiences, and other things that went through a local church and how they have evolved in their community. Others preferred to be charismatic, lively, or traditional, etc...

I knew there are LS Churches here in Philippines, but I don't have a clear idea about their statement of faith. Nonetheless, you can ask if they also belong or affiliated to other local ministerial groups, parachurch, or other ministerial groups, who have the same faith and understanding. Ministerial groups, sometimes do their check and balance in this way as part of local unity and community, which somehow very different from western churches. I guess you are just scouting any churches nearby and quite observing? If you belong to a local church, probably you can also ask your pastor or leader and accompany you there. Let your intention be known to the church you intend to visit. So they can give you direct answers, also as a courtesy to them.

The 2 marks of a cult are,

1. They consider themselves to be the only church.
2. They consider a book written by their leader as parallel to or even higher than Bible.

I have not personally contacted Witness Lee's group but I have heard the above 2 points are applicable to them. I have even heard that recent publications of Watchman Nee's books are altered according to Witness Lee's teachings. So all the recent editions are unreliable. If this is true then I have no doubt that they are cult.

I also have some reservations being with them: (just on my locality) I fear that

1. most of them are not really born again
2. can they go on without Watchman Nee or Witness Lee?

I talked to one leader on the phone, when I ask about salvation this is his answer (paraphrase):
quoting 1 Thessalonians 5:23

..we have spirit, body and soul, when we believe in Jesus our spirit is saved, eternally secure. Now we our soul needed to be saved (by Christ) quoting "working out our salvation with fear and trembling". and in the future our body will be resurrected again.

I then ask about the evidence of new birth because not all are truly saved even they call Jesus, Lord. He then says, that it is not for us to judge quoting from the parable of wheat and tares. Our task is to preach the gospel and pray for them. and if you have experience you will know who the true ones are.

I also said to the brother that I found their praying (monotonous intonation) and singing weird because it is spontaneous, he then said that him also at first. And he said because they want spirit led meetings and not just formality.

As I thought of it, it could be that in not wanting "formality" we can become "formality ourselves (can you get my point?).

I heard phrases as:

"Lord we empty ourselves", "eat Jesus" I fear that they just become empty words and phrases through familiarity.. but good thing it made me reflect on myself about my prayers and speaking about God to mean what I say..

I think they have a very different approach to Christianity but they are not extremist or heretics.. maybe have a more diverse emphasis.

I am not yet sure if they have healthy fellowship with other Christians/churches different from them.

But they believe that they are not the only one saved/true church. And for them there are major and minor doctrines(of which other Christians may differ)

I only speak from my experience on my locality not on the whole group..

But anyone who knows a church in Philippines(Pampanga), I would be glad to go..

I think I have better company here,

On the prophesying service, they share on what they "enjoy" on the book they are reading, compiled by Witness Lee.. on this instance they mostly talk about the typologies, pictures of Christ and the church in the old testament, but good thing someone ask, "what then is the application of this to us?". but mostly i can't relate much though I share a little. I even found some of my church mates there before! the one I leave after I've been really born-again.

When i saw many books of witness Lee on a shelf, one brother said that they don't make much of it. I think they just have an insistent practice that they don't insist?

On their view of salvation I think they are "Calvinist" though they don't call it that way..

and they don't focus much on personal salvation / holiness they have a different emphasis, like "God dwelling His people"?

They are also pre-tribulation on Rapture.

What I enjoy is their company after the service, we ate together.. have some conversations and I ask some of their belief s.. I found that they have a very detailed interpretation of the Bible but not dogmatic about it (I hope so)..

The problem that I find with all those who are trying to evaluate the witness Lee's groups is they are only interested in their theology. Theology wise the Devil even has the best theology. He knows everything about salvation. He knows the Bible in and out. So it is not the theology that they hold that will identify them as Cult or not. We will easily get deceived if we check only their theology.

The use of one man's book for all their teachings instead of relying on the Holy Spirit to give them revelation from the Bible should raise a cult alert. I am not saying this makes them a Cult, because I am not sure how much they rely on Lee's book. But if it is their primary source to interpret the Bible then I have serious concerns.

In our churches, for us to Baptize someone, they should be part of the Church for some time (at least 6 months). Without knowing someone, we are not willing to Baptize anyone. This is a Biblical stand. Baptizing someone is a serious thing, one cannot Baptize everyone just because they are visiting our Church. Even Apostle Paul was very cautious on who he Baptized (1 Cor 1:14).

I am sure someone (self appointed SI Police) will attack me for saying this, quoting how in Acts they readily Baptized anyone who has believed. But in Acts time, there was a serious persecution. One can even lose their life for getting baptized in the name of Jesus. Today such environment exists in some parts of the world. In that part, if someone wants to be baptized in the name of Jesus then immediately we can. But in the west where there is no Physical persecution for faith, anyone can take a decision to get baptized without counting the Cost. Jesus himself advised his followers to Count the Cost.

So the eagerness to Baptize someone is also a cult alert.

Mainly because of what I have heard. I have not seen it myself. I am also interested in what the Poster experiences in these local churches. The importance this movement gives to Local Churches is very similar to what I believe. But many of their activities are not.

There was a Godly brother in our fellowships in India who joined this group. Later he took few people from our fellowship as well into this group. I have nothing against him for leaving or even taking others with him, it is all for good and cleansing of fellowship. I too heard the complaints like frequent repetition of certain terms. I cannot discuss everything that I have heard in this public forum. Some of them might be subjective observation.

If they are not cults then I will be very happy for them as they are doing a work very similar to what I believe is much needed in Christendom today.

Brother,

I can share shortly my experience. I have first come to know a group of people through Bible distribution in my locality. We then had some wonderful time together and so I understood that they followed the teachings of Watchman Nee and Witness Lee. At that time there was a conference to be held and so I decided to go (I must confess hastily...).

But I spent some 2 days with them and also took part in one house meeting. There are several things that I admire: they are warm and welcoming, they sing almost constantly.

But on the other hand I had really difficulties accepting some of their practices and doctrines.

1. Yes, they do believe that once you are saved, you will never be lost (or you will have eternal life - no matter what). This is frankly unbiblical and very dangerous!
2. "Calling on the name of the Lord" - I have never understood the verse (2 Timothy 2:22; 1 Peter 1:17) as literally repeating the name of the Lord constantly. I do not believe that the first believers did it either.
3. Preaching : as you mentioned earlier there were books from Witness Lee. I am not generally against Christian books. I have read some books of Watchman Nee and can only recommend them to any believer (The Normal Christian Life, "Sit, Walk, Stand", The Overcoming Life). I truly believe that Watchman Nee was a servant of the Lord. Having said that, I think we should be very careful.

I believe that it is very important that the preacher (or elder) knows himself personally the Lord! Because if he is blind - he cannot lead other blind people (what to say about the seeing) to life or to Christ even if he has all the right theology in a book. (And that applies actually to EVERY CHURCH. So using books for preaching - we should be careful there.

The other thing that disturbs me actually more is the emphasis put on the teachings by W.Lee. And so I fear the people get indoctrinated without really knowing the Lord. ..

Personally, I find it very difficult to read the writings of W. Lee. I have tried several times and I find myself just struggling with so much words.

But I will advise you to be very careful. I can understand that you really enjoy talking with other people after the service, that is generally also good and necessary. We must always beware that the church does not turn just into social gathering! Wherever you go to church, your Number ONE PRIORITY is and should be to WORSHIP GOD! And God Himself must be pleased!

Pray and pray, continue to pray! Being a part of godly church is very important!

As for me, I still keep contact with some of them, but I do not worship with them. It will be difficult for me to do so, for the reasons above mentioned.
