I thought this observation might add something to this discussion.

Â"Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me.Â" (John 14:6, KJVS)

Biblical Greek does not need to use personal pronouns as the subject of verbs. In this it is like Spanish (and many other languages). In Spanish 'tengo' means 'I have'; the personal pronoun 'I/yo' is already built into the word. The Greek word 'eimi' means 'I am' with the personal pronoun I/egO already built into the verb. So Christ might simply have said

'eimi hE odos kai hE alEthia kai hE zOE' which would have meant "I\_am the way and the truth and the life"

However He said '

'egO eimi hE odos kai hE alEthia kai hE zOE'

This has the effect of emphasising the word 'I' and drawing all attention to the speaker. Rotherhams translation tries to capture this by punctuation; a comma after the word 'I'.

Jesus saith unto him—I, am the way, and the truth, and the life:

In our imagination we can see Him laying His hand on His breast as He speaks. The English spoken equivalent would be something like

am the way and the truth and the life.

Deleting is not really fairgame, especially when it involves a direct answer-back. However, I caught myself half expressing a view that I honestly believe was incomplete. You know 'mouth beats brain to paper senario.'

Because the information I have been studying is pretty recent, I just wanted time to verify it, but still hold the point up for scrutiny. I know how quickly threads change direction if one does not.

Just so it is not lost. I will with my best thoughts endeavour to reasonably answer-back your current question, which I might add is an extremely good one.

Anyway, how can there be a moral system of any kind, without God?

This goes to the core of Apologetics and the nature of man. The knowledge of good and evil. Whereas Paul writes: 'in Adam all died' again 'dead in our trespasses and sins' ~ however there is some question about whether Adam and Eve survived with a certain part of their nature which constituted the ability to still manifest a moral code without being in fellowship with God.

Paul seems to hint at this in Romans 1, where he talks about 'supressing the truth in ungodliness'. I have always been a oppossed in my view, but after studying and debating a fairly large number of evolutionists, I realized that the parts that deal with Natural Science in Romans 1, clearly show that God has allowed mankind to be able to practice inductive thought, the ability to extrapolate between visible and invisible, I am sorry if this does not make sense, it was hard for me in the beginning to. discusses this so well when he covers the Creation, Evolution Debate.

Now back to your question. Seriously this is something that really will have scholars and theologians turning up their toe s in disgust, it is something the Charles Finney and the Calvanists? find no point of agreement. It is to do with the ability to choose, which was/was-not taken away after Eden.

#### John 18

33 Then Pilate entered into the judgment hall again, and called Jesus, and said unto him, Art thou the King of the Jews?

- 34 Jesus answered him, Sayest thou this thing of thyself, or did others tell it thee of me?
- 35 Pilate answered, Am I a Jew? Thine own nation and the chief priests have delivered thee unto me: what hast thou do ne?
- 36 Jesus answered, My kingdom is not of this world: if my kingdom were of this world, then would my servants fight, that I should not be delivered to the Jews: but now is my kingdom not from hence.
- 37 Pilate therefore said unto him, Art thou a king then? Jesus answered, Thou sayest that I am a king. To this end was I born, and for this cause came I into the world, that I should bear witness unto the truth. Every one that is of the truth hea reth my voice.
- 38 Pilate saith unto him, What is truth? And when he had said this, he went out again unto the Jews, and saith unto the m, I find in him no fault.

The reason I've quoted the whole section is to show that Pilate was not seriously asking 'What is truth?' It wasn't a respectful question to which he hoped to learn an answer - an answer for which he then waited to hear a response from Jesu s. Jesus had mentioned truth in his last statement and Pilate picked up on it and then *scoffed* 'What is truth?' Immediat ely, not intending to receive an answer, (the great shame being that he was speaking with THE TRUTH), he walked awa y.

I'm not comfortable with *speculating* as to what Jesus might of said, apart from 'I Am', especially in the light of the preced ing exchange, in which you could say Pilate had had an extremely enlightening conversation with Jesus, where Jesus h ad been more open about His eternal agenda than his disciples had so far been able to grasp. And, Pilate recognised, in those few words, that Jesus was talking about invisible values - or so he thought.

'What is truth?' becomes a theoretical pastime, devoid of ultimate purpose, in the light of knowing Jesus already.

The only way to introduce others to 'truth' is by referring to Jesus, His words, or, living right under their noses in an irref

utable demonstration of His life.

I completely agree that discussions about meanings and comparisons of method of 'knowing' are a valuable part of bein g able to present the gospel to some people, but, please bear with my skepticism here; the knowledge of God and His S on Jesus Christ is not beyond a child of less than average intelligence or health. We all should be a little careful about h ow many years of our lives we give to mastering these avenues of human learning, since it may be, simply, a matter of t he seeker finding the Door and walking though it, to sup with the One in whom resides all the treasures of wisdom and k nowledge - a step out of their world, into His.
