James 4 verse 7: "Submit to God. Resist the devil and he will flee from you!"

Read Psalm 149 below, especially the part about the high praise of God in our mouths and how it binds the kings with fetters. Praising the Lord with all your heart takes your attention away from circumstances and negative thought patterns and focusses them on God and Christ. His power is unleashed against the enemy of your soul and binds them from operating against you

Psalm 149

1 Praise the LORD. b

Sing to the LORD a new song,
his praise in the assembly of his faithful people.

2 Let Israel rejoice in their Maker;
let the people of Zion be glad in their King.

3 Let them praise his name with dancing
and make music to him with timbrel and harp.

4 For the LORD takes delight in his people;
he crowns the humble with victory.

5 Let his faithful people rejoice in this honor
and sing for joy on their beds.

6 May the praise of God be in their mouths
and a double-edged sword in their hands,

7 to inflict vengeance on the nations
and punishment on the peoples,

8 to bind their kings with fetters,
their nobles with shackles of iron,

9 to carry out the sentence written against themâ€”

this is the glory of all his faithful people.

Also Psalm 91 the whole Psalm. Read it out loud with faith.

1 Whoever dwells in the shelter of the Most High

will rest in the shadow of the Almighty. b

2 They say of the LORD, "He is my refuge and my fortress,
my God, in whom I trust."

3 Surely he will save you
from the fowler's snare
and from the deadly pestilence.

4 He will cover you with his feathers,
and under his wings you will find refuge;

his faithfulness will be your shield and
rampart.

5 You will not fear the terror of night,
nor the arrow that flies by day,

6 nor the pestilence that stalks in the darkness,
nor the plague that destroys at midday.

7 A thousand may fall at your side,
ten thousand at your right hand,
but it will not come near you.

8 You will only observe with your eyes
and see the punishment of the wicked.

9 If you say, "The LORD is my refuge,"
and you make the Most High your
dwelling,

10 no harm will overtake you,
no disaster will come near your tent.

11 For he will command his angels concerning
you

to guard you in all your ways;

12 they will lift you up in their hands,
so that you will not strike your foot

you will trample the great lion and the

15 They will call on me, and I will answer them;
I will be with them in trouble,
I will deliver them and honor them.

16 With long life I will satisfy them
and show them my salvation."
