Unfortunately, it is a tourist destination where few people are interested in considering the eternal con dition of their souls. It is a bit like evangelizing at Bunyan's town of "Vanity Fair."

So, over the last few years, I've spent some time (particularly on holidays) at the Golden Gate Bridge. It is a "suicide des tination" for many people. In fact, an average of nearly one person per week jumps to their death from the bridge. While t

here are plenty of tourists (from all over the world), I find that there are plenty of people suffering from sorrow and depre ssion too.

I think that broken people contemplating death are more receptive to the power and love of God. They might have tried e verything to find happiness or joy in life -- except for God. In addition, I enjoy introducing Christ to people who might travel from overseas.

I wrote up a simple half page message with Scripture and point out that I am not representing any particular church. On holidays, tape a candy cane to it. I mention that Jesus is the Good Shepherd -- a shepherd of our souls who loves his sh eep (including those who are lost or strayed).

Of course, I usually speak to officers for permission. They see it as a "suicide prevention" option and often actually thank me for it. I've had some deep spiritual conversations there and have even prayed with people.

Yeah, I used to do a lot of homeless ministry and found that they were a lot more open to he aring the gospel than those who are better off. At the Santa Monica Pier there are a lot of tourists from all over the world as well. Down the street from there there's also the Santa Monica Promenade which also is a big tourist attraction. But I' ve found that at the Promenade they are more closed to the gospel than at the Pier, maybe because at the Promenade t hey are more focused on shopping as opposed to just hanging out and having a good time. At the Pier there are a lot of rich people coming through there but you also get a lot of locals who don't have that much comparatively, and there are a few homeless people there as well. So we pretty much get it all at the Pier and get plenty of opportunities to share Chri st. Today went great by God's grace, though I guess you could say not as "eventful" as at other times.
