For the past few years, our ministry has endorsed and worked very closely with another ministry called The Great News Network (GNN). Many of you first learned about GNN through our website, one of our newsletters, or on our radio progr am. We know that some of you are members of GNN and will therefore be greatly saddened by the following announce ment. Please know that we share in that sadness, and thank you in advance for your gracious understanding.

Due to growing concerns involving the direction of The Great News Network, the leadership of Living Waters Publication s and The Way of the Master has decided to withdraw our ministryÂ's endorsement of GNN. These serious concerns we re greatly compounded by a recent letter issued by the NetworkÂ's founder, entitled: Â"Warning! A Storm is Coming!Â" Our ministry strongly disagrees with both the severe tone of the letter and the disturbing ministerial philosophy engender ed therein. Living Waters and The Way of the Master will no longer be working in conjunction with GNN in ministry outre ach efforts, nor will we be recommending GNN to the friends and supporters of our ministry. We greatly regret this recent t measure, but feel that it is most necessary for the good of our ministry and all those involved.

We sincerely value your faithful prayers in the days and weeks ahead. We are truly appreciative of your sacrifice of love as you continue to labor with us for the furtherance of the gospel.

I am wondering if also at times we run the risk of having folk who have no sense of any authority at all. One of the great debates of our times deals with authority in the churches.
