For example, I looked up some with names like: *Doris verrucosa*, *Doris sticta*/ and *Doris montereyensis* (I can't pronounce the last one either :-P) This family all look quite like each other so they are all called Doris. Then there are others with different "surnames".

This naming system is for all living things, plants and animals. Most dogs are called Canis (as in canine). The wolf is *Canis lupus*, the dog is *Canis domestica* (=domesticated), although most think they are actually the same species because dogs and wolves can interbreed freely.

You will know that they call us *Homo sapiens*, and imagine that there are other "Homos" that we've evolved from.
