I believe this is the portion in question:

is the difference between twentieth century preaching and the preaching of John Wesley. Wesley was a preacher of righteousness that exalted the holiness of God. When he would exalt the holiness of God, and the law of God, and the righteousness of God, and the justice of God, and the wisdom of His requirements! And the justice of his wrath and his anger! Another way to search for words is to push "ctrl" + "F" and if you use IE a little window will come up and you can use it to find the words you're looking for. If you use Firefox, use the same keys and a bar will come up on the bottom, type the words you want to find and it will bring you to the place you're looking for.
