1. His native tongue was Welsh, that was the language of the revivial of 1904-05.
2. The recorded voice is Scottish.

I will try and get the recording of Evan Roberts Voice from a friend of mine who had a copy. I will share it with SI as soon as possible.

"The National Screen and Sound Archive of Wales in Aberystwyth, says it is the only recording of Evan Roberts.

A wax cylinder that contained the recording in 1905 was brought back to life by an expert in Los Angeles. "

This is a cut from the BBC page.

I heard the recording of the wax cylinder at the Revival Wales Conference in 2004. It was the centenary celebration. A museum of memorabilia was set up for the conference in the School Room.

The center piece was the recording of Mr Roberts voice.

The voice was that of Evan Roberts urging the congregation to sing. He was speaking in his native tongue which is Welsh. The whole of the revival was conducted in the Welsh Tongue.

We hold our prayer meetings there at every Revival conference. I believe my good friend Dyfrig, an Elder at Moriah, still holds a Monday afternoon prayer meeting in the School room.

It looks like I will have to retrieve the original recording for SI.
