About 3 years into my walk as a believer, I was struggling with the notion of man's total depravity. One day as I have de scribed in other posts, I was convicted by these words from my pastor, "If it is in the Bible I believe it." That day marked a milestone in my walk. The Holy Scriptures began to open up to me in a way that had not been clear before.

Now I must step back in time 20 years or so. When I was 17, my family began to experience financial difficulty. I saw the hopes of my father shattered when the steel mill shutdown in 1974. He had believed in the American dream. He was raised a coal miner. He enlisted into the Army at the age of 16. He fought in the Pacific near the end of WW2. Then my father was captured in the Korean Conflict. After the Korean conflict, he came back to begin working for Bethlehem Steel. He worked hard for 22 years. Then the end of his hope came. This time produced in me a bitterness, even at the age of 17 to 18 years old.

For the next 25 years I held that bitterness. At about the time I looked to Jesus to be my Lord and Savior, I began to stu dy political economics. It was not something any of my friends had a desire to discuss. Yet I had a passion for the subject. I was searching for the answers for why the American dream for many people was disappearing. I was studying the subject of the Cold War and the policies that were formulated by the NSA and CIA. Certain policy was put into place to combat the spread of Communism during the earlies 1950's. This could be a long post if I were to go into detail. So I will now go forward to the 1980's.

During the 1980's President Regan ramped up the war against Communism. The government took on huge debt to fina nce a military build up. Programs like Star Wars were initiated. When asked who was responsible for the idea of Star W ars, the public was told that President Regan came up with the idea.

In conjuction with this build up also came a wave of laws that were passed to protect American industry from foreign competition. President Regan signed more bills during his time than all the presidents that preceded him from the time of Eisinhower to Carter combined. American industry was suffering mightily during the 80's. The the Regan adminstration sought to protect them from the competition from abroad.

Please have patience. The Cold War strategy that was instituted in the 1950's was having a negative impact on Americ an industry by the 1970's. The Regan administration had to finish the Communist threat. As we all know they were succ essful.

One day as I was studing these two policies of the Regan administration, it seemed to me as a hopeless pursuit. God at that time had given me a passion for His word. The voice I heard that day brought understanding and peace to me. All at once I understood that man in his total depravity, brings suffering into the world. I had struggled for years to find the justice that was owed my family because the American dream had been lost. Now the idea of man's depravity gave me peace. All at once I understood there is no hope for the world and it's values. There is no hope in the rule of men. God gave me peace by showing me where men erone ously place their hope in. Once this understanding came to me, the bitterness of 25 years disappeared. Now I understood that it is a futile thing to put your hope in man.

As a side note, in December of 1989, three Communist countries declared that they would hold democratic elections. T hat same month the Japanese stock market peaked about 36000. Now 15 years later, it is a third of that former value. I would like to quote from an article in the Bakersfield Californian, May 14, 2004.

Title: United States had strong postwar ties with Nazis, released documents show.

The American government worked closely with Nazi war criminals and collaborators, allowing many to live in the United States after WW2, and paying others who worked for West Germany's secret service, according to declassified docume nts from the FBI, CIA and other intelligence agencies released Thursday.

The disclosures came as part of a project to place more than 8 million government documents in the public domain, under legislation passed by Congress in 1998 to create the Nazi War Crimes and Japanese Imperial government Records Inte ragency Working Group.

The article continues:

Goda and other historians who studied the documents said that at least 5 associates of the Nazi leader Adolf Eichmann, each of whom had significant role in Hitler's effort to exterminate Jews, had worked for the CIA. The records also indicat e that the CIA tried to recruit another two dozen war criminals or Nazi collaborators. Some of them received employmen t and in two cases, US citizenship, according to documents. The documents did not deal with those who concealed their Nazis pasts in order to gain entry to the United States.

The article continues, Timothy J. Naftali, an intelligence historian at the University of Virginia who examined the docume nts and who also wrote chapters in the book on intelligence and Nazis, said, "We had no policies for helping Gestapo m embers, no disqualifiers unless the public knew about the crimes. It was kind of a "Don't ask, don't tell culture."

In future posts I hope to shed some additional light on the relationships between this time in history and the fruit of what we see happening today.

The United States at the turn of the last century had experienced the growth of we alth which was mainly held by those who defined that period in history. It was the time of the Robber Barrons. All economic systems, (remember the doctrine of total depravity), fall short of the glory of God. The abuses of Capitalism at the turn of the century, proved no different. We as Christians spend quite a bit of effort to define words like justification, sanctification, and eternal security. In like manner, the world, especially in this last century has restled with words like Communism, Capitalism, Democracy, Nazism, and Fascism. These words represent the struggles of men. Blood has been spilled to promote each of these concepts men adhere themselves too.

During the period between the WW1 and WW2, all of these precepts of men came into direct opposition to one another. Nazism, Fascism, and Capitalism formed one side and Democracy and Communism the other. Now you may at first rebel with what I say, please have patience. Again focus on the thought of right of ownership. Nazism, Fascism, and Capitalism promote the power of a few over the majority. There are differences between each of these concepts. Yet the unifying precept among these forms of government are based on ownership. Nazism and Fascism sought to conquer the world. Capitalism is no different. The means of conquering may manifest themselves as being different yet the results are the same.

True Communism and Direct Democracy are one and the same precept. The Greeks practiced Democracy back before the incarnation of Christ. Edmund Burke wrote of Aristotle's thoughts: "I cannot help concurring that an absolute demo cracy, no more than an absolute monarchy, is not to be reckoned among the legitimate forms of government. They think it rather the corruption and degeneracy than the sound constitution of a republic."

Burke's agreement with Aristotle is in reference to the fact that Aristotle called democracy one of three "evil" forms of go vernment (the other two: ochlocracy and tyranny)."

On the other hand we have Democracy and Communism. Believe it or not Karl Marx based the precepts of Communism on Democracy.

"The word democracy originates from the Greek "demos" meaning "the people" and "kratein" meaning "to rule" or "the people to rule" which meant literally: "Rule by the People." The term is also sometimes used as a measurement of how much influence a people has over their government, as in how much democracy exists. Anarchism and Communism (as in the final stage of social development according to Marxist theory) are social systems that employ a form of direct democracy, but have no state.'

In a true democracy, one vote for every person, the interests of the majority would come to bear on all who live within this form of government. The right of ownership will follow the dictates of the majority for its own benefit. Again remember, man is totally depraved and is under the sway of the evil one.

So we have two opposing systems. Now again returning to the events prior to WW2, the right of rule and thus ownership were in direct conflict. Men like Henry Ford of Ford Motor Company, A.P. Sloan of General Motors, Watson of IBM, he lped Adolf Hitler and Nazism to gain power in Germany. Sloan and Ford actually went to Germany to recieve a medal of accomendation for their efforts in supporting Hitler's rise to power. Why did these American's support Hitler? They were commonly yoked together against the growing threat of rule by the people. Communism, labor unions, and the thought that the common man could come together to usurp the rights of the few was a real threat to the ruling class.

The owners in America, the industrialist actually formed a group to discuss how the United States and Germany would divide up the world after Germany's conquest of Europe was complete. This group met officially until the bombing of Pearl Harbor.

Here is a little story about the things that James warned us about. Yes it exists in the USA.

SAN FRANCISCO (Reuters) - When garment worker Lupe Hernandez had a needle shoot through her finger, she chos e to bandage it and continue sewing with her other hand out of fear that she might lose wages or even her job if she step ped away.

Hernandez, 29, has often worked in Los Angeles-area factories with no running water or bathrooms during her 12 years in the industry. A typical day lasted 11 or 12 hours without paid overtime or paid breaks, she said.

Yet even as many low-paying jobs in the U.S. garment industry move abroad, sweatshops still flourish in the Los Angel es area because of the large number of youth-oriented fashion retailers in Southern California, workers' rights groups sa y.

These companies rely on manufacturers and contractors that often operate as sweatshops -- many within sight of the gl earning glass skyscrapers of downtown Los Angeles -- to deliver finished products quickly to keep up with a fickle youth market, the labor groups say.

"There is a need to change fashions quickly," said Julie Su, an attorney with the Asian Pacific Legal Center. "There is something very appealing about local, domestic production."

Labor groups call Los Angeles the U.S. sweatshop capital and estimated that tens of thousands of workers are stuck in such factories because they lack the skills and often the legal status to find other jobs.

Many are recent immigrants, and Hernandez's situation is typical.

"You can take a break, but you don't earn enough," Hernandez said in Spanish during a recent interview at a factory in the Los Angeles garment district located just south of the city's financial center. "They don't ask for papers, and you don't need much experience."

Attention in recent years has focused on sweatshops outside the United States. In May, for example, Gap Inc. issued a report that acknowledged numerous violations -- from forced labor to physical punishment -- at its overseas factories.

Yet holding U.S.-based sweatshops accountable is difficult. Su said factories where workers are denied wages, physical ly abused or subjected to unsafe conditions simply shut down when facing fines and reopen in another location under a different name.

CRACKING DOWN

These sweatshops are very mobile, fly-by-night operations," said Joann Lo, lead organizer of the Garment Workers Center. "They just close up shop to avoid fines."

But the Los Angeles-based organization and other groups are trying to crack down on abuses with lawsuits targeting ret ailers that -- knowingly or unknowingly -- use contract manufacturers that produce goods under sweatshop conditions.

This has helped the Garment Workers Center win more than \$1.4 million in judgments from retailers, manufacturers and contractors on behalf of workers since opening three years ago, Lo said.

Specifically, the groups have used a California law that allows them to hold retailers liable if a contractor or subcontract or where the abuses took place closes up shop.

In recent months, retailers like Bebe Stores Inc. and Wet Seal Inc. have settled lawsuits charging wage and overtime ab uses.

Details of Bebe's settlement were not made public, while Wet Seal's new chief executive, Peter Whitford, has vowed to use only manufacturers and contractors that treat workers fairly and pay a decent wage.

Ilse Metchek, executive director of the California Fashion Association trade group, acknowledged a "significant" underground sewing operation exists in the Los Angeles area, the hub of California's \$30 billion garment industry.

But she said workers' rights groups have chased easier-to-regulate big manufacturers out of state and unfairly targeted retailers with deep pockets.

"The bigger the shop, the less the problem," Metchek said. "They go after the names that are really trying to do the best job they can possibly do."

Workers agree that small factories pose the biggest problems. During a walk through a warehouse in the Los Angeles g arment district, Hernandez pointed out dozens of operations that she called sweatshops on different floors.

Spanish-language postings offering work lined the walls, and groups of men loaded large rolls of uncut fabric into batter ed vans. Bundles of finished T-shirts, tops and other products lay on tables as workers hovered over sewing machines in cramped rooms where many windows remained closed even on a hot day.

Hernandez and other sweatshop workers like Catalina Martinez later said they have turned to the Garment Workers Ce nter to try to improve working conditions at their jobs.

Martinez, who said she has seen employers hit workers for complaining, is learning English and computer skills in hope s of finding another job.

"I would like people to be more interested about the people who are making their clothes," she said, "and to educate the mselves about how their clothes are being made."

Traders can be heard manipulating the market, using now-infamous schemes with names like death star, ricochet and fa t boy.

One employee is heard asking, "You want to do some fat boys or, or whatever, man, you know, take advantage of it."

In fat boy, Enron traders used fake power sales to hide megawatts, shrinking the supply of energy and driving up prices. They also used the oldest trick in the book: lies.

"It's called lies. It's all how well you can weave these lies together, Shari, alright, so," an employee is heard saying.

The other employee says, "I feel like I'm being corrupted now."

The first employee adds, "No, this is marketing,"

"OK."

The tapes could affect dozens of cases already filed against the company by California Attorney General Bill Lockyer.

"If these are ever heard by a jury, they're going get strung up," says Lockyer.

After hearing the tapes, the state's two U.S. senators demanded an immediate \$8.9 billion refund.

At a recent hearing Sen. Barbara Boxer, D-Calif. said, "All I can tell you is you have to listen to what's happening out the re to ordinary people who you are responsible to help through this."

With Enron and other major energy companies in bankruptcy, big refunds are unlikely. But the tapes could provide the e

vidence states and cities need to break contracts they were forced to sign at the height of the energy crisis."

"The coup in which General Augusto Pinochet seized power in 1973 was the bloodiest in 20th century South America.

More than 3,000 were killed in the September military onslaught, which began when fighter jets bombed the Presidential Palace while the democratically elected President, Salvador Allende, was still inside.

It was the start of a 17-year rule by General Pinochet. But the bloodshed did not stop there.

The general looked fearsome and talked tough. He promised wholesale reform of the political system which had allowed the annual rate of inflation to reach 150% in 1973.

No time was wasted. The military government dissolved Congress, suspended the constitution and opposition parties w ere outlawed. Shortly after came a night-time curfew and strict limits on the media.

Economic reform came in the shape of free-market principles. Nationalised companies were returned to their original ow ners, trade barriers were cut to encourage foreign imports and there was renewed emphasis on exports.

General Pinochet had once articulated his goal as "to make Chile not a nation of proletarians, but a nation of entreprene urs".

Chilean society had been split by Allende's socialist rule, and so it was under the new right-wing leader. But with Pinoch et in charge dissidents spoke out at their peril.

The general's iron rule was underpinned by the tactics of brutal repression that saw thousands die and thousands more f lee into exile. Others disappeared or were tortured. Many still respect Pinochet as a patriot.

Particular targets were those who threatened unrest in the workplace and the shantytown dwellers who demanded bette r living conditions.

In the absence of any official political opposition, the Roman Catholic Church assumed the role of moral critic.

In 1976 the Pinochet regime's anti-democratic tactics were glimpsed by the wider world when a former Allende ambassa dor to the US was killed by a car bomb in Washington DC.

There was little doubt that the murder was linked to the government in Santiago but attempts by the Americans to extrad ite the accused members of the Chilean military were reportedly rebuffed.

Ten years later General Pinochet himself was the target of an assassination attempt, by the armed wing of the Communi st Party. The dictator, however, escaped the attack on his motorcade with a few minor injuries. When in 1990 he steppe d down, it was due to his own miscalculation. He gambled his one-man rule on a plebiscite and lost.

The general was down but not out. The constitution he had been instrumental in drawing up guaranteed his continuation as army commander-in-chief until 1998.

He has ensured the armed forces remain largely outside the control of the government - a condition that has made it difficult to bring the military to book for past human rights offences."

Chile coup pleased Kissinger, Nixon

Newly released tapes raise questions about what role U.S. may have played, by Neil Lewis NY Times News Service

Five days after a bloody coup on Sept. 11, 1973, that toppled Salvador Allende, the Marxist leader of Chile, Henry Kissin ger chatted on the phone with President Richard Nixon about the event, which clearly had delighted both men.

After telling the president that he might go to the season opener for the Washington Redskins, Kissinger exulted in the to ppling of a pro-communist government and complained about how much the news media was lementing the event. The press's attitude, he said, was steeped in "unbelievable filthy hypocrisy."

The conversation is part of a 20,000 page cache of transcripts of Kissinger's telephone conversations while he served as national security adviser and secretary of state that was released this week by the National Archives...

...The conversation with Nixon about the coup in Chile will probably add to the debate about Washington's role in that event. Kissinger has long maintained, both in congressional testimony and his memoirs, that the United States had no direct role in the coup but only sought to protect private enterprise in the country.

In 1973 conversation, Kissinger tells the president that "of course the newspapers are bleeding because a pro-communi st government has been overthrown."

Nixon responds; "Isn't that something." To which Kissinger says that he and the president would have been hailed as he roes during "the Eisenhower period" of the mid-1950's. He complains that instead they are criticized for tolerating the ap arthied regime in South Africa.

WASHINGTON (CNN) -- Laura Bush, the wife of President-elect George W. Bush, said Friday she believes the country could do more to minimize the number of abortions, but also indicated she doesn't believe the 1973 Supreme Court rulin g legalizing abortions should be overturned.

"No, I don't think it should be overturned," Mrs. Bush told NBC's "Today Show" when asked about the high court's decisi on, Roe vs. Wade.

Mrs. Bush did not respond in the interview when asked if a woman had a right to an abortion. Instead, she said the count ry should do "what we can to limit the number of abortions, to try to reduce the number of abortions in a lot of ways, and that is, by talking about responsibility with girls and boys, by teaching abstinence, having abstinence classes everywhere in schools and in churches and in Sunday school," she replied.

"I agree with my husband that we should try to reduce the number of abortions in our country by doing all those things," she said.

The Bush team refused to comment on the first lady-to-be's statements.

Ari Fleischer, Bush's designated press secretary, said he would not discuss the "personal views" of the president-elect's family.

During the presidential campaign, Bush did not push for a constitutional amendment to ban abortion, even though he su pports one except in cases of rape or incest, or to protect the life of the mother. Bush said he didn't believe there was en ough public support for such a move.

Mrs. Bush said the country should do "what we can to limit the number of abortions" but that Roe v. Wade shouldn't be overturned

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In January 2000, Bush said he thought that Roe vs. Wade "was a reach" and that it "overstepped constitutional bounds."

Noelia Rodriguez, Mrs. Bush's press secretary, said that Mrs. Bush's position on abortion is that there should be educati on on issues, such as abstinence and responsible behavior, to reduce the number of abortions, and only when pressed, did she answer the question on the landmark Roe vs. Wade ruling.

When asked if Mrs. Bush supports a woman's right to choose, Rodriguez said, "She already addressed the question."

"Everything Mrs. Bush wants said on this topic has been said," Rodriguez added.

Later Friday in an interview on CNN, Mrs. Bush said she intends to use her position as first lady to put a focus on educat ion.

"I will take a high profile, at least a high interest, in education issues. I think education is the most important issue in our country," said Mrs. Bush, who earned her masters degree in library science and taught school from 1968-77.

Education is "the great equalizer," she said. "It's the one way that every single person has a chance to succeed."

Speaking with CNN's Wolf Blitzer, Mrs. Bush said she never imagined when she married Bush that he would rise to the highest position in the land.

Not only that, but she said she "would have never guessed then that his dad would have become vice president or president."

"People use to say, Do you think George will get back into politics?' and I'd joke, 'Maybe when we're 50.' And as it turned out, we were pretty close to 50 when he ran for governor."

Here is a story from the BBC. Are the nations of this era like those of old who sacrificed their babies to Moloch?

"A new type of ultrasound scan has produced the vivid pictures of a 12 week-old foetus "walking" in the womb.

The new images also show foetuses apparently yawning and rubbing its eyes.

The scans, pioneered by Professor Stuart Campbell at London's Create Health Clinic, are much more detailed than conventional ultrasound.

Professor Campbell has previously released images of unborn babies appearing to smile.

He has compiled a book of the images called Watch Me Grow.

Conventional ultrasound, usually offered to mothers at 12 and 20 weeks, produces 2D images of the developing foetus.

These are very useful for helping doctors to measure and assess the growth of the foetus, but convey very little informati on about behaviour.

Professor Campbell has perfected a technique which not only produces detailed 3D images, but records foetal moveme nt in real time.

He says his work has been able to show for the first time that the unborn baby engages in complex behaviour from an early stage of its development.

Professor Campbell told the BBC: "This is a new science for understanding and mapping out the behaviour of the baby.

"Maybe in the future it will help us understand and diagnose genetic disease, maybe even conditions like cerebral palsy which puzzles the medical profession as to why it occurs."

The images have shown:

From 12 weeks, unborn babies can stretch, kick and leap around the womb - well before the mother can feel movement

From 18 weeks, they can open their eyes although most doctors thought eyelids were fused until 26 weeks

From 26 weeks, they appear to exhibit a whole range of typical baby behaviour and moods, including scratching, smiling, crying, hiccoughing, and sucking.

Until recently it was thought that smiling did not start until six weeks after birth.

An hour long session using the new technology, which is not yet available on the NHS, costs £275."

Getting back to the time of post WW 2.

In a previous article:

"One of the main weapons in Hitler's Nazi organization was the use of manipulating the perceptions of the population. This was the first large scale use of propaganda. The Nazi called it; Weltanshauungkrieg. This word can be translated; world view warefare."

Following the WW 2, the United States found that it could not go back to the ways of isolationism. The Cold War intensified during this post war period. There were sporadic military interventions conducted by the Soviet and U.S. However, the main battle was waged in the way of propaganda campaigns. Civis Romanus sum--"I am a Roman citizen"--was the highest possible self-definition, a source of pride, and an aspiration for many. Eventually granted even to those not of Roman birth, the **exaulted status** of the Roman citizen was an expression of **cultural superiority** that justified the imperial power's sense of mission. It not only legitimated Rome's rule, but it also inclined those subject to it to **desire assimilation** and inclusion in the imperial structure. **Cultural superiority**, taken for granted by the rulers and conceded by the subjugated, thus reinforces imperial power."

Paul gives us a glimpse into this phenomena, when he choose to claim the rights of being a Roman citizen. These right s afforded him a level of treatment not held by the masses around him.

The appeal or the pull of belonging to something such as the thought of a superior culture causes blindness to the truth. The Nazi's proclaimed that they were the superior race. The Jews of Jesus' time on earth fell for basically the same rea son. They prided themselves in the fact that they shared in the genealogy of the twelve tribes of Jacob.

Laffer is perhaps best known for the "Laffer Curve" adopted in large degree by the Reagan administration. The story go es that Laffer drew the curve on the back of a napkin at a Washington, D.C., restaurant for a couple of administration big wigs, and the rest is history...

The summary of the call promotes the idea that the dollar's slike is about over, rates are generally where they should be (ten-year Treasury, short-term will increase) and the Fed is correctly managing the money supply. Break out your sungl asses.

Given the magnitude of the current bubbles, the damage will likely translate into a total collapse of the U.S. financial system. In short, andy economy based on ever-expanding credit is doomed in the long-term. The size of the bubble dictates the following pain. Jud ging by the current bubbles, the coming pain will be unprecedented. The Great Depression of the 1930's will be mild in comparison."

Ken Gerbino's recent essay, "The Fed Can't Stop Inflation," points out: "Starting in 2000, the U.S. has created \$1.5 trilli on new dollars (M2), and has cumulative trade deficit of \$1.6 trillion...

Crystal clear is the evidence that post-2000, the massive amounts of money supply and debt growth has produced an a nemic economy.

What has been produced is the universe's biggest real estate bubble. Investors hold stocks and bonds in this environm ent, but why? For exercise, simply imagine the economic performance during the past four-plus years without the curre ncy debsement and credit growth.

I'm reminded here of Howard Ruff's line that inflation is not rising prices, it's falling money. We are privy to this phenom enon via the daily drama of oil prices. China, India, terrorists, we're running out, refinery capacity, etc., etc. confront us d aily as to why oil is high, and rising. The fact of the matter is that that's hardly the point. The simple reality is that the Fe d is monetizing oil by its continued excess money growth. Inflation is being institutionalized, before your very eyes....

I close with a quote from John K. Galbraith's 1955 work, The Great Crash: 1929; "Even in such a time of madness as the late twenties, a great many men on Wall Street remained quite sane. But they also remained very quiet. The sense of responsibility in the financial community for the community as a whole is not small. It is nearly nil. Perhaps this is inhere nt. In a community where the primary concern is making money, one of the necessary rules is to live and let live. To speak out against madness may be to ruin those who succumbed to it. So the wise in Wall Street are nearly always silent. The foolish thus have the field to themselves."

Despite stricter enforcement and greater protection for victims, human traffickers continue to smuggle in thousands of fo reigners from poor countries to work as slaves in brothels, homes, factories and farm fields in the United States, witness es told a Senate Judiciary subcommittee Wednesday.

"Americans may be particularly alarmed to learn that at least 15,000 human beings are trafficked into lives of slavery in the United States each year," said Sen. John Cornyn, R-Texas, who chaired the hearing. He said some estimates put the figure as high as 50,000 a year.

Women, children and men are brought in from places as far apart as Uzbekistan and Mexico, enticed with false promise s of glamour, education or, in some cases, simply the propect of a steady pink-collar or blue-collar job. Beatings, isolation from society, threats of deportation, sexual humiliation, rape or theats of retaliation against family members in their home countries are among the tactics used to keep them from escaping.

The Justice Department's U.S. attorneys have uncovered "numerous examples of forced labor and sex slavery...from Ca lifornia to Maryland, from Hawaii to New Jersey, from Georgia to New Hampshire," Cornyn said. "The stories they tell ar e tragic, disturbing and hear-rending."

Sen. Russ Feingold of Wisconsin, the panel's ranking Democrat, said those cases include "forced farm labor, domestic s ervitude, sweatshop labor, forced prostitution, construction work, restaurant work, or adoption."

"Many companies, particularly in the high-tech industry, have railed against a current Financial Accounting Standards Bo

ard (FASB) proposal to account for employee stock options as expenses because it would increase the reported cost of these options and make their financial results appear worse. FASB isn't in the business of outcome-based decisions, but Congress sure as heck is. So the House, perhaps noting after the accounting scandals of the past decade and in the fac e of disgust over exploding executive compensation, recognizes that some further tightening of the rules is perhaps inevitable.

As Buffett notes, though, what the House bill has in mind is simply bizarre. It accepts the fact that options are compensat ion and, therefore, should be expensed, but then it comes up with the gimmick that companies must only expense for the five highest-paid executive officers at each company. Further, the pricing mechanism that the House bill proposes to be used is one that assumes that the price of the underlying stock never fluctuates.

Great. Show me the company stock that never fluctuates. Everything fluctuates. Buffett's verdict: "A for imagination... flat -out F for logic."

And just so his point isn't lost in the inevitable recriminations of the "he doesn't know how it works" or "he's just jealous" crowd, Buffett notes that his position on accounting for options has fealty from the following: all seven members of FASB, all four of the big accounting firms, and legions of investment professionals (I'm sure he was including me in that asses sment. I'm just sure of it.).

That House members wish to ignore the voices of these folks who know a thing or two about accounting (the standard s etters as well as the largest, most knowledgeable consumers thereof) is simply frightening. There is a good reason that FASB is an independent group not beholden to political interests: because it can make decisions for the benefit of the polity of accounting consumers without consideration of the special interests.

The tone Warren Buffett uses in this editorial is a little more acid than I've seen in the past. He notes the silliness of coun ting only the top five execs' bonuses as expenses, then also notes that if Congress wishes to take on the roll as the chief scorekeeper for accounting that it had better clean up the hash of its own financial reporting. He noted that current stand ards allowed managers to "lie." Not "fudge," not "adjust," not "adopt looser accounting standards." Lie.'

On our way back from Mexico, as we crossed the border, we were met with a shocking reality. A fence seperates the two countries. One is poor and the other is rich. As we entered the San Deigo area we were surrounded by the prosperity that has so permeated our lives. We have come to expect nothing but the best, the best buildings, the best food, the best schools, etc. We really know very little of the living conditions that exist throughout the rest of the world. We know very little of the struggles of our fellow brothers and sisters in Christ. We know very little of the joy that they have in Christ.

We know very little of the joys of fellowship because we have allowed ourselves to be encumbered by the pursuits for w hich men strive for. These encumberances dilute our prayer life, they dilute our time of meditation. These encumberances make us hard of hearing, and near sighted.

Brother Robert speaks to this from another thread:

The Key to Laying Aside Your WeightsÂ...

Hebrews 12:1 teaches us that there are weights that serve as an encumbrance in our spiritual lives, and sins also t hat easily beset us. The word beset could have been translated as compete. The Scripture would then readÂ...the sin th at does easily compete against us. The sense of the meaning is that there is a sin that easily competes against us and p revails. Key in on the word EASILY. There are sins that come against us and easily prevail against us. This ought not so to be! God has given us the keys to making that sin that easily beset us, into a sin that very RARELY if ever besets us. T hat is the context of Hebrews 12. This passage teaches us that there is a great cloud of witnesses that overcame the sin s that would have easily beset them, and the weights that would have hastened their defeat. Have you laid aside your w eights? Are you running the race to WIN! The victors of past races would be seated near the track in the ancient Greek g ames. The writer to Hebrews illudes to this. There are many that have gone before us as a testimony that God can keep us the same as He saved us.

The Destruction in the High Places

From the beginning of time mankind has sought to do or have that which is forbidden. For Israel it was the groves and t he high places. The Old Testament is literally filled with the people of God repenting and backsliding over and over agai n. Ultimately the issue was the heart of the people, but many things contributed to GodÂ's people backsliding. Much of t heir backsliding could have no doubt been prevented if the leadership had removed and kept removing the groves and t he high places. The high places were elevated or hilltop sites dedicated to the worship of pagan gods. Ancient peoples o ften built their shrines on hilltops. In Mesopotamia, where the land is flat, they built artificial mountains in the shape of ste p pyramids called Ziggurats. The Tower of Babel (Genesis 11:1-9) was probably such a Ziggurat. Most of the Old Testa ment references to high places indicate a form of pagan worship forbidden to the Israelites. But sometimes the Lord's pe ople, with His approval, worshipped Him at elevated altars. This happened between the time Shiloh was destroyed and before the ARK OF THE COVENANT was installed in Solomon's Temple. For example, Samuel blessed the offerings m ade at the high place which perhaps was Ramah, a word which itself means "high place" (1 Samuel 9:12-14). At nearby Gibeon there was a high place. During the reign of David the Tabernacle was there (1 Chronicles 16:39; 21:29; 2 Chroni cles. 1:3-4). At this "high place" Solomon made many sacrifices, had his dream, and asked God for wisdom (1 Kings 3:4) -15). At these times GodÂ's people would seek Him at the high place, but later they would serve other gods there. Solo mon would eliminate the need for ANY high place after the building of the Temple. So in our lives after becoming the tru e Temple of the Holy Ghost, we must forsake the high places, lest we return to them to our own destruction and perditio n.

Beside of these periods in Israel's history, all high places mentioned in the Bible were off limits to God's people. In Leviti cus 26:30 God promised to destroy the high places, which He knew His people would later build. When Solomon began to backslide he established high places for his pagan wives (I Kings 11:7-8). After Solomon's death, the rebellious North ern Kingdom had its high places. The two major ones, containing golden calves, were at Dan and Bethel (I Kings 12:28-33). Then as ungodly kings came to the throne in Judah they inaugurated high places, and afterwards righteous kings a bolished them. During Rehoboam's reign high places appeared (1 Kings 14:23), but Hezekiah broke them down (II Kings 18:4). Manasseh in his wickedness built them again (II Kings 3), but righteous Josiah utterly destroyed them and burned the groves as well (II Kings 23:8). He ground the images into powder and sprinkled the ashes of them over the graves of those who worshipped them and built them. Probably nothing provoked God to anger any more than His people turning from Him- to the groves and the high places.

Casting Down the High Places

In modern times a "high place" could be a place where you go to encounter that which you used to know as a sinner; a place where God does not reign in our livesÂ...., the place where God ceases to be God in our life. Going to a high place is like telling God "time out" lÂ'm going to take a break from my calling, Christian testimony, and worst of all from your presence.

In our Christian lives we will grow no farther than our high places. Our spirituality ends where our high places begin. Go d will not tolerate other things in our lives competing for the love and devotion that belongs to Him. We cannot be as Isra el and serve God on one hand and this world on the other.

Tossing Aside the Encumbrances

"There is a pathway of stepping stones that lead to the high places in our lives. These stepping-stones form a bridge back to the world. A bridge that was once burned, but has been rebuilt. Each of those stones makes a formidable pathway that must be removed piece by piece. The sins that easily beset us are like the high places in Israel that keep us backsli ding and repenting over and over, and the anger of the Lord thoroughly kindled. We must remove the things in our lives that make us vulnerable to the sins that so easily beset us. Why should we fool ourselves into believing that we can hand le a multitude of encumbrances that make us easy prey for Satan? Why should we hand Satan the advantage against us in our lives? Among all of SatanÂ's devices, none are more successful than the stepping stones that we put in our lives as we listen to his lies. If you know it is a hindrance and is making you vulnerable-forsake it! Before it leads to you having forsaken God.

What do you keep telling yourself that you can handle? What are you 'running with' that is alloeing sin to catch and trip y ou up? Why do you allow yourself to be knocked down by certain weights weighing you down? Always keep in mind that nothing is worth sacrificing the presence of God for, our victory for, and all the moreÂ...our soul for. What would a man p rofit if he gained all the world and lost his own soul? What would a man give in exchange for his soul? Words that are so oftenÂ...just words. They have become of none effect in so many lives. Now more than ever when direct access to the world has invaded many of our own homes, we must use discernment.

The FIRST KEY to unlocking the victory in YOUR LIFE is turned when you go through your house, car, work area, and heart and begin to dispose of those things that are causing you to struggle to keep the victory. Turning the key begins w hen we realize that we cannot take fire into our bosom and not be burned. Sadly, many people know WHAT they need to get rid of but will not, because they have listened to the lie of Satan and he has stolen their desire to have victory. God forbid that we would opt for defeat when God has made provision for victory, because we loved our toys and vices more than we desired to live righteously before God."

I believe there is an evil that permeates our way of life. The promotion of self and individualism has placed a veil betwee n us and our Lord. The media saturates ever means of communication with this philosophy. How many ways do we fall victim to this philosophy of individualism? How does this self promotion affect our fellowship with our Savior, with our fell ow brothers and sisters in Christ?

In this past week I have seen a little bit of the blessedness that Jesus speaks of in the beatitudes. It looks nothing like the prosperity gospel in this nation.

"America Hosts 76 percent of Islamic Terrorist Websites by Sean Beesley

While America and the world combat terror, it appears that the terrorists and their supporters themselves are tapping into AmericaÂ's booming web hosting industry to spread their venom.

With the war on terror in full swing and terrorists scrambling to reorganize and regroup, the anonymous nature of the Int ernet has become an essential tool. As we often hear in news reports terrorists and their supporters have become more reliant on websites, message boards and chat rooms to communicate, rally supporters, and grotesquely display their bar baric acts of beheading to the world. We in the western world generally assume that these sites are set up and run in so me remote Middle Eastern country spewing their hate to the world from afar. However, the first instalment of new report by MEMRI (Middle Middle East Media Research Institute) has a shocking revelation.

The Middle East Media Research Institute has released part one of it's report on terror affiliated Websites. In a special r eport entitled Islamist Websites and Their Hosts Part I: Islamist Terror Organizations, which they state is to be the first of many reports on the topic. MEMRI has listed 25 terror affiliated or official Websites active as of July 16 2004. Based on the information shown 20 of the sites are hosted in North America, 19 in the United States and 1 in Canada. The remaining sites were from the United Kingdom, Hong Kong, Russia, United Arab Emirates, and Iran. Meaning 76 percent of the official or affiliated terror sites mentioned are hosted in the United States, while two sites or 8 percent are from the middle east. The American hosted sites include the website of Palestinian Islamic Jihad, Army of Ansar Al-Sunnah; known su pporters of Al-Qa'ida, several pro Al-Qa'ida sites including one that publishes Al-Qa'ida's Al-Battar Training Camp magaz ine, the official website of Hamas, a pro-Hizbullah weekly magazine, Al-Aqsa Martyrs Brigades, the military wing of Araf atÂ's Fatah organization, Hizbullah TV station Al-Manar, website of Palestinian Islamic Jihad Secretary General Dr. Abd allah Ramadhan Shalah., and Al-Quds Brigades, military wing of Palestinian Islamic Jihad. While the site for Izz Al-din Al-Qassam, military wing of Hamas, is hosted in Kelowna, Canada.

In general, hosting companies have general terms and conditions regarding content that they require their clients to agree to. The majority of these terms state that the dissemination of hate is prohibited. However, with a large increase in thi rd party subcontracting of hosting services and thousands of news sites emerging everyday, it is not know how widely the ese conditions are enforced. Canada Free Press is presently contacting the companies listed in the report as to their comments.

Grand Jury Steps Up Inquiry Into Possible Halliburton Ties to Iran By T. Christian Miller and Peter Wallsten Times Staff Writers

July 21, 2004

WASHINGTON — A Halliburton controversy erupted Tuesday, fueled by a grand jury investigation into whether the o il services giant violated federal sanctions by operating in Iran while Vice President Dick Cheney was running the company.

The investigation centers on Halliburton Products and Services Ltd., a subsidiary registered in the Cayman Islands and headquartered in Dubai that provided oil field services in Iran. The unit's operations in Iran included Cheney's stint as chief executive from 1995 to 2000, when he frequently urged the lifting of such sanctions.

Numerous U.S. companies operate in Iran, but under strict guidelines requiring that their subsidiaries have a foreign registry and no U.S. employees, and that they act independently of the parent company.

At issue is whether Halliburton's subsidiary met those criteria.

The Treasury Department has been investigating the matter since 2001. But Halliburton disclosed in public financial filings this week that the department had forwarded the case to the U.S. attorney in Houston for further investigation. The company said a federal grand jury had subpoenaed documents on its Iranian operations.

The Treasury Department refers such complaints only after finding evidence of "serious and willful violations" of the sa nctions law, a government official said.

Sen. Frank R. Lautenberg (D-N.J.), whose office has provided information on the case to the Treasury Department, sai d Tuesday that Halliburton Products and Services was a sham that existed only to circumvent the sanctions.

"It's unconscionable that an American company would skirt the law to help Iran generate revenues," Lautenberg told re porters during a conference call arranged by the campaign of the presumed Democratic presidential nominee, Sen. John F. Kerry of Massachusetts.

Bush campaign spokesman Steve Schmidt called the allegations against Cheney baseless, and accused Democrats o f trying to use Halliburton as a distraction. Cheney's office and the White House characterized the latest criticisms of H alliburton as political.

"The Democrats have made clear that their all-purpose strategy, no matter—the issue, whether it's healthcare or John K erry's plans to raise taxes or John—Kerry's votes against our men and women in uniform or John Kerry's proposals—to cut the intelligence budget, will be met by one word: Halliburton,"—Schmidt said. "The Kerry campaign has become increasingly flailing in their—attacks as there has been increasing focus on John Kerry's record."

Democrats have long criticized Cheney for his connections to Halliburton, hoping to link the vice president to the comp any's contracts for Iraq reconstruction and its overbilling for services in that country. Cheney has denied any connection to the contracts.

The company has repeatedly found itself at the center of government investigations.

The Securities and Exchange Commission and the Justice Department are looking into allegations that top officials in a consortium that included a Halliburton subsidiary paid millions of dollars in bribes to win contracts in Nigeria. The Justice Department is also looking into reports that Halliburton officials took \$6.3 million in kickbacks in Iraq. The Penta gon is examining whether the company overcharged U.S. taxpayers by more than \$186 million for meals never served to U.S. troops abroad.

Treasury and Justice officials declined to comment on their inquiry into the Halliburton subsidiary.

Violation of the sanctions can result in criminal charges, and those found guilty can face 10 years in prison. A company can be fined as much as \$500,000.

Lautenberg said that in the Iran case, the actions taken by the Republican-controlled
Justice and Treasury department s showed that the accusations against Cheney
were more than political.

He noted that the grand jury investigation comes amid a flurry of questions about Iran's role in terrorism against the United States.

The independent commission investigating the 2001 terrorist attacks is expected to conclude in a report due Thursday that several of the Sept. 11 hijackers passed through Iran on their way to the United States.

Lautenberg's office distributed copies of four letters from 1997 sent from a London arm of the Iranian state oil company to Halliburton Products and Services in Dubai.

The four letters, all requests for goods and services from the Halliburton subsidiary, included handwritten notations to specific individuals. Lautenberg's staff questioned whether the individuals worked for the foreign subsidiary or for a U.S. subsidiary, in violation of the sanctions.

Halliburton confirmed the authenticity of the documents, but said that two of the individuals were British citizens who had never worked for any U.S. Halliburton subsidiary.

The other two handwritten notations did not list first names of the individuals, and Halliburton said it was unable to loca te records for them.

"These documents do not suggest that any violation of the applicable regulations occurred," Halliburton spokeswoman Wendy Hall said in a statement.

Hall said Halliburton's business in Iran had not violated any sanctions, and pledged full cooperation with the governme nt's inquiry.

"It is important to understand, especially in the current political environment, that this is not a condemnation of the company, but a method of further studying the facts," Hall said of the grand jury subpoena. "We welcome a thorough review of any and all of the company's business."

The law forbids U.S. companies from doing business with countries considered by the U.S. government to be sponsor s of terrorism. The list includes Iran, North Korea, Cuba and Sudan.

An executive order signed by President Clinton in 1995 specifically prohibits U.S. firms from activities that would benefit the Iranian petroleum industry. The order accuses Iran of sponsorship of international terrorism, undermining the Middle East peace process and developing weapons of mass destruction.

Development of petroleum resources, Clinton said at the time, "would provide new funds that the Iranian government c ould use to continue its current policies."

Halliburton's Iran operations are virtually all related to oil and gas, and generated at least \$39 million in revenue last ye ar, the company said.

The policy allowing U.S. firms to indirectly operate in prohibited countries has come under increasing attack.

One leading critic is New York City Comptroller William C. Thompson Jr., a Democrat who oversees the city's pension fund. He has launched an effort to persuade Halliburton and other firms he invests in to cut all ties to countries that s ponsor terrorism.

A January report by CBS' "60 Minutes" featured Thompson and raised questions about the Halliburton subsidiary that does business in Iran.

In that report, a CBS reporter traveled to the company's Cayman Islands operations, only to find no such company ther e. Instead, the building is owned by a local bank.

A bank employee told the reporter that when mail arrived for the Halliburton subsidiary, it was forwarded directly to Ho uston.

Five years ago, we would import 20 billion dollars worth of products and services above what we e xported each month. That means as a whole, our incurred debt was about 240 billion dollars. Now the current debt spe nding record is holding at 40 billion plus per month. China is the primary recipient of our debt spending. Why is this occ uring? Corporations, seeking profits, have been allowed to use the Chinese labor force as a comodity. I have a friend w hose sister works for Toshiba computer systems. Over time the corporation has determined that this demographic is the most productive segment of the population. Corporate Library survey finds median raise for S&P 500 CEO was 22.18% in 2003.

July 28, 2004: 8:34 AM EDT

NEW YORK (CNN/Money) - The CEO's at the nation's largest companies saw their raises more than doubled in 2 003 as the median raise handed out by S&P 500 companies to their top executives was 22.18 percent, according to a st udy by The Corporate Library.

The watchdog group said that stock options and award s of restricted stock drove the larger pay hikes. But most elements of the pay -- base salary, annual bonuses, restricted stock, long-term incentive payout, value realized from stock options and total compensation -- showed increases. The on ly type of compensation not to show a gain was the value of stock option grants during the year.

"This double-digit rise in pay shows that calls for pay restraint appear to be being ignored," said the statement from the group.

Here are some thoughts according to Scripture.

John 4:1-26

Jesus taught His disciples to preach the good news of the kingdom. The beatitudes identify the nature of the work that J esusÂ' life manifests in the lives of the believer. Jesus promises an abundant life, a passionate life, a joyful life to those who seek. Jesus promises, Â"whoever drinks of the water that I shall give him will never thirst. But the water that I shall give him will become in him a fountain of water springing up into everlasting life.Â" John 4:14 Are we living a life that is parched? Are we content with living a life that does not satisfy? Let us look to how Jesus ministered to the Samaritan w omen at the well.

The Samaritan woman said to Jesus, "Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us the well, and drank from it h imself, as well as his sons and his livestock? (verse 12) Also she said, "Our fathers worshipped on this mountain…" (verse 20) Listen to the words of the Samaritan. She claims to be of the same lineage as Jesus. Yet the Jews "have no dealings with Samaritans. Why is this so? It is important that we go back in time to understand the significance of this encounter between Jesus and the Samaritan woman.

We find a short summary of the judgment God placed on the tribes of Israel. He strengthened the hand of the Assyrians to conquer the northern tribes that lived in the area of Samaria. "For the children of Israel walked in all the sins of Jero boam which he did; they did not depart from them, until the Lord removed Israel out of His sight, as He had said by all Hi s servants the prophets. So Israel was carried away from their own land to Assyria, as it is this day." 2 Kings 17:22-23 "Therefore the Lord was very angry with Israel, and removed them from His sight; there was none left but the tribe of J udah alone." Vs 18

"Then the king of Assyria brought people from Babylon, Cuthah, Ava, Hamath, and from Sepharvaim, and placed them in the cities of Samaria instead of the children of Israel; and they took possession of Samaria and dwelt in its cities. And it was so, at the beginning of their dwelling there, that they did not fear the Lord; therefore the Lord sent lions among the m; which killed some of them. So they spoke to the king of Assyria, saying, "The nations whom you have removed and placed in the cities of Samaria do not know the rituals of the God of the land; therefore He has sent lions among them, a nd indeed, they are killing them because they do not know the rituals of the God of the land." Then the king of Assyria commanded, saying, "Send there one of the priests whom you brought from there; let him go and dwell there, and let hi m teach them the rituals of the God of the land." 2 Kings 17:24-27

Let us listen to what happen in the region of Samaria. "However every nation continued to make gods of its own, and put them in the shrines on the high places which the Samaritans had made, every nation in the cities where they dwelt ...They feared the Lord, yet served their own gods-according to the rituals of the nations from among whom they were c arried awayÂ...To this day they continue practicing the former rituals; they do not fear the Lord, nor do they follow their s tatutes or their ordinances, or the law and commandment which the Lord had commanded the children of JacobÂ..." 2 Kings 17:29-34

So, coming back to the time of Jesus we can understand why the Samaritan woman claims Jacob as the father of the S amaritans. She also knows that the Messiah is coming! She says, "I know that Messiah is coming" (who is called Ch rist). "When He comes, He will tell us all things." John 4:25 Yet Jesus says to her, "You worship what you do not k now; we know what we worship, for salvation is of the Jews." John 4:22 Jesus declares that the Samaritans do not kn ow God. Their history of mixing the word of God with the gods they brought with them from Assyria, combine to mean o nly that they practiced religious rituals. There can be no satisfaction, no fulfillment, no power in a life that seeks to have one foot in this world and one foot seeking God. Jesus asserts this precept when He says to the Samaritan woman, "

Whoever drinks of this water will thirst againÂ...Â" Jesus points out to the woman, Â"for you have had five husbands, a nd the one whom you now have is not your husband, in that you spoke truly.Â" She has strived to quench her thirst. She said to herself, I will fill the void in my life with the things that a good man can give me. She failed 5 times and now tries once more.

Jesus declares He will always quench her thirst if she will only ask. "Â...Whoever drinks of the water that I shall give him will never thirst. But the water that I shall give him will become in him a fountain of water springing up into everlastin g life." He says to her, "But the hour is coming, and now is, when the true worshippers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for the Father is seeking such to worship Him. God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth."

What does it mean to worship in spirit and truth? What is Jesus really teaching here? I believe the story of the Samarita n woman and PaulÂ's letters to the Corinthian church teach us an important precept about our relationship with God. Pa ul cries out to the hearts of the Corinthians, Â"O Corinthians! We have spoken openly to you, our heart is wide open. Y ou are not restricted by us, but you are restricted by your own affections.Â" 2 Corinthians 6:12 He goes on to identify the affections which hinder the flow of water that Jesus promises. Â"For what fellowship has righteousness with lawlessness? And what communion has light with darkness? And what accord has Christ with Belial? Or what part has a believe r with an unbeliever? And what agreement has the temple of God with idols?Â" Paul points to the central problem that is keeping the Corinthians from becoming a fountain of living water. He declares that the Corinthians still hope for the same substances as the world hopes in. PaulÂ's exhortation to the congregation, Â"Therefore, Come out from among the m and be separate, says the Lord. Do not touch what is unclean. And I will receive you. I will be a Father to you, and you shall be My sons and daughters, says the Lord Almighty.Â" 2 Corinthians 6:17-18. Jesus ministers to the Samaritan woman, Â"Whoever drinks of this water will thirst again, but whoever drinks of the water I shall give him will never thirst. But the water that I shall give him will become in him a fountain of water springing up into everlasting life.Â"

Many have tried to apply PaulÂ's solution. Â"Come out from among them and be separate, says the Lord. Do not touch what is uncleanÂ...Â" Many Christians walk this earth in frustration and fear. They struggle through life without the joy of the Lord. They fear contact with the world. They hide their lamp under their bed. They make rules like the Jews who wrote the Talmud. But this is not the way that Jesus provides for His disciples. Listen to Him minister to the Samaritan woman, Â"But the hour is coming, and now is, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth; for the Father is seeking such to worship Him. God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth.Â" Pa ul also gives us the same solution to our frustrations and fears, Just before he quotes from Isaiah, Â"Come out from am ong them,Â" Paul identifies that the indwelling Spirit is the only way, the most perfect way. Listen, Â"I will dwell in them and walk among them. I will be their God and they shall be My people.Â" Verse 16. Jesus will guide us through His Holy Spirit. He will do the work. He will convict us what hinders us in our relationship with our Lord. He will teach us a way t hat is not a burden. Jesus promises are true! Â"Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. Â"

Jesus promised the Samaritan woman that she would find rest for her soul if she would only seek. She would no longer search for the substances of the world in hope of finding true joy. Her heart would worship her Creator. Let us search o ur own hearts. Is our life filled with striving for the substances of this world and at the same time content with our walk w ith our Lord? Our hearts will either be convicted or confirmed by the Spirit. Jesus will change the substance of our hope . We will not strive for the things of this world, but we will strive for the things of God. Then we too will find rest.

Submit to the Spirit that yearns jealously for you. Â"For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, these are the sons of G od. It's really sad how far America has fallen ...

The Puritans and Money

by LELAND RYKEN

The Dangers of Wealth

Instead of regarding success as a sign of GodÂ's approval or of their own virtue, the Puritans were much more likely to look upon prosperity as a temptation. A marginal note to Genesis 13:1 in the Geneva Bible speaks volumes: Â"AbrahamÂ's great riches gotten in Egypt hindered him not to follow his vocation,Â" implying that his riches could easily have become a temptation to him. Â"Both poverty and riches,Â" wrote John Robinson, Â"have their temptations Â.... And of the two states, Â... the temptations of riches are the more dangerous.Â" Thomas Lever claimed, Â"He that seeks to be rich Â... will fall into diverse temptations and snares of the devil.Â" Richard Rogers woke up a little after midnight and was convicted of the fact that the blessings of God Â"waxed too sweet to me, and Â... dangerous.Â"

A second reason why riches are dangerous is that they instill reliance on self instead of on God. Richard Baxter was of the opinion that "when men prosper in the world, their minds are lifted up with their estates, and they can hardly believe that they are so ill, while they feel themselves so well."

The acquisition of wealth, said the Puritans, also has a way of absorbing so much of a personÂ's time and energy that it draws him or her away from religion and moral concern for others. Richard Mather, in his farewell sermon, said: Experience shows that it is an easy thing in the midst of a worldly business to lose the life and power of religion that nothing thereof should be left but only the external form, as it were the carcass or shell, worldliness having eaten out the kernel and having consumed the very soul and life of godliness.

Cotton Mather was equally alarmed by the trend toward materialism in New England Society: "Religion begat prosperity and the daughter devoured the mother."

If money is as dangerous as all this, shouldnÂ't a person simply avoid it? Not according to the Puritans. William Ames claimed that Â"richesÂ... are morally neither good or bad, but things indifferent which men may use either well or ill.Â" Thomas Adams told his city congregation, Â"We teach you not to cast away the bag, but covetousnessÂ"

How Much Is Enough? The Puritan Ideal of Moderation

For the Puritans, the crucial issue was not how large a personÂ's income was, but how much money was spent on oneself. The Puritan ideal was moderation. Such an ideal has, of course, appealed to many people besides the Puritans, but the concept of Â"temperanceÂ" was associated with the Puritans in their time.

The Puritans conceived of moderation or temperance as a golden mean between extremes. John Downame wrote that "the mean estate is much to be preferred before the greatest prosperity .… The mean estate… preserveth us from f orgetfulness of God, irreligion, and profaneness."

If moderation is the goal it needs to be protected against its opposites. One of these is greed for wealth which is often int ertwined with covetousness. In a sermon on Matt. 6: 19,20 Perkins listed the following as the things Christ forbids; "sun dry practices of covetousness, whereof the first is excessive seeking of worldly wealth, when men keep no measure or moderation."

Another thing that moderation stands opposed to is luxury. The Puritans looked askance at a luxurious lifestyle, no matt er what form it took oneÂ's house, clothing, recreation, or eating habits. When Richard Baxter denounced the Â"wealthy vices,Â" he included a discussion of sensuality, overeating, and overindulgence in sports and recreation. His Â"direction s against prodigality and sinful wastefulnessÂ" included comments against Â"pampering the belly in excess Â... or costli ness of meat or drink,Â" Â"needless costly visits and entertainments,Â" and Â"unnecessary sumptuous buildings.Â"

Such warnings against luxury were common among the Puritans. Having defined the essence of luxury with the formula "wealth more than necessary for nature and person," William Perkins proceeded to show his negative assessment of it: it is "as a knife in the hands of a child, likely to hurt, if not taken away." Samuel Ward, in his college diary, listed as one of the "sins of the university" that of "excess in apparel."

It would be wrong to conclude that because the Puritans were opposed to luxury they were ascetic. They did not think th at denying oneself legitimate indulgences was inherently virtuous. In fact, they were as clear-sighted about the temptations of poverty as they were about the temptations of luxury. BaxterÂ's list of temptations ran like this: Â"overmuch care a bout their wants and worldly matters,Â" discontent, covetousness, envy of the rich, neglect of spiritual duties, and neglec t of Â"the holy education of their children.Â"_

What Is Money For?

The more we explore Puritan attitudes, the more apparent it becomes that the key to everything they said on the topic w as their conviction that money is a social good, not a private possession. Its main purpose is the welfare of everyone in s ociety, not the personal pleasure of the person who happens to have control over it.

The genius of Puritanism was its clear-sightedness about what things are for, and that genius did not desert them in mo ney matters. Everything depends on how a person uses his or her money. Baxter stated, "The question is how they us e that which they labour so hard for, and save so sparingly. If they use it for God, and for charitable uses, there is no man taketh a righter course."

What are the ends or uses of money? The Puritans can speak for themselves on this topic. "Riches may enable us to r elieve our needy brethren, and to promote good works for church and state." Money exists "for the glory of God and t he good of others." "The more diligently we pursue our several callings, the more we are capacitated to extend our ch arity to such as are in poverty and distress." "GodÂ's children look to the spiritual use of those things which the worldlings use carnally." In none of these comments about the purpose of earning money does one get the impression that in come is something people have a right to spend on themselves simply because they have earned it.

William Perkins provides an adequate summary on using money:

We must so use and possess the goods we have, that the use and possession of them may tend to GodÂ's glory, and the salvation of our souls \hat{A} Our riches must be employed to necessary uses. These are first, the maintenance of our own good estate and condition. Secondly, the good of others, specially those that are of our family or kindred \hat{A} Thirdly, the relief of the poor \hat{A} Fourthly, the maintenance of the church of God, and true religion \hat{A} Fifth, the maintenance of the Commonwealth.

The belief that money is a social good is also the key to Puritan views on the taking of interest. In the sixteenth century the Puritans were overwhelmingly opposed to the practice of taking interest on money that had been lent. They were opposed to the practice of taking interest on money that had been lent.

osed to it because of Old Testament prohibitions against it and because of what they felt to be the spirit behind the practice, namely, covetousness and greed. As society changed, becoming less agrarian and more industrial, Puritans increasingly made a distinction between interest and usury (exploitive interest).

At first glance, the two attitudes seem contradictory, but in fact they are not. Look at what the anti-interest and pro-intere st Puritans had in common: they both agreed that money is a social good and that therefore hoarding and exploitation ar e not permissible. In an increasingly commercial society, the most compassionate act became the willingness to lend mo ney at a modest rate of interest. In BaxterÂ's words, Â"There is an usury which is against neither justice nor charity,Â" a nd he went on to describe conditions under which it is charitable.

Why did the Puritans view money as a social good when, as our modern view shows, it is so much more natural to view it as a personÂ's own possession? The Puritan outlook stemmed from a firm belief that people are stewards of what God has entrusted to them. Money is ultimately GodÂ's, not ours. In the words of the influential Puritan book, A Godly Form of Household Government, money is Â"that which God hath lent thee.Â"

The Puritan Critique of The Success Ethic

Modern Western culture is based overwhelmingly on the success ethic—the belief that material prosperity is the ultimat e value in life and that a personÂ's worth can be measured by material or social standards. By contrast, the Puritan Tho man Watson asserted that Â"blessednessÂ... does not lie in the acquisition of worldly things. Happiness cannot by any art of chemistry be extracted here.Â" Samuel Hieron was far from the success ethic when he prayed:

"Oh, let not mine eyes be dazzled, nor my heart bewitched with the glory and sweetness of these worldly pleasures Draw my affection to the love of that durable riches, and to that fruit of heavenly wisdom which is better than gold, an d the revenues thereof do surpass the silver, that my chief care may be to have a soul enriched and furnished with Thy g race."

The Puritan Critique of The Self-Made Person

American culture has been strangely enamored of the image of "the self-made person"—the person who becomes rich and famous through his or her own efforts. The idea of having status handed over as a gift does not appeal to such a noutlook. Yet the Puritans denied that there can even be such a thing as a self-made person. Based on an ethic of grace, Puritanism viewed prosperity solely as GodÂ's gift. John Preston wrote regarding riches that "it is God that gives the m, it is he that dispenseth them, it is he that gives the rewardÂ.... The care of the work only belongs to us."

The Puritan Critique of Modern Business Ethics

It has become an axiom of modern business that the goal of business is to make as much profit as possible and that any type of competition or selling practice is acceptable as long as it is legal. The Puritans would not agree. For one thing, th ey looked upon business as a service to society. "We must therefore think," wrote John Knewstub, "that when we co me to buying and selling, we come to witness our love towards our neighbor by our well dealing with him in his goods." William Perkins said, "The end of a manÂ's calling is not to gather riches for himselfÂ... but to serve God in the serving of man, and in the seeking the good of all men."

Nor would the Puritans agree with modern methods of competition or profiteering. When citizens in Boston complained t hat Robert Keayne charged excessive prices, the magistrates fined him two hundred pounds, and he very nearly found himself excommunicated from the church. John Cotton used the trial to lay down some business principles in a public le cture on economics. Cotton denounced as false the following premises:

That a man might sell as dear as he can, and buy as cheap as he canÂ.... That he may sell as he bought, though he pa id too dear, etc., and though the commodity be fallen, etc. That as a man may take advantage of his own skill or ability, s

o he may of anotherÂ's ignorance or necessity.

In England John Knewstub showed what a gulf lies between the Puritans and modern commercial practices when he wr ote disparagingly of businessmen who: come to buying and selling as it were to the razing and spoiling of some enemyÂ's city Â..., where every man catcheth, snatcheth and carrieth away whatsoever he can come by. And he is thought the best who carrieth away the mostÂ.... But the Holy Ghost will bring us to another trial of our love.

The Puritan Critique of The Â"Simple LifeÂ" Philosophy

Modern materialism has produced its own antithesis in the form of people who view affluence and possessions as inhere ntly tainted. The Puritans were closer to such an outlook than to one supporting an affluent lifestyle, but they cannot be fi tted comfortably here either. William Perkins wrote, "These earthly things are the good gifts of God, which no man can simply condemn, without injury to GodÂ's disposing hand and providence, who hath ordained them for natural life." The Puritans were also wary of a blanket condemnation of people who have a higher standard of living than some other people. In PerkinÂ's words:

We must not make one measure of sufficiency of goods necessary for all persons, for it varies according to the diverse c onditions of persons, and according to the time and place. More things are necessary to a public person than to a privat e; and more to him that has a charge than to a single man.

The Puritan Critique of Socialism

A final force in modern life of which the Puritans would not approve is socialism, whether in its overt form of government all ownership or in its subtle form of the welfare state. William Ames wrote, "Ownership and differences in the amount of possessions are ordinances of God and approved by him, Prov. 22:2; II Thess. 3:12." John Robinson commented:

God could Â... either have made menÂ's states more equal, or have given everyone sufficient of his own. But he hath ra ther chosen to make some rich, and some poor, that one might stand in need of another, and help another, that so he might try the goodness and mercy of them that are able, in supplying the wants of the rest.

As I have suggested, the Puritans would have shared some of the assumptions of many different groups on the economi c scene today. But they would stand aghast at what secularism and self-interest have made of principles that they place d in a Christian context.

Summary

One of the ironies in the history of the Puritans is that their very industriousness and plain living tended to make them rel atively affluent. Their virtues produced corresponding temptations. On the one hand, the Puritans held attitudes conduci ve to the amassing of wealth and property: the view that money and property are good in principle, disbelief that poverty is meritorious in itself, and a conviction that the disciplined and hardworking lifestyle is virtuous.

On the other hand, to curb the potential for self-indulgence that followed in the wake of their lifestyle, the Puritans had an even longer list of cautions: an awareness that God sends poverty as well as riches, an obsession with the dangers of w ealth, the ideal of moderation, a doctrine of stewardship in which God is viewed as the ultimate owner of goods, and a vi ew of money as a social good.

THE DIVIDENDS OF SUNDAY SCHOOL, HARD WORK AND CHEERFUL GIVING

" After it is all over, the religion of a man is his most important possession. And with that religion comes the accesso ries which it brings with it. The Sunday school should be a place, not only where the word of God is taught, but from it should go influences — which help each one to follow carefully in the footsteps of the Master.

There is nothing in this world that can compare with the Christian fellowship, nothing that can satisfy but Christ. It is the Sunday school which can bring both. Christ is to be studied and through an acquaintance with His life, and through His words, which have been handed down to us, we can only learn of His love for us, the greatest of that love and sacrifice which led Him to the cross that we. His brothers, might live with Him forever.

We can never learn too much of His will towards us, too much of his messages and His advice. The Bible is His word and its study gives at once the foundation for our faith and an inspiration to battle onward in the fight against the tempt er. We should learn more of His word, and the Sunday school is the place where all may gather that knowledge of His great love for us that will turn our dark days into brightness, and furnish the glad light which should shine out from our lives as an inspiration for the despondent and heart-sick brother who finds the way of life hard to tread.

In our Sunday school let us learn to repeat those passages which show forth best the beauties of holiness. Each cla ss should be taught to repeat at will those inspired words. Passages of Scriptures should be as familiar to our children a s are the lessons of education taught in day schools. In some moment of their lives who knows that the warning, the pro mise learned and understood in the Sunday school, may prove to be the turning point in their lives and save some one fr om being turned away from the right and swept down the broad road to destruction.

And we are never too old to study the Bible. Each time the lessons are studied comes some new meaning, some new thought which will make us better. DonÂ't forsake the Sunday school because you have reached years of maturity. Stick closer to it as the years go by. Dig deeper into its truths. Make your place early in the Sunday school, and let that place be filled by you as long as you live. It is particularly gratifying to me after my absence to notice the signs of prosperity in the Sunday school. The growth of the school has been exceptional, and I foresee in that growth the new beginning of a marvelous power for good in our city. The Sunday school has been a help to me, greater perhaps than any other force in my Christian life, and I can ask no better things for you, than that you, and all that shall come after you in this great band of workers for Christ, shall receive the same measure of blessedness which I have been permitted to have.

When you come to the church or to the Sunday school and associate yourself with it you must put something into it. When the business men associate themselves together for the manufacture of these gas fixtures, or the window glasses or many of the things that we see about us, each man contributes some money for that joint undertaking. In proportion to what they put into this business do they receive returns from their investments or dividends. The more they put in the mo re they receive in dividends.

Now it is not necessary that you put a great amount of money into this work that you are becoming a part of, but that the whole may accomplish the most it is necessary that each contribute something, be it money or what it may. Put something in. And according as you put something in the greater will be your dividends of salvation."

John D. Rockefeller Sr.

(from a speech given at the Euclid Ave. Baptist Church, to his Sunday school teachers and students, as itÂ's superinten dant and teacher of 49 years)

A reporter wrote this of Mr. Rockefeller, "Devoted as he is to his church, Mr. Rockefeller makes much more impres sion by his charities which are indeed one expression of his religion. Mr. Rockefeller has always held that methodical giv ing was a part of a Christian's duty. Again and again he has stated this view in his Sunday school talks. "I believe it is a religious duty to get all the money you can fairly, and honestly;" he told young men one day, "to save all you can, and to give away all you can." Will they (the people of the future) say of us, we accumulated wealth" he remarked in a little Cle veland address a few years ago: "No, that will all be forgotten. They will want to know what we did with it. Did we spend it for the benefit of our fellow man? Of that we ought to think". Such expression are often on his tongue. These are but reflections of his practice of methodical giving since his early childhood. It is evident that his giving is governed by some theory of 10% percent due to the Lord".

Rockefeller stated in 1905, "God gave me my money. I believe the power to make money is a gift from God . . . to b e developed & used to the best of our ability for the good of mankind. Having been endowed with the gift I possess, I believe it is my duty to make money and to use that money for the good of my fellow man, according to the dictates of my c onscience."

What better way to prepare ourselves and our children for the Kings business than by regularly attending or teachin g Sunday school. What better way for the King to do business with us but by our "cheerfully" funding His Church, Co mmision and Charity. Both are sure fire ways of seeking first His kingdom, and His righteousness. Free your mind about the dividends Â… they are blessedly assured.

This was the headline back on August 4, 1964.

"1964: Three civil rights activists found dead

The bodies of three civil rights workers missing for six weeks have been found buried in a partially constructe d dam near Philadelphia, Mississippi.

Agents from the Federal Bureau of Investigation found the three young men - two white and one black man - about six miles from the town in a wooded area near where they were last seen on the night of 21 June.

They were Michael Schwerner, aged 24, Andrew Goodman, 20, both from New York and James Chaney, 22, from Merid ian, Mississippi. All were members of the Congress of Racial Equality (CORE) dedicated to non-violent direct action against racial discrimination.

As soon as the men were reported missing, the case was made top priority and codenamed Miburn (Mississippi burning) . FBI agents headed by Major Case Inspector Joseph Sullivan were sent down to Mississippi to investigate the matter.

After a tip-off they found the mens' burnt-out car two days after their disappearance.

The bodies have been taken to Jackson, Mississippi, for further examination into the cause of death. It is believed all thr ee had been shot and the finger of blame is pointing at the Ku Klux Klan white supremacist group.

Church burned down

The three young men had left the CORE office in Meridian six weeks ago to investigate the destruction of a black congregation church in Longdale, Neshoba County because it was used as the site for a "freedom school".

The school was set up by Mr Schwerner as part of a wider civil rights campaign in Mississippi teaching black children, a mong other things, black history and the philosophy of the civil rights movement.

The Mount Zion Church was burned down on 16 June by members of the KKK searching for Mr Schwerner.

His wife, Rita, made an emotional statement to newspapers today.

She said: "My husband, Michael Schwerner, did not die in vain. If he and Andrew Goodman had been negroes, the worl d would have taken little notice of their deaths.

"After all, the slaying of a negro in Mississippi is not news. It is only because my husband and Andrew Goodman were w hite that the national alarm had been sounded."

"Bombing of Marine Barracks, Beirut, October 23, 1983: Simultaneous suicide truck-bomb attacks were made on Americ an and French compounds in Beirut, Lebanon. A 12,000-pound bomb destroyed the U.S. compound, killing 242 America ns, while 58 French troops were killed when a 400-pound device destroyed a French base. Islamic Jihad claimed respon sibility.

1984

Kidnapping of Embassy Official, March 16, 1984: The Islamic Jihad kidnapped and later murdered Political Officer Willia m Buckley in Beirut, Lebanon. Other U.S. citizens not connected to the U.S. government were seized over a succeeding two-year period.

Restaurant Bombing in Spain, April 12, 1984: Eighteen U.S. servicemen were killed and 83 people were injured in a bomb attack on a restaurant near a U.S. Air Force Base in Torrejon, Spain.

1985

WA Hijacking, June 14, 1985: A Trans-World Airlines flight was hijacked en route to Rome from Athens by two Lebanes

e Hizballah terrorists and forced to fly to Beirut. The eight crew members and 145 passengers were held for seventeen d ays, during which one American hostage, a U.S. Navy sailor, was murdered. After being flown twice to Algiers, the aircraft was returned to Beirut after Israel released 435 Lebanese and Palestinian prisoners.

Attack on a Restaurant in El Salvador, June 19, 1985: Members of the FMLN (Farabundo Marti National Liberation Fron t) fired on a restaurant in the Zona Rosa district of San Salvador, killing four Marine Security Guards assigned to the U.S. Embassy and nine Salvadorean civilians.

Soviet Diplomats Kidnapped, September 30, 1985: In Beirut, Lebanon, Sunni terrorists kidnapped four Soviet diplomats. One was killed but three were later released.

Achille Lauro Hijacking, October 7, 1985: Four Palestinian Liberation Front terrorists seized the Italian cruise liner in the eastern Mediterranean Sea, taking more than 700 hostages. One U.S. passenger was murdered before the Egyptian go vernment offered the terrorists safe haven in return for the hostagesÂ' freedom.

Egyptian Airliner Hijacking, November 23, 1985: An EgyptAir airplane bound from Athens to Malta and carrying several U.S. citizens was hijacked by the Abu Nidal Group.

Airport Attacks in Rome and Vienna, December 27, 1985: Four gunmen belonging to the Abu Nidal Organization attack ed the El Al and Trans World Airlines ticket counters at RomeÂ's Leonardo da Vinci Airport with grenades and automatic rifles. Thirteen persons were killed and 75 were wounded before Italian police and Israeli security guards killed three of the gunmen and captured the fourth. Three more Abu Nidal gunmen attacked the El Al ticket counter at ViennaÂ's Schwechat Airport, killing three persons and wounding 30. Austrian police killed one of the gunmen and captured the others.

1986

Aircraft Bombing in Greece, March 30, 1986: A Palestinian splinter group detonated a bomb as TWA Flight 840 approached Athens airport, killing four U.S. citizens.

Berlin Discothà que Bombing, April 5, 1986: Two U.S. soldiers were killed and 79 American servicemen were injured in a Libyan bomb attack on a nightclub in West Berlin, West Germany. In retaliation U.S. military jets bombed targets in an d around Tripoli and Benghazi.

Kimpo Airport Bombing, September 14, 1986: North Korean agents detonated an explosive device at SeoulÂ's Kimpo ai rport, killing 5 persons and injuring 29 others.

1987

Bus Attack, April 24, 1987: Sixteen U.S. servicemen riding in a Greek Air Force bus near Athens were injured in an apparent bombing attack, carried out by the revolutionary organization known as November 17.

Downing of Airliner, November 29, 1987: North Korean agents planted a bomb aboard Korean Air Lines Flight 858, which subsequently crashed into the Indian Ocean.

ServicemenÂ's Bar Attack, December 26, 1987: Catalan separatists bombed a Barcelona bar frequented by U.S. servicemen, resulting in the death of one U.S. citizen.

1988

Kidnapping of William Higgins, February 17, 1988: U.S. Marine Corps Lieutenant Colonel W. Higgins was kidnapped and murdered by the Iranian-backed Hizballah group while serving with the United Nations Truce Supervisory Organization (UNTSO) in southern Lebanon.

Naples USO Attack, April 14, 1988: The Organization of Jihad Brigades exploded a car-bomb outside a USO Club in Naples, Italy, killing one U.S. sailor.

Attack on U.S. Diplomat in Greece, June 28, 1988: The Defense Attaché of the U.S. Embassy in Greece was killed w

hen a car-bomb was detonated outside his home in Athens.

Pan Am 103 Bombing, December 21, 1988: Pan American Airlines Flight 103 was blown up over Lockerbie, Scotland, by a bomb believed to have been placed on the aircraft by Libyan terrorists in Frankfurt, West Germany. All 259 people on board were killed.

1989

Bombing of UTA Flight 772, September 19, 1989: A bomb explosion destroyed UTA Flight 772 over the Sahara Desert in southern Niger during a flight from Brazzaville to Paris. All 170 persons aboard were killed. Six Libyans were later found guilty in absentia and sentenced to life imprisonment.

U.S. Soldiers Assassinated in the Philippines, May 13, 1990: The New PeopleÂ's Army (NPA) killed two U.S. Air Force personnel near Clark Air Force Base in the Philippines.

1991

Attempted Iraqi Attacks on U.S. Posts, January 18-19, 1991: Iraqi agents planted bombs at the U.S. Ambassador to IndonesiaÂ's home residence and at the USIS library in Manila.

Sniper Attack on the U.S. Embassy in Bonn, February 13, 1991: Three Red Army Faction members fired automatic rifle s from across the Rhine River at the U.S. Embassy Chancery. No one was hurt.

Assassination of former Indian Prime Minister, May 21, 1991: A female member of the LTTE (Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam) killed herself, Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi, and 16 others by detonating an explosive vest after presenting a garl and of flowers to the former Prime Minister during an election rally in the Indian state of Tamil Nadu.

1992

Kidnapping of U.S. Businessmen in the Philippines, January 17-21, 1992: A senior official of the corporation Philippine Geothermal was kidnapped in Manila by the Red Scorpion Group, and two U.S. businessmen were seized independently by the National Liberation Army and by Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia (FARC).

Bombing of the Israeli Embassy in Argentina, March 17, 1992: Hizballah claimed responsibility for a blast that leveled the Israeli Embassy in Buenos Aires, Argentina, causing the deaths of 29 and wounding 242.

1993

Kidnappings of U.S. Citizens in Colombia, January 31, 1993: Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia (FARC) terrorist s kidnapped three U.S. missionaries.

World Trade Center Bombing, February 26, 1993: The World Trade Center in New York City was badly damaged when a car bomb planted by Islamic terrorists exploded in an underground garage. The bomb left 6 people dead and 1,000 injured. The men carrying out the attack were followers of Umar Abd al-Rahman, an Egyptian cleric who preached in the N ew York City area.

Attempted Assassination of President Bush by Iraqi Agents, April 14, 1993: The Iraqi intelligence service attempted to a ssassinate former U.S. President George Bush during a visit to Kuwait. In retaliation, the U.S. launched a cruise missile attack 2 months later on the Iraqi capital Baghdad.

1994

Hebron Massacre, February 25, 1994: Jewish right-wing extremist and U.S. citizen Baruch Goldstein machine-gunned Moslem worshippers at a mosque in West Bank town of Hebron, killing 29 and wounding about 150.

FARC Hostage-taking, September 23, 1994: FARC rebels kidnapped U.S. citizen Thomas Hargrove in Colombia.

Air France Hijacking, December 24, 1994: Members of the Armed Islamic Group seized an Air France Flight to Algeria. The four terrorists were killed during a rescue effort.

1995

Attack on U.S. Diplomats in Pakistan, March 8, 1995: Two unidentified gunmen killed two U.S. diplomats and wounded a third in Karachi, Pakistan.

Tokyo Subway Station Attack, March 20, 1995: Twelve persons were killed and 5,700 were injured in a Sarin nerve gas attack on a crowded subway station in the center of Tokyo, Japan. A similar attack occurred nearly simultaneously in the Yokohama subway system. The Aum Shinri-kyo cult was blamed for the attacks.

Bombing of the Federal Building in Oklahoma City, April 19, 1995: Right-wing extremists Timothy McVeigh and Terry Ni chols destroyed the Federal Building in Oklahoma City with a massive truck bomb that killed 166 and injured hundreds more in what was up to then the largest terrorist attack on American soil.

Kashmiri Hostage-taking, July 4, 1995: In India six foreigners, including two U.S. citizens, were taken hostage by Al-Far an, a Kashmiri separatist group. One non-U.S. hostage was later found beheaded.

Jerusalem Bus Attack, August 21, 1995: HAMAS claimed responsibility for the detonation of a bomb that killed 6 and injured over 100 persons, including several U.S. citizens.

Attack on U.S. Embassy in Moscow, September 13, 1995: A rocket-propelled grenade was fired through the window of the U.S. Embassy in Moscow, ostensibly in retaliation for U.S. strikes on Serb positions in Bosnia.

Saudi Military Installation Attack, November 13, 1995: The Islamic Movement of Change planted a bomb in a Riyadh mil itary compound that killed one U.S. citizen, several foreign national employees of the U.S. government, and over 40 others.

Egyptian Embassy Attack, November 19, 1995: A suicide bomber drove a vehicle into the Egyptian Embassy compound in Islamabad, Pakistan, killing at least 16 and injuring 60 persons. Three militant Islamic groups claimed responsibility.

1996

Papuan Hostage Abduction, January 8, 1996: In Indonesia, 200 Free Papua Movement (OPM) guerrillas abducted 26 in dividuals in the Lorenta nature preserve, Irian Jaya Province. Indonesian Special Forces members rescued the remaining nine hostages on May 15.

Kidnapping in Colombia, January 19, 1996: Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia (FARC) guerrillas kidnapped a U S citizen and demanded a \$1 million ransom. The hostage was released on May 22.

Tamil Tigers Attack, January 31, 1996: Members of the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE) rammed an explosives -laden truck into the Central Bank in the heart of downtown Colombo, Sri Lanka, killing 90 civilians and injuring more than 1,400 others, including 2 US citizens.

IRA Bombing, February 9, 1996: An Irish Republican Army (IRA) bomb detonated in London, killing 2 persons and wou nding more than 100 others, including 2 U.S. citizens.

Athens Embassy Attack, February 15, 1996: Unidentified assailants fired a rocket at the U.S. Embassy compound in At hens, causing minor damage to three diplomatic vehicles and some surrounding buildings. Circumstances of the attack suggested it was an operation carried out by the 17 November group.

ELN Kidnapping, February 16, 1996: Six alleged National Liberation Army (ELN) guerrillas kidnapped a U.S. citizen in C olombia. After 9 months, the hostage was released.

HAMAS Bus Attack, February 26, 1996: In Jerusalem, a suicide bomber blew up a bus, killing 26 persons, including three U.S. citizens, and injuring some 80 persons, including three other US citizens.

Dizengoff Center Bombing, March 4, 1996: HAMAS and the Palestine Islamic Jihad (PIJ) both claimed responsibility for a bombing outside of Tel Aviv's largest shopping mall that killed 20 persons and injured 75 others, including 2 U.S. citize ns.

West Bank Attack, May 13, 1996: Arab gunmen opened fire on a bus and a group of Yeshiva students near the Bet El s ettlement, killing a dual U.S./Israeli citizen and wounding three Israelis. No one claimed responsibility for the attack, but HAMAS was suspected.

AID Worker Abduction, May 31, 1996: A gang of former Contra guerrillas kidnapped a U.S. employee of the Agency for International Development (AID) who was assisting with election preparations in rural northern Nicaragua. She was rele ased unharmed the next day after members of the international commission overseeing the preparations intervened.

Zekharya Attack, June 9, 1996: Unidentified gunmen opened fire on a car near Zekharya, killing a dual U.S./Israeli citize n and an Israeli. The Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine (PFLP) was suspected.

Manchester Truck Bombing, June 15, 1996: An IRA truck bomb detonated at a Manchester shopping center, wounding 206 persons, including two German tourists, and caused extensive property damage.

Khobar Towers Bombing, June 25, 1996: A fuel truck carrying a bomb exploded outside the US military's Khobar Tower s housing facility in Dhahran, killing 19 U.S. military personnel and wounding 515 persons, including 240 U.S. personnel. Several groups claimed responsibility for the attack.

ETA Bombing, July 20, 1996: A bomb exploded at Tarragona International Airport in Reus, Spain, wounding 35 persons, including British and Irish tourists. The Basque Fatherland and Liberty (ETA) organization was suspected.

Bombing of Archbishop of Oran, August 1, 1996: A bomb exploded at the home of the French Archbishop of Oran, killin g him and his chauffeur. The attack occurred after the Archbishop's meeting with the French Foreign Minister. The Algeri an Armed Islamic Group (GIA) is suspected.

Sudanese Rebel Kidnapping, August 17, 1996: Sudan People's Liberation Army (SPLA) rebels kidnapped six missionari es in Mapourdit, including a U.S. citizen, an Italian, three Australians, and a Sudanese. The SPLA released the hostages 11 days later.

PUK Kidnapping, September 13, 1996: In Iraq, Patriotic Union of Kurdistan (PUK) militants kidnapped four French work ers for Pharmaciens Sans Frontieres, a Canadian United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) official, and two Iraqis.

Assassination of South Korean Consul, October 1, 1996: In Vladivostok, Russia, assailants attacked and killed a South Korean consul near his home. No one claimed responsibility, but South Korean authorities believed that the attack was c arried out by professionals and that the assailants were North Koreans. North Korean officials denied the country's involvement in the attack.

Red Cross Worker Kidnappings, November 1, 1996: In Sudan a breakaway group from the Sudanese People's Liberati on Army (SPLA) kidnapped three International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) workers, including a U.S. citizen, an Australian, and a Kenyan. On 9 December the rebels released the hostages in exchange for ICRC supplies and a health survey for their camp.

Paris Subway Explosion, December 3, 1996: A bomb exploded aboard a Paris subway train as it arrived at the Port Roy al station, killing two French nationals, a Moroccan, and a Canadian, and injuring 86 persons. Among those injured were one U.S. citizen and a Canadian. No one claimed responsibility for the attack, but Algerian extremists are suspected.

Abduction of US. Citizen by FARC, December 11, 1996: Five armed men claiming to be members of the Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia (FARC) kidnapped and later killed a U.S. geologist at a methane gas exploration site in La G uajira Department.

Tupac Amaru Seizure of Diplomats, December 17, 1996: Twenty-three members of the Tupac Amaru Revolutionary Mo vement (MRTA) took several hundred people hostage at a party given at the Japanese Ambassador's residence in Lima, Peru. Among the hostages were several US officials, foreign ambassadors and other diplomats, Peruvian Government o fficials, and Japanese businessmen. The group demanded the release of all MRTA members in prison and safe passag e for them and the hostage takers. The terrorists released most of the hostages in December but held 81 Peruvians and Japanese citizens for several months.

1997

Egyptian Letter Bombs, January 2-13, 1997: A series of letter bombs with Alexandria, Egypt, postmarks were discovere d at Al-Hayat newspaper bureaus in Washington, New York City, London, and Riyadh, Saudi Arabia. Three similar devic es, also postmarked in Egypt, were found at a prison facility in Leavenworth, Kansas. Bomb disposal experts defused all the devices, but one detonated at the Al-Hayat office in London, injuring two security guards and causing minor damage.

Tajik Hostage Abductions, February 4-17, 1997: Near Komsomolabad, Tajikistan, a paramilitary group led by Bakhrom Sodirov abducted four United Nations (UN) military observers. The victims included two Swiss, one Austrian, one Ukraini an, and their Tajik interpreter. The kidnappers demanded safe passage for their supporters from Afghanistan to Tajikista n. In four separate incidents occurring between Dushanbe and Garm, Bakhrom Sodirov and his group kidnapped two Int ernational Committee for the Red Cross members, four Russian journalists and their Tajik driver, four UNHCR members, and the Tajik Security Minister, Saidamir Zukhurov.

Venezuelan Abduction, February 14, 1997: Six armed Colombian guerrillas kidnapped a US oil engineer and his Venezuelan pilot in Apure, Venezuela. The kidnappers released the Venezuelan pilot on 22 February. According to authorities, the FARC is responsible for the kidnapping.

Empire State Building Sniper Attack, February 23, 1997: A Palestinian gunman opened fire on tourists at an observation deck atop the Empire State Building in New York City, killing a Danish national and wounding visitors from the United St ates, Argentina, Switzerland, and France before turning the gun on himself. A handwritten note carried by the gunman cl aimed this was a punishment attack against the "enemies of Palestine."

ELN Kidnapping, February 24, 1997: National Liberation Army (ELN) guerrillas kidnapped a U.S. citizen employed by a Las Vegas gold corporation who was scouting a gold mining operation in Colombia. The ELN demanded a ransom of \$2 .5 million.

FARC Kidnapping, March 7, 1997: FARC guerrillas kidnapped a U.S. mining employee and his Colombian colleague w ho were searching for gold in Colombia. On November 16, the rebels released the two hostages after receiving a \$50,00 0 ransom.

Hotel Nacional Bombing, July 12, 1997: A bomb exploded at the Hotel Nacional in Havana, injuring three persons and c ausing minor damage. A previously unknown group calling itself the Military Liberation Union claimed responsibility.

Israeli Shopping Mall Bombing, September 4, 1997: Three suicide bombers of HAMAS detonated bombs in the Ben Ye huda shopping mall in Jerusalem, killing eight persons, including the bombers, and wounding nearly 200 others. A dual U.S./Israeli citizen was among the dead, and 7 U.S. citizens were wounded.

OAS Abductions, October 23, 1997: In Colombia ELN rebels kidnapped two foreign members of the Organization of Am erican States (OAS) and a Colombian human rights official at a roadblock. The ELN claimed that the kidnapping was int ended "to show the international community that the elections in Colombia are a farce."

Yemeni Kidnappings, October 30, 1997: Al-Sha'if tribesmen kidnapped a U.S. businessman near Sanaa. The tribesmen sought the release of two fellow tribesmen who were arrested on smuggling charges and several public works projects t hey claim the government promised them. They released the hostage on November 27.

Murder of U.S. Businessmen in Pakistan, November 12, 1997: Two unidentified gunmen shot to death four U.S. auditor s from Union Texas Petroleum Corporation and their Pakistani driver after they drove away from the Sheraton Hotel in K arachi. The Islami Inqilabi Council, or Islamic Revolutionary Council, claimed responsibility in a call to the U.S. Consulat

e in Karachi. In a letter to Pakistani newspapers, the Aimal Khufia Action Committee also claimed responsibility.

Tourist Killings in Egypt, November 17, 1997: Al-Gama'at al-Islamiyya (IG) gunmen shot and killed 58 tourists and four Egyptians and wounded 26 others at the Hatshepsut Temple in the Valley of the Kings near Luxor. Thirty-four Swiss, eight Japanese, five Germans, four Britons, one French, one Colombian, a dual Bulgarian/British citizen, and four unidentified persons were among the dead. Twelve Swiss, two Japanese, two Germans, one French, and nine Egyptians were a mong the wounded.

1998

UN Observer Abductions, February 19, 1998: Armed supporters of late Georgian president Zviad Gamsakhurdia abduct ed four UN military observers from Sweden, Uruguay, and the Czech Republic.

FARC Abduction, March 21-23, 1998: FARC rebels kidnapped a US citizen in Sabaneta, Colombia. FARC members als o killed three persons, wounded 14, and kidnapped at least 27 others at a roadblock near Bogota. Four U.S. citizens and one Italian were among those kidnapped, as well as the acting president of the National Electoral Council (CNE) and his wife.

Somali Hostage-takings, April 15, 1998: Somali militiamen abducted nine Red Cross and Red Crescent workers at an ai rstrip north of Mogadishu. The hostages included a U.S. citizen, a German, a Belgian, a French, a Norwegian, two Swiss, and one Somali. The gunmen were members of a sub-clan loyal to Ali Mahdi Mohammed, who controlled the northern section of the capital.

IRA Bombing, Banbridge, August 1, 1998: A 500-pound car bomb planted by the Real IRA exploded outside a shoe stor e in Banbridge, North Ireland, injuring 35 persons and damaging at least 200 homes.

U.S. Embassy Bombings in East Africa, August 7, 1998: A bomb exploded at the rear entrance of the U.S. Embassy in Nairobi, Kenya, killing 12 U.S. citizens, 32 Foreign Service Nationals (FSNs), and 247 Kenyan citizens. Approximately 5, 000 Kenyans, 6 U.S. citizens, and 13 FSNs were injured. The U.S. Embassy building sustained extensive structural dam age. Almost simultaneously, a bomb detonated outside the U.S. Embassy in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania, killing 7 FSNs and 3 Tanzanian citizens, and injuring 1 U.S. citizen and 76 Tanzanians. The explosion caused major structural damage to the U.S. Embassy facility. The U.S. Government held Usama Bin Laden responsible.

IRA Bombing, Omagh, August 15, 1998: A 500-pound car bomb planted by the Real IRA exploded outside a local court house in the central shopping district of Omagh, Northern Ireland, killing 29 persons and injuring over 330.

Colombian Pipeline Bombing, October 18, 1998: A National Liberation Army (ELN) planted bomb exploded on the Ocen sa pipeline in Antioquia Department, killing approximately 71 persons and injuring at least 100 others. The pipeline is joi ntly owned by the Colombia State Oil Company Ecopetrol and a consortium including U.S., French, British, and Canadia n companies.

Armed Kidnapping in Colombia, November 15, 1998: Armed assailants followed a U.S. businessman and his family ho me in Cundinamarca Department and kidnapped his 11-year-old son after stealing money, jewelry, one automobile, and two cell phones. The kidnappers demanded \$1 million in ransom. On January 21, 1999, the kidnappers released the boy

1999

Angolan Aircraft Downing, January 2, 1999: A UN plane carrying one U.S. citizen, four Angolans, two Philippine nationals and one Namibian was shot down, according to a UN official. No deaths or injuries were reported. Angolan authorities blamed the attack on National Union for the Total Independence of Angola (UNITA) rebels. UNITA officials denied shooting down the plane.

Ugandan Rebel Attack, February 14, 1999: A pipe bomb exploded inside a bar, killing five persons and injuring 35 other s. One Ethiopian and four Ugandan nationals died in the blast, and one U.S. citizen working for USAID, two Swiss nation als, one Pakistani, one Ethiopian, and 27 Ugandans were injured. Ugandan authorities blamed the attack on the Allied D emocratic Forces (ADF).

Greek Embassy Seizure, February 16, 1999: Kurdish protesters stormed and occupied the Greek Embassy in Vienna, t aking the Greek Ambassador and six other persons hostage. Several hours later the protesters released the hostages a nd left the Embassy. The attack followed the Turkish Government's announcement of the successful capture of the Kurdi stan Workers' Party (PKK) leader Abdullah Ocalan. Kurds also occupied Kenyan, Israeli, and other Greek diplomatic faci lities in France, Holland, Switzerland, Britain, and Germany over the following days.

FARC Kidnappings, February 25, 1999: FARC kidnapped three U.S. citizens working for the Hawaii-based Pacific Cultural Conservancy International. On March 4, the bodies of the three victims were found in Venezuela.

Hutu Abductions, March 1, 1999: 150 armed Hutu rebels attacked three tourist camps in Uganda, killed four Ugandans, and abducted three U.S. citizens, six Britons, three New Zealanders, two Danish citizens, one Australian, and one Cana dian national. Two of the U.S. citizens and six of the other hostages were subsequently killed by their abductors.

ELN Hostage-taking, March 23, 1999: Armed guerrillas kidnapped a U.S. citizen in Boyaca, Colombia. The National Lib eration Army (ELN) claimed responsibility and demanded \$400,000 ransom. On 20 July, ELN rebels released the hostage unharmed following a ransom payment of \$48,000.

ELN Hostage-taking, May 30, 1999: In Cali, Colombia, armed ELN militants attacked a church in the neighborhood of Ci udad Jardin, kidnapping 160 persons, including six U.S. citizens and one French national. The rebels released approxim ately 80 persons, including three U.S. citizens, later that day.

Shell Platform Bombing, June 27, 1999: In Port Harcourt, Nigeria, armed youths stormed a Shell oil platform, kidnappin g one U.S. citizen, one Nigerian national, and one Australian citizen, and causing undetermined damage. A group calling itself "Enough is Enough in the Niger River" claimed responsibility. Further seizures of oil facilities followed.

AFRC Kidnappings, August 4, 1999: An Armed Forces Revolutionary Council (AFRC) faction kidnapped 33 UN represe ntatives near Occra Hills, Sierra Leone. The hostages included one U.S. citizen, five British soldiers, one Canadian citize n, one representative from Ghana, one military officer from Russia, one officer from Kyrgystan, one officer from Zambia, one officer from Malaysia, a local Bishop, two UN officials, two local journalists, and 16 Sierra Leonean nationals.

Burmese Embassy Seizure, October 1, 1999: Burmese dissidents seized the Burmese Embassy in Bangkok, Thailand, taking 89 persons hostage, including one U.S. citizen.

PLA Kidnapping, December 23, 1999: Colombian PeopleÂ's Liberation Army (PLA) forces kidnapped a U.S. citizen in a n unsuccessful ransoming effort.

Indian Airlines Airbus Hijacking, December 24, 1999: Five militants hijacked a flight bound from Katmandu to New Delhi carrying 189 people. The plane and its passengers were released unharmed on December 31.

2000

Car bombing in Spain, January 27, 2000: Police officials reported unidentified individuals set fire to a Citroen car dealer ship in Iturreta, causing extensive damage to the building and destroying 12 vehicles. The attack bore the hallmark of the Basque Fatherland and Liberty (ETA).

RUF Attacks on U.N. Mission Personnel, May 1, 2000: On 1 May in Makeni, Sierra Leone, Revolutionary United Front (RUF) militants kidnapped at least 20 members of the United Nations Assistance Mission in Sierra Leone (UNAMSIL) and surrounded and opened fire on a UNAMSIL facility, according to press reports. The militants killed five UN soldiers in the attack. RUF militants kidnapped 300 UNAMSIL peacekeepers throughout the country, according to press reports. On 15 May in Foya, Liberia, the kidnappers released 139 hostages. On 28 May, on the Liberia and Sierra Leone border, ar med militants released unharmed the last of the UN peacekeepers. In Freetown, according to press reports, armed militants ambushed two military vehicles carrying four journalists. A Spaniard and one U.S. citizen were killed in a May 25 car bombing in Freetown for which the RUF was probably responsible. Suspected RUF rebels also kidnapped 21 Indian UN peacekeepers in Freetown on June 6. Additional attacks by RUF on foreign personnel followed.

Diplomatic Assassination in Greece, June 8, 2000: In Athens, Greece, two unidentified gunmen killed British Defense At

taché Stephen Saunders in an ambush. The Revolutionary Organization 17 November claimed responsibility.

ELN Kidnapping, June 27, 2000: In Bogota, Colombia, ELN militants kidnapped a 5-year-old U.S. citizen and his Colombian mother, demanding an undisclosed ransom.

Kidnappings in Kyrgyzstan, August 12, 2000: In the Kara-Su Valley, the Islamic Movement of Uzbekistan took four U.S. citizens hostage. The Americans escaped on August 12.

Church Bombing in Tajikistan, October 1, 2000: Unidentified militants detonated two bombs in a Christian church in Dus hanbe, killing seven persons and injuring 70 others. The church was founded by a Korean-born U.S. citizen, and most of those killed and wounded were Korean. No one claimed responsibility.

Helicopter Hijacking, October 12, 2000: In Sucumbios Province, Ecuador, a group of armed kidnappers led by former m embers of defunct Colombian terrorist organization the Popular Liberation Army (EPL), took hostage 10 employees of S panish energy consortium REPSOL. Those kidnapped included five U.S. citizens, one Argentine, one Chilean, one New Zealander, and two French pilots who escaped four days later. On January 30, 2001, the kidnappers murdered America n hostage Ronald Sander. The remaining hostages were released on February 23 following the payment of \$13 million in ransom by the oil companies.

Attack on U.S.S. Cole, October 12, 2000: In Aden, Yemen, a small dingy carrying explosives rammed the destroyer U.S. Cole, killing 17 sailors and injuring 39 others. Supporters of Usama Bin Laden were suspected.

Manila Bombing, December 30, 2000: A bomb exploded in a plaza across the street from the U.S. Embassy in Manila, i njuring nine persons. The Moro Islamic Liberation Front was likely responsible.

2001

Srinagar Airport Attack and Assassination Attempt, January 17, 2001: In India, six members of the Lashkar-e-Tayyba mi litant group were killed when they attempted to seize a local airport. Members of Hizbul Mujaheddin fired two rifle grenad es at Farooq Abdullah, Chief Minister for Jammu and Kashmir. Two persons were wounded in the unsuccessful assassi nation attempt.

BBC Studios Bombing, March 4, 2001: A car bomb exploded at midnight outside of the British Broadcasting Corporation Â's main production studios in London. One person was injured. British authorities suspected the Real IRA had planted the bomb.

Suicide Bombing in Israel, March 4, 2001: A suicide bomb attack in Netanya killed 3 persons and wounded 65. HAMAS later claimed responsibility.

ETA Bombing, March 9, 2001: Two policemen were killed by the explosion of a car bomb in Hernani, Spain.

Airliner Hijacking in Istanbul, March 15, 2001: Three Chechens hijacked a Russian airliner during a flight from Istanbul to Moscow and forced it to fly to Medina, Saudi Arabia. The plane carried 162 passengers and a crew of 12. After a 22-hour siege during which more than 40 passengers were released, Saudi security forces stormed the plane, killing a hijack er, a passenger, and a flight attendant.

Bus Stop Bombing, April 22, 2001: A member of HAMAS detonated a bomb he was carrying near a bus stop in Kfar Siv a, Israel, killing one person and injuring 60.

Philippines Hostage Incident, May 27, 2001: Muslim Abu Sayyaf guerrillas seized 13 tourists and 3 staff members at a r esort on Palawan Island and took their captives to Basilan Island. The captives included three U.S. citizens: Guellermo Sobero and missionaries Martin and Gracia Burnham. Philippine troops fought a series of battles with the guerrillas betw een June 1 and June 3 during which 9 hostages escaped and two were found dead. The guerrillas took additional hostages when they seized the hospital in the town of Lamitan. On June 12, Abu Sayyaf spokesman Abu Sabaya claimed that Sobero had been killed and beheaded; his body was found in October. The Burnhams remained in captivity until June 2 002.

Tel-Aviv Nightclub Bombing, June 1, 2001: HAMAS claimed responsibility for the suicide bombing of a popular Israeli ni

ghtclub that caused over 140 casualties.

HAMAS Restaurant Bombing, August 9, 2001: A HAMAS-planted bomb detonated in a Jerusalem pizza restaurant, killing 15 people and wounding more than 90. The Israeli response included occupation of Orient House, the Palestine Libe ration OrganizationÂ's political headquarters in East Jerusalem.

Suicide Bombing in Israel, September 9, 2001: The first suicide bombing carried out by an Israeli Arab killed 3 persons in Nahariya. HAMAS claimed responsibility.

Death of "the Lion of the Panjshir", September 9, 2001: Two suicide bombers fatally wounded Ahmed Shah Massoud, a leader of AfghanistanÂ's Northern Alliance, which had opposed both the Soviet occupation and the post-Soviet Taliban government. The bombers posed as journalists and were apparently linked to al-Qaida. The Northern Alliance did not confirm MassoudÂ's death until September 15.

Terrorist Attacks on U.S. Homeland, September 11, 2001: Two hijacked airliners crashed into the twin towers of the Wo rld Trade Center. Soon thereafter, the Pentagon was struck by a third hijacked plane. A fourth hijacked plane, suspected to be bound for a high-profile target in Washington, crashed into a field in southern Pennsylvania. The attacks killed 3,02 5 U.S. citizens and other nationals. President Bush and Cabinet officials indicated that Usama Bin Laden was the prime suspect and that they considered the United States in a state of war with international terrorism. In the aftermath of the a ttacks, the United States formed the Global Coalition Against Terrorism.

Attack on the Jammu and Kashmir Legislature, October 1, 2001: After a suicide car bomber forced the gate of the state legislature in Srinagar, two gunmen entered the building and held off police for seven hours before being killed. Forty per sons died in the incident. Jaish-e-Muhammad claimed responsibility.

Anthrax Attacks, October-November 2001: On October 7 the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) re ported that investigators had detected evidence that the deadly anthrax bacterium was present in the building where a FI orida man who died of anthrax on October 5 had worked. Discovery of a second anthrax case triggered a major investig ation by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). The two anthrax cases were the first to appear in the United States in 25 years. Anthrax subsequently appeared in mail received by television networks in New York and by the offices in Was hington of Senate Majority Leader Tom Daschle and other members of Congress. Attorney General John Ashcroft said in a briefing on October 16, "When people send anthrax through the mail to hurt people and invoke terror, itÂ's a terrorist act."

Assassination of an Israeli Cabinet Minister, October 17, 2001: A Palestinian gunman assassinated Israeli Minister of T ourism Rehavam Zeevi in the Jerusalem hotel where he was staying. The Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine (PFLP) claimed to have avenged the death of PFLP Mustafa Zubari.

Attack on a Church in Pakistan, October 28, 2001: Six masked gunmen shot up a church in Bahawalpur, Pakistan, killing 15 Pakistani Christians. No group claimed responsibility, although various militant Muslim groups were suspected.

Suicide Bombings in Jerusalem, December 1, 2001: Two suicide bombers attacked a Jerusalem shopping mall, killing 1 0 persons and wounding 170.

Suicide Bombing in Haifa, December 2, 2001: A suicide bomb attack aboard a bus in Haifa, Israel, killed 15 persons an d wounded 40. HAMAS claimed responsibility for both this attack and those on December 1 to avenge the death of a HA MAS member at the hands of Israeli forces a week earlier.

Attack on the Indian Parliament, December 13, 2001: Five gunmen attacked the Indian Parliament in New Delhi shortly after it had adjourned. Before security forces killed them, the attackers killed 6 security personnel and a gardener. Indian officials blamed Lashkar-e-Tayyiba and demanded that Pakistan crack down on it and on other Muslim separatist groups in Kashmir.

2002

Ambush on the West Bank, January 15, 2002: Palestinian militants fired on a vehicle in Beit Sahur, killing one passenge r and wounding the other. The dead passenger claimed U.S. and Israeli citizenship. The al-Aqsa MartyrsÂ' Battalion clai

med responsibility.

Shooting Incident in Israel, January 17, 2002: A Palestinian gunman killed 6 persons and wounded 25 in Hadera, Israel, before being killed by Israeli police. The al-Aqsa MartyrsÂ' Brigades claimed responsibility as revenge for IsraelÂ's killing of a leading member of the group.

Drive-By Shooting at a U.S. Consulate, January 22, 2002: Armed militants on motorcycles fired on the U.S. Consulate in Calcutta, India, killing 5 Indian security personnel and wounding 13 others. The Harakat ul-Jihad-I-Islami and the Asif Raza Commandoes claimed responsibility. Indian police later killed two suspects, one of whom confessed to belonging to Lashkar-e-Tayyiba as he died.

Bomb Explosion in Kashmir, January 22, 2002: A bomb exploded in a crowded retail district in Jammu, Kashmir, killing one person and injuring nine. No group claimed responsibility.

Kidnapping of Daniel Pearl, January 23, 2002: Armed militants kidnapped Wall Street Journal reporter Daniel Pearl in K arachi, Pakistan. Pakistani authorities received a videotape on February 20 depicting PearlÂ's murder. His grave was fo und near Karachi on May 16. Pakistani authorities arrested four suspects. Ringleader Ahmad Omar Saeed Sheikh claim ed to have organized PearlÂ's kidnapping to protest PakistanÂ's subservience to the United States, and had belonged t o Jaish-e-Muhammad, an Islamic separatist group in Kashmir. All four suspects were convicted on July 15. Saeed Sheik h was sentenced to death, the others to life imprisonment.

Suicide Bombing in Jerusalem, January 27, 2002: A suicide bomb attack in Jerusalem killed one other person and wou nded 100. The incident was the first suicide bombing made by a Palestinian woman.

Suicide Bombing in the West Bank, February 16, 2002: A suicide bombing in an outdoor food court in Karmei Shomron killed 4 persons and wounded 27. Two of the dead and two of the wounded were U.S. citizens. The Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine (PFLP) claimed responsibility.

Suicide Bombing in the West Bank, March 7, 2002: A suicide bombing in a supermarket in the settlement of Ariel wound ed 10 persons, one of whom was a U.S. citizen. The PFLP claimed responsibility.

Suicide Bombing in Jerusalem, March 9, 2002: A suicide bombing in a Jerusalem restaurant killed 11 persons and wounded 52, one of whom was a U.S. citizen. The al-Aqsa MartyrsÂ' Brigades claimed responsibility.

Drive-By Shooting in Colombia, March 14, 2002: Gunmen on motorcycles shot and killed two U.S. citizens who had co me to Cali, Colombia, to negotiate the release of their father, who was a captive of the FARC. No group claimed respons ibility.

Grenade Attack on a Church in Pakistan, March 17, 2002: Militants threw grenades into the Protestant International Church in Islamabad, Pakistan, during a service attended by diplomatic and local personnel. Five persons, two of them U.S. citizens, were killed and 46 were wounded. The dead Americans were State Department employee Barbara Green and her daughter Kristen Wormsley. Thirteen U.S. citizens were among the wounded. The Lashkar-e-Tayyiba group was sus pected.

Car Bomb Explosion in Peru, March 20, 2002: A car bomb exploded at a shopping center near the U.S. Embassy in Lim a, Peru. Nine persons were killed and 32 wounded. The dead included two police officers and a teenager. Peruvian auth orities suspected either the Shining Path rebels or the Tupac Amaru Revolutionary Movement. The attack occurred 3 days before President George W. Bush visited Peru.

Suicide Bombing in Jerusalem, March 21, 2002: A suicide bombing in Jerusalem killed 3 persons and wounded 86 mor e, including 2 U.S. citizens. The Palestinian Islamic Jihad claimed responsibility.

Suicide Bombing in Israel, March 27, 2002: A suicide bombing in a noted restaurant in Netanya, Israel, killed 22 person s and wounded 140. One of the dead was a U.S. citizen. The Islamic Resistance Movement (HAMAS) claimed responsibility.

Temple Bombing in Kashmir, March 30, 2002: A bomb explosion at a Hindu temple in Jammu, Kashmir, killed 10 persons. The Islamic Front claimed responsibility.

Suicide Bombing in the West Bank, March 31, 2002: A suicide bombing near an ambulance station in Efrat wounded fo ur persons, including a U.S. citizen. The al-Aqsa MartyrsÂ' Brigades claimed responsibility.

Armed attack on Kashmir, April 10, 2002: Armed militants attacked a residence in Gando, Kashmir, killing five persons and wounding four. No group claimed responsibility.

Synagogue Bombing in Tunisia, April 11, 2002: A suicide bomber detonated a truck loaded with propane gas outside a historic synagogue in Djerba, Tunisia. The 16 dead included 11 Germans, one French citizen, and three Tunisians. Twe nty-six German tourists were injured. The Islamic Army for the Liberation of the Holy Sites claimed responsibility.

Suicide Bombing in Jerusalem, April 12, 2002: A female suicide bomber killed 6 persons in Jerusalem and wounded 90 others. The al-Agsa MartyrsÂ' Brigades claimed responsibility.

Car Bombing in Pakistan, May 8, 2002: A car bomb exploded near a Pakistani navy shuttle bus in Karachi, killing 12 per sons and wounding 19. Eleven of the dead and 11 of the wounded were French nationals. Al-Qaida was suspected of the attack.

Parade Bombing in Russia, May 9, 2002: A remotely-controlled bomb exploded near a May Day parade in Kaspiisk, Da gestan, killing 42 persons and wounding 150. Fourteen of the dead and 50 of the wounded were soldiers. Islamists linke d to al-Qaida were suspected.

Attack on a Bus in India, May 14, 2002: Militants fired on a passenger bus in Kaluchak, Jammu, killing 7 persons. They then entered a military housing complex and killed 3 soldiers and 7 military dependents before they were killed. The al-Mansooran and Jamiat ul-Mujahedin claimed responsibility.

Bomb Attacks in Kashmir, May 17, 2002: A bomb explosion near a civil secretariat area in Srinagar, Kashmir, wounded 6 persons. In Jammu, a bomb exploded at a fire services headquarters, killing two and wounding 16. No group claimed r esponsibility for either attack.

Hostage Rescue Attempt in the Philippines, June 7, 2002: Philippine Army troops attacked Abu Sayyaf terrorists on Min danao Island in an attempt to rescue U.S. citizen Martin Burnham and his wife Gracia, who had been kidnapped more th an a year ago. Burnham was killed but his wife, though wounded, was freed. A Filipino hostage was killed, as were four of the guerrillas. Seven soldiers were wounded.

Car Bombing in Pakistan, June 14, 2002: A car bomb exploded near the U.S. Consulate and the Marriott Hotel in Karac hi, Pakistan. Eleven persons were killed and 51 were sounded, including one U.S. and one Japanese citizen. Al Qaida a nd al-Qanin were suspected.

Suicide Bombing in Jerusalem, June 19, 2002: A suicide bombing at a bus stop in Jerusalem killed 6 persons and wounded 43, including 2 U.S. citizens. The al-Agsa MartyrsÂ' Brigades claimed responsibility.

Suicide Bombing in Tel Aviv, July 17, 2002: Two suicide bombers attacked the old bus station in Tel Aviv, Israel, killing 5 persons and wounding 38. The dead included one Romanian and two Chinese; another Romanian was wounded. The Islamic Jihad claimed responsibility.

Bombing at the Hebrew University, July 31, 2002: A bomb hidden in a bag in the Frank Sinatra International Student Ce nter of JerusalemÂ's Hebrew University killed 9 persons and wounded 87. The dead included 5 U.S. citizens and 4 Israe lis. The wounded included 4 U.S. citizens, 2 Japanese, and 3 South Koreans. The Islamic Resistance Movement (HAMA S) claimed responsibility.

Suicide Bombing in Israel, August 4, 2002: A suicide bomb attack on a bus in Safed, Israel, killed 9 persons and wound ed 50. Two of the dead were Philippine citizens; many of the wounded were soldiers returning from leave. HAMAS claim ed responsibility.

Attack on a School in Pakistan, August 5, 2002: Gunmen attacked a Christian school attended by children of missionari es from around the world. Six persons (two security guards, a cook, a carpenter, a receptionist, and a private citizen) we re killed and a Philippine citizen was wounded. A group called al-Intigami al-Pakistani claimed responsibility.

Attack on Pilgrims in Kashmir, August 6, 2002: Armed militants attacked a group of Hindu pilgrims with guns and grena des in Pahalgam, Kashmir. Nine persons were killed and 32 were wounded. The Lashkar-e-Tayyiba claimed responsibility.

Assassination in Kashmir, September 11, 2002: Gunmen killed KashmirÂ's Law Minister Mushtaq Ahmed Lone and six security guards in Tikipora. Lashkar-e-Tayyiga, Jamiat ul-Mujahedin, and Hizb ul-Mujahedin all claimed responsibility. Ot her militants attacked the residence of the Minister of Tourism with grenades, injuring four persons. No group claimed re sponsibility.

Ambush on the West Bank, September 18, 2002: Gunmen ambushed a vehicle on a road near Yahad, killing an Israeli and wounding a Romanian worker. The al-Aqsa MartyrsÂ' Brigades claimed responsibility.

Suicide Bomb Attack in Israel, September 19, 2002: A suicide bomb attack on a bus in Tel Aviv killed 6 persons and wo unded 52. One of the dead was a British subject. HAMAS claimed responsibility.

Attack on a French Tanker, October 6, 2002: An explosive-laden boat rammed the French oil tanker Limburg, which was anchored about 5 miles off al-Dhabbah, Yemen. One person was killed and 4 were wounded. Al-Qaida was suspected

Car Bomb Explosion in Bali, October 12, 2002: A car bomb exploded outside the Sari Club Discotheque in Denpasar, B ali, Indonesia, killing 202 persons and wounding 300 more. Most of the casualties, including 88 of the dead, were Austral ian tourists. Seven Americans were among the dead. Al-Qaida claimed responsibility. Two suspects were later arrested and convicted. Iman Samudra, who had trained in Afghanistan with al-Qaeda and was suspected of belonging to Jemaa h Islamiya, was sentenced to death on September 10, 2003.

Chechen Rebels Seize a Moscow Theater, October 23-26, 2002: Fifty Chechen rebels led by Movsar Barayev seized the Palace of Culture Theater in Moscow, Russia, to demand an end to the war in Chechnya. They seized more than 800 hostages from 13 countries and threatened to blow up the theater. During a three-day siege, they killed a Russian police man and five Russian hostages. On October 26, Russian Special Forces pumped an anesthetic gas through the ventilati on system and then stormed the theater. All of the rebels were killed, but 94 hostages (including one American) also die d, many from the effects of the gas. A group led by Chechen warlord Shamil Basayev claimed responsibility.

Assassination of an AID Official, October 28, 2002: Gunmen in Amman assassinated Laurence Foley, Executive Officer of the U.S. Agency for International Development Mission in Jordan. The Honest People of Jordan claimed responsibility

Suicide Bombing in Jerusalem, November 21, 2002: A suicide bomb attack on a bus on Mexico Street in Jerusalem kille d 11 persons and wounded 50 more. One of the dead was a Romanian. HAMAS claimed responsibility.

Attack on Temples in Kashmir, November 24, 2002: Armed militants attacked the Reghunath and Shiv temples in Jammu, Kashmir, killing 13 persons and wounding 50. The Lashkare-e-Tayyiba claimed responsibility.

Attacks on Israeli Tourists in Kenya, November 28, 2002: A three-person suicide car bomb attack on the Paradise Hotel in Mombasa, Kenya, killed 15 persons and wounded 40. Three of the dead and 18 of the wounded were Israeli tourists; the others were Kenyans. Near MombasaÂ's airport, two SA-7 shoulder-fired missiles were fired as an Arkia Airlines Boeing 757 that was carrying 261 passengers back to Israel. Both missiles missed. Al-Qaida, the Government of Universal Palestine in Exile, and the Army of Palestine claimed responsibility for both attacks. Al-Ittihad al-Islami was also suspected of involvement.

Attack on a Bus in the Philippines, December 26, 2002: Armed militants ambushed a bus carrying Filipino workers employed by the Canadian Toronto Ventures Inc. Pacific mining company in Zamboanga del Norte. Thirteen persons were killed and 10 wounded. Philippine authorities suspected the Moro Islamic Liberation Front (MILF), which had been extorting money from Toronto Ventures. The Catholic charity Caritas-Philippines said that Toronto Ventures had harassed tribes men who opposed mining on their ancestral lands.

Bombing of a Government Building in Chechnya, December 27, 2002: A suicide bomb attack involving two explosives-laden trucks destroyed the offices of the pro-Russian Chechen government in Grozny. The attack killed over 80 people a

nd wounded 210. According to a Chechen website run by the Kavkaz Center, Chechen warlord Shamil Basayev claimed responsibility.

2003

Suicide Bombings in Tel Aviv, January 5, 2003: Two suicide bomb attacks killed 22 and wounded at least 100 persons in Tel Aviv, Israel. Six of the victims were foreign workers. The Al-Agsa MartyrsÂ' Brigades claimed responsibility.

Night Club Bombing in Colombia, February 7, 2003: A car bomb exploded outside a night club in Bogota, Colombia, killing 32 persons and wounding 160. No group claimed responsibility, but Colombian officials suspected the Colombian Revolutionary Armed Forces (FARC) of committing the worst terrorist attack in the country in a decade.

Assasination of a Kurdish Leader, February 8, 2003: Members of Ansar al-Islam assassinated Kurdish legislator Shawk at Haji Mushir and captured two other Kurdish officials in Qamash Tapa in northern Iraq.

Suicide Bombing in Haifa, March 5, 2003: A suicide bombing aboard a bus in Haifa, Israel, killed 15 persons and wound ed at least 40. One of the dead claimed U.S. as well as Israeli citizenship. The bomberÂ's affiliation was not immediately known.

Suicide Bombing in Netanya, March 30, 2003: A suicide bombing in a cafe in Netanya, Israel, wounded 38 persons. Only the bomber was killed. Islamic Jihad claimed responsibility and called the attack a "gift" to the people of Iraq.

Unsuccessful Hostage Rescue Attempt in Colombia, May 5, 2003: The FARC killed 10 hostages when Colombian speci al forces tried to rescue them from a jungle hideout near Urrao, in Colombiaâ's Antioquia State. The dead included Gov ernor Guillermo Gavira and former Defense Minister Gilberto Echeverri Mejia, who had been kidnapped in April 2002.

Truck Bomb Attacks in Saudi Arabia, May 12, 2003: Suicide bombers attacked three residential compounds for foreign workers in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia. The 34 dead included 9 attackers, 7 other Saudis, 9 U.S. citizens, and one citizen each from the United Kingdom, Ireland, and the Philippines. Another American died on June 1. It was the first major attack on U.S. targets in Saudi Arabia since the end of the war in Iraq. Saudi authorities arrested 11 al-Qaida suspects on May 28.

Truck Bombing in Chechnya, May 12, 2003: A truck bomb explosion demolished a government compound in Znamensk oye, Chechnya, killing 54 persons. Russian authorities blamed followers of a Saudi-born Islamist named Abu Walid. Pre sident Vladimir Putin said that he suspected that there was an al-Qaida connection.

Attempted Assassination in Chechnya, May 12, 2003: Two female suicide bombers attacked Chechen Administrator Mu fti Akhmed Kadyrov during a religious festival in Iliskhan Yurt. Kadyrov escaped injury, but 14 other persons were killed and 43 were wounded. Chechen rebel leader Shamil Basayev claimed responsibility.

Suicide Bomb Attacks in Morocco, May 16, 2003: A team of 12 suicide bombers attacked five targets in Casablanca, M orocco, killing 43 persons and wounding 100. The targets were a Spanish restaurant, a Jewish community, a Jewish ce metery, a hotel, and the Belgian Consulate. The Moroccan Government blamed the Islamist al-Assirat al-Moustaquim (The Righteous Path), but foreign commentators suspected an al-Qaida connection.

Suicide Bomb Attack in Jerusalem, May 18, 2003: A suicide bomb attack on a bus in JerusalemÂ's French Hill district ki lled 7 persons and wounded 20. The bomber was disguised as a religious Jew. HAMAS claimed responsibility

Suicide Bombing in Afula, May 19, 2003: A suicide bomb attack by a female Palestinian student killed 3 persons and wo unded 52 at a shopping mall in Afula, Israel. Both Islamic Jihad and the al-Aqsa MartyrsÂ' Brigades claimed responsibilit y.

Suicide Bombing in Jerusalem, June 11, 2003: A suicide bombing aboard a bus in Jerusalem killed 16 persons and wou nded at least 70, one of whom died later. HAMAS claimed responsibility, calling it revenge for an Israeli helicopter attack on HAMAS leader Abdelaziz al-Rantisi in Gaza City the day before.

Truck Bombing in Northern Ossetia, August 1, 2003: A suicide truck bomb attack destroyed a Russian military hospital i

n Mozdok, North Ossetia and killed 50 persons. Russian authorities attributed the attack to followers of Chechen rebel le ader Shamil Basayev.

Hotel Bombing in Indonesia, August 5, 2003: A car bomb exploded outside the Marriott Hotel in Jakarta, Indonesia, killing 10 persons and wounding 150. One of the dead was a Dutch citizen. The wounded included an American, a Canadian, an Australian, and two Chinese. Indonesian authorities suspected the Jemaah Islamiah, which had carried out the Octo ber 12, 2002 bombing in Bali.

Bombing of the Jordanian Embassy in Baghdad, August 7, 2003: A car bomb exploded outside the Jordanian Embassy in Baghdad, Iraq, killing 19 persons and wounding 65. Most of the victims were apparently Iraqis, including 5 police offic ers. No group claimed responsibility.

Suicide Bombings in Israel and the West Bank, August 12, 2003: The first suicide bombings since the June 29 Israeli-P alestinian truce took place. The first, in a supermarket at Rosh Haayin, Israel, killed one person and wounded 14. The se cond, at a bus stop near the Ariel settlement in the West Bank, killed one person and wounded 3. The al-Aqsa MartyrsÂ' Brigades claimed responsibility for the first; HAMAS claimed responsibility for the second.

Bombing of the UN Headquarters in Baghdad, August 19, 2003: A truck loaded with surplus Iraqi ordnance exploded ou tside the United Nations Headquarters in BaghdadÂ's Canal Hotel. A hospital across the street was also heavily damage d. The 23 dead included UN Special Representative Sergio Viera de Mello. More than 100 persons were wounded. It was not clear whether the bomber was a Baath Party loyalist or a foreign Islamic militant. An al-Qaeda branch called the Brigades of the Martyr Abu Hafz al-Masri later claimed responsibility.

Suicide Bombing in Jerusalem, August 19, 2003: A suicide bombing aboard a bus in Jerusalem killed 20 persons and in jured at least 100, one of whom died later. Five of the dead were American citizens. HAMAS and Islamic Jihad claimed r esponsibility, although HAMAS leader al-Rantisi said that his organization remained committed to the truce while reserving the right to respond to Israeli military actions.

Car Bomb Kills ShiÂ'ite Leader in Najaf, August 29, 2003: A car bomb explosion outside the Shrine of the Imam Ali in N ajaf, Iraq killed at least 81 persons and wounded at least 140. The dead included the Ayatollah Mohammed Bakir al-Hakir m, one of four leading ShiÂ'ite clerics in Iraq. Al-Hakim had been the leader of the Supreme Council for the Islamic Revo lution in Iraq (SCIRI) since its establishment in 1982, and SCIRI had recently agreed to work with the U.S.-sponsored Iraq i Governing Council. It was not known whether the perpetrators were Baath Party loyalists, rival ShiÂ'ites, or foreign Isl amists.

Suicide Bombings in Israel, September 9, 2003: Two suicide bombings took place in Israel. The first, at a bus stop near the Tsrifin army base southeast of Tel Aviv, killed 7 soldiers and wounded 14 soldiers and a civilian. The second, at a ca fé in JerusalemÂ's German Colony neighborhood, killed 6 persons and wounded 40. HAMAS did not claim responsibility until the next day, although a spokesman called the first attack" a response to Israeli aggression."

Assassination of an Iraqi Governing Council Member, September 20, 2003: Gunmen shot and seriously wounded Akila Hashimi, one of three female members of the Iraqi Governing Council, near her home in Baghdad. She died September 25.

A Second Attack on the UN Headquarters in Baghdad, September 22, 2003: A suicide car bomb attack on the UN Head quarters in Baghdad killed a security guard and wounded 19 other persons.

Suicide Bombing in Israel, October 4, 2003: A Palestinian woman made a suicide bomb attack on a restaurant in Haifa, killing 19 persons and wounding at least 55. Islamic Jihad claimed responsibility for the attack. The next day, Israel bom bed a terrorist training camp in Syria.

Attacks in Iraq, October 9, 2003: Gunmen assassinated a Spanish military attaché in Baghdad. A suicide car bomb att ack on an Iraqi police station killed 8 persons and wounded 40.

Car Bombings in Baghdad, October 12, 2003: Two suicide car bombs exploded outside the Baghdad Hotel, which hous ed U.S. officials. Six persons were killed and 32 wounded. Iraqi and U.S. security personnel apparently kept the cars from actually reaching the hotel.

Bomb Attack on U.S. Diplomats in the Gaza Strip, October 15, 2003: A remote-controlled bomb exploded under a car in a U.S. diplomatic convoy passing through the northern Gaza Strip. Three security guards, all employees of DynCorp, we re killed. A fourth was wounded. The diplomats were on their way to interview Palestinian candidates for Fulbright schola rships to study in the United States. Palestinian President Arafat and Prime Minister Qurei condemned the attack, while the major Palestinian militant groups denied responsibility. The next day, Palestinian security forces arrested several sus pects, some of whom belonged to the Popular Resistance Committees.

Rocket Attack on the al-Rashid Hotel in Baghdad, October 26, 2003: Iraqis using an improvised rocket launcher bombar ded the al-Rashid Hotel in Baghdad, killing one U.S. Army officer and wounding 17 persons. The wounded included 4 U.S. military personnel and seven American civilians. Deputy Secretary of Defense Paul D. Wolfowitz, who was staying at the hotel, was not injured. After visiting the wounded, he said, "TheyÂ're not going to scare us away; weÂ're not giving up on this job."

Assassination of a Deputy Mayor in Baghdad, October 26, 2003: Two gunmen believed to be Baath Party loyalists assa ssinated Faris Abdul Razaq al-Assam, one of three deputy mayors of Baghdad. U.S. officials did not announce al-Assa mÂ's death until October 28.

Wave of Car Bombings in Baghdad, October 27, 2003: A series of suicide car bombings in Baghdad killed at least 35 p ersons and wounded at least 230. Four attacks were directed at Iraqi police stations, the fifth and most destructive was d irected at the International Committee of the Red Cross headquarters, where at least 12 persons were killed. A sixth atta ck failed when a car bomb failed to explode and the bomber was wounded and captured by Iraqi police. U.S. and Iraqi of ficials suspected that foreign terrorists were involved; the unsuccessful bomber said he was a Syrian national and carrie d a Syrian passport. After a meeting with Administrator L. Paul Bremer, President Bush said, "The more successful we a re on the ground, the more these killers will react."

Suicide Bombing in Riyadh, November 8, 2003: In Riyadh, a suicide car bombing took place in the Muhaya residential c ompound, which was occupied mainly by nationals of other Arab countries. Seventeen persons were killed and 122 wer e wounded. The latter included 4 Americans. The next day, Deputy Secretary of State Armitage said al-Qaeda was probably responsible.

Truck Bombing in Nasiriyah, November 12, 2003: A suicide truck bomb destroyed the headquarters of the Italian militar y police in Nasiriyah, Iraq, killing 18 Italians and 11 Iraqis and wounding at least 100 persons.

Synagogue Bombings in Istanbul, November 15, 2003: Two suicide truck bombs exploded outside the Neve Shalom an d Beth Israel synagogues in Istanbul, killing 25 persons and wounding at least 300 more. The initial claim of responsibilit y came from a Turkish militant group, the Great Eastern Islamic RaidersÂ' Front, but Turkish authorities suspected an al-Qaeda connection. The next day, the London-based newspaper al-Quds al-Arabi received an e-mail in which an al-Qae da branch called the Brigades of the Martyr Abu Hafz al-Masri claimed responsibility for the Istanbul synagogue bombin gs.

Grenade Attacks in Bogota, November 15, 2003: Grenade attacks on two bars frequented by Americans in Bogota kille d one person and wounded 72, including 4 Americans. Colombian authorities suspected FARC (the Revolutionary Arme d Forces of Colombia). The U.S. Embassy suspected that the attacks had targeted Americans and warned against visiting commercial centers and places of entertainment.

More Suicide Truck Bombings in Istanbul, November 20, 2003: Two more suicide truck bombings devastated the British HSBC Bank and the British Consulate General in Istanbul, killing 27 persons and wounding at least 450. The dead included Consul General Roger Short. U.S., British, and Turkish officials suspected that al-Qaeda had struck again. The U.S. Consulate in Istanbul was closed, and the Embassy in Ankara advised American citizens in Istanbul to stay home.

Car Bombing in Kirkuk, November 20, 2003: A suicide car bombing in Kirkuk killed 5 persons. The target appeared to be the headquarters of the Patriotic Union of Kurdistan. PUK officials suspected the Ansar al-Islam group, which was said to have sheltered fugitive Taliban and al-Qaeda members after the U.S. campaign in Afghanistan.

Attacks on Other Coalition Personnel in Iraq, November 29-30, 2003: Iraqi insurgents stepped up attacks on nationals of other members of the Coalition. On November 29, an ambush in Mahmudiyah killed 7 out of a party of 8 Spanish intelligence officers. Iraqi insurgents also killed two Japanese diplomats near Tikrit. On November 30, another ambush near Tikrit killed two South Korean electrical workers and wounded two more. A Colombian employee of Kellogg Brown & Root

was killed and two were wounded in an ambush near Balad.

Train Bombing in Southern Russia, December 5, 2003: A suicide bomb attack killed 42 persons and wounded 150 aboa rd a Russian commuter train in the south Russian town of Yessentuki. Russian officials suspected Chechen rebels; Pres ident Putin said the attack was meant to disrupt legislative elections. Chechen rebel leader Aslan Maskhadov denied an y involvement.

Suicide Bombing in Moscow, December 9, 2003: A female suicide bomber killed 5 other persons and wounded 14 outsi de MoscowÂ's National Hotel. She was said to be looking for the State Duma.

Suicide Car Bombings in Iraq, December 15, 2003: Two days after the capture of Saddam Hussein, there were two suic ide car bomb attacks on Iraqi police stations. One at Husainiyah killed 8 persons and wounded 20. The other, at Ameriy ah, wounded 7 Iraqi police. Guards repelled a second veh

Dick Cheney, Hugo Chávez and Bill Clinton's Band Greg Palast, Â August 16, 2004

There's so much BS and baloney thrown around about Venezuela that I may be violating some rule of US journalism by providing some facts. Let's begin with this: 77% of Venezuela's farmland is owned by 3% of the population, the 'hacenda dos.'

I met one of these farmlords in Caracas at an anti-Chavez protest march. Oddest demonstration I've ever seen: frosted blondes in high heels clutching designer bags, screeching, "Chavez - dic-ta-dor!" The plantation owner griped about the "socialismo" of Chavez, then jumped into his Jaguar convertible.

That week, Chavez himself handed me a copy of the "socialist" manifesto that so rattled the man in the Jag. It was a ne w law passed by Venezuela's Congress which gave land to the landless. The Chavez law transferred only fields from the giant haciendas which had been left unused and abandoned.

This land reform, by the way, was promoted to Venezuela in the 1960s by that Lefty radical, John F. Kennedy. Venezuel

a's dictator of the time agreed to hand out land, but forgot to give peasants title to their property.

But Chavez won't forget, because the mirror reminds him. What the affable president sees in his reflection, beyond the ri bbons of office, is a "negro e indio" -- a "Black and Indian" man, dark as a cola nut, same as the landless and, until now, the hopeless. For the first time in Venezuela's history, the 80% Black-Indian population elected a man with skin darker th an the man in the Jaguar.

So why, with a huge majority of the electorate behind him, twice in elections and today in a referendum, is Hugo Chavez in hot water with our democracy-promoting White House?

Maybe it's the oil. Lots of it. Chavez sits atop a reserve of crude that rivals Iraq's. And it's not his presidency of Venezuel a that drives the White House bananas, it was his presidency of the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries, OP EC. While in control of the OPEC secretariat, Chavez cut a deal with our maximum leader of the time, Bill Clinton, on the price of oil. It was a 'Goldilocks' plan. The price would not be too low, not too high; just right, kept between \$20 and \$30 a barrel.

But Dick Cheney does not like Clinton nor Chavez nor their band. To him, the oil industry's (and Saudi Arabia's) freedom to set oil prices is as sacred as freedom of speech is to the ACLU. I got this info, by the way, from three top oil industry I obbyists.

Why should Chavez worry about what Dick thinks? Because, said one of the oil men, the Veep in his bunker, not the pre tzel-chewer in the White House, "runs energy policy in the United States."

And what seems to have gotten our Veep's knickers in a twist is not the price of oil, but who keeps the loot from the curr ent band-busting spurt in prices. Chavez had his Congress pass another oil law, the "Law of Hydrocarbons," which chan ges the split. Right now, the oil majors - like PhillipsConoco - keep 84% of the proceeds of the sale of Venezuela oil; the nation gets only 16%.

Chavez wanted to double his Treasury's take to 30%. And for good reason. Landless, hungry peasants have, over deca des, drifted into Caracas and other cities, building million-person ghettos of cardboard shacks and open sewers. Chavez promised to do something about that.

And he did. "Chavez gives them bread and bricks," one Venezuelan TV reporter told me. The blonde TV newscaster, in the middle of a publicity shoot, said the words "pan y ladrillos" with disdain, making it clear that she never touched bricks and certainly never waited in a bread line.

But to feed and house the darker folk in those bread and brick lines, Chavez would need funds, and the 16% slice of the oil pie wouldn't do it. So the President of Venezuela demanded 30%, leaving Big Oil only 70%. Suddenly, Bill Clinton's al ly in Caracas became Mr. Cheney's -- and therefore, Mr. Bush's -- enemy.

So began the Bush-Cheney campaign to "Floridate" the will of the Venezuela electorate. It didn't matter that Chavez had twice won election. Winning most of the votes, said a White House spokesman, did not make Chavez' government "legiti mate." Hmmm. Secret contracts were awarded by our Homeland Security spooks to steal official Venezuela voter lists. Cash passed discreetly from the US taxpayer, via the so-called 'Endowment for Democracy,' to the Chavez-haters running today's "recall" election.

A brilliant campaign of placing stories about Chavez' supposed unpopularity and "dictatorial" manner seized US news an d op-ed pages, ranging from the San Francisco Chronicle to the New York Times.

But some facts just can't be smothered in propaganda ink. While George Bush can appoint the government of Iraq and c all it "sovereign," the government of Venezuela is appointed by its people. And the fact is that most people in this slum-c hoked land don't drive Jaguars or have their hair tinted in Miami. Most look in the mirror and see someone "negro e indio," as dark as their President Hugo.

The official CIA handbook on Venezuela says that half the nation's farmers own only 1% of the land. They are the lucky ones, as more peasants owned nothing. That is, until their man Chavez took office. Even under Chavez, land redistributi on remains more a promise than an accomplishment. But today, the landless and homeless voted their hopes, knowing t hat their man may not, against the armed axis of local oligarchs and Dick Cheney, succeed for them. But they are convin

ced he will never forget them.

And that's a fact.

I've started researching Nazism. Here is what occurred in a small town in Germany around 1933. The name of the town is Northeim. The information is taken from, The New Order, The Third Reich/Time-Life Books.

"The nazification of Northeim did not take that long. By May 1933, one-fifth of the town's adults, 1200 people, had joined the party. Not everyone joined voluntarily or for motives of personal advancement. Some, such as Otto von Schulenber g, the county prefect, had little choice. The Nazi county leader, Walter Steineck, threw a swastika pin on Schenlenberg's desk and said, "Put that on! If you don't, you won't be prefect tomorrow." Others were pressured, less bluntly but just as effectively, by their own families. One resident remembered wives "who actually went out and bought a brown shirt and put their men into it." (page 34)

(page 40)

"Meanwhile, the process of nazification extended to Northeim's every nook. The railroad unions, civil servants' society, c raft guilds, and shooting and sports clubs, as well as the organizations of doctors, dentists, and teachers, immediately b ecame targets. Each was taken over by the Nazis or replaced by a parallel Nazi organization and then forced to dissolv e. Surviving organizations all had the prefix "National Socialist" added to their names. Even the local Lutherans, confid ent that their support of the Nazis would bring rewards, found instead that the Nazis intended to take over the churches. The Nazis set out to win Lutheran elective offices and urged the church elders to join the German Christian Movement, a pro-Nazi infiltration group. Even the public library was nazified when 500 volumes of "worthless literary trash" were burn ed.

The people in Northeim who were not converted or neutralized by nazification were usually subjected to terror. In April, a four-day boycott of the town's Jewish businesses was announced as retaliation against "international Jewry" for "sland ering" Germany. The action notified astonished Northeimers that while the Nazis had soft-pedaled their anti-Semitism d uring the election campaigns, they had no intention of doing so now. Once the point was made, most of the town's 120

Jews submitted to their new role as second-class citizens. And signs appeared in non-Jewish stores that read, "Purely Christian Family Enterprise" and German Merchant." Later, the signs declared, "Jews not admitted."

I imagine that these times will be repeated once again. What Scripture do these events bring to mind?

"It's a fact -- as a child he could not have seen a Soviet tank in Styria," the southeastern province where Schwarzenegge r was born and raised, historian Stefan Karner told the Vienna newspaper Kurier.

Schwarzenegger, now a naturalized U.S. citizen, was born on July 30, 1947, when Styria and the neighboring province of Carinthia belonged to the British zone. At the time, postwar Austria was occupied by the four wartime allies, which also included the United States, the Soviet Union and France.

The Soviets already had left Styria in July 1945, less than three months after the end of the war, Karner noted.

"Let me tell you this: As a boy, I lived for many years across the street from where the Russians were based in Vienna -- and honestly, I never saw a Russian tank there," retiree Franz Nitsch said Friday. "He said it all on purpose -- and that's bad."

In his convention address, Schwarzenegger also said: "As a kid, I saw the Socialist country that Austria became after the Soviets left" in 1955 and Austria regained its independence.

But Martin Polaschek, a law history scholar and vice rector of Graz University, told Kurier that Austria was governed by c oalition governments, including the conservative People's Party and the Social Democratic Party. Between 1945 and 19 70. all the nation's chancellors were conservatives -- not Socialists.

What's more, when Schwarzenegger left in 1968, Austria was run by a conservative government headed by People's Pa rty Chancellor Josef Klaus, a staunch Roman Catholic and a sharp critic of both the Socialists as well as the Communist s ruling in countries across the Iron Curtain.

Schwarzenegger "confuses a free country with a Socialist one," said Polaschek, referring to East European Communist officials' routine descriptions of their countries as Socialist.

Polaschek saw the moderate Republican governor's recollections at the convention as a tactical move. Schwarzenegger , he said, was "using the old Communist enemy image for Bush's election campaign."

"He did not speak as a historian, after all, but as a politician," Polaschek said.

Norbert Darabos, a ranking official of Austria's opposition Social Democratic Party, sharply criticized Schwarzenegger's "disdain for his former homeland."

"The Terminator is constructing a rather bizarre Austria image," he said.

But many ordinary Austrians seemed to be in a forgiving mood Friday over the gaffes.

"Maybe he has a wrong recollection -- it's so many years since he left," said Wilma Fadrany, 32, a Vienna waitress.

"There must be political reasons for such comments," she said. "You've got to tell the (convention delegates) what they want to hear in order to win them over. Politicians always talk the way it fits into their agenda."

"SACRAMENTO – Gov. Arnold Schwarzenegger signed the first major gay rights legislation to reach his desk yesterday when he approved a bill that would require insurance companies to offer coverage to registered domestic partners.

The governor's office announced his approval late yesterday without any fanfare or even a signing message explaining his decision.

AB 2208, sponsored by Assemblywoman Christine Kehoe, D-San Diego, would require companies that offer health, life, homeowners and auto insurance to offer policies that cover domestic partners in the same way they cover spouses.

Current law requires insurers to offer domestic partners coverage equivalent to a dependent, rather than a spouse.

Gay rights advocates say the bill is a technical fix needed to pave the way for California's domestic partnership law, which takes effect next year. The law gives same-sex registered domestic partners a variety of rights and responsibilities now available only to married couples."

GANGS WITHOUT BORDERS CONFOUND THE LAW

BY GINGER THOMPSON, N.Y. TIMES NEWS SERVICE

San Pedro Sula, Honduras--- Christian Antunez chokes back a scream as the nurse sticks a needle above his left eyebr ow.

"Ay mama!" he shouts, "It really hurts." "Don't move," the nurse tells him, sticking him again and again with anesthesia. He pleads for a break. At least four other men, all covered with tattos, are taking needles around him, on their arms and legs, backs and chests. The whining rises from the chairs. One has a tatoo on his scalp. Another has one over his top I ip. Yet another on his neck. Antunez, 22, has them everywhere.

The men have all come to this makeshift clinic in a neighborhood ravaged by street violence for a desperate and disfigur ing kind of healing; to have their gang tatoos removed.

"Society thinks we are monsters," Antunez said. "The police want us dead. That's why we do this. If we do not take off these tatoos, we will never be able to live in peace."

The pain, he said, seems a small price for a new life. 'I dream of being clean, even if it means being scarred."

They are gang members, known here as "maras," after a species of swarming ants. Indeed, over the last decade, gangs have spread like a scourge across Central America, Mexico and the United States, setting off a catastrophic crime wave that has turned dirt-poor neighborhoods into combat zones and an equally virulent crackdown that has left thousands of gang members dead, in hiding, in jail or heading **to the United States**.

The authorities estimate there are 70,000 to 100,000 gang members across Central America and Mexico. In the last de cade, gangs have killed thousands of people, sowing new fear in a region still struggling to overcome civil wars that end ed just a decade ago. Gangs have replaced guerrilas as public enemy No. 1.

MANO DURA RULES

The president of Honduras and El Savador have called the gangs as big a threat to national security as terroism is to the United States. They have revived old counterinsurgency strategies and adopted zero-tolerance laws known as Mano D ura, which loosely translates as "firm hand," that bypass basic rules of due process and allow them to send young men to prison for nothing more than a gang tatoo.

Instead of offering reassurance, official campaigns inflame public fear. and in the last year, human rights investigators have begun to report alarming increases in the numbers of young men killed by the police and vigilantes.

No one denies that gang violence requires a tough response. No one-not even the nurese who remove his tatoos- feels sympathy for men with brutal histories, like Antunez. But many human rights advocates and community leaders worry th at the aggressive measures governments are taking against gangs have not solved the problem as much as they have s pread it.

Thousands of gang members are **fleeing north**, moving with and preying on the waves of illegal migrants who travel to the United States, which is taking aggresive measures of its own and deporting thousands of gang members on immigration violations. The effect is to churn the gangs throughtout the region. As gang members move, the gang culture moves with them. Police departments across the United States call the gangs a top crime problem.

In January, some 72 departments nation wide met to discuss the issue in Los Angeles. Another gang summit meeting by law enforcement authorities will be held in Washington on Thursday.

In Guatemala, the authorities say gun violence will kill 1000 more people this year, compared with two years ago. Gang s, they say, will commit 80 percent of those killings.

The Mexican state of Chiapas, which shares a lawless border with Guatemala, has become another mara hunting groun d. Gangs strike in parks and bus stations. Over the last year, gang members reportedly killed more than 70 migrants st owed away on northbound freight trains.

In a rare display of solidarity last year, the governments of Honduras, El Salvador, Guatemala, Panama, and Mexico sig ned an agreement to begin exploring ways to collaborate in the fight against gangs. They stopped short of adopting me asures as tough as those in Honduras and El Salvador.

But in countries crippled by official corruption and impunity, the crackdowns have weakened the rule of law as much as t hey have stemmed the rise in crime.

Prisons are filled way beyond capacity with young men waithing months before they are formally charged. Overcrowded cellblocks have turned into death traps, with hundreds of gang members killed in suspicious riots and fires.

Some gang members, picked up by the police, never make it to jail. Human rights organizations, including Amnesty Inte rnational and the Honduras National Commission for Human Rights, have reported incidents of gang members being kid napped, tortured and killed by the same kinds of secret security forces responsible for the disappearance of hundreds of suspected leftists during the civil war years. Commissioner Ramon Custodio has described the killings as a "Slow social cleansing," often involving youths with no criminal records.

Reports by Amnesty International and the State Department have echoed similiar warnings.

"It seems to me that this country is losing, in great measures, the democratic advances that have cost us so much," said Bertha Oliva, director of the Committee for the Relatives of the Disappeared, formed at the height of the Cold War. "In the 1980's, this country said it was OK to dill off its political enemies because they were anti-social. We say the same today about gang members."

The two largest gangs, the Mara Salvatrucha and the Mara 18, began on the streets of Los Angeles. The Salvatruch as gang was started by the children of refugees from U.S. -sponsored civil wars in Central America of the 1980's . Young people started the gangs as support networks, even social clubs.

Mara 18 was started by Mexican immigrants in the 1970's. Fist fights with rival groups turned to gunfights. Gunfights le d to declarations of war. Then in the crackdown by U.S immigration officials, tens of thousands of gang members were sent back to their home countries. At the peak of the program in the mid-1990's, some 40,000 criminal illegal immigrant s were sent back each year.

Suddenly, one of the poorest corners of the world, which struggles to meet its people's basic needs, was burdened by a **superpower's crime plague.**

Entire neighborhoods were plundered by violent turf wars waged by volatile young men armed with machetes and home made pipe guns, called chimbas. Homicide rates, especially among men under 30, soared. Law-abiding citizens lived like prisoners in their own homes. Armies and law enforcement agencies that had been scaled down for what was supposed to be a new era of peace were forced to build back up.

RETURNING TO HAUNT U.S.

Now, with the extraordinary measures by Central American governments driving them away, the rampage had come full circle. The sheer force of illegal immigration has made the Mara Salvatruchas and Mara 18 two of the fastest growing gangs in the United States.

They are driving crime in cities like Los Angeles, Chicago and the suburbs around Washington, police officials say. The y have expanded from their big city bases to make violent debuts in places like **Durham NC**, **Omaha NE**, **and Nassau County NY**.

A national study by Northeastern University found that while overall crime dropped by more than 20 percent from 1999 t o 2002, gang homicides increased by more than 50 percent.

Some of the most shocking violence has played out in the suburbs around Washington, where members of Mara Salvatr ucha have been blamed for hacking the hands of a 16-year old rival with a machete, and stabbing a pregnant 17-year old who was an informant in murder investigations.

Metropolitan Los Angeles, with a population almost equal to that of Honduras, remains the **world capital of street gang s.**, with an estimated 700 different cliques and more than 110,000 gang members. City and county police officials sya h alf of all homicides they are gang related.

Chief William J. Bratton of the Los Angeles Police Department has described gang members as "domestic terrorists," who have received little attention from a society preoccupied with al-Qaida since September 11. In speeches across the country, he has urged other police departments to make gangs their top law enforcement priority and demand increased federal support......"People deserve protection," he added. "And I believe gang members are terrorizing our communitie s."

Two years before 9/11, candidate Bush was already talking privately about attacking Iraq, according to his former ghost writer

Houston: Two years before the September 11 attacks, presidential candidate George W. Bush was already talking privately about the political benefits of attacking Iraq, according to his former ghost writer, who held many conversations with then-Texas Governor Bush in preparation for a planned autobiography.

"He was thinking about invading Iraq in 1999," said author and journalist Mickey Herskowitz. "It was on his mind. He said to me: 'One of the keys to being seen as a great leader is to be seen as a commander-in-chief.Â' And he said, 'My father had all this political capital built up when he drove the Iraqis out of Kuwait and he wasted it.Â' He said, 'If I have a chance to invadeÂ....if I had that much capital, IÂ'm not going to waste it. IÂ'm going to get everything passed that I want to get passed and IÂ'm going to have a successful presidency."

Herskowitz said that Bush expressed frustration at a lifetime as an underachiever in the shadow of an accomplished father. In aggressive military action, he saw the opportunity to emerge from his fatherÂ's shadow. The moment, Herskowitz said, came in the wake of the September 11 attacks. Â"Suddenly, heÂ's at 91 percent in the polls, and heÂ'd barely crawled out of the bunker.Â"

That President Bush and his advisers had Iraq on their minds long before weapons inspectors had finished their work – and long before alleged Iraqi ties with terrorists became a central rationale for war – has been raised elsewhere, including in a book based on recollections of former Treasury Secretary Paul OÂ'Neill. However, Herskowitz was in a unique position to hear BushÂ's unguarded and unfiltered views on Iraq, war and other matters – well before he became president.

In 1999, Herskowitz struck a deal with the campaign of George W. Bush about a ghost-written autobiography, which was ultimately titled A Charge to Keep: My Journey to the White House, and he and Bush signed a contract in which the two would split the proceeds. The publisher was William Morrow. Herskowitz was given unimpeded access to Bush, and the two met approximately 20 times so Bush could share his thoughts. Herskowitz began working on the book in May, 1999, and says that within two months he had completed and submitted some 10 chapters, with a remaining 4-6 chapters still on his computer. Herskowitz was replaced as BushÂ's ghostwriter after BushÂ's handlers concluded that the candidateÂ's views and life experiences were not being cast in a sufficiently positive light.

According to Herskowitz, who has authored more than 30 books, many of them jointly written autobiographies of famous Americans in politics, sports and media (including that of Reagan adviser Michael Deaver), Bush and his advisers were sold on the idea that it was difficult for a president to accomplish an electoral agenda without the record-high approval numbers that accompany successful if modest wars.

The revelations on BushÂ's attitude toward Iraq emerged recently during two taped interviews of Herskowitz, which included a discussion of a variety of matters, including his continued closeness with the Bush family, indicated by his subsequent selection to pen an authorized biography of BushÂ's grandfather, written and published last year with the assistance and blessing of the Bush family.

Herskowitz also revealed the following:

- -In 2003, BushÂ's father indicated to him that he disagreed with his sonÂ's invasion of Iraq.
- -Bush admitted that he failed to fulfill his Vietnam-era domestic National Guard service obligation, but claimed that he had been Â"excused.Â"

-Bush revealed that after he left his Texas National Guard unit in 1972 under murky circumstances, he never piloted a plane again. That casts doubt on the carefully-choreographed moment of Bush emerging in pilotÂ's garb from a jet on the aircraft carrier USS Abraham Lincoln in 2003 to celebrate Â"Mission AccomplishedÂ" in Iraq. The image, instantly telegraphed around the globe, and subsequent hazy White House statements about his capacity in the cockpit, created the impression that a heroic Bush had played a role in landing the craft.

-Bush described his own business ventures as Â"flounderingÂ" before campaign officials insisted on recasting them in a positive light.

Throughout the interviews for this article and in subsequent conversations, Herskowitz indicated he was conflicted over revealing information provided by a family with which he has longtime connections, and by how his candor could comport with the undefined operating principles of the as-told-to genre. Well after the interviews—in which he expressed consternation that BushÂ's true views, experience and basic essence had eluded the American people —Herskowitz communicated growing concern about the consequences for himself of the publication of his remarks, and said that he had been under the impression he would not be quoted by name. However, when conversations began, it was made clear to him that the material was intended for publication and attribution. A tape recorder was present and visible at all times.

Several people who know Herskowitz well addressed his character and the veracity of his recollections. Â"I donÂ't know anybody thatÂ's ever said a bad word about Mickey,Â" said Barry Silverman, a well-known Houston executive and civic figure who worked with him on another book project. An informal survey of Texas journalists turned up uniform confidence that HerskowitzÂ's account as contained in this article could be considered accurate.

One noted Texas journalist who spoke with Herskowitz about the book in 1999 recalls how the author mentioned to him at the time that Bush had revealed things the campaign found embarrassing and did not want in print. He requested anonymity because of the political climate in the state. Â"I canÂ't go near this,Â" he said.

According to Herskowitz, George W. BushÂ's beliefs on Iraq were based in part on a notion dating back to the Reagan White House – ascribed in part to now-vice president Dick Cheney, Chairman of the House Republican Policy Committee under Reagan. Â"Start a small war. Pick a country where there is justification you can jump on, go ahead and invade.Â"

BushÂ's circle of pre-election advisers had a fixation on the political capital that British Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher collected from the Falklands War. Said Herskowitz: Â"They were just absolutely blown away, just enthralled by the scenes of the troops coming back, of the boats, people throwing flowers at and her getting these standing ovations in Parliament and making these magnificent speeches.Â"

Republicans, Herskowitz said, felt that Jimmy CarterÂ's political downfall could be attributed largely to his failure to wag e a war. He noted that President Reagan and President BushÂ's father himself had (besides the narrowly-focused Gulf War I) successfully waged limited wars against tiny opponents – Grenada and Panama – and gained politically. But t here were successful small wars, and then there were quagmires, and apparently George H.W. Bush and his son did no t see eye to eye.

"I know would not admit this now, but he was opposed to it. I asked him if he had talked to W about invading Iraq. "H e said, 'No I havenÂ't, and I wonÂ't, but Brent has.Â' Brent would not have talked to him without the old manÂ's okayin g it." Scowcroft, national security adviser in the elder BushÂ's administration, penned a highly publicized warning to Ge orge W. Bush about the perils of an invasion.

HerskowitzÂ's revelations are not the sole indicator of BushÂ's pre-election thinking on Iraq. In December 1999, some s ix months after his talks with Herskowitz, Bush surprised veteran political chroniclers, including the Boston GlobeÂ's Dav id Nyhan, with his blunt pronouncements about Saddam at a six-way New Hampshire primary event that got little notice: Â"It was a gaffe-free evening for the rookie front-runner, till he was asked about SaddamÂ's weapons stash,Â" wrote Ny han. Â'IÂ'd take Â'em out,Â' grinned cavalierly, Â'take out the weapons of mass destructionÂ...IÂ'm surprised heÂ's stil I there,Â" said Bush of the despot who remains in power after losing the Gulf War to Bush Jr.Â's fatherÂ...It remains to b e seen if that offhand declaration of war was just Texas talk, a sort of locker room braggadocio, or whether it was BushÂ's s first big clinker. Â"

The notion that President Bush held unrealistic or naÃ-ve views about the consequences of war was further advanced r

ecently by a Bush supporter, the evangelist Pat Robertson, who revealed that Bush had told him the Iraq invasion would yield no casualties. In addition, in recent days, high-ranking US military officials have complained that the White House d id not provide them with adequate resources for the task at hand.

Herskowitz considers himself a friend of the Bush family, and has been a guest at the family vacation home in Kennebu nkport. In the late 1960s, Herskowitz, a longtime Houston Chronicle sports columnist designated President BushÂ's fath er, then-Congressman George HW Bush, to replace him as a guest columnist, and the two have remained close since th en. (Herskowitz was suspended briefly in April without pay for reusing material from one of his own columns, about lege ndary UCLA basketball coach John Wooden.)

In 1999, when Herskowitz turned in his chapters for Charge to Keep, BushÂ's staff expressed displeasure —often ov er HerskowitzÂ's use of language provided by Bush himself. In a chapter on the oil business, Herskowitz included Bush Â's own words to describe the TexanÂ's unprofitable business ventures, writing: Â"the companies were flounderingÂ". Â "I got a call from one of the campaign lawyers, he was kind of angry, and he said, Â'YouÂ've got some wrong informatio n.Â' I didnÂ't bother to say, Â'Well you know where it came from.Â' said, Â'We do not consider that the governor struggl ed or floundered in the oil business. We consider him a successful oilman who started up at least two new businesses.Â' Â"

In the end, campaign officials decided not to go with HerskowitzÂ's account, and, moreover, demanded everything back . Â'The lawyer called me and said, Â'Delete it. Shred it. Just do it.Â' Â"

"They took it and Karen rewrote it," he said. A campaign official arrived at his home at seven a.m. on a Monday mor ning and took his notes and computer files. However, Herskowitz, who is known for his memory of anecdotes from his long history in journalism and book publishing, says he is confident about his recollections.

According to Herskowitz, Bush was reluctant to discuss his time in the Texas Air National Guard — and inconsistent wh en he did so. Bush, he said, provided conflicting explanations of how he came to bypass a waiting list and obtain a covet ed Guard slot as a domestic alternative to being sent to Vietnam. Herskowitz also said that Bush told him that after trans ferring from his Texas Guard unit two-thirds through his six-year military obligation to work on an Alabama political camp aign, he did not attend any Alabama National Guard drills at all, because he was "excused." This directly contradicts his public statements that he participated in obligatory training with the Alabama National Guard. BushÂ's claim to have fulfilled his military duty has been subject to intense scrutiny; he has insisted in the past that he did show up for monthly drills in Alabama — though commanding officers say they never saw him, and no Guardsmen have come forward to acc ept substantial "rewards" for anyone who can claim to have seen Bush on base.

Herskowitz said he asked Bush if he ever flew a plane again after leaving the Texas Air National Guard in 1972 \hat{A} – which was two years prior to his contractual obligation to fly jets was due to expire. He said Bush told him he never flew any plane \hat{A} – military or civilian \hat{A} – again. That would contradict published accounts in which Bush talks about his days in 19 73 working with inner-city children, when he claimed to have taken some of the children up in a plane.

In 2002, three years after he had been pulled off the George W. Bush biography, Herskowitz was asked by BushÂ's fat her to write a book about the current presidentÂ's grandfather, Prescott Bush, after getting a message that the senior Bu sh wanted to see him. Â"Former President Bush just handed it to me. We were sitting there one day, and I was visiting h im there in his officeÂ...He said, Â'I wish somebody would do a book about my dad.Â' Â"

"He said to me, 'I know this has been a disappointing time for you, but itÂ's amazing how many times something goo d will come out of it.Â' I passed it on to my agent, he jumped all over it. I asked , 'Would you support it and would you g ive me access to the rest of family?Â' He said yes."

That book, Duty, Honor, Country: The Life and Legacy of Prescott Bush, was published in 2003 by Routledge. If anythin g, the book has been criticized for its over-reliance on the Bush familyÂ's perspective and rosy interpretation of events. Herskowitz himself is considered the ultimate Â"as-told-toÂ" author, lending credibility to his account of what George W. Bush told him. HerskowitzÂ's other books run the gamut of public figures, and include the memoirs of Reagan aide Deav er, former Texas Governor and Nixon Treasury Secretary John Connally, newsman Dan Rather, astronaut Walter Cunni ngham, and baseball greats Mickey Mantle and Nolan Ryan.

After Herskowitz was pulled from the Bush book project, the biographer learned that a scenario was being prepared to e xplain his departure. Â'I got a phone call from someone in the Bush campaign, confidentially, saying Â'Watch your back.

Â' Â"

Reporters covering Bush say that when they inquired as to why Herskowitz was no longer on the project, Hughes intima ted that Herskowitz had personal habits that interfered with his writing \hat{A} – a claim Herskowitz said is unfounded. Later, the campaign put out the word that Herskowitz had been removed for missing a deadline. Hughes subsequently finished the book herself \hat{A} – it received largely critical reviews for its self-serving qualities and lack of spontaneity or introspection.

So, said Herskowitz, the best material was left on the cutting room floor, including BushÂ's true feelings.

Â"He told me that as a leader, you can never admit to a mistake,Â" Herskowitz said. Â"That was one of the keys to bein g a leader.Â"

When Senator Arlen Specter, R-PA, faced the toughtest primary race of hsi political career, **President Bush came to hi s rescue**, campaigning with Specter at every turn. But when both men were re-elected this week, Specter promptly caut ioned the president against nominating Supreme Court justices who would overturn the 1973 ruling legalizing abortion.

On Thursday, as outraged conservatives tried to block Specter's rise to the chairmanship of the Senate Judiciary Committee, the Pennsylvania senator issued a statement clarifying his remarks.

"I did not warn the president about anything," and "I have never and would never apply any litmus test on the abortion is sue," he said.

The controversy suggests that, despite talk of a political mandate, the long-running battle over federal judgeships will be in full bloom when the new Congress convenes next year under strengthened Republican control......

As the second-most senior Republican on the Senate Judiciary Committee, Specter is in line to replace the current chair man, Senator Orin Hatch of Utah, who must step down under Senate rules that limit the terms of committee chairmen to eight years.

The position will give Specter, a **centrist** who is known for his independent streak, great influence over the judicial confir mation process.

The issue of judicial nominations percolated throughout the elections, including Specter's own. This spring, he faced a difficult primary challenge he faced a difficulty primary challenge from Rep. Patrick J. Toomey, a conservative Republican, who labeled Specter a "Ted Kennedy" liberal who would block conservative judges if he asc ended to the Judiciary charmanship.

With help from the White House, Specter won that race, and then went on Tuesday to win a fifth term in the Senate. He broached the topic of Roe v. Wade, the 1973 ruling that legalized abortion nationally, in an interview with The Associate d Press.

"When you talk about judges who would change the right of a woman to choose, overturn Roe v. Wade, **I think that is u nlikely**" that they would be approved. Specter said.

On Thursday, Specter did not dispute those remarks. He said that he was simply noting "the political reality of the Senat e on the Democrats' filibustering."

And I saw a woman sitting on a scarlet beast which w as full of names of blasphemy, having seven heads and ten horns. 4 The woman was arrayed in purple and scarlet, and adorned with gold and precious stones and pearls, having in her hand a golden cup full of abominations and the filthines s of her fornication. 5 And on her forehead a name was written:

MYSTERY, BABYLON THE GREAT, THE MOTHER OF HARLOTS AND OF THE ABOMINATIONS OF THE EARTH. 6 I saw the woman, drunk with the blood of the saints and with the blood of the martyrs of Jesus. And when I saw her, I marveled with great amazement.

What is the nature of this deception? It is said that, "the kings of the earth committed fornication," with her. In the past p ost we are given an example of a nation whose activities mirrow the events depicted in Revelation 18. The king of Tyre committed fornication with the Mother of Harlots. Listen to God's description of the result of the kings fornication with the Harlot.

Ezek. 28:11 Moreover the word of the LORD came to me, saying, 12 Â"Son of man, take up a lamentation for the king of Tyre, and say to him, Â"Thus says the Lord GOD:

Â'You were the seal of perfection,

Full of wisdom and perfect in beauty.

13 You were in Eden, the garden of God;

Every precious stone was your covering:

The sardius, topaz, and diamond,

Beryl, onyx, and jasper,

Sapphire, turquoise, and emerald with gold.

The workmanship of your timbrels and pipes

Was prepared for you on the day you were created.

14 Â"You were the anointed cherub who covers:

I established you;

You were on the holy mountain of God;

You walked back and forth in the midst of fiery stones.

15 You were perfect in your ways from the day you were created,

Till iniquity was found in you.

First we see that by the power of God, this man was established king of the nation of Tyre. In the book of Job, we see that God picks and destroys the kings of the earth. Listen to a description of how God rules over this world.

17 Should one who hates justice govern? Will you condemn Him who is most just? 18 Is it fitting to say to a king, Â"You are worthless,Â' And to nobles. Â'You are wickedÂ'? 19 Yet He is not partial to princes, Nor does He regard the rich more than the poor; For they are all the work of His hands. 20 In a moment they die, in the middle of the night; The people are shaken and pass away; The mighty are taken away without a hand. 21 A"For His eyes are on the ways of man, And He sees all his steps. 22 There is no darkness nor shadow of death Where the workers of iniquity may hide themselves. 23 For He need not further consider a man, That he should go before God in judgment. 24 He breaks in pieces mighty men without inquiry, And sets others in their place.

25 Therefore He knows their works;

He overthrows them in the night,

And they are crushed.

26 He strikes them as wicked men

In the open sight of others,

27 Because they turned back from Him,

And would not consider any of His ways,

28 So that they caused the cry of the poor to come to Him;

The UN has warned that Afghanistan could become a "narco-state" after opium cultivation rose by two-thirds this year.

A UN report released on Thursday urged the US and Nato forces to fight drugs as well as Taleban insurgents.

It said Afghanistan now supplied 87% of world opium. In 2003, the trade was worth \$2.8bn, representing more than 60% of gross domestic product.

One in 10 Afghans are now estimated to be involved in the business.

The UN said it would be an "historical error" to abandon the nation to opium.

'No silver bullet'

The UN Afghanistan Opium Survey 2004 said the drug was now the "main engine of economic growth and the strongest bond among previously quarrelsome peoples"

It said opium cultivation had increased by 64% compared to 2003.

It would be an historical error to abandon Afghanistan to opium, right after we reclaimed it from the Taleban and al-Qae da

Antonio Maria Costa, executive director of the UN Office on Drugs and Crime, said the report was a wake-up call to the world.

Mr Costa said the Afghan government was too weak to tackle the problem alone.

He called on US and Nato-led forces to carry out military operations against drug traffickers.

"In Afghanistan, drugs are now a clear and present danger," Mr Costa said.

"The fear that Afghanistan might degenerate into a narco-state is becoming a reality."

He said there was "no silver bullet" with which to tackle the problem.

"The opium economy in Afghanistan has to be dismantled with democracy, the rule of law and economic improvement - it will be a long and difficult process," Mr Costa said.

The UN report said opium production in 2004 was close to the peak of 4,600 tons in 1999, a year before the Taleban banned new cultivation.

The BBC's Roland Buerk in Kabul says it is easy to see why 2.3m people - a tenth of the population - is involved in opiu m, when a farmer can earn more than 10 times as much growing poppies than cultivating wheat.

US prosecutions

The report came as the US announced a major new offensive against drug production in Afghanistan.

Washington expects to spend an extra \$780m in the next financial year on measures including the eradication of poppie s and alternatives for farmers.

US officials describe the new plan as a full-board commitment to support the new Afghan government in its battle agains t the growing drugs trade.

A senior Western diplomat in Kabul also told the BBC there were plans to take some of the largest drugs barons to the U nited States to prosecute them there.

Robert Charles, assistant secretary of state for International Narcotics and Law Enforcement, described poppy cultivation as a primary, if not the primary, concern for the country.

Aggressive eradication would be backed up, Mr Charles said, by a public information campaign, better law enforcement and, perhaps most crucially, real alternatives for farmers.

"You don't go in and eradicate in an area without making provision... for a marked up or added alternative development r esources, or alternative livelihoods," he said.

A secular thought on what the birth of Jesus meant to the world power at that time.

By James Carroll Republished from Boston Globe Jesus represents more than a guilty conscience

THE SINGLE most important fact about the birth of Jesus, as recounted in the Gospels, is one that receives almost no e mphasis in the American festival of Christmas. The child who was born in Bethlehem represented a drastic political chall enge to the imperial power of Rome. The nativity story is told to make the point that Rome is the enemy of God, and in J esus, RomeÂ's day is over.

The Gospel of Matthew builds its nativity narrative around HerodÂ's determination to kill the baby, whom he recognizes as a threat to his own political sway. The Romans were an occupation force in Palestine, and Herod was their puppet-ki

ng. To the people of Israel, the Roman occupation, which preceded the birth of Jesus by at least 50 years, was a defilem ent, and Jewish resistance was steady. (The historian Josephus says that after an uprising in Jerusalem around the time of the birth of Jesus, the Romans crucified 2,000 Jewish rebels.)

Herod was right to feel insecure on his throne. In order to preempt any challenge from the rumored newborn "king of th e Jews," Herod murdered "all the male children who were 2 years old or younger." Joseph, warned in a dream, slipp ed out of HerodÂ's reach with Mary and Jesus. Thus, right from his birth, the child was marked as a political fugitive.

The Gospel of Luke puts an even more political cast on the story. The narrative begins with the decree of Caesar August us calling for a world census—a creation of tax rolls that will tighten the empireÂ's grip on its subject peoples. It was C aesar Augustus who turned the Roman republic into a dictatorship, a power-grab he reinforced by proclaiming himself di vine.

His census decree is what requires the journey of Joseph and the pregnant Mary to Bethlehem, but it also defines the co ntext of their childÂ's nativity as one of political resistance. When the angel announces to shepherds that a Â"savior has been born,Â" as scholars like Richard Horsley point out, those hearing the story would immediately understand that the blasphemous claim by Caesar Augustus to be Â"savior of the worldÂ" was being repudiated.

When Jesus was murdered by Rome as a political criminal—crucifixion was the way such rebels were executed—the storyÂ's beginning was fulfilled in its end. But for contingent historical reasons (the savage Roman war against the Jews in the late first century, the gradual domination of the Jesus movement by Gentiles, the conversion of Constantine in the early fourth century) the Christian memory deemphasized the anti-Roman character of the Jesus story. Eventually, Rom an imperialism would be sanctified by the church, with Jews replacing Romans as the main antagonists of Jesus, as if he were not Jewish himself. (Thus, Herod is remembered more for being part-Jewish than for being a Roman puppet.)

In modern times, religion and politics began to be understood as occupying separate spheres, and the nativity story bec ame spiritualized and sentimentalized, losing its political edge altogether. Å"PeaceÅ" replaced resistance as the main m otif. The baby Jesus was universalized, removed from his decidedly Jewish context, and the narrativeÂ's explicit critique s of imperial dominance and of wealth were blunted.

This is how it came to be that Christmas in America has turned the nativity of Jesus on its head. No surprise there, for if the story were told today with Roman imperialism at its center, questions might arise about AmericaÂ's new self-understanding as an imperial power. A story of Jesus born into a land oppressed by a hated military occupation might prompt an examination of the American occupation of Iraq. A story of Jesus come decidedly to the poor might cast a pall over the festival of consumption. A story of the Jewishness of Jesus might undercut the Christian theology of replacement.

Today the Roman empire is recalled mainly as a force for good—those roads, language, laws, civic magnificence, "or der" everywhere. The United States of America also understands itself as acting in the world with good intentions, aiming at order. "New world order," as George H.W. Bush put it.

That we have this in common with Rome is caught by the Latin motto that appears just below the engraved pyramid on e ach American dollar bill, "Novus Ordo Seculorum." But, as Iraq reminds us, such "order" comes at a cost, far more than a dollar. The price is always paid in blood and suffering by unseen "nobodies" at the bottom of the imperial pyra mid. It is their story, for once, that is being told this week."

Dollar drops on reserves concerns

Recent rebounds in the dollar have proved to be short lived.

The US dollar has dropped against major currencies on concerns that central banks may cut the amount of dollars they hold in their foreign reserves.

Comments by South Korea's central bank at the end of last week have sparked the recent round of dollar declines.

South Korea, which has about \$200bn in foreign reserves, said it plans instead to boost holdings of currencies such as the Australian and Canadian dollar.

Analysts reckon that other nations may follow suit and now ditch the dollar.

At 1930 GMT, one euro was worth \$1.325, up 1.46% on the day.

The British pound had added 0.76% to reach \$1.91, while the dollar had fallen by 1.25% against the Japanese yen to tra de at 104.2 yen.

Change in mood

At the start of the year, the US currency, which had lost 7% against the euro in the final three months of 2004 and had fa llen to record lows, staged something of a recovery.

The comments from Korea come at a time when sentiment towards the dollar was already softening.

lan Gunner, Mellon Financial Analysts, however, pointed to the dollar's inability recently to extend that rally despite positive economic and corporate data, and highlighted the fact that many of the US's economic problems had not disappeare d.

The focus once again has been on the country's massive trade and budget deficits, with predictions of more dollar weak ness to come.

"The comments from Korea came at a time when sentiment towards the dollar was already softening," said Ian Gunner, a trader at Mellon Financial.

On Tuesday, traders in Asia said that both South Korea and Taiwan had withdrawn their bids to buy dollars at the start of the session.

Mansoor Mohi-Uddin, chief currency strategist at UBS, said that there was a sentiment in the market that "central banks from Asia and the Middle East are buying euros".

A report last month already showed that the dollar was losing its allure as a currency that offered rock-steady returns an d stability.

Compiled by Central Banking Publications and sponsored by the UK's Royal Bank of Scotland, the survey found 39 nati ons out of 65 questioned were increasing their euro holdings, with 29 cutting back on the US dollar.

Lex: Buffett/trade deficit Sunday March 6, 1:45 pm ET

Warren Buffett's letters to shareholders at times read like scripts from The Waltons TV show. But the billionaire fund ma nager's folksy style is a breath of fresh air for currency investors used to the obfuscation of Alan Greenspan, chairman of

the Federal Reserve.

Mr Buffett believes the dollar has further to fall and the US trade deficit risks turning America into a "sharecropper's socie ty". It is only fair to point out that the chairman of Berkshire Hathaway is talking his own book. The value of the group's fo reign exchange contracts mostly short positions against the dollar increased to \$21.4bn at December 31 2004 from \$12b n the previous year. That caveat aside, Mr Buffett's reasoning has merit.

Some might argue that while foreigners are happy to finance the US deficit by recycling their corresponding surpluses int o dollar assets the situation is sustainable. But, as Mr Buffett's sharecropping analogy highlights, that argument ignores the transfer of wealth that accompanies persistent large trade deficits. US net external liabilities are currently about three times export earnings. With a trade deficit amounting to 5.4 per cent of gross domestic product, net indebtedness continues to grow. It is unlikely that America can trade its way out of the problem. Since 1991, the share of exports in US GDP has remained static, at close to 10 per cent, while the share of imports has jumped by five percentage points.

Not all of the transfer of wealth to the rest of the world leaves US control. Part of the deficit reflects trade between US-ba sed companies and their overseas subsidiaries. But it has been the willingness of foreign central banks, particularly in A sia, to accumulate currency reserves that has allowed the deficit to persist without more significant dollar depreciation. A s US indebtedness grows, so does the risk that its creditors' appetite for dollar assets wanes or they at least require a hi gher return. The dollar has already proved sensitive to suggestions that South Korea might diversify the currencies in wh ich it holds its foreign exchange reserves. In Mr Buffett's words, US "spendthrift behaviour won't be tolerated indefinitely"

Trade Deficit Hits \$58.3B in Jan. on Imports of Consumer Goods and Cars; 2nd Highest Level Ever

WASHINGTON (AP) -- The U.S. trade deficit climbed to \$58.3 billion in January, the second-highest level in history, as Americans' appetite for foreign consumer products and automobiles hit record highs. The deficit with China was pushed higher by a surge in textile shipments, reflecting the end of global quota.

The Commerce Department reported Friday that the January trade gap was 4.5 percent higher than December's \$55.7 b illion deficit and was just below the all-time high monthly deficit of \$59.4 billion, recorded in November.

For all of last year, the U.S. trade gap surged by 24.3 percent to \$617.1 billion, setting a record for the third straight year. Analysts believe that 2005 will also set a record, reflecting higher prices for imported oil and continued heavy demand by U.S. consumers for all things foreign.....

NPD march in Dresden: Support surged in Saxony

Germany's parliament has tightened restrictions on neo-Nazi marches to keep them away from sensitive memorials such as former concentration camps.

The changes make it easier for local authorities to ban such gatherings.

The new curbs target a planned march by the far right National Democratic Party (NPD) at Berlin's Brandenburg Gate, n ear a new Holocaust memorial.

The 8 May march would coincide with the 60th anniversary of Germany's capitulation in World War II.

Germany's upper house of parliament still has to approve the changes.

But the government says it is determined to get them in place in time to prevent neo-Nazi demonstrations overshadowin g the official May ceremonies marking the 60th anniversary.

Support for NPD

Last month, thousands of neo-Nazis marched through Dresden on the 60th anniversary of the allied bombing of the city.

It was one of the biggest far-right demonstrations in Germany's post-war history.

Last year the NPD won 9% of the vote in Saxony, giving it seats in a German state assembly for the first time since 1968 .

Germany already has laws to restrict neo-Nazi propaganda and Nazi symbols are banned.

On Thursday, Germany's highest court upheld a ruling that a neo-Nazi rock band was a criminal organisation whose son gs spread racial hatred.

The German Constitutional Court rejected an appeal by the band's former lead singer, Michael Regener, against his thre e-year prison sentence.

Two years ago a Berlin court found the rock group Landser - meaning "foot soldiers" - guilty of spreading hatred of Jewis h people and foreigners in Germany.

Landser's CDs included The Reich Will Rise Again and Get The Enemy.

It is the kind of TV new coverage every president covets.

"Thank you, Bush. Thank you, USA, " a jubilant Iraqi-American told a camera crew in Kansas City for a segment about reaction to the fall of Baghdad. A second report told of "another success" in the Bush administrationÂ's drive to strengthen aviation security"; the reporter called it "one of the most remarkable campaign in aviation history." A third segment, broadcast in January, described the administrationÂ's determination to open markets for American farmers.

To viewers, each report looked like any other 90 second segment on the local news. In fact, the federal government pro duced all three. The report from Kansas City was made by State Department. The "reporter" covering airport safety was actually a public-relations professional working under a false name for the Transportation Security Administration. The farming segment was done by the Agriculture DepartmentÂ's office of communication.

Under the Bush administration, the federal government has aggressively used a well-established tool of public relations: the prepackaged, ready-to-serve news report that major corporations have long distributed to TV stations to pitch everyt hing from headache remedies to auto insuranceÂ.....

This winter, Washington has been roiled by revelations that a handful of columnists wrote in support of administration policies without disclosing they had accepted payments from the government. But the administrationÂ's efforts to generate positive news coverage have been considerably more pervasive than previously knownÂ....

An examination of government-produced news reports offers a look inside a world where the traditional lines between public relations and journalism have become tangled, where local anchors introduce prepackaged segments with "sugges ted" lead-ins written by public relations experts. It is a world where government-produced reports disappear into a maze of satellite transmissions, Web portals, syndicated news programs and network feeds, only to emerge cleansed on the other side as "independent" journalismÂ.....

A recent study by congressional Democrats offers another rough indicator; The Bush Administration spent \$254 million in its first term on public relations contracts, nearly double what the last Clinton Administration spentÂ....

Here is a portion of an history found in a Time-Life Books, THE NEW ORDER. This book covers events that took place in Nazi Germany in the 1930Â's.

"Goebbels was rewarded for good service on March 13, 1933, six weeks after Hitler had become chancellor. He was a ppointed to HitlerÂ's cabinet in the new position of minister of popular enlightenment and propaganda. The ministry con solidated functions formerly scattered in a half-dozen government agencies, and it assumed sweeping new powers. By decree, Goebbels was to be responsible "for all influences on the intellectual life of the nation; for public relations for st ate, culture, and the economy; and for the administration of all the institutions serving these purposes."

SCHWARZENEGGER AIDES DEFEND DISTRIBUTION OF "VIDEO NEWS RELEASES" By Beth Fouhy AP Political Writer

Saturated as he is in the ways of Hollywood, it's no surprise that Gov. Arnold Schwarzenegger know better than most politicians how to fashion an image for television cameras. But the recent disclosure that several state agencies have distributed video news releases masquerading as TV news reports have led Democrats to cry foul and news directors to re-examine their policies about airing such material.

Schwarzenegger aides have acknowledged using state money to produce "video news releases," or VNRs, that cast an entirely favorable light on some of the administration's most controversial policies.

They have been used to advocate proposed regulatory changes, like modifying lunch break rules for workers and easing a new law requiring more nurses in California hospitals.

And one video was produced to help sell a key aspect of Schwarzenegger's policital agenda; to pay teachers by merit instead of tenure, and to make it harder for teachers to get tenure.

The videos resemble local television news stories, complete with a suggested script for anchors to read as a lead-in to the pieces. They're distributed via satellite for TV stations to broadcast as they wish.

Video news releases have been used for years by private industries, like pharmaceutical companies, to promote their products. They are routinely sent to television newrooms around the country and often provide useful vid eo images, or "B-roll," to help illustrate the story. But most TV stations have strict rules governing the use of VNRs, such as clearly labeling the source of the material when it appears on the air....

Earlier in this thread I covered the development of propaganda as a "mind science" that was developed during the time of Nazi Germany. The influences of that time are still alive today. In this article what is the underlying motive for VRNs? Is it about helping people or making money?

100 alleged members of the violent Honduran street gang MS-13 have been arrested in a nationwide sweep, authorities said Monday.

Using information from local and state law enforcement agencies, federal agents charged 103 members of the Mara Sal vatrucha, or MS-13, gang with a range of criminal and immigration charges.

The arrests came in the New York, Washington, Los Angeles, Baltimore, Newark, Miami and Dallas metropolitan areas over the last several weeks.

Officials said MS-13 is one of the largest and most violent street gangs in the United States, and the majority of its mem bers are in the country illegally. The gang has carried out beheadings and grenade attacks in Central America and is kn own to hack their enemies with machetes in cities along the East Coast in the United States.

The arrests are the result of a new "Operation Community Shield" nationwide sting by the U.S. Bureau of Immigration and Customs Enforcement to target violent gangs.

"By bringing the full range of ICE's immigration and customs authorities in the fight against violent street gangs, we can t ake hundreds of gang members off the streets and have a significant impact on community safety," said Homeland Security Assistant Secretary Michael Garcia, who is director of the ICE bureau.

Half of the alleged gang members have prior arrests or convictions for violent crimes, including murder, sodomy, assault, arson and weapons and drug possession, officials said.

In one example, on March 13 agents arrested a man who acknowledged he is a founding member and leader of the MS-13 cell in Hollywood, officials said. The man, who was charged with immigration violations, was previously convicted in the United States for robbery, possession of a dangerous weapon and mail theft.

Authorities also arrested the purported leader of the MS-13 cell in Long Branch, New Jersey on March 10. The suspect has a criminal rap sheet that includes charges of arson, weapons possession and grand larceny, officials said. He was a lso arrested on immigration charges.

Last month, former Homeland Security Deputy Secretary James Loy called MS-13 an emerging threat to the United Stat es, referring to the gang and the al Qaeda terrorist organization in the same breath in testimony to Congress.

Besides al Qaeda, Loy said, "We are seeing the emergence of other threatening groups and gangs like MS-13 that will a lso be destabilizing influences."

Officials arrested 30 alleged gang members in the New York metropolitan area, the most of any of the seven cities target ed. Twenty-five were arrested in Washington, 17 in Los Angeles, and 10 each in the Baltimore, Newark and Miami areas . The last arrest came in Dallas, officials said.

U.S. Trade Deficit Hits All-Time High of \$665.9 Billion in 2004, Commerce Dept. Reports

WASHINGTON (AP) -- The United States deficit in the broadest measure of international trade soared to an all-time high of \$665.9 billion in 2004, showing in stark terms the speed with which the country is becoming indebted to the rest of the world.

The Commerce Department reported Wednesday that the shortfall in the current account was 25.5 percent higher than the previous record, the \$530.7 billion deficit set in 2003. The department also noted that the deficit was worsening as the year ended with the shortfall in the fourth quarter hitting a record \$187.9 billion, up 13.3 percent from the third quarter deficit.

The Bush administration contends the soaring trade deficits reflect a U.S. economy that is growing faster than the rest of the world, pushing up imports and dampening demand for U.S. exports. But private economists are worried that the hug e level of resources being transferred into the hands of foreigners will eventually result in lower U.S. living standards."

U.S. REPORTEDLY MISLED ALLIES ABOUT TRANSFER

Pakistan, not North Korea, sold nuclear material to Libya, intelligence shows

In an effort to increase pressure on North Korea, the Bush Administration told its Asian allies in briefings earlier this year that Pyongyang had exported nuclear material to Libya. That was a significant new charge, the first allegation that North

Korea was helping to create a new nuclear weapon state.

But that is not what U.S. intelligence reported, according to two officials with detailed knowledge of the transaction. Nort h Korea, according to intelligence had supplied uranium hexafluoride-which can be enriched to weapon-grade uranium—to Pakistan. It was Pakistan, a key U. S. ally with its own nuclear arsenal, that sold the material to Libya. The U.S. go vernment had no evidence, the officials said, that North Korea knew of the second transaction.

PakistanÂ's role as both the buyer and the seller was concealed to cover up the part played by WashingtonÂ's partner in the hunt for al-Qaida leaders, according to the officials, who discussed the issue on the condition of anonymity. In addition, a North Korea-Pakistan transfer would not have been news to the U.S. allies, which have known of such transfers for years and viewed them as a business matter between sovereign states.

The Bush administrationÂ's approach, intended to isolate North Korea, instead left allies increasingly doubtful as they be gan to learn that the briefings omitted essential details about the transaction, U.S. officials and foreign diplomats said int erviews. North Korea responded to public reports last month about the briefings by withdrawing for talks with its neighbors and the United StatesÂ...Â...

CHURNING OUT PROPAGANDA, TEXAS-STYLE

Was it just five years and two presidential campaigns ago that George W. Bush was so prolifically mangling English synt ax? Or was that some previous White House resident?

I ask because the once-parodied president is building a Ronald Reagan-like rep these days, and not just in the ideologic al sense.

This Great Communicator (West Texas version) doesnÂ't have ReaganÂ's oratorical gifts, but he makes up in resource mobilization what he lacks in enunciation.

We got a taste of that Monday when Vice President Dick Cheney was dispatched to Bakersfield to pitch BushÂ's Social Security privatization plan.

In a meticulously choreographed infomercial, Cheney—accompanied by Bakersfield Congressman Bill Thomas—hos ted a "town hall meeting" at Cal State Bakersfield that was more like town hall theater. It lacked the two key attributes that tend to characterize the real thing: access and spontaneity.

In order to attend, townfolk first needed to land on somebodyÂ's guest list. And, if history is an indication, the people pa ssing out the invitations were interested in giving the vice president the kind of reception that would best serve his purpo se; a crowd willing to supply itÂ's-all-good sound bites for the evening news.

(A couple of dissenters obtained tickets anyway and briefly interrupted CheneyÂ's Q-and-A-modeled presentation. Ah, t he hazards of going live.)

Cheney called on seven people who raised their hands with questions, and six were conveniently seated on or near an a isle. The microphone-holders located them instantly, and the questions were uniformly positive, on point and clearly stat ed.

Were they a true cross-section of Americans with realistic range of Social Security concerns? Hardly.

Nationally, only 33 percent approve of the presidentÂ's handling of Social Security, according to the latest Newsweek po II; 59 percent disapprove. More people trust the Democrats (44 percent) on the issue than trust Bush (33 percent.)

But the president had a 99 percent approval rating Monday in the Icardo Room at CSUB.

Give Bush this much: His White House manipulates the media as well as any administration ever has.

Two Bakersfield TV stations broadcast all or part of CheneyÂ's appearance live, and all four English-language stations t hat have newscasts topped their evening shows with his appearance. It was probably much the same Monday in Tuscon, where Bush himself was making the same Social Security pitch.

Nothing surprising about that. Republican and Democratic presidents alike have always commanded the cameraÂ's att ention.

But this administration seems to take things a step further. Whether itÂ's allowing idealogue reporters with laughably ina dequate credentials into the White House press briefing room, or paying sympathetic newspaper columnists on the QT t o promote BushÂ's education agenda, or hiring faux reporters to produce one-sided Â"news storiesÂ" that TV stations c an and do broadcast as straight news, this White House plays by a different set of rules.

It is called propaganda.

And to think, A recent Knight Foundation survey tells us that one in three teens believes the government ought to be able to approve newspaper stories prior to publicationÂ...Â"

Did you see that last thought? In the 1930Â's Hitler and Goebbels brought about that very circumstance. This fact alrea dy exists in nations like China. Do you see the growing tide?

When Iran sells oil in euros, the dollar suffers

Iran does not pose a threat to the United State because of its nuclear projects, its WMD, or its support to "terrorists org anizations" as the American administration is claiming, but in its attempt to re-shape the global economical system by c onverting it from a petrodollar to a petroeuro system. Such conversion is looked upon as a flagrant declaration of economical war against the US that would flatten the revenues of the American corporations and eventually might cause an economic collapse.

In June of 2004 Iran declared its intention of setting up an international oil exchange (a bourse) denominated in the Eu ro currency. Many oil-producing as well as oil-consuming countries had expressed their welcome to such petroeuro bour se. The Iranian reports had stated that this bourse may start its trade with the beginning of 2006. Naturally such an oil bo urse would compete against LondonÂ's International Petroleum Exchange (IPE), as well as against the New York Merca ntile Exchange (NYMEX), both owned by American corporations. Oil consuming countries have no choice but use the American Dollar to purchase their oil, since the Dollar has been so far the global standard monetary fund for oil exchang e. This necessitates these countries to keep the Dollar in their central banks as their reserve fund, thus strengthening th e American economy. But if Iran \hat{A} – followed by the other oil-producing countries \hat{A} – offered to accept the Euro as anoth er choice for oil exchange the American economy would suffer a real crisis. We could witness this crisis at the end of 20 05 and beginning of 2006 when oil investors would have the choice to pay \$57 a barrel of oil at the American (NYMEX) and at LondonÂ's (IPE), or pay 37 Euros a barrel at the Iranian oil bourse. Such choice would reduce trade volumes at b oth the Dollar-dependent (NYMEX) and the (IPE). Many countries had studied the conversion from the ever weakening petrodollar to the gradually strengthening petroeuro system. The de-valuation of the Dollar was caused by the American economy shying away from manufacturing local products Â- except those of the military -, by outsourcing the American j obs to the cheaper third world countries and depending only on the general service sector, and by the huge cost of two major wars that are still going on. Foreign investors started withdrawing their money from the shaky American market ca using further devaluation of the Dollar. The keen observer of the money market could have noticed that the devaluatio n of the American Dollar had started since November 2002, while the purchasing power of European Euro had crept up ward to reach nowadays to \$1.34. Compared to the Japanese Yen the Dollar had dropped from 104.45 to 103.90 yen. T he British pound climbed another notch from \$1.9122 to \$1.9272.

Economic reports published at the beginning of this month (March) had pointed towards the deep dive of the American e conomy and to the quick rise of the deficit up to \$665.90 billion at the end of 2004. The worst is still to come. These num bers worried the international banks, who had sent some warnings to the Bush administration.

In its economical war Iran is treading the same path Saddam Hussein had started when he, in 2000, converted all his re serve from the Dollar to the Euro, and demanded payments in Euro for Iraqi oil. Many economists then mocked Saddam because he had lost a lot of money in this conversion. Yet they were very surprised when he recuperated his losses with in less than a year period due to the valuation of the Euro. The American administration became aware of the threat wh en central banks of many countries started keeping Euros along side of Dollars as their monetary reserve and as an exc hange fund for oil (Russian and Chinese central banks in 2003). To avoid economical collapse the Bush administration h astened to invade and to destroy Iraq under false excuses to make it an example to any country who may contemplate d ropping the Dollar, and to manipulate OPECÂ's decisions by controlling the second largest oil resource. Iraqi oil sale was reverted back to the petrodollar standard.

There is only one technical obstacle concerning the use of a euro-based oil exchange system, which is the lack of a euro-denominated oil pricing standard, or oil 'markerÂ' as it is referred to in the industry. The three current oil markers are U.S. dollar denominated, which include the West Texas Intermediate crude (WTI), Norway Brent crude, and the UAE Du bai crude. Yet this did not stop Iran from requiring payments in the euro currency for its European and Asian oil exports since spring 2003.

IranÂ's determination in using the petroeuro is inviting in other countries such as Russia and Latin American countries, a nd even some Saudi investors especially after the Saudi/American relations have weakened lately. This determination h ad also invited an aggressive American political campaign using the same excuses used against Iraq: WMD in the form of nuclear bomb, support to Â"terroristÂ" Lebanese Hezbollah organization, and threat to the peace process in the Middl e East.

During the late 1930's Germany was suffering from the economic collapse of it's currency. Remember the pictures we have all seen of a German citizen pushing a wheel barrow full of paper currency?

Also, do you remember the military tactic of what Germany called the 'blitzkrieg." Germany would pour over the border of neighboring countries in lightning like fashion. One of the results of such tactics is that the banking systems of each country did not have time to move it's gold bullion out of harms way. Hitler invaded each country with the same intensity. He needed real gold to finance his ambitious goals.

Now we may be a country in need of "black gold."

Trade Deficit Hits All-Time High of \$61.04B in Feb., Aggravated by Surging Oil, Textile Imports

WASHINGTON (AP) -- The U.S. trade deficit, aggravated by surging imports of oil and textiles, soared to an all-time high of \$61.04 billion in February.

The Commerce Department said Tuesday that the February imbalance was up 4.3 percent from a \$58.5 billion trade ga p in January as a small \$50 million rise in U.S. exports of goods and services was swamped by a \$2.58 billion increase in imports.

The surging trade deficit is leading to an increase in protectionist pressures as American textile and clothing manufactur ers are lobbying the administration to limit imports of Chinese textile and clothing goods to ward off a flood of products n ow that global quotas have expired.

For February, imports of textiles and clothing from China rose by 9.8 percent even though America's overall trade gap wi th China actually narrowed to \$13.9 billion, down by 9.2 percent from a January deficit of \$15.3 billion. The improvement reflected an increase in U.S. exports to China and declines in other import categories outside of textiles.

For the first two months of this year, the trade deficit is running at an annual rate of \$717.2 billion, a full \$100 billion abov e the record imbalance of \$617.1 billion set for all of 2004.

HAVANA, Cuba (AP) -- Hundreds of thousands of Cubans answered Fidel Castro's call to file past the American missio n early Tuesday in a "March against Terrorism," demanding that the United States arrest a Cuban militant in the deadly bombing of an airliner.

Dressed in his traditional olive green military uniform and cap, the 78-year-old Castro showed up in the crowd outside the U.S. Interests Section minutes before the march was to start.

"Down with terrorism!" Castro shouted in brief comments before he stepped off to lead the march. "Down with Nazi doctr ines and methods! Down with the lies!"

Marchers began gathering hours before dawn, recalling the scores of massive marches the communist government organized in 2000 during the battle for the return of young Cuban castaway Elian Gonzalez to his homeland.

Cuban state TV showed huge rivers of people crowded into side streets spilling into the Malecon coastal highway, which runs past the American mission. Most marchers were T-shirts in red, blue or white, the colors of the Cuban flag.

Protesters were calling for the arrest of Castro's longtime foe, Luis Posada Carriles, an elderly Cuban exile who recently traveled to the United States where he is seeking political asylum. Venezuela is seeking the extradition of Posada in the 1976 airliner bombing that killed 73 people.

Posada, was once a senior officer of the Venezuelan intelligence service, denies involvement in the bombing.

Cuban officials -- and newly released U.S. archives -- also link Posada to other violent actions, some of them military, so me aimed at civilians. The declassified U.S. documents indicate he was on the CIA's payroll until a few months before the 1976 bombing.

In his first media interview since arriving in the United States earlier this year, Posada again denied involved in the airlin er explosion in a story published Tuesday by the Miami Herald.

"They accused me of being the intellectual author of fabricating a weapon of war and of treason to the homeland. No on e saw me make a bomb," Posada said Wednesday in a two-hour interview at a luxury condominium. "Sincerely, I didn't k now anything about it."

But he was less forthcoming about a series of bombings targeting Cuban tourist sites in 1997, including one that killed a young Italian tourist. Despite previous admissions, Posada refused to confirm or deny playing a role in those bombings, saying, "Let's leave it to history."

Posada applied for political asylum shortly after arriving in Miami in March following an illegal trip through Central America

Since then, Castro has been waging a relentless campaign, appearing frequently on state TV and calling on the U.S. go vernment to arrest his old nemesis.

Earthly Empires

There's no shortage of churches in Houston, deep in the heart of the Bible Belt. So it's surprising that the largest one in the city -- and in the entire country -- is tucked away in a depressed corner most Houstonians would never dream of visiting. Yet 30,000 people endure punishing traffic on the narrow roads leading to Lakewood Church every weekend to hear Pastor Joel Osteen deliver upbeat messages of hope. A youthful-looking 42-year-old with a ready smile, he reassures the thousands who show up at each of his five weekend services that "God has a great future in store for you." His services are rousing affairs that often include his wife, Victoria, leading prayers and his mother, Dodie, discussing passages from the Bible.

Osteen is so popular that he has nearly quadrupled attendance since taking over the pulpit from his late father in 1999, winning over believers from other churches as well as throngs of the "unsaved." Many are drawn first by his ubiquitous p resence on television. Each week 7 million people catch the slickly produced broadcast of his Sunday sermons on natio nal cable and network channels, for which Lakewood shells out \$15 million a year. Adherents often come clutching a copy of Osteen's best-seller, Your Best Life Now, which has sold 2.5 million copies since its publication last fall.

To keep them coming back, Lakewood offers free financial counseling, low-cost bulk food, even a "fidelity group" for me n with "sexual addictions." Demand is brisk for the self-help sessions. Angie Mosqueda, 34, who was brought up a Cath olic, says she and her husband, Mark, first went to Lakewood in 2000 when they were on the brink of a divorce. Mark even threw her out of the house after she confessed to infidelity. But over time, Lakewood counselors "really helped us to forgive one another and start all over again," she says.

Disney Look

Osteen's flourishing Lakewood enterprise brought in \$55 million in contributions last year, four times the 1999 amount, c hurch officials say. Flush with success, Osteen is laying out \$90 million to transform the massive Compaq Center in dow ntown Houston -- former home of the NBA's Houston Rockets -- into a church that will seat 16,000, complete with a high -tech stage for his TV shows and Sunday School for 5,000 children. After it opens in July, he predicts weekend attendan ce will rocket to 100,000. Says Osteen: "Other churches have not kept up, and they lose people by not changing with the times."

Pastor Joel is one of a new generation of evangelical entrepreneurs transforming their branch of Protestantism into one

of the fastest-growing and most influential religious groups in America. Their runaway success is modeled unabashedly on business. They borrow tools ranging from niche marketing to MBA hiring to lift their share of U.S. churchgoers. Like Osteen, many evangelical pastors focus intently on a huge potential market -- the millions of Americans who have drifted away from mainline Protestant denominations or simply never joined a church in the first place.

To reach these untapped masses, savvy leaders are creating Sunday Schools that look like Disney World (NYSE: DIS - News) and church cafés with the appeal of Starbucks (NasdaqNM: SBUX - News). Although most hold strict religious views, they scrap staid hymns in favor of multimedia worship and tailor a panoply of services to meet all kinds of consum er needs, from divorce counseling to help for parents of autistic kids. Like Osteen, many offer an upbeat message intert wined with a religious one. To make newcomers feel at home, some do away with standard religious symbolism -- even basics like crosses and pews -- and design churches to look more like modern entertainment halls than traditional place s of worship.

Branding Whiz

So successful are some evangelicals that they're opening up branches like so many new Home Depots (NYSE: HD - Ne ws) or Subways. This year, the 16.4 million-member Southern Baptist Convention plans to "plant" 1,800 new churches u sing by-the-book niche-marketing tactics. "We have cowboy churches for people working on ranches, country music churches, even several motorcycle churches aimed at bikers," says Martin King, a spokesman for the Southern Baptists' No rth American Mission Board.

Branding whizzes that they are, the new church leaders are spreading their ideas through every available outlet. A line of "Biblezines" packages the New Testament in glossy magazines aimed at different market segments -- there's a hip-hop version and one aimed at teen girls. Christian music appeals to millions of youths, some of whom otherwise might never give church a second thought, serving up everything from alternative rock to punk and even "screamo" (they scream reli gious lyrics). California megachurch pastor Rick Warren's 2002 book, The Purpose-Driven Life, has become the fastest-selling nonfiction book of all time, with more than 23 million copies sold, in part through a novel "pyro marketing" strategy . Then there's the Left Behind phenomenon, a series of action-packed, apocalyptic page-turners about those left on eart h after Christ's second coming, selling more than 60 million copies since 1995.

Evangelicals' eager embrace of corporate-style growth strategies is giving them a tremendous advantage in the battle for religious market share, says Roger Finke, a Pennsylvania State University sociology professor and co-author of a new book, The Churching of America, 1776-2005: Winners and Losers in Our Religious Economy. A new Pope has given Ca tholicism a burst of global publicity, but its nominal membership growth in the U.S. stems largely from the influx of Mexic an immigrants. Overall, the Catholic Church's long-term decline in U.S. attendance accelerated after the recent sex-abus e scandals, there's a severe priest shortage, and parish churches and schools are closing in the wake of a financial crisi s.

Similarly, the so-called mainline Protestants who dominated 20th century America have become the religious equivalent of General Motors Corp. (NYSE: GM - News) The large denominations -- including the United Methodist Church and the Episcopal Church -- have been shrinking for decades and have lost more than 1 million members in the past 10 years al one. Today, mainline Protestants account for just 16% of the U.S. population, says University of Akron political scientist John C. Green.

In contrast, evangelicalism's theological flexibility gives it the freedom to adapt to contemporary culture. With no overarc hing authority like the Vatican, leaders don't need to wrestle with a bureaucratic hierarchy that dictates acceptable behav ior. "If you have a vision for ministry, you just do it, which makes it far easier to respond to market demand," says Univer sity of North Carolina at Chapel Hill sociology professor Christian Smith.

With such low barriers to entry, the number of evangelical megachurches -- defined as those that attract at least 2,000 w eekly worshippers -- has shot up to 880 from 50 in 1980, figures John N. Vaughan, founder of research outfit Church Gr

owth Today in Bolivar, Mo. He calculates that a new megachurch emerges in the U.S. an average of every two days. Ov erall, white evangelicals make up more than a quarter of Americans today, experts estimate. The figures are fuzzy beca use there's no common definition of evangelical, which typically refers to Christians who believe the Bible is the literal wo rk of God. They may include many Southern Baptists, nondenominational churches, and some Lutherans and Methodist s. There are also nearly 25 million black Protestants who consider themselves evangelicals but largely don't share the c onservative politics of most white ones. Says pollster George Gallup, who has studied religious trends for decades: "The evangelicals are the most vibrant branch of Christianity."

The triumph of evangelical Christianity is profoundly reshaping many aspects of American politics and society. Historically, much of the U.S. political and business elite has been mainline Protestant. Today, President George W. Bush and more than a dozen members of Congress, including House Speaker Dennis Hastert, are evangelicals. More important, the Republican Right has been fueled by the swelling ranks of evangelicals, whose leaders tend to be conservative politically despite their progressive marketing methods. In the 1960s and '70s, prominent evangelicals like Billy Graham kept a careful separation of pulpit and politics -- even though he served as a spiritual adviser to President Richard M. Nixon. That began to change in the early 1980s, when Jerry Falwell formed the Moral Majority to express evangelicals' political views. Many of today's evangelicals hope to expand their clout even further. They're also gaining by taking their views into Corporate America. Exhibit A: the recent clash at software giant Microsoft.

As they thrive, though, there are growing tensions, with some mainline Protestants offended by their conservative politics and brazen marketing. "Jesus was not a capitalist; check out what says about how hard it is to get into heaven if you're a rich man," says the Reverend Robert W. Edgar, general secretary of the liberal National Council of Churches.

Especially controversial are leaders like Osteen and the flamboyant Creflo A. Dollar, pastor of World Changers Church I nternational in College Park, Ga., who preach "the prosperity gospel." They endorse material wealth and tell followers th at God wants them to be prosperous. In his book, Osteen talks about how his wife, Victoria, a striking blonde who dress es fashionably, wanted to buy a fancy house some years ago, before the money rolled in. He thought it wasn't possible. "But Victoria had more faith," he wrote. "She convinced me we could live in an elegant home...and several years later, it did come to pass." Dollar, too, defends materialistic success. Dubbed "Pass-the-Dollar" by critics, he owns two Rolls Ro yces (NasdaqNM: RYCEY.PK - News) and travels in a Gulfstream 3 jet. "I practice what I preach, and the Bible says...th at God takes pleasure in the prosperity of his servants," says Dollar, 43, nattily attired in French cuffs and a pinstriped su it.

Hucksters?

Some evangelical leaders acknowledge that flagrant materialism can raise the specter of religious hucksterism \tilde{A} la Sin clair Lewis' fictional Elmer Gantry or Jim and Tammy Faye Bakker. "Our goal is not to turn the church into a business," in sists Warren, the founder of Saddleback megachurch in Lake Forest, Calif. After The Purpose-Driven Life made him milli ons, he repaid Saddleback all the salary he had taken over the years and still lives modestly. Cautions Kurt Frederickso n, a director of the Fuller Theological Seminary in Pasadena, Calif.: "We have to be careful when a pastor moves into the CEO mode and becomes too market-oriented, or there might be a reaction against megachurches just as there is against Wal-Mart."

Many evangelicals say they're just trying to satisfy demands not met by traditional churches. Craig Groeschel, who launc hed Life Church in Edmond, Okla., in 1996, started out doing market research with non-churchgoers in the area -- and g ot an earful. "They said churches were full of hypocrites and were boring," he recalls. So he designed Life Church to counter those preconceptions, with lively, multimedia-filled services in a setting that's something between a rock concert and a coffee shop.

All the razzmatazz has helped Life Church quadruple its Sunday school attendance to more than 2,500 a week. "The kids are b ringing their parents to church," says children's pastor Scott Werner.

Such marketing and services help to create brand loyalty any CEO would envy. Willow Creek ranks in the top 5% of 250 major brands, right up with Nike (NYSE: NKE - News) and John Deere (NYSE: DE - News), says Eric Arnson. He helped develop a consumer-brand practice that McKinsey then bought and recently did a probono study for Willow Creek using that methodology.

Other megachurches are franchising their good name. Life Church now has five campuses in Oklahoma and will expand into Phoenix this fall. Pastor Groeschel jumped the 1,000 miles to Arizona after market research pinpointed Phoenix as an area with a large population but few effective churches. Atlanta's Dollar, who is African American, has pushed into five countries, including Nigeria and South Africa.

All this growth, plus the tithing many evangelicals encourage, is generating gushers of cash. A traditional U.S. church ty pically has fewer than 200 members and an annual budget of around \$100,000. The average megachurch pulls in \$4.8 million, according to a 1999 study by the Hartford Seminary, one of the few surveys on the topic. The money is also fueling a megachurch building boom. First Baptist Church of Woodstock, near Atlanta, for example, has just finished a \$62 m illion, 7,000-seat sanctuary.

Megachurch business ventures sometimes grow beyond the bounds of the church itself. In the mid-1990s, Kirbyjon Cald well, a Wharton MBA who sold bonds for First Boston before he enrolled in seminary, formed an economic development corporation that revived a depressed neighborhood near Houston's 14,000-member Windsor Village United Methodist C hurch, which he heads. A former Kmart now houses a mix of church and private businesses employing 270 people, including a Christian school and a bank. New plans call for a massive center with senior housing, retailing, and a public school.

For all their seemingly unstoppable success, evangelicals must contend with powerful forces in U.S. society. The ranks of Americans who express no religious preference have quadrupled since 1991, to 14%, according to a recent poll. Des pite the megachurch surge, overall church attendance has remained fairly flat. And if anything, popular culture has become more vulgar in recent years. Still, experts like pollster Gallup see clear signs of a rising fascination with spirituality in the U.S. The September 11 attacks are one reason. So is the aging of the culturally influential Baby Boom, since spiritual ity tends to increase with age, he says. If so, no one is better poised than evangelicals to capitalize on the trend.

The main campus of Groeschel's Life Church in Edmond, Okl a., includes a "Toon Town" of 3D buildings, a 16-foot high slide, and an animatronic police chief who recites rules. All the razzmatazz has helped Life Church quadruple its Sunday school attendance to more than 2,500 a week. "The kids are b ringing their parents to church," says children's pastor Scott Werner.

Such marketing and services help to create brand loyalty any CEO would envy. Willow Creek ranks in the top 5% of 250 major brands, right up with Nike (NYSE: NKE - News) and John Deere (NYSE: DE - News), says Eric Arnson. He helped develop a consumer-brand practice that McKinsey then bought and recently did a probono study for Willow Creek using that methodology.

Other megachurches are franchising their good name. Life Church now has five campuses in Oklahoma and will expand into Phoenix this fall. Pastor Groeschel jumped the 1,000 miles to Arizona after market research pinpointed Phoenix as an area with a large population but few effective churches. Atlanta's Dollar, who is African American, has pushed into five countries, including Nigeria and South Africa.

All this growth, plus the tithing many evangelicals encourage, is generating gushers of cash. A traditional U.S. church ty pically has fewer than 200 members and an annual budget of around \$100,000. The average megachurch pulls in \$4.8 million, according to a 1999 study by the Hartford Seminary, one of the few surveys on the topic. The money is also fueling a megachurch building boom. First Baptist Church of Woodstock, near Atlanta, for example, has just finished a \$62 m illion, 7,000-seat sanctuary.

Megachurch business ventures sometimes grow beyond the bounds of the church itself. In the mid-1990s, Kirbyjon Cald well, a Wharton MBA who sold bonds for First Boston before he enrolled in seminary, formed an economic development corporation that revived a depressed neighborhood near Houston's 14,000-member Windsor Village United Methodist C hurch, which he heads. A former Kmart now houses a mix of church and private businesses employing 270 people, including a Christian school and a bank. New plans call for a massive center with senior housing, retailing, and a public school

For all their seemingly unstoppable success, evangelicals must contend with powerful forces in U.S. society. The ranks of Americans who express no religious preference have quadrupled since 1991, to 14%, according to a recent poll. Des pite the megachurch surge, overall church attendance has remained fairly flat. And if anything, popular culture has become more vulgar in recent years. Still, experts like pollster Gallup see clear signs of a rising fascination with spirituality in the U.S. The September 11 attacks are one reason. So is the aging of the culturally influential Baby Boom, since spiritual ity tends to increase with age, he says. If so, no one is better poised than evangelicals to capitalize on the trend.

US army 'let down dead NFL star'

Tillman joined up six months after the 11 Septemb

er 2001 terror attacks

The family of NFL star turned soldier, Pat Tillman have expressed anger at the US army's handling of his death.

"After it happened, all the people in positions of authority went out of their way to script this," his father told the Washingt on Post.

Tillman died in Afghanistan in 2004 and for weeks afterwards, US army officials said he was killed by enemy fire.

They are said to have known he had been accidentally shot by US troops, but failed to inform his family of this.

'Poster boy'

Tillman's parents said they believe the military concocted the story that their son had been killed in a hail of enemy fire to

stimulate national pride.

The fact that he was the ultimate team player and he watched his own men kill him is absolutely he artbreaking and tragic. The fact that they lied about it afterwards is disgusting

"They purposely interfered with the investigation, they covered it up. I think they thought they could control it, and they re alised that their recruiting efforts were going to go to hell in a hand basket if the truth about the death got out. They blew up their poster boy," Patrick Tillman Senior said.

Tillman turned his back on a contract with the Arizona Cardinals American football team, worth \$3.6m (£2m), when he j oined the US army six months after the 11 September 2001 attacks.

He enlisted in the US Rangers alongside his brother Kevin - a former professional baseball player with the Cleveland Ind ians - and both were subsequently despatched to Afghanistan as part of the US war on terror.

"Pat had high ideals about the country, that's why he did what he did. The military let him down. The administration let him down. It was a sign of disrespect," his mother Mary Tillman said.

Uniform burnt

Tillman died on 22 April 2004 when his US Rangers patrol was hit by gunfire as it passed along a canyon road in Khost province, south of Kabul, at twilight.

Fans flocked to pay tribute to the star when he died

The 27-year-old was hit by a hail of bullets, which army officials quickly claimed came from the enemy - a story they stuck to for weeks afterwards.

But according to a recent US military investigation, army chiefs were informed that Tillman's death was the result of "frie ndly fire" within days of his death, but chose not to reveal this fact to his family or friends.

The true details of his death were not made known until 29 May 2004, weeks after a televised memorial service in which fans paid tribute to the man hailed as an "American hero".

"The fact that he was the ultimate team player and he watched his own men kill him is absolutely heartbreaking and tragi c. The fact that they lied about it afterward is disgusting," his mother said.

Tillman's uniform and body armour were burned the day after he was fatally shot.

At the time, officials claimed his uniform had been burned because it presented a biohazard. However, investigators no w say his clothes should have been preserved as evidence.

The military investigation, led by Brig Gen Gary Jones of the Army Special Operations Command, was carried out at the request of Tillman family, who wanted to know why the uniform was burned and why information was withheld.

Pension penance Retirement funding needs a major overhaul, now

The traditional notion of retirement took a body blow recently. United Airlines dumped its pension plan, the largest such default in U.S. history.

It won't be the last.

The corporate pension system is staggering. We need to shore it up before it collapses.

Many companies have been underfunding their retirement plans for years. With the added pressure of a weak stock m arket and low interest rates, the shortfall is estimated at \$450 billion.

The government agency that insures pensions, the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corp., is reeling, too. With the United def ault, it has deficit of nearly \$30 billion.

If struggling companies keep bailing out of pension plans, the PBGC will face financial catastrophe.

There are just three possibilities for dealing with the losses, says Bradley Belt, executive director of the PBGC. The companies that participate in the insurance program will have to make up the difference. Workers will take severe cuts in benefits (there's already a limit on their paychecks when the PBGC takes over a plan). Or taxpayers will be left holding the bag.

Stiffing workers is neither fair nor acceptable.

Sure, companies have been phasing out the "defined benefit" plans, which providing a regular retirement check for life. Only one out of five workers now has that once-standard benefit.

But there's still a huge number of Americans - an estimated 34 million - who have made their retirement plans counting on the promised pension.

A full-scale rescue by taxpayers is equally unacceptable.

When the federal government is deep in debt, we would be hard-pressed to come up with the resources. And the pens ion liabilities dwarf the size of the fiasco that occurred when the savings-and-loan industry went belly-up.

We must find ways to keep the pension system functioning.

In some cases, that means companies will freeze current benefits and shift to a different type of pension, based not on fixed payouts but on the amount of money contributed to the plan. Northwest and Continental airlines are negotiating su ch an arrangement with their unions, according to news reports.

Congress needs to clarify the rules for companies seeking to switch from traditional plans to other systems.

Regulations must be tighter for funding pension plans, preventing companies from deliberately contributing too little m oney. Congress should also remove the disincentives for putting in extra funding when times are flush.

We must also strengthen the PBGC. Premiums need to be higher for participating companies and should take into acc ount the relative riskiness of their pension plans. The Bush administration has proposed an increase of nearly 60 percent in premiums.

Some argue that an across-the-board premium increase puts an unfair burden on responsible companies that have pr operly funded their pension plans. And it would be counterproductive if the rate increase were so high that it prompted c ompanies to pull out of the pension system, shrinking the support for the PBGC.

On the other hand, the current rate for premiums was set in 1994. An adjustment is certainly in order.

The biggest adjustment, though, is for workers.

Even the most effective job of stabilizing pensions is no more than temporary life support. The traditional security of a company-sponsored retirement plan, with a dependable monthly paycheck, is gone.

And Social Security, as we know, is in real need of an overhaul.

The bottom line: Save like crazy.

Researcher Stands by Fetal Pain Findings Review suggesting early-stage fetuses don't feel pain has triggered heated debate. By Randy Dotinga HealthDay Reporter

WEDNESDAY, Aug. 24 (HealthDay News) -- A controversial new research article questioning whether early-term fetuses feel pain has triggered a heated debate on how the research might influence the flash-point realm of abortion politics.

But a neuroscientist who helped write the paper, published Wednesday, said there's no doubt about the conclusion: Humans only feel pain if they have a properly functioning brain, and fetuses in the early stages of development don't.

"The circuitry is not there," at least in the first 20 weeks, said Dr. Henry Ralston, a professor of anatomy and neuroscience at the University of California, San Francisco. "Without the connections, the sensation can't take place."

The report, a review of known research by four doctors and a researcher at UCSF, goes even further: In examining the effectiveness of giving anesthesia to a fetus for therapuetic procedures or abortion, the researchers concluded that fetal perception of pain is unlikely before the third trimester, at 29 to 30 weeks.

Other doctors disagree, however, as do anti-abortion activists who criticized the findings, which appear in the Aug. 24/31 issue of the Journal of the American Medical Association.

Dr. K. S. Anand, a pediatrician at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, told The New York Times, "There is circumstantial evidence to suggest that pain occurs in the fetus."

Anand said premature babies only 23 or 24 weeks old cry when their heels are pricked for blood tests and become conditioned to cry when someone nears their feet.

"In the first trimester, there is very likely no pain perception," Anand said. "By the second trimester, all bets are off, and I would argue that in the absence of absolute proof we should give the fetus the benefit of the doubt if we are going to call ourselves compassionate and humane physicians."

The study is also raising eyebrows, according to a Philadelphia Inquirer report, because one of its authors is the head of an abortion clinic. Her affiliation was not disclosed in the study, nor was that of the lead author, a medical student who once worked for an abortion-rights organization, the newspaper said.

The researcher, UCSF obstetrician-gynecologist Eleanor A. Drey, is medical director of the abortion clinic at San Francisco General Hospital. She told the Inquirer: "We thought it was critical to include an expert in abortion among the authors. I think my presence ... should not serve to politicize a scholarly report."

JAMA editor-in-chief Catherine D. DeAngelis told the newspaper she had been unaware of that.

"This is the first I've heard about it," she said. "We ask them to reveal any conflict of interest. I would have published" the disclosure if it had been made.

The issue of fetal pain, once fairly obscure, has taken an increasingly prominent position in the public consciousness in recent months. More than a dozen state legislatures -- including those in New York and California -- have debated whether to require doctors to tell women getting abortions about the potential pain felt by fetuses during the procedures. The proposed laws would require doctors to offer anesthesia for the fetus.

Arkansas, Georgia and Minnesota have already passed such laws.

And Congress is considering whether to require doctors to provide anesthesia to fetuses in all cases of abortion after 22 weeks of gestational age. (The new study noted that only 1.2 percent of abortions in the United States are performed at or after 21 weeks.)

Ralston said he and his colleagues launched their study, an analysis of previous research, to provide some perspective on the debate.

The researchers examined studies that looked at feelings of fetal pain before the age of 30 weeks. They found that while there hasn't been much research, the evidence suggests that fetuses aren't able to sense pain before the third trimester. They also report that "little or no" research provides guidance about the use of anesthesia on fetuses.

Advocates of anesthesia legislation have pointed to medical reports that fetuses shy away from painful stimuli, like the stick of a needle, in operations during pregnancy. Some doctors argue that infants between 20 and 30 weeks actually suffer pain more intensely than older fetuses and babies because their neural systems aren't set up to adequately process the sensations.

But Ralston said early fetal reactions are simply reflexes stemming from the spinal cord, not a matter of brain response to pain. The spinal cord develops earlier than the brain, as early as eight weeks, he said.

So when do fetuses actually start feeling pain? Ralston said it's not clear, but the lack of feeling before 20 to 22 weeks is "open and shut."

However, Dr. David A. Grimes, a former head of abortion surveillance at the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention who now delivers babies and also performs abortions in Chapel Hill, N.C., told the Times, "This is an

unknowable question."

"All we can do in medicine is to infer," he added.

Still, he said, the new research makes a compelling case that fetuses younger than 29 weeks have no perception of pain.

St. Paul, Minn. — The law was a top legislative priority for the state's largest anti-abortion group, Minnesota Citizens C oncerned for Life. While such measures often draw a fight from abortion rights supporters, Minnesota's fetal pain measure passed with little opposition.

The new law says women seeking abortions who are more than 20 weeks pregnant must be offered anesthesia for their fetuses. In practical terms, that will not affect many cases. Only 67 of the nearly 14,000 abortions performed in Minnesot a last year were at more than 20 weeks. Still, Minnesota Citizens Concerned for Line lobbyist Jackie Moen says her org anization felt strongly about the provision.

"We do want people to know that these are unborn children, and they can feel pain," she said.

Moen says scientific evidence shows that by 20 weeks, all the systems are in place for a fetus to feel pain. But the Ameri can College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists says there is no legitimate scientific information indicating that a fetus ex periences pain. Chavez warns U.S. against invasion

United States says it has no plans to invade.

Venezuelan President Hugo Chavez addressed businessmen in Paris Thursday.

PARIS, France (AP) -- Venezuelan President Hugo Chavez said Thursday that his government is preparing for a possible U.S. invasion, and he warned that such "aggression" would send gasoline prices in the United States soaring.

The U.S. government repeated that it is not planning any such thing.

Chavez, a vocal critic of "imperialism" and the Bush administration, said he was not against the American people -- just t he current government.

"We are sure that it will be very difficult for the United States to attack Venezuela," Chavez said. He said his country has eight oil refineries and 14,000 gasoline stations in the United States.

"If the United States tried to attack Venezuela by a direct invasion, forget the oil," he said during a two-hour news confer ence beamed live to Venezuela. "Everyday we send 1.5 million barrels to the United States."

The barrel price of crude oil could hit \$150 following a U.S. attack, Chavez said. Currently New York light sweet crude oil trades around \$60 a barrel.

"That's why Pat Robertson, the spiritual adviser of Mr. Bush, is calling for my assassination. That would be much cheape r than an invasion." Chavez said.

Robertson, the U.S. religious broadcaster, said in August that Chavez should be killed, then later apologized.

In Washington, State Department spokesman Sean McCormack said Chavez's suspicions were unfounded.

"I've stated many times before, the United States is prepared to work with any government in the region: left of center, c enter, right of center. Our issue is with states that don't govern in a democratic manner," McCormack said.

The Venezuelan leader used his news conference to trumpet what he called his "alternative" vision of a world that works for the poor rather than corporations seeking profits.

Chavez reiterated longtime claims that the United States finances his opponents, seeks his ouster and sabotages efforts to move his country forward.

"Venezuela is used to defending itself ... and fighting imperialism," Chavez said, speaking in Spanish with a French translator.

"We must be ready for an aggression," said Chavez, who previously said Venezuela is organizing an expanded military r eserve and civilian defense units.

In an interview with the British Broadcasting Corp. radio aired earlier Thursday, Chavez said he had evidence to prove the U.S. government was planning an invasion.

Chavez said he believed the reason Washington was plotting an invasion was to take control of Venezuela's oil fields.

Meanwhile, Israel canceled -- under American pressure -- a lucrative deal to upgrade Venezuelan warplanes, Israel TV reported Thursday.

The report said Israel was to install its own systems in U.S.-made F-16 fighters for the Venezuelan air force, but the U.S. government forced Israel to call off the deal. No dollar figure for the deal was given.

Israeli Defense Ministry officials were not immediately available for comment.

Voodoo practitioners scatter after Katrina

Louisiana (AP) -- The last time Don Glossop saw his customers they were ritually burning green candles, hoping voodo o would pierce the federal bureaucracy and hasten the arrival of desperately needed relief checks.

Glossop's shop, New Orleans Mistic, has been closed since Hurricane Katrina swamped the city two months ago, and m ost of his clients, who practice a local variant of voodoo, have scattered across the country.

He fears that Katrina, which laid waste to entire neighborhoods and claimed hundreds of lives here, may take another ca sualty: New Orleans' status as the country's voodoo capital.

"As of today I would say it's pretty dead," Glossop said. "Even the tourist shops are in jeopardy. There is a chance for a huge loss here."

Voodoo has long been entrenched in New Orleans, quietly practiced in homes with altars, candles and incense to solve problems of the heart and wallet. Before the storm tore through, about 15 percent of the city's population actively practic ed, according to Lisa Fannon, a tour guide, though estimates vary widely.

Voodoo is part of the vernacular here, showing up in jazz and conversation. Some residents still sprinkle red brick dust on their doorway steps to ward off evil spirits.

It's an economic draw as well, enticing curious tourists and their pocketbooks into stores such as Glossop's.

While plans are still on for an annual voodoo fest for Monday, organizer Brandi Kelley said the event will be much smalle r this year because many drummers and dancers were forced to relocate.

The ceremony at her shop will focus mainly on healing the city.

"We have got to call on the ancestors for help and get real serious about it," Kelley said. "The spirit is in the city. It's the spirit of this city that is going to rise from the ashes."

If only she could find her snake for the closing ceremony. He was supposed to be in a bathtub of a friend's apartment.

"They say he's somewhere in this room full of debris," Kelley said, her voice trailing off.

It wasn't supposed to be this way. The "go away" hurricane ritual was performed in July, just as it always is at the start of the hurricane season.

"It didn't quite work out so well," acknowledged Giselle Moller, manager of Marie Laveau House of Voodoo. But, she sai d, it may have helped a bit.

"Imagine if the hurricane would have hit us straight on. There would have been no French Quarter," she said.

Even before Katrina, some thought voodoo was fading in New Orleans because the younger generation was less interes ted in the complicated practice, which involves substantial memorization of rituals and songs, Glossop said.

But New Orleans is not giving up on voodoo, notwithstanding evangelist Franklin Graham's recent comments that the cit y's Mardi Gras revelry and ties to voodoo were adverse to Christian beliefs.

Defenders say voodoo is a legitimate African-based religion that has been unfairly maligned in movies and popular cultu re.

"Voodoo is not some kind of black magic cult," said Wade Davis, a Washington-based National Geographic explorer-in-residence who has studied the religion extensively in Haiti. "It's the distillation of very profound religious ideas that came over during the tragic era of slavery."

In New Orleans, much of what is practiced these days is a system of folk magic. Some also practice Haitian voodoo.

As the city revives, proponents hope voodoo will make a comeback, too, because it's part of the intrigue that draws visito rs.

"I think it's going to be a very strong part of what will get people back here," said Jameson King, who works in one of the voodoo shops in the French Quarter. "We're here for more than drinking."

US 'uses incendiary arms' in Iraq

Italian state TV, Rai, has broadcast a documentary accusing the US military of using white phosphorus bombs against c ivilians in the Iraqi city of Falluja.

Rai says this amounts to the illegal use of chemical arms, t

hough the bombs are considered incendiary devices.

Eyewitnesses and ex-US soldiers say the weapon was used in built-up areas in the insurgent-held city.

The US military denies this, but admits using white phosphorus bombs in Iraq to illuminate battlefields.

Washington is not a signatory of an international treaty restricting the use of white phosphorus devices.

Spontaneously flammable chemical used for battlefield illumination Contact with particles causes burning of skin and fles h

Use of incendiary weapons prohibited for attacking civilians (Protocol III of Convention on Certain Conventional Weapons)

Transmission of the documentary comes a day after the arrival of Iraqi President Jalal Talabani on a five-day official visit to Italy.

It also coincides with the first anniversary of the US-led assault on Falluja, which displaced most of the city's 300,000 population and left many of its buildings destroyed.

The documentary was shown on Rai's rolling news channel, with a warning that the some of the footage was disturbing.

The future of the 3,000-strong Italian peacekeeping contingent in Iraq is the subject of a political tug-of-war, says the BB C's David Willey in Rome.

'Destroyed evidence'

The documentary begins with formerly classified footage of the Americans using napalm bombs during the Vietnam war.

It then shows a series of photographs from Falluja of corpses with the flesh burnt off but clothes still intact - which it says is consistent with the effects of white phosphorus on humans.

Jeff Englehart, described as a former US soldier who served in Falluja, tells of how he heard orders for white phosphoru s to be deployed over military radio - and saw the results.

"Burned bodies, burned women, burned children; white phosphorus kills indiscriminately... When it makes contact with s kin, then it's absolutely irreversible damage, burning flesh to the bone,

Last December, the US state department issued a denial of what it called "widespread myths" about the use of illegal we apons in Falluja.

"Phosphorus shells are not outlawed. US forces have used them very sparingly in Falluja, for illumination purposes. The y were fired into the air to illuminate enemy positions at night, not at enemy fighters," the US statement said.

However, the Rai film also alleges that Washington has systematically attempted to destroy filmed evidence of the alleg ed use of white phosphorus on civilians in Falluja.

Italian public opinion has been consistently against the war and the Rai documentary can only reinforce calls for a pullou t of Italian soldiers as soon as possible, our correspondent says.

Both the Italian government and opposition leaders are talking about a phased withdrawal in 2006.

President Talabani and the US say the continued presence of multi-national forces in Iraq is essential.

Powell Aide Wilkerson Says Bush Policymaking 'Courts Disaster'

Oct. 21 (Bloomberg) -- The Bush administration has ``courted disaster" in Iraq, Iran and North Korea and is so inept t hat it could not cope with a major domestic disaster, according to Lawrence Wilkerson, chief of staff to former Secretary of State Colin Powell.

Wilkerson said Vice President Dick Cheney and Defense Secretary Donald Rumsfeld formed a ``cabal" to formulate U. S. foreign policy in isolation from other government institutions, seriously weakening the nation's decision-making proces s.

"If something comes along that is truly serious, truly serious, something like a nuclear weapon going off in a major Ame rican city, or something like a major pandemic, you are going to see the ineptitude of this government in a way that will t ake you back to the Declaration of Independence," Wilkerson said in a speech Oct. 19 to the New America Foundation, a Washington research institute.

The Bush administration has ``flummoxed" the interagency decision-making process, Wilkerson said. He chastised Con gress for abandoning oversight and warned that, without more accountability, ``it's going to get even more dangerous than it already is."

Wilkerson, 60, left office in January along with Powell at the end of President George W. Bush's first term. A retired colo nel, he is a former director of the U.S. Marine Corps War College and a former associate director of policy planning at the e State Department. He also served under Powell when Powell was chairman of the U.S. Joint Chiefs under President G eorge H.W. Bush.

Other Critics

Wilkerson's criticism echoes that of others who've left the current administration, including former Treasury Secretary P aul O'Neill and counter-terrorism adviser Richard Clarke, although not Powell, who has remained largely silent. Wilkerso n said Powell was ``not happy" with his decision to speak out.

Telephoned requests for comment to the White House, Pentagon and State Department were not immediately returned.

Opinion polls show Americans broadly dissatisfied with Bush's stewardship. A USA Today/CNN/Gallup poll released Oc t. 17 found just 39 percent of U.S. adults approve of how he's handling his job, the lowest level of his presidency. On Oct . 19, Republicans as well as Democrats on the Senate Foreign Relations Committee attacked Secretary of State Condol eezza Rice for more than three hours for failing to present a clear strategy for bringing troops home from Iraq, and they accused her of presenting an unrealistically optimistic picture of the situation there.

Rice `Extremely Weak'

Wilkerson said Rice, as national security adviser during Bush's first term, was ``extremely weak." Rather than ensure a broad airing of views within the White House, ``she made a decision that she would side with the president to build her i ntimacy with the president."

She did not play the role of ``the balancer" or ``the person who would make sure that every dissent got to the president that made sense," Wilkerson said.

What ``I saw for four-plus years was a case that I have never seen in my studies of aberrations, bastardizations, perturb ations, changes to the national security decision-making process," he said.

"What I saw was a cabal between the vice president of the United States, Richard Cheney, and the secretary of defens e, Donald Rumsfeld, on critical issues that made decisions that the bureaucracy did not know were being made," he said, according to a transcript posted on the New America Foundation Web site. Wilkerson did not respond to e-mails seeking elaboration on his comments.

`Why?'

Wilkerson was scathing in his criticism of the Bush administration's foreign policy decisions. He said he still cannot expl ain why the U.S. invaded Iraq.

"So many decisions" defy explanation, he said. "Why did we wait three years to talk to the North Koreans? Why did we wait four-plus years to say we at least back the EU-3 approach to Iran? Why did we create the national director of intellig ence and add further to the bureaucracy, which was what caused the problem in the first place?"

While Wilkerson's criticism is his strongest to date, and perhaps among the strongest of any former Bush administration official, it's not his first attack on Bush's foreign policymaking.

In an interview with GQ magazine last May, Wilkerson likened former deputy secretary of defense Paul Wolfowitz to the Russian revolutionary Vladimir Lenin. ``I don't care whether Utopians are Vladimir Lenin in a sealed train going to Mosco w or Paul Wolfowitz. Utopians, I don't like. You're never going to bring Utopia, and you're going to hurt a lot of people in the process trying to do it."

He also described U.S. sanctions on Cuba as the ``dumbest policy on the face of the earth."

McCain vows to add torture ban to all major Senate legislation

WASHINGTON - Girding for a potential fight with the Bush administration, supporters of a ban on torturing prisoners of war by U.S. interrogators threatened Friday to include the prohibition in nearly every bill the Senate considers until it becomes law.

The no-torture wording, which proponents say is supported by majorities in both houses of Congress, was included las t month in the Senate's version of a defense spending bill. The measure's final form is being negotiated with the House, and the White House is pushing for either a rewording or deletion of the torture ban.

On Friday, at the urging of Sen. John McCain, R-Ariz, the Senate by a voice vote added the ban to a related defense b ill as a backup.

Speaking from the Senate floor, McCain said, "If necessary - and I sincerely hope it is not - I and the co-sponsors of this amendment will seek to add it to every piece of important legislation voted on in the Senate until the will of a substantial bipartisan majority in both houses of Congress prevails. Let no one doubt our determination."

The ban would establish the Army Field Manual as the guiding authority in interrogations and prohibit "cruel, inhumane, and degrading treatment" of prisoners.

The Bush administration has sought to exempt the CIA from the ban.

McCain's stature in the fight is enhanced because he was tortured while he was a prisoner during the Vietnam War. W hen the Senate voted to include the ban in the defense spending bill last month, it was approved 90-9.

The House's version of the spending bill does not contain the torture ban. But Rep. John Murtha of Pennsylvania, the r anking Democrat on the House Defense Appropriations subcommittee, earlier this week urged his colleagues to accept t he Senate provision.

The provision would reverse the Bush administration's contention that conditions placed on the treatment of prisoners of war in the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights and other international treaties signed by the United States do not apply to foreigners held overseas.

The prisoners "can, apparently, be treated inhumanely," McCain said. "This means that America is the only country in the world that asserts a legal right to engage in cruel and inhumane treatment."

Bush initially threatened to veto the "must-pass" spending bill for the Pentagon if it contained the Senate provision. Lat er, he sought simply to exempt the CIA from the ban. McCain called that proposal "totally unacceptable."

Opponents of the McCain language contend that setting no-torture ground rules would signal to prisoners that they have little to fear during interrogations, discouraging them from providing information.

Pentagon spokesman Larry DiRita had said Thursday that prisoners captured during the wars in Afghanistan and Iraq "know what we do by virtue of interrogation manuals and procedures, And they are trained to resist."

"So there's a perception that the kind of rigidity that comes with these kinds of amendments could restrict the president'

s flexibility in the global war on terror," DiRita said. "And anything that restricts our ability to engage this highly agile adversary is not desirable."

U.S. Trade Deficit Hits High on Storms

U.S. Trade Deficit Hits All-Time High of \$66.1B; Storm-Related Jobless Claims Increase

WASHINGTON (AP) -- The trade deficit soared to a record in September as the Gulf Coast hurricanes helped push Ame rica's foreign oil bill to an all-time high. The politically sensitive deficit with China also set a record.

The Commerce Department reported Thursday that the deficit jumped to \$66.1 billion in September, 11.4 percent higher than the \$59.3 billion imbalance recorded in August. It was a far bigger increase than analysts had been expecting and r eflected in part a record \$23.8 billion in oil purchases as the price skyrocketed, reflecting widespread shutdowns of prod uction facilities following hurricanes Katrina and Rita.

So far this year, the deficit is running at an annual rate of \$706.4 billion. This puts the country on track to far surpass the old deficit record of \$617.6 billion set last year and gives critics ammunition to argue that President Bush's trade policies are not working

So now China enjoys a trade surplus with the U.S. that is ever increasing. China then takes this surplus and buys from r egional nations like Iran and its oil, Korea, India, and Japan. This event has begun to transform the Asian continent in te rms of economic interests. It was and still is about the oil, stupid!

When Colin PowellÂ's former chief of staff Lawrence Wilkerson publicly decried the Bush administrationÂ's bungling of U.S. foreign policy, the focus of the press coverage was on WilkersonÂ's depiction of a Â"cabalÂ" headed by Vice President Dick Cheney that had hijacked the decision-making process.

Largely overlooked were WilkersonÂ's frank admissions about the importance of oil in justifying a long-term U.S. military intervention in Iraq. Â"The other thing that no one ever likes to talk about is SUVs and oil and consumption,Â" the retired Army colonel said in a speech on Oct. 19.

While bemoaning the administrationÂ's incompetence in implementing the war strategy, Wilkerson said the U.S. government now had no choice but to succeed in Iraq or face the necessity of conquering the Middle East within the next 10 years to ensure access to the regionÂ's oil supplies.

"We had a discussion in (the State DepartmentÂ's Office of) Policy Planning about actually mounting an operation to take the oilfields of the Middle East, internationalize them, put them under some sort of U.N. trusteeship and administer the revenues and the oil accordingly," Wilkerson said. "ThatÂ's how serious we thought about it."

The centrality of IraqÂ's oil in WilkersonÂ's blunt comments contrasted with three years of assurances from the Bush administration that the war had almost nothing to do with oil.

When critics have called the Iraq War a case of "blood for oil," George W. BushÂ's defenders have dismissed them as "conspiracy theorists." The Bush defenders insisted the president went to war out of concern about IraqÂ's weapons of mass destruction and Saddam HusseinÂ's links to al-Qaeda, neither of which turned out to be true. Later, Bush cited humanitarian concerns and the desire to spread democracy.

Always left out of the administrationÂ's war equation — or referenced only obliquely — was the fact that Iraq sits atop one of the worldÂ's largest known oil reserves at a time when international competition is intensifying to secure reliable oil supplies.

But Wilkerson is not the first senior Bush administration official to cite the importance of oil in the U.S. calculus toward Iraq. Former Treasury Secretary Paul OÂ'Neill made similar assertions in 2004.

OÂ'Neill, who was fired in late 2002 after disagreeing with Bush on tax cuts and Iraq, told author Ron Suskind that BushÂ's first National Security Council meeting just days into his presidency included a discussion of invading Iraq. OÂ'Neill said even at that early date, the message from Bush was Â"find a way to do this.Â"

Oil and Iraq were soon mixing in the administrationÂ's thinking about energy and politics.

On Feb. 3, 2001 Â- only two weeks after Bush took office Â- an NSC document instructed NSC officials to cooperate with CheneyÂ's Energy Task Force because it was Â"meldingÂ" two previously unrelated areas of policy: Â"the review of operational policies towards rogue statesÂ" and Â"actions regarding the capture of new and existing oil and gas fields.Â"

Before this disclosure, which appeared in The New Yorker three years later, it was believed that CheneyÂ's secretive task force was focusing on ways to reduce environmental regulations and fend off the Kyoto protocol on global warming.

But the NSC document suggested that the Bush administration from its first days recognized the linkage between ousting unreliable leaders like Saddam Hussein and securing oil reserves for future U.S. consumption. In other words, the Cheney task force appears to have had a military component to "capture" oil fields in "rogue states."

After al-QaedaÂ's Sept. 11, 2001, terror attacks, Bush had the political opening he needed to turn his designs on Iraq int o reality. Though there was no credible evidence connecting Hussein to al-Qaeda and Sept. 11, Bush and Cheney made the linkage anyway.

Active preparations for war with Iraq were soon underway. Behind the scenes, OÂ'Neill said he watched as the administr ation refined its plans for how to divvy up IraqÂ's oil reserves after the invasion.

"Documents were being prepared by the Defense Intelligence Agency, (Defense Secretary Donald) RumsfeldÂ's intelligence arm, mapping IraqÂ's oil fields and exploration areas and listing companies that might be interested in leveraging the precious asset," Suskind wrote in The Price of Loyalty.

Beyond giving U.S. firms access to IraqÂ's oil, the Bush administration recognized how the oil could help induce both alli es and rivals to back broader U.S. policies.

"One document, headed 'Foreign Suitors for Iraqi Oilfield Contracts,Â' lists companies from 30 countries – including France, Germany, Russia and the United Kingdom – their specialties, bidding histories, and in some cases their particular areas of interest," Suskind wrote in recounting OÂ'NeillÂ's observations.

"An attached document maps Iraq with markings for 'supergiant oilfield,Â' 'other oilfield,Â' and 'earmarked for prod uction sharing,Â' while demarking the largely undeveloped southwest of the country into nine 'blocksÂ' to designate ar eas for future exploration.

"The desire to 'dissuadeÂ' countries from engaging in 'asymmetrical challengesÂ' to the United States Â... matched with plans for how the worldÂ's second largest oil reserve might be divided among the worldÂ's contractors made for an irresistible combination, OÂ'Neill later said."

In pronouncements to the American people, however, Bush and other administration officials denied that oil was a reaso n for the Iraq invasion. Instead they stressed the danger posed by IraqÂ's supposed WMD, then the humanitarian intere st in removing Hussein, then encouraging democracy to flourish in the region, and finally preventing the spread of Islami c extremism.

Air Force Lt. Col. Karen Kwiatkowski, who was among the career military officers pulled into the war planning, said she a nd her fellow officers were troubled by how the American people were manipulated.

"Many of us in the Pentagon, conservatives and liberals alike, felt that this (Iraq) agenda, whatever its flaws or merits, h ad never been openly presented to the American people," she wrote. "Instead, the public story line was a fear-peddlin g and confusing set of messages, designed to take Congress and the country into a war of executive choice, a war base d on false pretenses."

WilkersonÂ's Critique

By contrast, Wilkerson openly acknowledged the oil factor both in explaining the U.S. invasion and in justifying the need to remain in Iraq to ensure that any new government is not hostile to American interests.

Despite his earlier doubts about the wisdom of invading, the former chief of staff to Secretary of State Powell said the Mi ddle EastÂ's oil reserves makes withdrawal from Iraq more dangerous than leaving Vietnam three decades ago.

"We canÂ't leave Iraq; we simply canÂ't," Wilkerson said in his Oct. 19 speech to the New America Foundation in Wa shington.

"IÂ'm not evaluating the decision to go to war. ThatÂ's a different matter. But weÂ're there, weÂ've done it, and we can not leave. I would submit to you that if we leave precipitously or we leave in a way that doesnÂ't leave something there we can trust, if we do that, we will mobilize the nation, put five million men and women under arms and go back and take the Middle East within a decade. ThatÂ's what weÂ'll have to do."

Wilkerson made clear that what made Iraq such a strategic concern was the oil.

 \hat{A} "We consume 60 percent of the world \hat{A} 's resources, \hat{A} " he said. \hat{A} "We have an economy and we have a society that is built on the consumption of those resources. We better get fast at work changing the foundation \hat{A} — and I don \hat{A} 't see us f ast at work on that, by the way, another failure of this administration, in my mind \hat{A} — or we better be ready to take those assets (in the Middle East).

The Pentagon has come clean and said that 'White Phosphorus' was used in Iraq

The Pentagon has confirmed that US troops used white phosphorus during last yearÂ's offensive in the Iraqi city of Fallu ja.

"It was used as an incendiary weapon against enemy combatants," spokesman Lt Col Barry Venable told the BBC –though not against civilians, he said.

The US earlier denied it had been used in Falluja at all.

BBC defence correspondent Paul Wood says having to retract its denial is a public relations disaster for the US.

Col Venable denied that the substance \hat{A} – which can cause burning of the flesh \hat{A} – constituted a banned chemical weap on.

Washington is not a signatory of an international treaty restricting the use of white phosphorus devices.

Col Venable said a statement by the US state department that white phosphorus had not been used was based on "po or information".

Â'IncendiaryÂ'

The US-led assault on Falluja Â- a stronghold of the Sunni insurgency west of Baghdad Â- displaced most of the cityÂ's 300,000 population and left many of its buildings destroyed.

Col Venable told the BBCÂ's PM radio programme that the US army used white phosphorus incendiary munitions Â"pri marily as obscurants, for smokescreens or target marking in some casesÂ".

Â"However it is an incendiary weapon and may be used against enemy combatants.Â"

And he said it had been used in Falluja, but it was Â"conventional munitionÂ", not a chemical weapon.

It is not Â"outlawed or illegalÂ", Col Venable said.

He said US forces could use white phosphorus rounds to flush enemy troops out of covered positions.

 \hat{A} "The combined effects of the fire and smoke \hat{A} — and in some case the terror brought about by the explosion on the ground \hat{A} — will drive them out of the holes so that you can kill them with high explosives, \hat{A} " he said.

Â'Particularly nastyÂ'

White phosphorus is highly flammable and ignites on contact with oxygen. If the substance hits someoneÂ's body, it will burn until deprived of oxygen.

Globalsecurity.org, a defence website, says: "Phosphorus burns on the skin are deep and painfulÂ... These weapons are particularly nasty because white phosphorus continues to burn until it disappearsÂ... it could burn right down to the bone."

A spokesman at the UK Ministry of Defence said the use of white phosphorus was permitted in battle in cases where the re were no civilians near the target area.

But Professor Paul Rodgers of the University of Bradford department of peace studies said white phosphorus could be c onsidered a chemical weapon if deliberately aimed at civilians.

He told PM: Â"It is not counted under the chemical weapons convention in its normal use but, although it is a matter of le gal niceties, it probably does fall into the category of chemical weapons if it is used for this kind of purpose directly again st people.Â"

When an Italian TV documentary revealing the use of white phosphorus in Iraq was broadcast on 8 November, it sparke d fury among Italian anti-war protesters, who demonstrated outside the US embassy in Rome.

What is white phosphorus?

White phosphorus is a solid, waxy man-made chemical which ignites spontaneously at about 30C and produces an intense heat, bright light and thick pillars of smoke.

The US military says it used white phosphorus to flush out insurgents

It continues to burn until deprived of oxygen and, if extinguished with water, can later reignite if the particles dry out and are exposed again to the air.

Also known by the military as WP or Willy Pete, white phosphorus is used in munitions, to mark enemy targets and to produce smoke for concealing troop movements.

It can also be used as an incendiary device to firebomb enemy positions.

What are its effects?

If particles of ignited white phosphorus land on a person's skin, they can continue to burn right through flesh to the bone. Toxic phosphoric acid can also be released into wounds, risking phosphorus poisoning.

Skin burns must be immersed in water or covered with wet cloths to prevent re-combustion until the particles can be removed.

Exposure to white phosphorus smoke in the air can also cause liver, kidney, heart, lung or bone damage and even deat h.

A former US soldier who served in Iraq says breathing in smoke close to a shell caused the throat and lungs to blister un til the victim suffocated, with the phosphorus continuing to burn them from the inside.

Long-term exposure to lesser concentrations over several months or years may lead to a condition called "phossy jaw", where mouth wounds are caused that fail to heal and the jawbone eventually breaks down.

"Containment is not possible when unbalanced dictators with weapons of mass destruction can deliver those weapons on missiles or secretly provide them to terrorist allies...If we wait for threats to fully materialize, we will have waited too long.

The war on terror will not be won on the defensive. We must take the battle to the enemy, disrupt his plans, and confront the worst threats before they emerge. In this world we have entered, the only path to safety is the path of action. And this nation will act."

....The president then took the Bush Doctrine a great leap forward, asserting a sovereign right to prevent any nation from ever acquiring the power to challenge the strategic supremacy of the United States:

"Competition between great nations is inevitable, but armed conflict in our world is not...America has, and inten ds to keep, military strengths beyond challenge--thereby making the destabilizing arms races of other eras poin tless, and limiting rivalries to trade and other pursuits of peace."

This was breathtaking. President Bush was saying to Beijing, Moscow, New Delhi; You may compete with us in trade, but we will not allow you to increase your strength to where it challenges America's power.....

Last week we began receiving a subscription to a news paper that serves the area we are planning to move to. "The La ncaster New Era" was described by the sales rep as a paper that represents the conservative agenda. So I began to re ad and found one of the editorials written by "Charles Krauthammer. Up until last week I had never heard or read of Krauthammer, yet I also came across this man in Buchanan's book. I would like to quote this in relation to your thought.

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"When the Soviet empire started to unravel with the fall of the Berlin Wall in 1989, the Cold War that had defined Americ a's mission came to an end. Americans began to cast about for a new foreign policy. Owen Harries of the National Inter est invited this writer to participate in a symposium on America's role in the post-Cold War world, alon with neoconservat ives Jeane Kirkpatrick, Ben Wattenberg, and Charles Krauthammer.

Kirkpatrick, a former UN ambassador, held out the hope that we might become again what we had been before a half ce ntury of hot and cold war from 1939 to 1989: "The time when Americans should bear such unusual burdens (as the Cold War) is past. With a return to "normal" times, we can again become a normal nation-- and take care of pressing problem s of education, family, industry, and technology."

Wattenberg, however, urged that America not come home at all but launch a global campaign to "wage democracy" all o ver the world.

Krauthammer's vision was even more grandiose. It should be the "wish and work" of America now, he wrote, to "integr ate" with Europe and Japan inside a "super-sovereign" entity that would be "economically, culturally and politically hege monic in the world." The old republic was to be absorbed by the new entity.

This "new univeralism," wrote **Krauthammer**, "would require the conscious depreciation not only of American sovereignt y but of the notion of sovereignty in general. This is not as outrageous as it sounds."

I've mentioned this before, but it seems hard for Americans to imagine themselves anything less then the greatest nation on Earth. That is not so bad in it if our definition of greatness is righteousness. There was a time when our aspirations w ere to be more then rich and powerful, as captured by this well-known 1850 statement attributed to Alexis de Tocqueville .

Â"I sought for the greatness and genius of America in her commodious harbors and her ample rivers - and it was not the re... in her fertile fields and boundless forests and it was not there... in her rich mines and her vast world commerce - and it was not there... in her democratic Congress and her matchless Constitution - and it vas not there. Not until I wen t into the churches of America and heard her pulpits flame with righteousness did I understand the secret of her genius a nd power. America is great because she is good, and if America ever ceases to be good, she will cease to be great.Â" (It 's typical of the disillusionment of our times that the authenticity of this cherished quote is now being called into question by scholars.)

Now, that the cold war is over, we might have hoped that the arms race would likewise wind down. On the contrary I fear it's only grown more chaotic and dangerous, and we have become the pace setter. In a twist of the plot, Americans who previously saw themselves as making the world safe for democracy are finding themselves the subject of fear and loathing.

While we are allied with Israel, France h as funded the Palestinian Authority...yet both nations suffered from terrorist strikes before the Gulf Wars. Historical Review	of Iraq Situation

A California Lawyer's Perspective on the Iraq War

Sixty-three years ago, Nazi Germany had overrun almost all of Europe and hammered England to the verge of bankruptcy and defeat, and had sunk more than four hundred British ships in their convoys between England and America for food and war materials.

Bushido Japan had overrun most of Asia, beginning in 1928, killing millions of civilians throughout China, and impressing millions more as slave labor.

The US was in an isolationist, pacifist mood, and most Americans and Congress wanted nothing to do with the European war or the Asian war.

Then along came Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941 and in outrage Congress unanimously declared war on Japan, and the following day on Germany, which had not attacked us. It was a dicey thing. We had few allies.

France was not an ally (Are they ever? General Patton once said,"I'd rather have a battalion of Germans in front of me, than a battalion of french behind me!") the Vichy government of France aligned with its German occupiers. Germany was not an ally, it was an enemy, and Hitler intended to set up a Thousand Year Reich in Europe. Japan was not an ally, it was intent on owning and controlling all of Asia. Japan and Germany had long-term ideas of invading Canada and Mexico, and then the United States over the north and south borders, after they had settled control of Asia and Europe.

America's allies then were England, Ireland, Scotland, Canada, Australia, and Russia, and that was about it. There were no other countries of any size or military significance with the will and ability to contribute much or anything to the effort to defeat Hitler's Germany and Japan, and prevent the global dominance of Nazism. And we had to send millions of tons of arms, munitions, and war supplies to Russia, England, and the Canadians, Aussies, Irish, and Scots, because none of them could produce all they needed for themselves.

All of Europe, from Norway to Italy, except Russia in the east, was already under the Nazi heel.

America was not prepared for war. America had stood down most of its military after WWI and throughout the depression, at the outbreak of WWII there were army units training with broomsticks over their shoulders because they didn't have guns, and cars with "tank" painted on the doors because they didn't have tanks. And a big chunk of our navy had just been sunk and damaged at Pearl Harbor.

Britain had already gone bankrupt, saved only by the donation of \$600 million in gold bullion in the Bank of England that was the property of Belgium and was given by Belgium to England to carry on the war when Belgium was overrun by Hitler - actually, Belgium surrendered in one day, because it was unable to oppose the German invasion, and the Germans bombed Brussels into rubble the next day anyway just to prove they could. Britain had been holding out for two years already in the face of staggering shipping loses and the near-decimation of its air force in the Battle of Britain, and was saved from being overrun by Germany only because Hitler made the mistake of thinking the Brits were a relatively minor threat that could be dealt with later and turning his attention to Russia, at a time when England was on the verge of collapse in the late summer of 1940.

Russia saved America's ass by putting up a desperate fight for two years until the US got geared up to begin hammering away at Germany. Russia lost something like 24 million people in the sieges of Stalingrad and Moscow, 90% of them from cold and starvation, mostly civilians, but also more than a million soldiers. More than a million. Had Russia surrendered, then, Hitler would have been able to focus his entire campaign against the Brits, then America, and the Nazis would have won that war.

Had Hitler not made that mistake and invaded England in 1940 or 1941, instead, there would have been no England for the US and the Brits to use as a staging ground to prepare an assault on Nazi Europe, England would not have been able to run its North African campaign to help take a little pressure off Russia while America geared up for battle, and today Europe would very probably be run by the Nazis, the Third Reich. Isolated and without any allies (not even the Brits), the US would very probably have had to cede Asia to the Japanese, who were basically Nazis by another name and the world we live in today would be very different and much worse. I say this to illustrate that turning points in history are often dicey things. AND we are at another one.

There is a very dangerous minority in Islam that either has, or wants and may soon have, the ability to deliver small nuclear, biological, or chemical weapons, almost anywhere in the world, unless they are prevented from doing so.

France, Germany, and Russia, have been selling them weapons technology as recently as 2002, as have North Korea, Syria, and Pakistan, paid for with billions of dollars Saddam Hussein skimmed from the "Oil For Food" program administered by the UN with the complicity of Kofi Annan and his son.

The Jihadis, the militant Muslims, are basically Nazis in Kaffiyahs - they believe that Islam, a radically conservative (definitely not liberal!) form of Wahhabi Islam, should own and control the Middle East first, then Europe, then the world, and that all who do not bow to Allah should be killed, enslaved, or subjugated. They want to finish the Holocaust, destroy Israel and purge the world of Jews. This is what they say.

There is also a civil war raging in the Middle East - for the most part not a hot war, but a war of ideas. Islam is having its Inquisition and its Reformation today, but it is not yet known which will win - the Inquisition, or the Reformation.

If the Inquisition wins, then the Wahhabis, the Jihadis, will control the Middle East, and the OPEC oil, and the US, European, and Asian economies, the techno-industrial economies, will be at the mercy of OPEC - not an OPEC dominated by the well-educated and rational Saudis of today, but an OPEC dominated by the Jihadis.

You want gas in your car? You want heating oil next winter? You want jobs? You want the dollar to be worth anything? You better hope the Jihad, the Muslim Inquisition, loses, and the Islamic Reformation wins.

If the Reformation movement wins, that is, the moderate Muslims who believe that Islam can respect and tolerate other religions, and live in peace with the rest of the world, and move out of the 10th century into the 21st, then the troubles in the Middle East will eventually fade away, and a moderate and prosperous Middle East will emerge.

We have to help the Reformation win, and to do that we have to fight the Inquisition, i.e., the Wahhabi movement, Al Qaeda and other Islamic terrorist movements. We have to do it somewhere. We cannot do it everywhere at once so we have created a focal point for the battle now, at the time and place of our choosing, in Iraq. Not in New York, not in London, or Paris, or Berlin, but in Iraq, where we did and are doing two very important things.

- (1) We deposed Saddam Hussein. Whether Saddam Hussein was directly involved in 9/11 or not, it is undisputed that Saddam has been actively supporting the terrorist movement for decades. Saddam is or was a terrorist, a weapon of mass destruction, who is responsible for the deaths of probably more than a million Iraqis and two million Iranians.
- (2) We created a battle, a confrontation, a flash point, with Islamic terrorism in Iraq. We have focused the battle. We are killing bad guys there and the ones we get there we won't have to get here, or somewhere else. We also have a good shot at creating a democratic, peaceful Iraq, which will be a catalyst for democratic change in the rest of the Middle East, and an outpost for a stabilizing American military presence in the Middle East for as long as it is needed.

The Europeans could have done this, but they didn't, and they won't. We now know that rather than opposing the rise of the Jihadist, the French, Germans, and Russians were selling them arms - we have found more than a million tons of weapons and munitions in Iraq. If Iraq was not a threat to anyone, why did Saddam need a million tons of weapons?

And Iraq was paying for much of these French, German, and Russian arms with money skimmed from the UN Oil For Food Program that was supposed to pay for food, medicine, and education, for Iraqi children.

World War II, the war with the German and the Japanese Nazis, really began with a "whimper" in 1928. It did not begin with Pearl Harbor. It began with the Japanese invasion of China. It was a war for fourteen years before America joined it. It officially ended in 1945 - a 17 year war - and was followed by another decade of US occupation in Germany and Japan to get those countries reconstructed and running on their own again . . . a 27 year war.

World War II cost the United States an amount equal to approximately a full year's GDP - adjusted for inflation, equal to about \$12 trillion dollars, WWII cost America more than 400,000 killed in action, and nearly 100,000 still missing in action.

But the cost of not fighting and winning WWII would have been unimaginably greater - a world now dominated by Germa n and Japanese Nazism.

Americans have a short attention span, conditioned I suppose by 60 minute TV shows and 2-hour movies in which every thing comes out okay. The real world is not like that. It is messy, uncertain, and sometimes bloody and ugly. Always has been, and probably always will be.

If we do this thing in Iraq successfully, it is probable that the Reformation will ultimately prevail. Many Muslims in the Mi ddle East hope it will. We will be there to support it. It has begun in some countries, e. g. Libya, Dubai and Saudi Arab ia. If we fail, the Inquisition will probably prevail, and terrorism from Islam will be with us for all the foreseeable future, be cause the Inquisition, the Jihadist, believe they are called by Allah to kill all the Infidels, and that death in Jihad is gloriou s

The bottom line here is that we will have to deal with Islamic terrorism until we defeat it (or are defeated by it), whenever that is. It will not go away on its own. It WILL NOT go away if we ignore it.

If the US can create a reasonably democratic and stable Iraq, then we have an "England" in the Middle East, a platform, from which we can work to help modernize and moderate the Middle East. The history of the world is the clash between the forces of relative civility and civilization, and the barbarians clamoring at the gates. The Iraq war is merely another battle in this ancient and never-ending war. Now, for the first time ever, the barbarians are about to get nuclear weapon s unless WE prevent them.

The Iraq war is expensive, and uncertain, yes. But the consequences of not fighting and winning it will be horrifically greater. We have four options:

- 1. We can defeat the Jihad now, before it gets nuclear weapons.
- 2. We can fight the Jihad later, after it gets nuclear weapons (which may be as early as next year, if Iran's progress on n uclear weapons is what Iran claims it is).
- 3. We can surrender to the Jihad and accept its dominance in the Middle East, now, in Europe in the next few years or decades, and ultimately in America.
- 4. Or we can stand down now, and pick up the fight later when the Jihad is more widespread and better armed, perhaps after the Jihad has dominated France and Germany, which is well underway, and maybe most of the rest of Europe. It will be more dangerous, more expensive, and much bloodier then.

Yes, the Jihadist say that they look forward to an Islamic America. If you oppose this war, I hope you like the idea that y our children, or grandchildren, may live in an Islamic America under the Mullahs and the Sharia (Islamic law as dictated by the Qur'an), an America that resembles Iran today.

We can be defeatist peace-activists as anti-war types seem to be, and concede, surrender, to Jihad, or we can do what ever it takes to win this war against it.

The history of the world is the history of civilizational clashes -cultural clashes. All wars are about ideas, ideas about wh at society and civilization should be like, and the most determined always win.

Those who are willing to be the most ruthless win. The pacifists always lose, because the anti-pacifists kill them.

In the 20th century, it was Western democracy vs. communism, and before that Western democracy vs. Nazism, and before that Western democracy vs. German Imperialism. Western democracy won, three times, but it wasn't cheap, fun, nice, easy, or quick. Indeed, the wars against German imperialism (WWI), Nazi imperialism (WWII), and communist imperialism (the 40-year Cold War that included the Vietnam War, itself a major battle in a larger war) covered almost the entire century.

The first major war of the 21st Century is the war between Western Judeo/Christian Civilization and Wahhabi Islam. It m ay last a few more years, or most of this century. It will last until the Wahhabi branch of Islam fades away, or gives up it s ambitions for regional and global dominance through Jihad, or until Western Civilization gives in to the Jihad.

Senator John Kerry, in the debates and almost daily, makes 3 scary claims:

1. We went to Iraq without enough troops.

We went with the troops the US military wanted. We went with the troop levels General Tommy Franks asked for. We deposed Saddam in 30 days with light casualties, much lighter than we expected.

The real problem in Iraq is that we are trying to be nice - we are trying to fight a minority of the population that is Jihadi, and trying to avoid killing the large majority that is not. We could flatten Fallujah in minutes with a flight of B52s, or seconds with one nuclear cruise missile - but we don't. We're trying to do brain surgery, not amputate the patient's head. The Jihadis amputate heads.

2. We went to Iraq with too little planning.

This is a specious argument. It supposes that if we had just had the right plan the war would have been easy, cheap, quick and clean.

That is not an option. It is a guerrilla war against a determined enemy and no such war ever has been or ever will be ea sy, cheap, quick, and clean. This is not TV.

3. We proved ourselves incapable of governing and providing security.

This too is a specious argument. It was never our intention to govern and provide security. It was our intention from the beginning to do just enough to enable the Iraqis to develop a representative government and their own military and police forces to provide their own security, and that is happening. The US and the Brits and other countries there have trained over 100,000 Iraqi police and military, now, and will have trained more than 200,000 by the end of next year. We are in the process of transitioning operational control for security back to Iraq.

It will take time. It will not go with no hitches. This is not TV.

Remember, perspective is everything, and America's schools teach too little history for perspective to be clear, especiall y in the young American mind.

The Cold war lasted from about 1947 at least until the Berlin Wall came down in 1989. Forty-two years. Europe spent the first half of the 19th century fighting Napoleon, and from 1870 to 1945 fighting Germany.

World War II began in 1928, lasted 17 years, plus a ten year occupation, and the US still has troops in Germany and Ja pan. World War II resulted in the death of more than 50 million people, maybe more than 100 million people, depending on which estimates you accept.

The US has taken a little more than 1,900 KIA in Iraq. The US took more than 4,000 killed in action on the morning of June 6, 1944, the first day of the Normandy Invasion to rid Europe of Nazi Imperialism. In WWII the US averaged 2,000

KIA a week for four years. Most of the individual battles of WWII lost more Americans than the entire Iraq war has done so far.

But the stakes are at least as high . . . a world dominated by representative governments with civil rights, human rights , and personal freedoms . . . or a world dominated by the radical Islamic Wahhabi movement, by the Jihadist under the Mullahs and the Sharia.

I do not understand why the American Left does not grasp this.

They favor human rights, civil rights, liberty and freedom, but evidently not for Iraqis. In America, absolutely, but nowher e else.

300,000 Iraqi bodies in mass graves in Iraq are not our problem. The US population is about twelve times that of Iraq, so let's multiply 300,000 by twelve. What would you think if there were 3,600,000 American bodies in mass graves in A merica because of George Bush? Would you hope for another country to help liberate America?

"Peace Activists" always seem to demonstrate where it's safe - in America. For this priviledge, they should thank US v eterans.

Why don't we see Peace Activist demonstrating in Iran, Syria, Iraq, Sudan, North Korea, in the places in the world that really need peace activism the most?

The liberal mentality is supposed to favor human rights, civil rights, democracy, multiculturalism, diversity, etc., but if the Jihad wins, wherever the Jihad wins, it is the end of civil rights, human rights, democracy, multiculturalism, diversity, etc. Americans who oppose the liberation of Iraq are coming down on the side of their own worst enemy.

If the Jihad wins, it will be the death of Liberalism.

Sadly, American Liberals just don't get it.

WHY DO THEY HATE US?

When the terrorists of 9/11 drove those planes into the twin towers of the World Trade Center, the Pentagon, and the field in Pennsylvania, Americans were shocked at how many in the Islamic world said, "The Americans had it coming."

What had we don that any should take satisfaction in the massacre of three thousand of our people? Why did demonstrators from Palestine to Pakistan support the Taliban? Why do millions in that world admire Osama? Why do Islamic radicals hate us so they willing to commit suicide if they can take some of us with them? They cannot defeat or destroy the United States. Are they mad?

"Why do they hate us?" Americans asked after 9/11, President Bush professed himself shocked even by the implications of the questions. "I am," he declared,

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THE CANONIZATION OF TERRORISTS

While we condemn terror, it will be used again and again. For terror often triumphs. Sherman and the Union armies cru shed the South, setting it back a century. But they were victorious, they freed the slaves, and they are lionized. Hiroshi ma and Nagasaki convinced the emperor that unconditional surrender was preferalbe to the alternative. The IRA, the Ir gun, the Stern Gang, the Viet Minh, the FLN, the Mau Mau, the ANC all used terror and all prevailed. And innocent bloo d shed in the revolution is quickly washed away in the exhilaration of victory.

The FLN's Ben Bella became the first president of Algeria. Jomo Kenyatta, Kikiyu leader to the Mau Mau, became the f ather of his country, Kenya, and the "grand old man" of Africa. Yitzhak Shamir became prime minister, as had Menache m Begin, his predecessor, who would go on to win the Nobel Prize for Peace. So would Nelson Mandela, who went to p rison in 1964 for the bombing of trains and whose ANC was famous for "necklacing" enemies, i.e., cutting off their arms and draping a gas-filled tire around their necks, which was set ablaze to the laughter of the mob. Today, Mandela is per haps the most respected political figure on earth. Arafat, too, shares a Nobel Prize for Peace and aspires to be the first president of Palestine.

The body of the Communist state terrorist Ho Chi Minh is honored in Hanoi. Saigon is no Ho Chi Minh City. The remain s of the tyrant responsible for the deaths of perhaps 30 million Chinese lie in a crystal sarcophagus in Tiananmen Squar e. The waxen body of Lenin, the archterrorist and the brother of the terrorist who attempted to assasinate Czar Alexand er III, lies in a mausoleum in the heart of Red Square.

D. W. Griffith's classic Birth of a Nation protrayed the Klan as gallant and heroic. Geronimo, the Indian chief who murder ed pioneer women and children, was lionized in a Hollywood film. Michael Collins is the title of a film starring Liam Nees on, in which Collins portrayed as an Irish hero fighting for freedom. In State of Siege, the 1973 film based on the kidnap ping and murder of a U.S. aid official in Uruguay, his Tupamaro executioners are protrayed as sensitive and principled.

Terrorism often succeeded in the twentieth century, and, when it did, the ex-terrorists achieved power, glory, and immort ality, with streets, towns, and cities named for them. And America today recognizes every regime to come out of these wars where terrorism was a common tactic.

Chapter 2,,, WHERE HAVE ALL THE CHILDREN GONE?

"And ye shall be left few in numbers, whereas ye were as the stars of heaven for multitude; because thou wouldst not obey the voice of the Lord thy God.

Deuteronomy 28:28

Why have Europe's nations and peoples stopped having babies and begun to accept their disappearance from this earth with such seeming indifference? Did the wounds of wars or the loss of empire kill the will to live? From the evidence, neither appears to be the case.

The Great War left Imperial Germany defeated and dismembered, with two million dead and millions crippled. Yet the German population grew so quickly after 1919 that France, which had been among the victors, was alarmed. After World War 2, baby booms exploded among the vanquished Japanese and Germans as well as the victorious Americans. From studying the birth charts, we find that something happened in the mid-1960's, in the midst of the postwar prosperity, that changed the hearts and minds of Western women and killed in them the desire to live as their

mothers had. But if the reason Western women stopped having babies remains in dispute, how they did so is not. Contraception halted the population growth of the West, with abortion as the second line of defense against the unwanted child.

First, a little history: Only once had the U.S. birthrate fallen below population replacement, during the Depression, when the economy shrank by half and a fourth of America's breadwinners were out of work, many of them out on the streets. Pessimism, a sense of despair that the good times are over and may never come again, can apparently impact national fertility. The Silent Generation was born in the 1930's, a relatively small cohort and the only generation of the twentieth century never to have produced a president.

The postwar baby boom began in 1946, peaked in 1957, and fizzled out in 1964. But just as the World War 2 generation was about done having babies, and the baby boomers themselves were about to begin, a new and more convenient way to prevent pregnancies was discovered.

Historians may one day call "the pill" the suicide tablet of the West. It was first licensed in 1960. By 1963, 6 percent of American married women were using Dr. Rock's invention; by 1970, 43 percent were "on the pill." As Catholics furiously debated the morality of contraception and Pope Paul VI issued his encyclical Humane Vitae--which declared all artificial birth control to be immoral for Catholics, the pill included---suddenly a graver issue arose.

Arizona TV personality Sherry Finkbine, a married mother of four who had taken thalidomide, the drug that caused deformaties in babies in Europe, learned that she was pregnant. Mrs. Finkbine was subjected to threats from some and offers from others to raise the child if only she would carry it to term. As abortion was still against the law, a blazing national debate ensued. But Mrs. Finkbine mooted the issue by flying to Sweden and having the child aborted.

By 1966, however, the Finkbine affair was ancient history, for 6000 abortions were being done every year. By 1970, that figure had leapt to 200,000 as Governors Rockefeller of New York and **Reagan of California** signed the most liberal ab ortion laws in America. By 1973, 600,000 abortions were being done. That year, the Supreme Court, with three of Presi dent **Nixon's** four nominees concurring, declared that a woman's right to an abortion was protected by the Constitution. Within a decade, the number of abortions had soared to 1.5 million a year, and abortions had replaced tonsillectomies a s the most common surgical procedure in America. Since Justice Blackmun's decision, 40,000,000 abortions have been performed in the United States. Thirty percent of all pregnancies now end on a tabletop in an abortionist's clinic.

In 2000, the Food and Drug Administation approved RU-486, a do-it-yourself abortion drug for use in the first seven wee ks of pregancy. As no U.S. firm wished to be associated with RU-486, a China-based company began to produce the d rug. Cynics might characterize China's role in producing RU-486 for America as an act of assisted suicide for the one n ation blocking Beijing's path to Asian hegemony and world power.

Roe vs. Wade put a constitutional canopy over a woman's right to an abortion. Yet that decision does not of itself explain the sea change in the attitudes of American and Western women. What was it that made them so hostile to the idea of pregnancy and motherhood that they would prefer to have an abortion, an act their own grandparents would have considered a monstrous offense against God and man? In the 1950's abortion was not only a crime, but a shameful act. The re was no national clamor for its legalization. Yet, fifteen years later, a Supreme Court decision declaring abortion a constitutional right was hailed as a milestone of social progress. A revolutionary transformation had taken place in the belief s of tens of millions of Americans. One of two things had happened; either the sixties drove a moral wedge getween us, or the sixties exposed a moral fracture that had existed, but that we had failed to recognize. I believe the former is true. In that pivotal decade of the last century, a large slice of young America was converted to a new way of thinking, believin g, and living.

From 1945 to 1965, America passed through what sociologists call "the golden age of marriage," when the average age of first mariages fell to record lows for both men and women, and the proportion of adults woho were married reached a n astronomical 95%. The America Eisenhower and John F. Kennedy was a vibrant, dynamic nation. But, as Allan Carls

on, president of The Howard Center for Family, Religion, and Society, writes:

"All the indicators of family well-being abruptly turned in these places (Western nations) during the short 1963-1965 peri od. Fertility resumed its fall, tumbling well below zero-growth levels; a massive retreat from marriage commenced; and Western societies seemed to lose all sense of inherited family order."

Dutch demographer Dirk van de Kaa traces the phenomenon to four transformations: (A) A shift from the golden age of marriage to the dawn of a new age of cohabitation. (B) A shift from a time of "king-child" with parents to that of king-pare nts with one child. (C) A shift from preventive contraception, to benefit early children, to self-fulfilling contraception, to be nefit parents. (D) A shift from a uniform family system to a pluralistic system of families and households, including single -parent families.

As the drop-off in the birthrate began in the mid-1960's, this is the site to excavate to discover the causes of this tectonic shift in attitude of American and Western women away from having children. What ideas did the boomers bring to maturity? What ideas did they absorb in college?

Tens of millions still lived in small towns in rural America, where the Depression had hit the farms long before the 1929 Crash that hit Wall Street. After Pearl Harbor, the war and the war economy made the career decisions for America's young. The Silent Generation of the fifties grew up with parents, teachers, and clergy still as authority figures. Not until 1957 did Professor Galbraith discover that we were all living in The Affluent Society.

But the parents who had gone through the Depression and the war were determined that "my kid's not going to have it as rough as I did." so the baby boomers were raised differently, spending almost as many hours in front of a television as in school. By the mid-1950s, parent had a serious rival for their children's attention, and youngsters had an entertaining and witty ally, and a privileged sanctuary to retreat to, in the age-old struggle against parents. **The message that came from TV, especially the ads, was instant gratification.**

By 1964, the year of Mario Savio and the Free Speech movement at Berkeley, when the first wave of boomers hit the ca mpuses, never having kown hardship or war, it was ready to rock. And though the student riots and rebellions were bla med on LBJ, Nixon, Agnew, and Vietnam, this will not do. For student rebellions were not confined to America. They br oke out across Europe and even in Japan. Women's group vows to again appeal Colombia's abortion ban.

Bogota, Columbia --

Days after Columbia's highest court rejected a case challenging the country's complete prohibition on abortion, an **inter national women's rights group** says it is planning to file another suit on Monday.

Humanist Manifesto II

It is forty years since Humanist Manifesto I (1933) appeared. Events since then make that earlier statement seem far too optimistic. Nazism has shown the depths of brutality of which humanity is capable. Other totalitarian regimes have suppr essed human rights without ending poverty. Science has sometimes brought evil as well as good. Recent decades have shown that inhuman wars can be made in the name of peace. The beginnings of police states, even in democratic societ ies, widespread government espionage, and other abuses of power by military, political, and industrial elites, and the continuance of unyielding racism, all present a different and difficult social outlook. In various societies, the demands of wo men and minority groups for equal rights effectively challenge our generation.

As we approach the twenty-first century, however, an affirmative and hopeful vision is needed. Faith, commensurate wit h advancing knowledge, is also necessary. In the choice between despair and hope, humanists respond in this Humanis t Manifesto II with a positive declaration for times of uncertainty.

As in 1933, humanists still believe that traditional theism, especially faith in the prayer-hearing God, assumed to live and care for persons, to hear and understand their prayers, and to be able to do something about them, is an unproved and outmoded faith. Salvationism, based on mere affirmation, still appears as harmful, diverting people with false hopes of h eaven hereafter. Reasonable minds look to other means for survival.

Those who sign Humanist Manifesto II disclaim that they are setting forth a binding credo; their individual views would be stated in widely varying ways. This statement is, however, reaching for vision in a time that needs direction. It is social analysis in an effort at consensus. New statements should be developed to supersede this, but for today it is our conviction that humanism offers an alternative that can serve present-day needs and guide humankind toward the future.

Paul Kurtz and Edwin H. Wilson (1973)
The next century can be and should be the humanistic century. Dramatic scientific, technological, and ever-accelerating social and political changes crowd our awareness. We have virtually conquered the planet, explored the moon, overcome the natural limits of travel and communication; we stand at the dawn of a new age, ready to move farther into space and perhaps inhabit other planets. Using technology wisely, we can control our environment, conquer poverty, markedly reduce disease, extend our life-span, significantly modify our behavior, alter the course of human evolution and cultural development, unlock vast new powers, and provide humankind with unparalleled opportunity for achieving an abundant and meaningful life.
The future is, however, filled with dangers. In learning to apply the scientific method to nature and human life, we have of pened the door to ecological damage, over-population, dehumanizing institutions, totalitarian repression, and nuclear and bio- chemical disaster. Faced with apocalyptic prophesies and doomsday scenarios, many flee in despair from reason and embrace irrational cults and theologies of withdrawal and retreat.
Traditional moral codes and newer irrational cults both fail to meet the pressing needs of today and tomorrow. False "the ologies of hope" and messianic ideologies, substituting new dogmas for old, cannot cope with existing world realities. The ey separate rather than unite peoples.
Humanity, to survive, requires bold and daring measures. We need to extend the uses of scientific method, not renounce them, to fuse reason with compassion in order to build constructive social and moral values. Confronted by many possible futures, we must decide which to pursue. The ultimate goal should be the fulfill- ment of the potential for growth in each human personality not for the favored few, but for all of humankind. Only a shared world and global measures will suffice.
A humanist outlook will tap the creativity of each human being and provide the vision and courage for us to work together. This outlook emphasizes the role human beings can play in their own spheres of action. The decades ahead call for dedicated, clear-minded men and women able to marshal the will, intelligence, and cooperative skills for shaping a desire ble future. Humanism can provide the purpose and inspiration that so many seek; it can give personal meaning and significance to human life.

Many kinds of humanism exist in the contemporary world. The varieties and emphases of naturalistic humanism include "scientific," "ethical," "democratic," "religious," and "Marxist" humanism. Free thought, atheism, agnosticism, skepticism, deism, rationalism, ethical culture, and liberal religion all claim to be heir to the humanist tradition. Humanism traces its r oots from ancient China, classical Greece and Rome, through the Renaissance and the Enlightenment, to the scientific r evolution of the modern world. But views that merely reject theism are not equivalent to humanism. They lack commitme nt to the positive belief in the possibilities of human progress and to the values central to it. Many within religious groups, believing in the future of humanism, now claim humanist credentials. Humanism is an ethical process through which we all can move, above and beyond the divisive particulars, heroic personalities, dogmatic creeds, and ritual customs of past religions or their mere negation.

We affirm a set of common principles that can serve as a basis for united action -- positive principles relevant to the present human condition. They are a design for a secular society on a planetary scale.

For these reasons, we submit this new Humanist Manifesto for the future of humankind; for us, it is a vision of hope, a direction for satisfying survival.

Religion

FIRST: In the best sense, religion may inspire dedication to the highest ethical ideals. The cultivation of moral devoti on and creative imagination is an expression of genuine "spiritual" experience and aspiration.

We believe, however, that traditional dogmatic or authoritarian religions that place revelation, God, ritual, or creed above human needs and experience do a disservice to the human species. Any account of nature should pass the tests of scientific evidence; in our judgment, the dogmas and myths of traditional religions do not do so. Even at this late d ate in human history, certain elementary facts based upon the critical use of scientific reason have to be restated. We find insufficient evidence for belief in the existence of a supernatural; it is either meaningless or irrelevant to the question of survival and fulfillment of the human race. As nontheists, we begin with humans not God, nature not deity. Nature may indeed be broader and deeper than we now know; any new discoveries, however, will but enlarge our knowledge of the natural.

Some humanists believe we should reinterpret traditional religions and reinvest them with meanings appropriate to the current situation. Such redefinitions, however, often perpetuate old dependencies and escapisms; they easily become obscurantist, impeding the free use of the intellect. We need, instead, radically new human purposes and goals.

We appreciate the need to preserve the best ethical teachings in the religious traditions of humankind, many of which we share in common. But we reject those features of traditional religious morality that deny humans a full appreciation of their own potentialities and responsibilities. Traditional religions often offer solace to humans, but, as often, they inhibit humans from helping themselves or experiencing their full potentialities. Such institutions, creeds, and rituals

often impede the will to serve others. Too often traditional faiths encourage dependence rather than independence, obedience rather than affirmation, fear rather than courage. More recently they have generated concerned social action, with many signs of relevance appearing in the wake of the "God Is Dead" theologies. But we can discover no divine purpose or providence for the human species. While there is much that we do not know, humans are responsible for what we are or will become. No deity will save us; we must save ourselves.

SECOND: Promises of immortal salvation or fear of eternal damnation are both illusory and harmful. They distract hu mans from present concerns, from self-actualization, and from rectifying social injustices. Modern science discredits su ch historic concepts as the "ghost in the machine" and the "separable soul." Rather, science affirms that the human s pecies is an emergence from natural evolutionary forces. As far as we know, the total personality is a function of the biological organism transacting in a social and cultural context. There is no credible evidence that life survives the de ath of the body. We continue to exist in our progeny and in the way that our lives have influenced others in our cultur e.

Traditional religions are surely not the only obstacles to human progress. Other ideologies also impede human advance. Some forms of political doctrine, for instance, function religiously, re-flecting the worst features of orthodoxy and a uthoritarianism, especially when they sacrifice individuals on the altar of Utopian promises. Purely economic and political viewpoints, whether capitalist or communist, often function as religious and ideological dogma. Although humans undoubtedly need economic and political goals, they also need creative values by which to live.

Ethics

THIRD: We affirm that moral values derive their source from human experience. Ethics is autonomous and situation all needing no theological or ideological sanction. Ethics stems from human need and interest. To deny this distorts the whole basis of life. Human life has meaning because we create and develop our futures. Happiness and the creative realization of human needs and desires, individually and in shared enjoyment, are continuous themes of humanism. We strive for the good life, here and now. The goal is to pursue life's enrichment despite debasing forces of vulga r-ization, commercialization, and dehumanization.

FOURTH: Reason and intelligence are the most effective instruments that humankind possesses. There is no substitute: neither faith nor passion suffices in itself. The controlled use of scientific methods, which have transformed the natural and social sciences since the Renaissance, must be extended further in the solution of human problems. But reason must be tempered by humility, since no group has a monopoly of wisdom or virtue. Nor is there any guarantee that all problems can be solved or all questions answered. Yet critical intelligence, infused by a sense of human caring, is the best method that humanity has for resolving problems. Reason should be balanced with compassion and empathy and the whole person fulfilled. Thus, we are not advocating the use of scientific intelligence independent of or in opposition to emotion, for we believe in the cultivation of feeling and love. As science pushes back the boundary of the known, humankind's sense of wonder is continually renewed, and art, poetry, and music find their places, along with religion and ethics.

The Individual

FIFTH: The preciousness and dignity of the individual person is a central humanist value. Individuals should be enco uraged to realize their own creative talents and desires. We reject all religious, ideological, or moral codes that denig rate the individual, suppress freedom, dull intellect, dehumanize person-ality. We believe in maximum individual aut onomy consonant with social responsibility. Although science can account for the causes of behavior, the possibilities of individual freedom of choice exist in human life and should be increased.

SIXTH: In the area of sexuality, we believe that intolerant attitudes, often cultivated by orthodox religions and puritani cal cultures, unduly repress sexual conduct. The right to birth control, abortion, and divorce should be recognized. While we do not approve of exploitive, denigrating forms of sexual expression, neither do we wish to prohibit, by law or social sanction, sexual behavior between consenting adults. The many varieties of sexual exploration should not in the emselves be considered "evil." Without countenancing mindless permissiveness or unbridled promiscuity, a civilized society should be a tolerant one. Short of harming others or compelling them to do likewise, individuals should be permitted to express their sexual proclivities and pursue their life-styles as they desire. We wish to cultivate the development of a responsible attitude toward sexuality, in which humans are not exploited as sexual objects, and in which in timacy, sensitivity, respect, and honesty in interpersonal relations are encouraged. Moral education for children and adults is an important way of developing awareness and sexual maturity.

Democratic Society

SEVENTH: To enhance freedom and dignity the individual must experience a full range of civil liberties in all societie s. This includes freedom of speech and the press, political democracy, the legal right of opposition to governmental policies, fair judicial process, religious liberty, freedom of association, and artistic, scientific, and cultural freedom. It also includes a recognition of an individual's right to die with dignity, euthanasia, and the right to suicide. We oppose the increasing invasion of privacy, by whatever means, in both totalitarian and democratic societies. We would safegu ard, extend, and implement the principles of human freedom evolved from the Magna Carta to the Bill of Rights, the Rights of Man, and the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.

EIGHTH: We are committed to an open and democratic society. We must extend participatory democracy in its true sense to the economy, the school, the family, the workplace, and voluntary associations. Decision-making must be de centralized to include widespread involvement of people at all levels -- social, political, and economic. All persons should have a voice in developing the values and goals that determine their lives. Institutions should be responsive to expressed desires and needs. The conditions of work, education, devotion, and play should be humanized. Alienating forces should be modified or eradicated and bureaucratic structures should be held to a minimum. People are more important than decalogues, rules, proscriptions, or regulations.

NINTH: The separation of church and state and the separation of ideology and state are imperatives. The state should encourage maximum freedom for different moral, political, religious, and social values in society. It should not favor any particular religious bodies through the use of public monies, nor espouse a single ideology and function thereby as an instrument of propaganda or oppression, particularly against dissenters.

TENTH: Humane societies should evaluate economic systems not by rhetoric or ideology, but by whether or not they increase economic well-being for all individuals and groups, minimize poverty and hardship, increase the sum of huma n satisfaction, and enhance the quality of life. Hence the door is open to alternative economic systems. We need to d emocratize the economy and judge it by its responsiveness to human needs, testing results in terms of the common good.

ELEVENTH: The principle of moral equality must be furthered through elimination of all discrimination based upon ra ce, religion, sex, age, or national origin. This means equality of opportunity and recognition of talent and merit. Individu als should be encouraged to contribute to their own betterment. If unable, then society should provide means to satis fy their basic economic, health, and cultural needs, including, wherever resources make possible, a minimum guaran teed annual income. We are concerned for the welfare of the aged, the infirm, the disadvantaged, and also for the ou teasts -- the mentally retarded, abandoned, or abused children, the handicapped, prisoners, and addicts -- for all who are neglected or ignored by society. Practicing humanists should make it their vocation to humanize personal relations.

We believe in the right to universal education. Everyone has a right to the cultural opportunity to fulfill his or her unique capacities and talents. The schools should foster satisfying and productive living. They should be open at all levels t o any and all; the achievement of excellence should be encouraged. Innovative and experimental forms of education are to be welcomed. The energy and idealism of the young deserve to be appreciated and channeled to constructive purposes.

We deplore racial, religious, ethnic, or class antagonisms. Although we believe in cultural diversity and encourage racial and ethnic pride, we reject separations which promote alienation and set people and groups against each other; we envision an integrated community where people have a maximum opportunity for free and voluntary association.

We are critical of sexism or sexual chauvinism -- male or female. We believe in equal rights for both women and men to fulfill their unique careers and potentialities as they see fit, free of invidious discrimination.

World Community

TWELFTH: We deplore the division of humankind on nationalistic grounds. We have reached a turning point in huma n history where the best option is to transcend the limits of national sovereignty and to move toward the building of a world community in which all sectors of the human family can participate. Thus we look to the development of a syste m of world law and a world order based upon transnational federal government. This would appreciate cultural plurali sm and diversity. It would not exclude pride in national origins and accomplishments nor the handling of regional pro blems on a regional basis. Human progress, however, can no longer be achieved by focusing on one section of the world, Western or Eastern, developed or underdeveloped. For the first time in human history, no part of humankind can be isolated from any other. Each person's future is in some way linked to all. We thus reaffirm a commitment to the building of world community, at the same time recognizing that this commits us to some hard choices.

THIRTEENTH: This world community must renounce the resort to violence and force as a method of solving international disputes. We believe in the peaceful adjudication of differences by international courts and by the development of the arts of negotiation and compromise. War is obsolete. So is the use of nuclear, biological, and chemical weapons. It is a planetary imperative to reduce the level of military expenditures and turn these savings to peaceful and people -oriented uses.

FOURTEENTH: The world community must engage in cooperative planning concerning the use of rapidly depleting r esources. The planet earth must be considered a single ecosystem. Ecological damage, resource depletion, and exce ssive population growth must be checked by international concord. The cultivation and conservation of nature is a m oral value; we should perceive ourselves as integral to the sources of our being in nature. We must free our world fro m needless pollution and waste, responsibly guarding and creating wealth, both natural and human. Exploitation of natural resources, uncurbed by social conscience, must end.

FIFTEENTH: The problems of economic growth and development can no longer be resolved by one nation alone; they are worldwide in scope. It is the moral obligation of the developed nations to provide -- through an international auth ority that safeguards human rights -- massive technical, agricultural, medical, and economic assistance, including bir th control techniques, to the developing portions of the globe. World poverty must cease. Hence extreme disproporti ons in wealth, income, and economic growth should be reduced on a worldwide basis.

SIXTEENTH: Technology is a vital key to human progress and development. We deplore any neo-romantic efforts to condemn indiscriminately all technology and science or to counsel retreat from its further extension and use for the go od of humankind. We would resist any moves to censor basic scientific research on moral, political, or social ground s. Technology must, however, be carefully judged by the consequences of its use; harmful and destructive changes should be avoided. We are particularly disturbed when technology and bureaucracy control, manipulate, or modify human beings without their consent. Technological feasibility does not imply social or cultural desirability.

SEVENTEENTH: We must expand communication and transportation across frontiers. Travel restrictions must cease. The world must be open to diverse political, ideological, and moral viewpoints and evolve a worldwide system of telev ision and radio for information and education. We thus call for full international cooperation in culture, science, the arts, and technology across ideological borders. We must learn to live openly together or we shall perish together.

Humanity As a Whole

IN CLOSING: The world cannot wait for a reconciliation of competing political or economic systems to solve its probl ems. These are the times for men and women of goodwill to further the building of a peaceful and prosperous world. We urge that parochial loyalties and inflexible moral and religious ideologies be transcended. We urge recognition of the common humanity of all people. We further urge the use of reason and compassion to produce the kind of world we want -- a world in which peace, prosperity, freedom, and happiness are widely shared. Let us not abandon that vi sion in despair or cowardice. We are responsible for what we are or will be. Let us work together for a humane world by means commensurate with humane ends. Destructive ideological differences among communism, capitalism, socia lism, conservatism, liberalism, and radicalism should be overcome. Let us call for an end to terror and hatred. We wil I survive and prosper only in a world of shared humane values. We can initiate new directions for humankind; ancien t rivalries can be superseded by broad-based cooperative efforts. The commitment to tolerance, understanding, and peaceful negotiation does not necessitate acquiescence to the status quo nor the damming up of dynamic and revol utionary forces. The true revolution is occurring and can continue in countless nonviolent adjustments. But this entails t he willingness to step forward onto new and expanding plateaus. At the present juncture of history, commitment to al I humankind is the highest commitment of which we are capable; it transcends the narrow allegiances of church, stat e, party, class, or race in moving toward a wider vision of human potentiality. What more daring a goal for humankin d than for each person to become, in ideal as well as practice, a citizen of a world community. It is a classical vision;

we can now give it new vitality. Humanism thus interpreted is a moral force that has time on its side. We believe that humankind has the potential, intelligence, goodwill, and cooperative skill to implement this commitment in the decades ahead.

We, the undersigned, while not necessarily endorsing every detail of the above, pledge our general support to Humanist Manifesto II for the future of humankind. These affirmations are not a final credo or dogma but an expression of a living and growing faith. We invite others in all lands to join us in further developing and working for these goals.

Iran leader: Holocaust a 'myth'

TEHRAN, Iran (CNN) -- Iranian President Mahmoud Ahmadinejad has described the Holocaust as "a myth" and suggest ed that Israel be moved to Europe, the United States, Canada or Alaska.

The United States, Israel and the European Commission -- along with individual European countries -- have condemned the remark.

Ahmadinejad sparked widespread international condemnation in October when he called for Israel to be "wiped off the map."

Last week, he also expressed doubt about the killing by the Nazis of six million Jews during World War II, but Wednesda y was the first occasion when he said in public that the Holocaust was a myth.

"They have invented a myth that Jews were massacred and place this above God, religions and the prophets," Ahmadin ejad said in a speech to thousands of people in the Iranian city of Zahedan, according to a report on Wednesday from Isl amic Republic of Iran Broadcasting.

"The West has given more significance to the myth of the genocide of the Jews, even more significant than God, religion, and the prophets," he said. "(It) deals very severely with those who deny this myth but does not do anything to those w ho deny God, religion, and the prophet."

"If you have burned the Jews, why don't you give a piece of Europe, the United States, Canada or Alaska to Israel," Ahm adinejad said.

"Our question is, if you have committed this huge crime, why should the innocent nation of Palestine pay for this crime?"

Mark Regev, spokesman for Israel's Foreign Ministry, said: "The combination of a regime with a radical agenda, together with a distorted sense of reality that is clearly indicated by the statements we heard today, put together with nuclear wea pons -- I think that's a dangerous combination that no one in the international community can accept."

"What the Iranian president has shown us today is that he is clearly outside the international consensus, he is clearly out side international norms and international legitimacy, and in so doing he has shown the Iranian government for what it is -- a rogue regime opposed to peace and stability and a threat to all its neighboring countries," Regev said.

In addition, Ahmadinejad spoke in Zahedan about Iran's nuclear program, maintaining it will insist on its right to develop nuclear energy for peaceful purposes.

"Those who themselves produce nuclear arms should not raise hue and cry against those who only want to gain access to nuclear technology for peaceful purposes," he said, according to a report from the Islamic Republic News Agency.

"Countries which have arsenals of nuclear, chemical and biological weapons which can be used against other countries at their whim and those who supplied the Baathist regime with (chemical) weapons that killed thousands of innocent Iran ians ... now go to all lengths to block Iran from gaining access to peaceful nuclear technology," he said.

"We are sure they have criminal intentions, and there was never any doubt that they were piling weapons of mass destruction to be used against less powerful nations," Ahmadinejad said, according to the IRNA report.

In an agricultural economy, the workplace was the home where the husband and wife labored together and lived together. In the industrial economy, the man left the home to work in a factory, while the wife stayed home to look after the children. The agricultural economy gave us the extended family; the industrial economy, the nuclear family. But in the postindustrial economy, husband and wife both work at the office, and no one stays home with the children. Indeed, there may be no children. As political science professor James Kurth of Swarthmore writes:

"The greatest movement of the second half of the nineteenth century was the movement of men from farm to the factory.... The greatest movement of the second half of the twentieth century has been the movement of women from the home to the office... movement separates the parent from the children, as well as enabling the wife to separate hers elf from her husband. By splitting the nuclear family, it is helping to bring about the replacement of the nuclear family with the non-family."

As men's jobs in manufacturing, mining, farming, and fishing are no longer needed, or are shipped overseas, the skills a nd talents of women are now more desirable. There are also opportunities in government, education, and the profession s open to women today that their mothers and grandmothers never had. Businesses, large and small, offer packages of pay and benefits to lure talented women out of the home and keep them out of the maternity ward, where they are "no g ood to the company."

It is working. In the scores of millions, American women have left the home for the office to work beside and compete wi th men. By the tens of millions, women college graduates have put off marriage, many forever. "You can have it all!" the modern woman is told--baby and a career. With nannies, courtesy of open borders, with equal-pay-for-equal work, ma ternity leave, and daycare, courtesy of the government and the company, the lure is not a lie. What you can't have is a b rood of kids back home while keeping pace with the competition at the office.

Forced to choose, women are choosing career, or career and the joy of motherhood, once. The Global Economy works hand in hand with the New Economy, transfering manufacturing jobs from high wage Western nations to the low-wage, n ewly industrialized nations of Asia and Latin America. With Working America's yellow brick road to the middle class dow n to one lane, wives must work to keep up with the Jones next door. So children are put off, sometimes for good. In 19 50, 88 percent of women with children under six stayed home, where they often had more kids. Today, 64 percent of A merican women with children under six are in the labor force.

"How you gonna keep' em down on the farm, after they've seen Paree?" was said of the World War I soldiers who went off to Europe. Well, how you gonna get' em back in the 'burbs, after they've seen D.C. one might ask of the talented wo men lawyers, journalists, PR specialists, and political aides who have enjoyed the great game in an exciting city.

Writing in the Spectator, Eleanor Mills is an authentic voice of her generation; "The fact is that girls like me--ie. healthy, hearty, middle-class women in their 20s--are just not breeding." Why not? Because, she writes, "my generation's twin p reoccupations are, unfortunately, looks and money." She quotes one of her many childless contemporaries;

"If I had a kid," said Jane, and advertising executive, thoughtfully, "I wouldn't be able to do half the things I take for grant ed. Every Saturday at 10:30 am when we are still in bed, my husband and I look at each other and just say, "Thank God we weren't up at 5 a.m. caring for a brat." We have such a great time just the two of us; who know if it would work if we i ntroduced another person into the equation?"

"The rich are different from us," said F. Scott Fitzgerald. To which Hemingway replied, "Yes, they have more money." But the rich also have fewer children. Using Occam's razor--the somplest explanation is usually the right one--the best ex

plaination for the sinking birthrate in the West may be the simplest. As America's poor enter the middle class, and the middle class becomes affluent, and the affluent become rich, each adopts the style of the class they have lately entered. All begin to downsize their families; all begin to have fewer children. A corollary follows; The richer a nation becomes, the fewer its children, and the sooner it begins to die. Societies organized to ensure the maximum pleasure, freedom, and happiness for all their members are, at the same time, advancing the date of their own funerals. Fate may compensate the Chinese, Islamic, and Latin peoples for their hardships and poverty in this century with the domination of the earth in the next. Indeed, do we not have it on high authority that "Blessed are the meek...they shall inherit the earth?"

(B) End of the "Family Wage."

In the 1830s, as America's industrial revolution was about to begin, the Philadelphia Trade Union warned its members about the hidden agenda of what it called "cormorant capital":

"Oppose with all your minds and with all your strength for it will prove our ruin. We must strive to obtain sufficient remun eration for our labor to keep the wives and daughters and sisters of our people at home... That cormorant capital will have every man, woman, and child to toil: but let us exert our families to oppose its design."

In 1848, the year of Karl Marx's Communist Manifesto, the labor publication Ten Hour Advocate editorialized: "We hope the day is not distant when the husband will be able to provide for his wife and family, without sending to endure the dru dgery of a cotton mill.?

This vison of American free labor was at war with the view being espoused by Marx and his patron and collaborator, Frie drich Engels, who wrote in The Origin of the Family, Private Property, and the State; "The first condition for the libera tion of the wife is to bring the whole female sex into public industry and ...this in turn demands the abolition of the monogamous family as the economic unit of societ." Is it not a remarkable coincidence how global capitalism's view of women-as units of production, liberated from husbands, home, and family--conforms so precisely to the view of the fathers of global communism?

As Allan Carlson, who also publishes The Family in America, writes, there was a consensus in America, not so long ago, that employers should pay fathers a "family wage" sufficient to support their wives and children in dignity without their ha ving to leave the home to go to work. That was considered one of the defining characteristics of a good society.

...This idea was widely accepted. Carlson notes that the "wage gap" between men and women actually widened after W orld War II. In 1939, women earned 59.3 percent of men's pay; by 1966, that had fallen to 53.6 percent. In the 1940s a nd 1950s, the culture, with a good conscience, separated men and women in the workplace. In newspapers, the "Men

Wanted" ads were run separate from the "Women Wanted" ads. Only rarely could working women be found outside such occupations as clerk-typist, secretary, nurse, school teacher, or salegirl. Carlson writes:

"To an observer from the Year 2000, the most amazing thing about this system was that it was both understood by the a verage people and popularly supported. In opinion polls, large majorities of Americans (85 percent or more), women an d men, agreed that fathers deserved as income that would support their wives and children at home and that the labor of mothers was secondary or supplemental. This was seen as simple justice."

This system fell apart in the 1960s, when feminists managed to add "sex" to the discriminations forbidden by the sweeping Civil Rights Act of 1964, which had been written to protect the rights of African Americans. This turned the new Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) into a siege gun against the family wage. "Men Wanted" ads were declared discriminatory and outlawed. Gender equality replaced "moral contract." The rights of individuals took precedence over the requirements of family. Women's pay soared, and as women began moving into occupations that had been lar gely restrictived to men--medicine, law, the media, the academy, the upper bureaucracy, and business--families began to crumble.

Between 1973 and 1996, writes Dr. Carlson, "the median income of men, aged 15 and above, working full-time, fell 24 p ercent, from \$37,200 to \$30,000," Marching under feminist banners--equal pay for equal work, and equal pay for compa rable work--women moved into direct competition with men. Millions succeeded, shouldering men aside with superior p erformance. Their pay rose steadily, and the absolute and relative pay of married men began to yield to wives' insistenc e that they "go back to work." Young men found they no longer earned enough in their late teens or early twenties to st art a family, even if that had been their hope and dream. Stripped of the duties of fatherhood and family, many of these young men wound up in trouble--and even in prison.

America's young women found they could achieve independance on their own. They need not get married, certainly not yet. More and more did not marry. In 1970, only 36 percent of women aged twenty to twenty-four were unmarried. By 1995, 68 percent were in the "never married" category. Among women twenty-five to twenty-nine, the "never marrieds" had soared from 10 percent to 35 percent.

The young family with a batch of kids is now an endangered species. Only the young rich can afford that "lifestyle," and they are uninterested. With the Democratic party so beholden to feminism that it cannot even oppose partial birth aborti ons, and the GOP in thrall to libertarian ideology and controlled by corporate interests, the call of the gods of the market place for more women workers prevails over the command of the God of Genesis: "Be fruitful and multiply, and replenish the earth."

Many conservatives have succumbed to the heresy of Economism, a mirror-Marxism that holds that man is an economic animal, that free trade and free markets are the path to peace, prosperity, and happiness, that if we can only get the mar ginal tax rates right and the capital gains tax abolished, Paradise--Dow 36,000!--is at hand. But when the income tax rat e for the wealthiest was above 90 percent in the 1950s, America, by every moral and social indicator, was a better count ry.

The reformed radical and Christian convert Orestes Brownson saw this new idolatry of "Mammon worship" rising in t he America of the nineteenth century: "Mammonism has become the religion of Saxodom, and God is not in all our thoughts. We have lost our faith in the noble, the beautiful and the just." A century later, another convert from a failed materialistic faith would remind us again. Wrote Whittaker Chambers, "Economics is not the central proble m of our age, faith is."

(C) The Population Bomb Hysteria.

Then there was the antipeople movement of the 1960s and 1970s, the elite's backlash against the baby boom. Paul Ehrlich, a Stanford University biologist, was its guru, and his bestseller, The Population Bomb, did for population control what Rachel Carson's Silent Spring had done for environmentalism. Ehrlich was a twentieth-century reincarnation of Thomas Robert Malthus, the British demographer whose prediction of world starvation proved so spectacularly wrong in the nineteenth century. Malthus had written: "It may be safely asserted....that population, when unchecked, increases in geometrical progression of such a nature as to double itself every twenty-five years." As the world's food production could not double every twenty-five years, said the gloomy parson, mass starvation was dead ahead.

Malthus proved as wrong about food production as Ehrlich did about the world's resources, which he assured us were running out. Today, the six billion on earth live in far greater freedom and prosperity than did the three billion in 1960, the two billion in 1927, or the one billion in 1830. Political incompetence and criminality, foolish ideas and insane ideologies, are the cause of starvation and misery, not people.

Published by the Sierra Club, Ehrlich's book became required reading in many high schools. By 1977, former secretary of defense and World Bank president Robert McNamara was playing Henny Penny to Ehrlich's Chicken Little, warning that "continued population growth would cause "poverty, hunger, stress, crowding, and frustration," that would threaten social, economic and military stability."

In 1978, a congressional select committee on population announced that the "major biological systems that humanity depends upon....are being strained by rapid population growth... in some cases, they are.... losing productive capacity." As Jacqueline Kasun, author of The War Against Population, writes, about this time the Smithsonian Institution created a "traveling exhibit for schoolchildren called "Population: The Problem Is Us," featured a picture of a dead rat on a dinne r plate as an example of "future food sources."

As a result of this antipopulation propaganda from America's elite institutions of politics and ideas, the public f unding for population control here and abroad exploded. But though the message was taken to heart by the First World wealthy and middle class, it was largely ignored by the Third World poor, at whom it had been targeted. We can see the results today: a birth dearth among the affluent nations, and baby boom across the Third World.

National Security Study Memorandum 200

TO: The Secretary of Defense
The Secretary of Agriculture
The Director of Central Intelligence
The Deputy Secretary of State
Administrator, Agency for International Development

SUBJECT: Implications of Worldwide Population Growth for U.S. Security and Overseas Interests

The President has directed a study of the impact of world population growth on U.S. security and overseas interests. The study should look forward at least until the year 2000, and use several alternative reasonable projections of population growth.

In terms of each projection, the study should assess:

- the corresponding pace of development, especially in poorer countries:
- the demand for US exports, especially of food, and the trade problems the US may face arising from competition for resources; and
- the likelihood that population growth or imbalances will produce disruptive foreign policies and international instability.

The study should focus on the international political and economic implications of population growth rather than its ecological, sociological or other aspects.

The study would then offer possible courses of action for the United States in dealing with population matters abroad, particularly in developing countries, with special attention to these questions:

- What, if any, new initiatives by the United States are needed to focus international attention on the population problem?
- Can technological innovations or development reduce growth or ameliorate its effects?
- Could the United States improve its assistance in the population field and if so, in what form and through which agencies -- bilateral, multilateral, private?

The study should take into account the President's concern that population policy is a human concern intimately related to the dignity of the individual and the objective of the United States is to work closely with others, rather than seek to impose our views on others.

The President has directed that the study be accomplished by the NSC Under Secretaries Committee. The Chairman, Under Secretaries Committee, is requested to forward the study together with the Committee's action recommendations no later than May 29, 1974 for consideration by the President.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY World Demographic Trends

 \hat{A} \hat{A} \hat{A} \hat{A} 1. World Population growth since World War II is quantitatively and qualitatively different from any previous e poch in human history. The rapid reduction in death rates, unmatched by corresponding birth rate reductions, has brought total growth rates close to 2 percent a year, compared with about 1 percent before World War II, under 0.5 percent in 1750-1900, and far lower rates before 1750. The effect is to double the world's population in 35 years instead of 100 years. Almost 80 million are now being added each year, compared with 10 million in 1900.

 \hat{A} \hat{A} \hat{A} \hat{A} 2. The second new feature of population trends is the sharp differentiation between rich and poor countries. Since 1950, population in the former group has been growing at 0 to 1.5 percent per year, and in the latter at 2.0 to 3.5 percent (doubling in 20 to 35 years). Some of the highest rates of increase are in areas already densely populated and with a weak resource base.

 \hat{A} \hat{A} \hat{A} \hat{A} 3. Because of the momentum of population dynamics, reductions in birth rates affect total numbers only slow ly. High birth rates in the recent past have resulted in a high proportion in the youngest age groups, so that there will c ontinue to be substantial population increases over many years even if a two-child family should become the norm in the future. Policies to reduce fertility will have their main effects on total numbers only after several decades. However, i future numbers are to be kept within reasonable bounds, it is urgent that measures to reduce fertility be started and m ade effective in the 1970's and 1980's. Moreover, programs started now to reduce birth rates will have short run advantages for developing countries in lowered demands on food, health and educational and other services and in enlarged capacity to contribute to productive investments, thus accelerating development.

 \hat{A} \hat{A} \hat{A} \hat{A} 4. U.N. estimates use the 3.6 billion population of 1970 as a base (there are nearly 4 billion now) and project from about 6 billion to 8 billion people for the year 2000 with the U.S. medium estimate at 6.4 billion. The U.S. medium projections show a world population of 12 billion by 2075 which implies a five-fold increase in south and southeast Asia and in Latin American and a seven-fold increase in Africa, compared with a doubling in east Asia and a 40% increase in the presently developed countries (see Table I). Most demographers, including the U.N. and the U.S. Population Co uncil, regard the range of 10 to 13 billion as the most likely level for world population stability, even with intensive effort s at fertility control. (These figures assume, that sufficient food could be produced and distributed to avoid limitation thr ough famines.)

 \hat{A} \hat{A} \hat{A} \hat{A} For most of man's history, world population grew very slowly. At the rate of growth estimated for the first 18 c enturies A.D., it required more than 1,000 years for world population to double in size. With the beginnings of the industrial revolution and of modern medicine and sanitation over two hundred years ago, population growth rates began to acc elerate. At the current growth rate (1.9 percent) world population will double in 37 years.

By about 1830, world population reached 1 billion. The second billion was added in about 100 years by 1930. The third billion in 30 years by 1960. The fourth will be reached in 1975.

Between 1750-1800 less than 4 million were being added, on the average, to the earth's population each year. Between 1850-1900, it was close to 8 million. By 1950 it had grown to 40 million. By 1975 it will be about 80 million.

 \hat{A} \hat{A} \hat{A} \hat{A} In the developed countries of Europe, growth rates in the last century rarely exceeded 1.0-1.2 percent per year, almost never 1.5 percent. Death rates were much higher than in most LDCs today. In North America where growth rates were higher, immigration made a significant contribution. In nearly every country of Europe, growth rates are now be low 1 percent, in many below 0.5 percent. The natural growth rate (births minus deaths) in the United States is less than 0.6 percent. Including immigration (the world's highest) it is less than 0.7 percent.

 \hat{A} \hat{A} \hat{A} \hat{A} In less developed countries growth rates average about 2.4 percent. For the People's Republic of China, with a massive, enforced birth control program, the growth rate is estimated at under 2 percent. India's is variously estimated from 2.2 percent, Brazil at 2.8 percent, Mexico at 3.4 percent, and Latin America at about 2.9 percent. African countries, with high birth as well as high death rates, average 2.6 percent; this growth rate will increase as death rates go down.

 \hat{A} \hat{A} \hat{A} \hat{A} The world's population is now about 3.9 billion; 1.1 billion in the developed countries (30 percent) and 2.8 billion in the less developed countries (70 percent).

 \hat{A} \hat{A} \hat{A} \hat{A} In 1950, only 28 percent of the world's population or 692 million, lived in urban localities. Between 1950 and 1 970, urban population expanded at a rate twice as rapid as the rate of growth of total population. In 1970, urban populat ion increased to 36 percent of world total and numbered 1.3 billion. By 2000, according to the UN's medium variant projection, 3.2 billion (about half of the total) of world inhabitants will live in cities and towns.

Â Â În developed countries, the urban population varies from 45 to 85 percent; in LDCs, it varies from close to zer o in some African states to nearly 100 percent in Hong Kong and Singapore.

 \hat{A} \hat{A} \hat{A} \hat{A} In LDCs, urban population is projected to more than triple in the remainder of this century, from 622 million in 1970 to 2,087 in 2000. Its proportion in total LDC population will thus increase from 25 percent in 1970 to 41 percent in 2000. This implies that by the end of this century LDCs will reach half the level of urbanization projected for DCs (82 percent) (See Table I).

 \hat{A} \hat{A} \hat{A} The enormous built-in momentum of population growth in the less developed countries (and to a degree in the developed countries) is, if possible, even more important and ominous than current population size and rates of growth. Unlike a conventional explosion, population growth provides a continuing chain reaction. This momentum springs from (

1) high fertility levels of LDC populations and (2) the very high percentage of maturing young people in populations. The typical developed country, Sweden for example, may have 25% of the population under 15 years of age. The typical de veloping country has 41% to 45% or its population under 15. This means that a tremendous number of future parents, c ompared to existing parents, are already born. Even if they have fewer children per family than their parents, the increa se in population will be very great.

 \hat{A} \hat{A} \hat{A} Moderation of population growth offers benefits in terms of resources saved for investment and/or higher per c apita consumption. If resource requirements to support fewer children are reduced and the funds now allocated for cons truction of schools, houses, hospitals and other essential facilities are invested in productive activities, the impact on the growth of GNP and per capita income may be significant. In addition, economic and social progress resulting from popul ation control will further contribute to the decline in fertility rates. The relationship is reciprocal, and can take the form of either a vicious or a virtuous circle....

In most, if not all, developing countries high fertility rates impose substantial economic costs and restrain economic gr owth. The main adverse macroeconomic effects may be analyzed in three general categories: (1) the saving effect, (2) " child quality" versus "child quantity", and (3) "capital deepening" versus "capital widening." These three categories are n ot mutually exclusive, but they highlight different familial and social perspectives. In addition, there are often longer-run adverse effects on agricultural output and the balance of payments.

 \hat{A} \hat{A} \hat{A} \hat{A} (1) The saving effect. A high fertility economy has perforce a larger "burden of dependency" than a low fertility economy, because a larger proportion of the population consists of children too young to work. There are more non-working people to feed, house and rear, and there is a smaller surplus above minimum consumption available for savings and investment. It follows that a lower fertility rate can free resources from consumption; if saved and invested, these resources could contribute to economic growth. (There is much controversy on this; empirical studies of the savings effect have produced varying results.)

 \hat{A} \hat{A} \hat{A} \hat{A} (2) Child quality versus quantity. Parents make investment decisions, in a sense, about their children. Healt hier and better-educated children tend to be economically more productive, both as children and later as adults. In addit ion to the more-or-less conscious trade-offs parents can make about more education and better health per child, there are certain biologic adverse effects suffered by high birth order children such as higher mortality and limited brain growth due to higher incidence of malnutrition. It must be emphasized, however, that discussion of trade-offs between child quality and child quantity will probably remain academic with regard to countries where child mortality remains high. When parents cannot expect most children to survive to old age, they probably will continue to "over-compensate", using high fertility as a form of hedge to insure that they will have some living offspring able to support the parents in the distant future.

 \hat{A} \hat{A} \hat{A} \hat{A} (3) Capital deepening versus widening. From the family's viewpoint high fertility is likely to reduce welfare per child; for the economy one may view high fertility as too rapid a growth in labor force relative to capital stock. Society's c apital stock includes facilities such as schools and other educational inputs in addition to capital investments that raise w orkers' outputs in agriculture and manufacturing. For any given rate of capital accumulation, a lower population growth r ate can help increase the amount of capital and education per worker, helping thereby to increase output and income per capita. The problem of migration to cities and the derived demand for urban infrastructure can also be analyzed as problems of capital widening, which draw resources away from growth-generating investments.

These thoughts are based on man's economy. How does this differ from God's economy?

(Nssm200 policy paper continued) Now I will try to post the "means by which the U.S. planned to reduce populations in Low Developed Countries as well as here in the States.

Within the overall array of U.S. foreign assistance programs, preferential treatment in allocation of funds and manpow er should be given to cost-effective programs to reduce population growth; including both family planning activities and s upportive activities in other sectors.

While some have argued for use of explicit "leverage" to "force" better population programs on LDC governments, the re are several practical constraints on our efforts to achieve program improvements. Attempts to use "leverage" for far I ess sensitive issues have generally caused political frictions and often backfired. Successful family planning requires str ong local dedication and commitment that cannot over the long run be enforced from the outside. There is also the dang er that some LDC leaders will see developed country pressures for family planning as a form of economic or racial imper ialism; this could well create a serious backlash.

Short of "leverage", there are many opportunities, bilaterally and multilaterally, for U.S. representations to discuss an d urge the need for stronger family planning programs. There is also some established precedent for taking account of f amily planning performance in appraisal of assistance requirements by AID and consultative groups. Since population g rowth is a major determinant of increases in food demand, allocation of scarce PL 480 resources should take account of what steps a country is taking in population control as well as food production. In these sensitive relationships, however, it is important in style as well as substance to avoid the appearance of coercion.

D. Provision and Development of Family Planning Services, Information and Technology

Past experience suggests that easily available family planning services are a vital and effective element in reducing f ertility rates in the LDCs.

Two main advances are required for providing safe and effective fertility control techniques in the developing countrie s:

- 1. Expansion and further development of efficient low-cost systems to assure the full availability of existing family pla nning services, materials and information to the 85% of LDC populations not now effectively reached. In developing countries willing to create special delivery systems for family planning services this may be the most effective method. In ot hers the most efficient and acceptable method is to combine family planning with health or nutrition in multi-purpose delivery systems.
- 2. Improving the effectiveness of present means of fertility control, and developing new technologies which are simple, low cost, effective, safe, long-lasting and acceptable to potential users. This involves both basic developmental research and operations research to judge the utility of new or modified approaches under LDC conditions.

Both of these goals should be given very high priority with necessary additional funding consistent with current or adjusted divisions of labor among other donors and organizations involved in these areas of population assistance.

Do you see that the main components listed here are "family planning programs" and medical research for "fertility control?"
