Nothing coming from the outside can change what is on the inside. God works from the inside out, not vice versa. He is not pleased with a shallow "God and..." event, even with us making some good friends; what He demands is full devotion and absolute surrender. At that point persona I opinions and preferences have no value. Everything *personal* is nailed to the Cross.

Is the Christian life meant to	be boring then?

Dear George, there is nothing boring in the Christian life. The word "boredom" has no place in it. In fact, if we are bored, this is a sure indication that we are outside the will of God. For what do we have to choose for ourselves? Have we not b een bought with a price? Are we our own to say "I want this also, God, because I am getting bored, because this is too h ard for me... my flesh just can't take it"? The Christian life--the life of Christ in us--is anything but boring. It is abundant, n ot because of the things we do *externally*, but because of the work of the living God *internally*. It is written, "If then you w ere raised with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ is, sitting at the right hand of God" (Col. 3:1). Th e way to overcome boredom--or the temptation to boredom and futility--is to turn to God and seek His face and His will, not at ourselves or the world around us for inspiration. By looking at ourselves and finding ways to engage ourselves in s omething positive or seemingly God-honoring, we, in fact, say to God we don't need Him; we make it clear to Him that w e are sufficient on our own (perhaps not even realizing it), and *we cannot abide in Him* with such an attitude. We must c ome to the end of ourselves.

And what is fun? Wasn't "sorrow better than laughter"? Weren't those who mourn going to be comforted? Where is fun p resent in the Word as an end in itself or an example we should follow? We see quite the contrary picture painted in the S criptures:

"The heart of the wise is in the house of mourning, but the heart of fools is in the house of mirth" (Eccl. 7:4), and in another place,

"Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted" (Matthew 5:3-4).

Before rejecting Tears of joy's admonition, you should examine yourself, George, in light of the Truth. You should try to find where your heart is, for there also will be your treasure. "He who disdains instruction despises his own soul, but he who heeds rebuke gets understanding" (Prov. 15:32).

I have been to many such conferences and events in the past, and they have added *zero* to my faith in the Lord. I went there, I played games, I sang songs; I was thrilled deeply and I said to myself: "This must be the Lord!" But then I left an d went home, and in a couple of days or a week the emotion was gone, and things started as usual. I was the same old wretched man, who thought he'd found deliverance, but came back empty-handed. God is not pleased with bombastic p erformances of men's adoration, He is not fascinated by big crowds, huge offerings, many professed conversions. He w ants a quiet and obedient heart to speak to. See this example in the Word when God came to Elijah:

1Ki 19:7 And the angel of the Lord came back the second time, and touched him, and said, "Arise and eat, because the journey is too great for you."

1Ki 19:8 So he arose, and ate and drank; and he went in the strength of that food forty days and forty nights as far as H oreb, the mountain of God.

1Ki 19:9 And there he went into a cave, and spent the night in that place; and behold, the word of the Lord came to him, and He said to him, "What are you doing here, Elijah?"

1Ki 19:10 So he said, "I have been very zealous for the Lord God of hosts; for the children of Israel have forsaken Your covenant, torn down Your altars, and killed Your prophets with the sword. I alone am left; and they seek to take my life."

1Ki 19:11 Then He said, "Go out, and stand on the mountain before the Lord." And behold, the Lord passed by, and a g reat and strong wind tore into the mountains and broke the rocks in pieces before the Lord, but the Lord was not in the w ind; and after the wind an earthquake, but the Lord was not in the earthquake;

1Ki 19:12 and after the earthquake a fire, but the Lord was not in the fire; and after the fire a still small voice.

Dear George, you don't have to do special research or listen to "respected speakers" to find God and hear from Him, alt hough God can and does speak through people. Just go to a solitary place and cry out to Him. He will be there as He ha s promised; "All that the Father gives Me will come to Me, and the one who comes to Me I will by no means cast out" (Jo hn 6:37).

I'm afraid I must agree with Tears_for_Joy and NotMe. I understand what the conference coordinators were trying to do but I believe they went about it in the wrong way. A worldly way. Surely, this can't be a surprise to anyone given the type of holiness preaching available on this website?

They're using the world's ways to draw in participants, many of whom will undoubtedly show up with ulterior motives of having fun by going to the water park and all the recreational opportunities. God is a God of motives. Motives matter.

Water parks and recreation aren't bad things and I don't think Kire or Slavyan were trying to say that they are. But, to use these things to attract people to come to this event is like saying, "God, alone, isn't going to be enough to get people here. We need to entertain them." The problem is, in the UK, and in America, we know full well what "entertainment" is doing to our countries! Remember Brother Leonard Ravenhill's comment? "One day, the tombstone of America will read: They Entertained Themselves to Death!" The very same is true with the UK. If you tried to hold one of these events in true churches in other countries, like Peru, or in countries where Christians must rely on God daily for their most basic needs, they would *tremendously grieved* at how God was being treated so casually. I mention Peru because

Brother Paul Washer has given sermons saying this very thing. They cried out, "The demons have come to us!" (I'm no t saying this conference is full of demons, I'm just giving a very real example of what would happen.)

Leonard Ravenhill and Keith Daniel, both of whom's sermons can be heard on this site, explain very convincingly that en tertainment has no place in the pulpit. "Contemporary Christian music" is also questionable. I came from a background of churches who played this music with full bands and it was an outrage to me, even before I became a true Christian. It 's performance, not worship. People (especially the youth) are dancing, not praising. (Even in this event's promotional v ideo.) As Brothers Leonard and Keith say, "You don't use the world's ways to win them to Christ!" Also, Jesus never us ed the perks or the benefits to draw people to Him. God is not a vacation destination. He's not a fun-time God. He's hol y and He commands His children to be, too.

I'm not saying the coordinators of this event's hearts aren't in the right place or that they didn't mean well. I am saying th at they're using seeker-sensitive methods and worldly ways to accomplish what they're trying to do. Their hearts might be in the right place, but scripture says, in Revelation, to the seven churches, "I know your works." (Not hearts.)

Brothers, you've made many excellent points in your replies.

Not by way of defence, but more by explanation, the way the culture works here, there are several school holidays each year. The majority of women work part time at least, and child care is an issue for the whole Christian family.

If a couple want to go to a conference like this, during a school holiday, to make what money they have for a holiday *at a* // work its hardest, they might choose an event like this which enables them to pay for their children to be cared for by C hristians, while they themselves sit under ministry they would not otherwise hear.

When there are no meetings going on, they still have to pass the time with their children. For those without family, it is a time of networking, as well as usually offering opportunities to pray early in the morning together, and fellowship around t he teaching, or, after the seminars. The schedule is very hectic for a few days, and is the only type of opportunity for lay Christians who are at that stage in their walk with God.

True, those serving at these events - such as Soul Survivor assisting with the music - are in full time ministry all year rou nd, and many of the other support workers for such a conference are already in leadership in their home churches, or, in full time Christian service as ordinary believers.

Having said that, you are right to call for full surrender. (You know this!) These kind of events leave much room for man oeuvre to those who are not already on fire, to go away as they came, or worse off for the disappointment.

People go there from dry churches, hoping to come away with their problems solved, and instead of being able to cry ou to God personally amongst friends and witnesses, they are faced with yet more high-expectation-of-performance minist ered to them.

It is very easy to come away with an even bigger gap between God and the reality in their lives, the only cure for which is a closer relationship with Jesus Christ, as you have said.

If there's any merit for seeking Christians, in these events, it is the access to ministers - even amongst other conferees - who may be able to pray for them properly, for a full deliverance where it's needed.

But, the time does come, when attending is a thing of the past, because one has grown beyond the need for them, and h as one's own calling to obey.

And yet Christian conferences are a blessed time for a Christian and one of great encouragment and i dont think they should be treated as unimportant.
