Dear brother,

Thank you so much for this testimony. Praise the Lord for what He has been doing in your heart!

What you wrote is something that needs to be heard. Many, many, many Christians have the same attitude you had. Singing songs, telling folks what they want to hear, living your own life and having fun with Jesus...

When someone stands up to preach the word of God, all of a sudden many people don't like it. Well, I guess that's true. Jesus always speaks to the heart and when a heart is not upright, the sword of the Spirit shall cut in painfully. When Stephen preached "*his face was like the face of an angel*" (Acts 6:15) but nevertheless at the end of Gods sermon this is what happened:

"When they heard this, they were furious and gnashed their teeth at him...they covered their ears and, yelling at the top of their voices, they all rushed at him, draggend him out of the city and began to stone him" (Acts 7:54,57-58)

On the other hand, when Jesus speaks to the heart people will be touched and lives will be changed and they will say: "*No one ever spoke the way this man does*" (John 7:46)!

It's amazing to know that the word of God is Jesus. When we read the Bible we encounter our Lord. Sometimes this word can be dry to us, but every word we've read shall not be in vain. No word that comes from God is without power.

I met a Christian last Friday who made a wonderful remark about Revelation 1:3 *Blessed is the one who reads the words of this prophecy*. He said: "It doesn't say: 'blessed is the one who completely understands this prophecy'. Reading the Bible alone with a seeking heart is enough for God to call you 'blessed'."

It's so amazing to realize that the Bible isn't a book that you read once...very carefully...and then you've had it. It's a living miracle. God is revealing Himself to us through His word. Every day a little bit more than the day before...until we will meet the Word of God that became flesh!

To reach this world, they need not hear the words of mighty men, but the word of a mighty God through men who are real, honest, pure and devoted to Christ alone.

Hmmm...have to think of some verse I read yesterday. Here you go, have some more Manna :-P :-)

*"O God, be not far from me: O my God, make haste for my help...
I will hope continually, and will yet praise thee more and more.
My mouth shall shew forth thy righteousness and thy salvation all the day;
for I know not the numbers thereof.
I will go in the strength of the Lord GOD:
I will make mention of thy righteousness, even of thine only...
Thy righteousness also, O God, is very high, who hast done great things: O God, who is like unto thee! (Psalm 71)"*

Just to add a big “Amen” to what each of you has written.

I heard the sermon for the first time when Greg put it up some time ago, and refreshed my memory today by reading the text.

When I finished I was sad as I thought of the many folks who will hear this message and whose response will be like Augustine's: “I had no answer to thy calling to me, "Awake, you who sleep, and arise from the dead, and Christ shall give you light.” On all sides, thou didst show me that thy words are true, and I, convicted by the truth, had nothing at all to reply but the drawling and drowsy words: "Presently; see, presently. Leave me alone a little while." But “presently, presently,” had no present; and my "leave me alone a little while" went on for a long while.”

Keith Daniel has pleaded passionately to commend the Bible to others. But I fear there will be many whose response to the message will be “Presently; see, presently. Leave me alone a little while.”

As I thought about this, I was reminded of the little servant-girl (1Kings 5:1-14) who said to the wife of Naaman the leper, “I know a man in Israel (Elisha) who can cure my master of his leprosy.”

“So Naaman, (the commander of the Syrian army, who was “a great man” and “a mighty man in valour” came with his horses and with his chariot, and stood at the door of the house of Elisha. And Elisha sent a messenger unto him, saying, Go and wash in the Jordan seven times, and thy flesh shall come again to thee, and thou shalt be clean. But Naaman was wroth, and went away, and said, Behold, I thought, He will surely come out to me, and stand, and call on the name of the Lord his God, and strike his hand over the place, and recover the leper. Are not Abana and Pharpar, rivers of Damascus, better than all the waters of Israel? may I not wash in them, and be clean?”

“So he turned and went away in a rage.

“And his servants came near, and spake unto him, and said, My father, if the prophet had bid thee do some great thing, wouldest thou not have done it? how much rather then, when he saith to thee, Wash, and be clean? Then went he down, and dipped himself seven times in Jordan, according to the saying of the man of God: and his flesh came again like unto the flesh of a little child, and he was clean.”
