These words remind us of a passage in another Psalm (36:8), "They shall be abundantly satisfied with the fatness of thy house." Or, as Dr. Kay renders it, "They shall overflow with the fatness of Thy house." The thought is that there is such an abundant fullness of provision, that every want is met--every need supplied--and even this to overflowing. It is one thing to be SAFE, it is another thing to be SATISFIED. Of course the first pressing necessity is that of safety. And so in the 36th Psalm, already quoted, we read, in the 7th verse, "The children of men shall put their trust under the shadow of thy wings." There we see the soul under divine protection--safe. How blessed to be there, and to know that we are there! But we may also know what it is to overflow with the goodness of God's house--to be abundantly satisfied. Fulness of life and fulness of joy are the blessings the Lord has secured for His people. It is they are thus enriched that they are equipped for service.
