All true service springs out of liberty; that is to say, there must be freedom before there can be real acceptable service. This cuts at the root of all selfishness. It is the principle of divine love. "Seeketh not her own" (1 Cor. 13:5). It is one of the chief characteristics of the mind of Christ. "Look not every man on his own things, but every man also on the things of others" (Phil. 2:4). "By love," not by knowledge only, "SERVE one another." This service shows itself in various ways. Perhaps sympathy and help are needed, then "bear ye one another's burdens." Where wrong has been done, or feelings have been wounded, then "confess your faults one to another," and "Pray ye for one another," "Forgiving one another." Where conflicting claims are clashing, then "Forbearing one another," "In honor preferring one another." "In lowliness of mind, let each esteem others better than themselves."
