Quicken us, and we will call upon Thy name.--Ps. 80:18

Dr. Kay renders it--"Thou shalt revive us, and we shall call on Thy name." It is the mark of the revived and awakened soul that it begins at once to call on God with reality and power. All coldness of spirit and formality are at an end. The beginning of such a revival is seen in the soul's desire to be quickened. There is a sense of deadness and a consciousness of weakness. The soul begins to cry to God for renewed vitality and power. And when the fullness of life does come, nothing is more marked than the change that takes place in the soul's intercourse with God. There is a joy of heart and a freedom of spirit before the throne that was never known before. "Wilt thou not revive us again: that thy people may rejoice in thee?" (Ps. 85:6). Looking at the preceeding verses, we notice how this thought runs through the whole Psalm (80). "Turn us again, O God, and cause thy face to shine; and we shall be saved" (v.3). The same word occurs again in verse 7, and with a sleight modification in verse 19, and in verse 14.
