Things are VERY hard in our home. I have 3 of the finest sons who were dedicated to the Lord from birth and raised up for His kingdom, but the devil has them all bound up in lies. Unfortunately, itÂ's natural for those who hurt deeply to lash out against the ones who have loved them the most  $\hat{A}$ - like parents. And they can always find some  $\hat{A}$ "justifiable $\hat{A}$ " reason. But that only keeps them in a victim mode.

For what itÂ's worth: During my own parenting trials, I found great comfort in the Parable of the Prodigal Son. The fath er does not wring his hands in desperation and guilt.
