Even so no one knows the things of God except the Spirit of God. 12Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from Go d, that we might know the things that have been freely given to us by God. 13These things we also speak, not in words which manÂ's wisdom teaches but which the Holy Spirit teaches, comparing spiritual things with spiritual. 14But the natu ral man does not receive the things of the Spirit of God, for they are foolishness to him; nor can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned. 15But he who is spiritual judges all things, yet he himself is rightly judged by no one. 16Fo r Â"who has known the mind of the LORD that he may instruct Him?Â" But we have the mind of Christ.

Â"The spirit is not synonymous with our soul nor is it the same as the Holy Spirit. We worship God in this spirit.

Â"According to the teaching of the Bible and the experience of believers, the human spirit can be said to comprise three parts; or, to put it another way, one can say it has three main functions. These are conscience, intuition and communion.

Â"From the following three groups of Scripture verses it can readily be observed that our spirits possess the function of c onscience (we do not say that the spirit is conscience), the function of intuition (or spiritual sense), and the function of, c ommunion (or worship).
