While I don't know that they matter much in the content, I do think that the avatars help provide a distinction between who is making a comment. I have noticed some confusion sometimes when someone incorrectly attributed a statement to the wrong person. I have been mistaken about who was saying certain statements in some discussions, and I notice that it is easier to make a distinction regarding who is speaking by the presence of an avatar.

I'm not sure if the "operating in the Spirit" idea would make much of a difference in an online forum. It is true that we sho uld all be walking in the Spirit. Unfortunately, some people are quick to question your "walking ability" if you don't line up with what their own particular sets of beliefs (including non-essentials). Even some of the Apostles and other believers in the early church had disagreements within their actions, beliefs and discussions.

Even now, we have many believers from different backgrounds who make comments. Those comments can often turn i nto debate or aggression when someone says something that the other person doesn't agree with or doesn't believe line s up with their own notion of what beliefs are the result of "operating in the Spirit." After all, many outlandish claims are often shared by people who believe that they came to such revelation after "walking in the Spirit." In an online forum of diverse believers, I think that it is the comments -- and the spirit and attitude behind them -- that serve to divide the Body of Christ more than an avatar or screen name.

Personally, I have found much encouragement with the brethren via PM. Although there have been a few, occasional di sappointing or highly confrontational experiences via PM, most of my experiences with the PM feature here at SermonIn dex have been quite beneficial.

For instance, I have sometimes felt inclined to respond privately about certain issues that might not need to be said in a public forum. Sometimes, a believer here may be struggling through a difficult situation and asks for prayer, advice and/ or guidance. I have sometimes felt led to share something with them in regard to their potentially embarrassing issue in private since it might not need to be voiced in the public.

At other times, I have been able to set up meetings (by offering telephone numbers or by meeting in person) with some of the brethren as well. Even recently, my wife and I were able to meet with a long-time member from SermonIndex at o ne of Zac Poonen's local meetings. We have met with other brothers as well. We corresponded and set up meetings en tirely by the PM feature here.

In addition, I have sometimes written a response in the forums that I felt inclined to pause and prayerfully consider when and if I should post it. So, instead of immediately posting it, I send it to myself via PM. After prayer, I revisit the post and consider whether to post it, delete it or reconsider the specific words that I used as I felt impressed to do so.

I suppose that all of this can still be done through email. However, the email address that I use here is rarely checked. I used to have another personal email address registered here, but I began receiving quite a bit of spam and even several angry emails in my Inbox associated with discussions on SermonIndex. Because of this, I removed the address to my m ost often checked email. In fact, I even considered removing any email from my profile.

Perhaps there is a way to list our emails in our profile so that a spam bot doesn't pick it up? I.e. - "johndoe at gmail dot c om" instead of "johndoe@gmail.com."

Yes we are working on getting developed entirely new profile pages which will tie in facebook, twitter and google+ accounts easier. And we want to encrypt the emails with a good solution also. Right now we have put in place an email hidder that hides it from email harvesters who try and grab many emails at once. This is the first step in security we are taking for the emails.
