I love how this version uses the word "pain" here instead of sorrow.

For if I did give you pain by my letter, I do not regret it; if I did regret it (for I see that that letter, if only for a time, gave yo u pain), now I rejoice, not in your pain, but because the pain led to repentance; for your pain was such as God accepts, so that you received no injury from us in any respect. For the pain God accepts produces repentance not to be regretted , leading to salvation; but the pain of the world finally produces death. For mark this very pain that God accepts, what ea rnestness it has called forth in you, what self-defence, what indignation, what alarm, what longing affection, what jealous y, what requital of wrong! You have completely wiped away reproach from yourselves in the matter.
