Many thanks to Greg for posting this information about Zac Poonan. I was very interested to read his book and understa nd why he is so popular. Indeed it is good to hear about his integrity and witness in India and he is indeed a beacon and light upon a hill, having a spirit of humility and willingness to hear God. It is always good to hear about those who are pre aching holiness but I have made a few observations over the years regarding those who have their roots in the Pentecos tal movement even if they avoid the extremes and even dont see themselves as Pentecostals.

One important point which is always overlooked, is that Pentecostals in their beginings were in dispute with Holiness people at that time, and the Holiness people would never share a platform with them because of the disagrement over wha t happens at the Baptism of the Holy Spirit. Pentecostals said it brought power and the evidence of tongues, though Zac is more moderate like others in saying that the scriptures say that not all speak in tongues. Holiness people however, sai d that entire sanctification comes with the Baptism, it is a baptism in the HOLY Spirit and the rest follows on from being d elivered from the sin nature. And they denied tongues.

Today many Pentecostals revere those holiness people and turn a blind eye to their stance over tongues. If they were h ere today they would not be fellowshipping with the tongue speakers without contention.

So how can they each say they received the baptism and disagree so much on what occurs? I believe we must look for t he fruit. If a man says he has been baptised by the HOLY Spirit and still say he is seeking after holiness, then he needs t o look more deeply into what the Holiness teachers of old said because they were the ones who bore the fruit whereas a demonstration of gifts was not the proof shown in scripture.

One important point, I feel is this, that although it is good to see the Promised Land and talk about it and encourage othe rs to look over and see it too, we can spend a whole lifetime doing this and IT WILL NOT GET US THERE.

It is just not enough to see the truth and not appropriate it for ourselves no matter how sincere or earnest we are. There are many like Zac who know the truth but as they have not entered in themselves, they cannot lead others in - they must enter in first. Zac admits himself that he has not entered in even though he has seen a great deal of improvement in him self, he still cannot give the witness of living without sin. It is easy to talk about entering in, but another thing entirely to d o it.

Now here is the most contraversial thing I have to say. I know other charismatics who are doing the same as Zac but no matter how long they wait they do not enter in and the difference between them and the ones who did enter in, and who have written many books on it and testimonies, is the speaking of tongues.

It is my belief that this is stopping them but I do not know of one who is willing to test the spirits and stop in order to see i f I am telling the truth or not.

They are not willing to see if the Holiness teachers of old were actually right on this one, and the evidence is that they do not have the witness of entering His rest and living without sin.

May the Lord reveal His truth.

With all respect for you. There are 2 kinds of sin, conscious and unconscious sin. Conscious sins are those that we kno w are sin and are still committing them. Unconscious sins are those that we are not aware of but we are made aware of by the Holy Spirit. When we become Christians we all struggle with Conscious sin (Romans 7) but when we start walkin g in Spirit, we get victory over them (Romans 8). Now we stop committing them in our day today life and hence we have clear conscience towards God. But that does not mean we became holy. Listen to what Paul is saying.

1 Corinthians 4-4:-

My conscience is clear, but that does not make me innocent. It is the Lord who judges me.

Having a clear conscience towards God does not mean we became Holy. I am sure Brother Zac has a clear conscience like Paul. Even I achieve it many days. But that does not mean I am holy. There are so many Sins that I commit unconsc iously. The Holy Spirit reveals them to us as we continue walking with Spirit. I am not saying I have heard all his sermons. But based on what I have heard he teaches Gradual Sanctification. Please read his book on -'Good Foundation'. He explains the 3 steps in Salvation clearly. The example I quoted comparing the Grade of Student to Growth in Christ was actually taken from him. Even Paul agrees there are different standard among believers that is why he says some can take only Milk and some take solid food. The standard I quoted earlier is a solid f ood and it cannot be had by all.

No it is not. Then 1 John 1-8 is also contradicting to Jude 24. 1 John 1-8 says that "If we (believers) claim to be without s in, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us."

See Jude 24 talks about Stumbling. Stumbling is different from falling. Anyways Stumbling means committing a Sin that you know is a Sin which is Conscious sin. God protects us from that by the Power of Holy Spirit. John 1-8 talks about un conscious sin, though God protects us from conscious sin and helps us to have clear conscience towards him, it does n ot mean that we are sinless. We still need blood of Jesus for God not to look at our unconscious sin.

For example when I came to Christ from Hindu background I knew that talking low of someone is Pride. Once I overcam e that by the power of Holy Spirit the Holy Spirit revealed to me that even if I entertain the thought that I am superior to a nother person in any area say education or athleticism, money, power etc, I have pride in my heart. Because Bible says that -'all I have is received from God'. Now I have to overcome that by his power. God gives power but I should be seeki ng his power to give up that attitude of Pride. This is growth in Christ. I am just giving you an example with Pride as sin. There are so many areas and we need to be Christlike in all these areas.

So when I stopped talking low of others my conscience might be clear that I have not sinned but that does not mean that

I became Perfect and sinless. I have sins but I am unware of it. Once the Holy Spirit makes me aware of it I immediately seek to overcome that and repent as explained in 1 John 9.

See if you do not want to agree on unconscious sin then it is fine with me, you posted a question and I responded with a nother scripture and explained the answer. Lets stop here, I do not want to argue as I find Christ will never argue with so meone who believes he has all the answers. Taking my life example, when I as a believer was struggling with spe aking low of others, how will it benefit me if the Holy Spirit shows me that I should not even think low of others? Only wh en I overcome one I will be revealed next. It is like a Kid has to pass 1st grade for it to take the lessons of 2nd grade. Wh at will happen if we give the lessons from 1st to 10th Grade at a stretch and then expect the kid to pass all at 1 time? Th e kid will lose interest and will be heavily discouraged. It is like feeding solid food to a new born baby which will kill the b aby.

Also look into nature created by God, every growth happens progressively and that is why it is strong. For a plant grows slowly and it becomes tree and then bears fruits. If the seed becomes a tree with fruit directly then will the tree be strong ? will it not break? A strong foundation is made by digging deep with lots of effort.

The doctrine that you are referring to here is the false teaching of sinless perfection. It was a major stumbling block to J ohn Wesley, in fact it was the core of the falling out between George Whitfield and John & Charles. Later Charles was r econciled to George but he never was with John.

If you believe that you are without sin, you are deceiving yourself:

"If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us." -1 John 1:8

No one has 'entered' this state, except Jesus himself. The 'holy people of old' never entered into this sinless state either because it's unattainable in the flesh. Furthermore these 'holy people of old' are not our examples, we have one exampl e, His name is Jesus Christ.

The good news for us is that we all fall short of this and He is merciful.
