I don't think it's safe to say that that verse applies only to Old Testament times? Nowhere in God's Word are we told that God changes His attitude toward unrepentant sinners. The cross shows how serious God takes sin. He does not punish the sin but the sinner in hell if he does not repent and trust in Christ.

There are so many New Testament verses that warn about God's wrath.

Jesus said, "And I say to you, My friends, do not be afraid of those who kill the body, and after that have no more that they can do. 5 But I will show you whom you should fear: Fear Him who, after He has killed, has power to cast into hell; yes, I say to you, fear Him!"-Luke 12:4-5

"26 For if we sin willfully after we have received the knowledge of the truth, there no longer remains a sacrifice for sins, 27 but a certain fearful expectation of judgment, and fiery indignation which will devour the adversaries. 28 Anyone who has rejected Moses' law dies without mercy on the testimony of two or three witnesses. 29 Of how much worse punishment, do you suppose, will he be thought worthy who has trampled the Son of God underfoot, counted the blood of the covenant by which he was sanctified a common thing, and insulted the Spirit of grace? 30 For we know Him who said, 'Vengeance is Mine, I will repay,' says the Lord. And again, 'The Lord will judge His people.' 31 It is a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living God."-Hebrews 10:26-31

I remember that decades ago it was common for Christians to say to a stranger "Jesus Loves You". But after a while it changed. I guess they figured out that if you tell a lost person that Jesus Loves You and just leave it at that, the lost sinner would get comfortable in their lost sinful condition. So it changed to "Jesus Loves You and has a wonderful plan for your life". Or perhaps you have heard the other one, "Jesus loves you where you are at but loves you too much to leave you there". These revised sayings go a long way in getting the message across that Jesus loves you, but not your sin.

I've heard Christians point out that the Bible says that God hated Esau. I suppose they want to justify their own hatred for the lost. I think that even though Esau was a real human being, in the Bible he is a Type. In this case he represents the flesh (and the self-life) so that is why hate is directed toward him.

The tension in the dual truth of God hating sin but loving the sinner is so great that it beggars belief. Except for the fact that Jesus the sinless only begotten Son of God died to save lost sinners when he hung on that Cross.

If a wife cheats on her husband, or vice versa, the betrayed spouse will feel hurt and angry toward his/her spouse, while at the same time still have feelings of love toward them. In many cases the offended spouse will hope that the offending spouse sincerely repents of his/her infidelity.

Similarly, God loves every unrepentant sinner and it is clear by the way He is patient with them. At the same time, He is

This very Scripture is speaking of the Lord Jesus.

If you love children you will hate abortion

If you love Africans you will hate slavery

If you love Jews you will hate the Holocaust

If you love righteousness you must hate iniquity

Please don't confuse God's righteous anger and hatred with the wicked and corrupted anger of fallen men. Man was made in the image of God, with personality, reason, and emotion. But upon the fall the image of God in man has been defiled in every way. Therefore the anger you see expressed in this world, from man to man, is unrighteous. But God is Holy and good and He truly loves righteousness. He truly loves all that which conforms to His own character. Therefore He hates every and all sin and those who remain in it. If God loves everyone then no one is going to hell right? If God's love is impure and not so holy then won't even Hitler and Stalin be allowed into heaven? Because surely He would love even those who refuse Him. If He loves everything and everyone why would He even send folks to hell? If God is all love and cannot hate why did Christ even have to die? But the truth is that all, apart from grace, are like Hitler in heart including myself and all have turned from God. All are guilty of hating Him! So the real question is how can a good just God love wicked men?

I'm glad that you want to emphasize the love of God. But it's impossible to do if you ignore the justice of God. You can throw out all kinds of Scriptures which speak of the love of God however you must reconcile them with other Scriptures which clearly say that God hates those who do evil. Wrongly dividing the Word of God is dangerous business.

"Jesus spent His life with sinners and loved them wherever He went. He hated the pompous religious people (scribes, pharisees, saducees etc.) He said that He came not to condemn the world but to save those who believe into Him."

So Jesus does hate, if he didn't He wouldn't have had to come and be a willing sacrifice to satisfy the wrath of God in the place of His people. Man could have continued on in sin just fine and "god" who loves anything, wouldn't have minded a bit. Jesus wouldn't have needed to come.

Jim, religious people and pharisees are sinners too. Self righteousness is just as much a sin as adultery or murder. The pharisee Saul was a sinner.

The LORD is a jealous and avenging God; the LORD is avenging and wrathful; the LORD takes vengeance on his adversaries and keeps wrath for his enemies. (Nah 1:2)

For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who by their unrighteousness suppress the truth. (Rom 1:18)

Jesus had severe warnings to all who persist in sin and unbelief. Repent or perish! Broad is the way that leads to destruction. Fear not man, but God who can destroy body and soul in hell Matt 10:28. This same Jesus spoke of wielding the winnowing fork and baptisms of fire.

His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire." (Luk 3:17)

Kiss the Son, lest he be angry, and you perish in the way, for his wrath is quickly kindled. Blessed are all who take refuge in him. (Psa 2:12)

Yes Jesus love sinners to, but it is always a pure and redeeming love. The very reason Christ came was to save His people from their sin. Jesus had to come and die and bear the punishment from a just God that sinners like you and me deserve. He had to bear the curse of the law in our place. The curse which was from God! If all of mankind is now under the blood of the Lamb then what exactly is the point of missions and Gospel preaching? From what you wrote it sounds like it is safer to remain a pagan than to actually become a Christian. It is true Scripture makes it clear that those who hear the Gospel but remain unconverted are in even a worse plight than those who never hear. But those who have never heard the Gospel are still guilty of sin and without excuse before God and under His wrath. When Paul in Romans 1 speaks of wrath being revealed he is talking about all of mankind, not just the Jews. Romans 1-3 is an indictment upon the entire human race. Jew and Gentile both are guilty of having the truth but yet suppressing it in unrighteousness. Did the Jews have greater light, yes, but both have vigorously rejected what light they had and are without excuse.

Rom 1:18 For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who by their unrighteousness suppress the truth.

Rom 1:19 For what can be known about God is plain to them, because God has shown it to them.

Rom 1:20 For his invisible attributes, namely, his eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly perceived, ever since the creation of the world, in the things that have been made. So they are without excuse.

Rom 1:21 For although they knew God, they did not honor him as God or give thanks to him, but they became futile in their thinking, and their foolish hearts were darkened.

One of the sermons promoted by SI clearly speaks to this issue of the condition of the lost pagan. Paris Reidhead's "Ten Shekels and a Shirt"

I would argue that not all men are under the blood of Christ, if this is so then all men are no longer under condemnation. If this is true then all men are part of the body of Christ. This would be universalism.

It seems to me that according to Scripture that all men are not under the blood until they do, savingly see the glorious light of the Gospel and repent and believe in Christ alone. The ones under the blood are the Christians, not the unbelievers. It is the church that Christ bought with His precious blood. As in the first Passover, it was only those with blood on their own doorpost and lintel who were saved.

And they sang a new song, saying, "Worthy are you to take the scroll and to open its seals, for you were slain, and by your blood you ransomed people for God from every tribe and language and people and nation, (Rev 5:9)

Now may the God of peace who brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus, the great shepherd of the sheep, by the blood of the eternal covenant, (Heb 13:20)

In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace, (Eph 1:7)

whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins. (Rom 3:25)

Since, therefore, we have now been justified by his blood, much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God. (Rom 5:9)

So Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. (Joh 6:53)

But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. (1Jn 1:7)

Surely the all in the "once for all" written by the author of Hebrews is speaking of all who believe in Christ. It is those who believe in Christ and by faith are justified by His blood. It is for whosoever believes.

God's winking at sin doesn't mean that it is a light thing to remain in unbelief. It definitely shows His great forbearance. But at the cross God showed that He is indeed just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Christ Jesus. Not the justifier of those who have not faith. Christ didn't say that those who haven't heard of Him were under His blood. He said repent or you all likewise will perish.

Sinners need to hear what Jesus has already done for them. Even though legally they are under the blood, they still need to believe and put their trust in Jesus Christ hence the preaching of the gospel. Men live under condemnation because they have not yet received Christ by faith. They need to receive Him to fulfill all righteousness.

Rom 1:19 For what can be known about God is plain to them, because God has shown it to them.

With all reason, this cannot be applied to ignorant sinners who have not heard the gospel of Jesus Christ. God is more just than you and I, and for Him to condemn a sinner who has never heard it nor was the plan of God plain to them would be an unrighteous act on His part. This has to be speaking about those that knew God, knew His ways, and knew the plan of God and yet would suppress the truth. From Paul's perspective, this reassembles the Jews that fought with him in every city that he went into.

Quote:

True but to "remain in unbelief" denotes that the person had to have believed at some point. So this can't be referring to people that have not heard the gospel.

In Romans 1 it seems to me that it is clear that Paul is talking about all mankind. Jew and Gentile. Near and Far. They are guilty not because they have rejected special or gracious revelation but because they have rejected even natural revelation, verse 20. This is a clear description of the pagans in the text. It says that the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against ALL ungodliness and unrighteousness of men. People go to hell because they have sinned against God, not because they haven't heard the Gospel.

Chapter 2 brings this out even more clearly

Rom 2:9 There will be tribulation and distress for every human being who does evil, the Jew first and also the Greek,

Rom 2:10 but glory and honor and peace for everyone who does good, the Jew first and also the Greek.

Rom 2:11 For God shows no partiality.

Rom 2:12 For all who have sinned without the law will also perish without the law, and all who have sinned under the law will be judged by the law.

As Paris Reidhead said in "Ten Shekels in a Shirt" he found out when he got to Africa that these tribal people weren't poor or innocent folk who were just waiting to hear about Jesus, but rather they didn't want to hear about Christ. They hated the One true God and they loved their sin and wanted to stay in it.

Upon the fall of Adam and Eve all mankind of been guilty of sin. There are no good or innocent people. Rom 3 9-20 says this well. There are no good atheist. Those who appear to be good on the outside have wicked hearts and they don't do their "good" works for God's glory, but rather for their own reputation's sake or for pride.

The fall is the reason for the beginning of temporal judgments from God, such as physical death, disease, thorns, floods, sweat etc. But all the outward judgments of God point to the greater inner reality that mankind is spiritually dead toward God and turned against Him. It not merely what men do, but the very state of their hearts and minds toward God.

Eph 2:1 And you were dead in the trespasses and sins

Eph 2:2 in which you once walked, following the course of this world, following the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work in the sons of disobedience--

Eph 2:3 among whom we all once lived in the passions of our flesh, carrying out the desires of the body and the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, like the rest of mankind.

Rom 8:6 For to set the mind on the flesh is death, but to set the mind on the Spirit is life and peace.

Rom 8:7 For the mind that is set on the flesh is hostile to God, for it does not submit to God's law; indeed, it cannot.

Mar 7:20 And he said, "What comes out of a person is what defiles him.

Mar 7:21 For from within, out of the heart of man, come evil thoughts, sexual immorality, theft, murder, adultery,

Mar 7:22 coveting, wickedness, deceit, sensuality, envy, slander, pride, foolishness.

Mar 7:23 All these evil things come from within, and they defile a person."

The wicked are estranged from the womb; they go astray from birth, speaking lies. (Psa 58:3)

Gen 6:5 The LORD saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every intention of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually.

Rom 8:8 Those who are in the flesh cannot please God.

Joh 8:34 Jesus answered them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin.

The greatest sin is the breaking of the highest law and the highest law is this.

Mar 12:30 And you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.'

All sin hangs upon this great law. All sin is rooted in not loving the Infinite God as His is worthy to be loved. We live in a world that smiles at sin and frown upon Christ. To be perfectly righteous one must every moment of his life obey this good command from the heart all of his life. But no one except Christ has done this. This is how far we have fallen short of His glory. We were all made in the image of God but now now it has been though not eradicated greatly defaced and twisted in every way. Lying isn't wrong just because is breaking some rule but rather because God is Truthful and to lie is not to rightly reflect His image. Rather it reflect the image of the devil instead. Adultery is wrong because God is not an adulterous but He is faithful to His bride etc. Everyone is a murderer and an adulterer at heart. Man if he could would storm the very throne of heaven and kill God and sit in His place(Tower of Babel). This is the heart of man. Christ frees a man from a demon and others try to push Him off a cliff. The One by whom and for whom all things were made. All men are haters of God. Rom 1:30 slanderers, haters of God, insolent, haughty, boastful, inventors of evil, disobedient to parents,

Because of all this all mankind is rightly under the wrath of God. As Jesus said on the broad way headed to destruction. This is why the flood came and why Sodom was destroyed, great examples of God's judgment. All men have something of God's law written on their heart and have a conscience. They know that there is a God and they know they should do good, but what they do know about God they suppress because they hate Him and they want to continue in unrighteousness. Every soul that sins will die. Everyone apart from conversion is marching into hell. 1Co 6:9 Or do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived: neither the sexually immoral, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor men who practice homosexuality, 1Co 6:10 nor thieves, nor the greedy, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor swindlers will inherit the kingdom of God.

I believe there is a principle of greater and lesser punishment. Those who received not only natural revelation but Gospel revelation will be held to even greater punishment, more stripes. However nonetheless all are guilty of countless sins against God and to face eternal damnation with fewer stripes than others is a prospect to horrifying to imagine. Who knows the power of His anger? God is just and He cannot pass over any sin. For Him to pass over just one sin would undo Him. It would defraud His character. His own throne is upheld with righteousness and justice.

This may be helpful. A Jew (physical descendant of Abraham) is simply a Gentile with greater revelation. God in grace gave the Jews written revelation and knowledge of the coming Messiah. But every Jew who only had the letter of the law, but not saving faith in Christ nor the indwelling of the Holy Spirit was in all reality no better than any of the gentiles. This is why many of the Jews were so wicked, because they were the same as the gentiles, just with a little "religious" exterior. Some just flat out were lawless and altogether pagan. Other Jews thought they could earn their own salvation by their own works and twisted the word of God they had received into a religion of works. They weren't good people, but God hated them. They looked "good" on the exterior but like Jesus said on the inside they were filthy. They tried to look like believers on the outside, in order to satisfy their own pride, but on the inside, in their hearts they were gentiles. But praise be to God's grace there were some Jews who truly knew their own sinfulness and wretchedness before God and they had the Holy Spirit and were cast upon the coming Christ by faith alone looking unto Him for redemption. These Jews were the ones who realized that all the sacrifices were only shadows and types. God in grace saved some of the gentiles as well. But most of the Jewish nation was just as unrighteous and the pagans around them. And any Gentile, apart from God's saving grace, would have acted just like the lost Jews did. They would have either remained lawless with a little religion or they would have become self-righteous monsters, but lost nonetheless. This is why the Pharisees in the NT hated Christ. Because they were haters of God and they had twisted the revelation that was given them. They thought they were good when they were wicked. They didn't want Christ or His salvation.

This is to prove that all men are the same at heart. Give any Gentile what the Jews had but without conversion and they would end up either lawless wicked Jews or proud Pharisees. This is why it is not physical circumcision that matters but the inner circumcision of regeneration and conversion.

Rom 2:28 For no one is a Jew who is merely one outwardly, nor is circumcision outward and physical.

Rom 2:29 But a Jew is one inwardly, and circumcision is a matter of the heart, by the Spirit, not by the letter. His praise is not from man but from God.

It could be said this way. I don't want to be presuming on what you have said. But it sounds like you are saying that all of mankind is now under the blood of Christ and if they don't hear the Gospel in this life God will still allow them into heaven. That faith is only necessary for them to enter into the full benefits of the Gospel. As Platt said if this is true the worst thing we could do is take the Gospel to the nations, because doubtless some who hear it will reject it and if they would have went to heaven had they not heard it it would have been better never to have taken it to them. But surely this is wrong, for Christ said to take the Gospel to the nations, no one can have faith without the hearing of the word. Scripture says that we are saved by grace through faith alone in Christ and His blood. Christ's blood has no benefit to anyone redemptively unless that person has saving Gospel faith in Christ. People aren't innocent until the day they first hear the Gospel, they are guilty every day of their existence for every sin they have committed and their only hope is to find pardon for sin and righteousness in Christ. Man is not in a neutral state, but either a slave to Satan or to Christ. Luk_11:23 He that is not with me is against me: and he that gathereth not with me scattereth.

If people don't have faith then they are relying on the works of the law and no one will be justified by the works of the law.

Gal_2:16 Knowing that a man is not justified by the works of the law, but by the faith of Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Jesus Christ, that we might be justified by the faith of Christ, and not by the works of the law: for by the works of

the law shall no flesh be justified.

If one has not faith in Christ then in order to be righteous before God they have to have a perfect record of righteousness and no one in this world has ever had that, except Christ.

I'm sorry, I didn't mean to be cryptic about it. The way I understand it is that Christians are saved by grace through faith alone. Faith in Christ alone. It's not faith itself that saves or justifies us. We don't have faith in our faith, but rather in Christ the object of our faith. However faith is the sole means, avenue or channel by which we apprehend or behold Christ.

It is not in works at all but by faith alone which is a beholding or being totally cast upon Christ. Christ and Him crucified is the ground of our justification; faith is the sole avenue or instrument by which we receive the righteousness of Christ. Faith has to have an object. No one is covered by the blood of Christ unless they have faith in Him.

Rom 3:21 But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it--

Rom 3:22 the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction:
