"COOL" CHRISTIANITY - Entertained to Death?? by Andrew Strom

In 1993, the well-known evangelical preacher John MacArthur put out a book entitled 'Ashamed of the Gospel' (subtitled, "When the church becomes like the world"). Obviously, because it was written by a known Conservative, many modern I eaders may have found it easy to bypass this book's insights and warnings. But when I read it, I found it an incisive and devastating expose of much that is now occurring in Christendom. In it, MacArthur writes: "Traditional methodology - mo st noticably preaching - is being discarded or downplayed in favor of newer means, such as drama, dance, comedy, varie ty, side-show histrionics, pop-psychology, and other entertainment forms... In the past half-decade, some of America's la rgest evangelical churches have employed worldly gimmicks like slapstick, vaudeville, wrestling exhibitions and even mo ck striptease to spice up their Sunday meetings. No brand of horseplay, it seems,

is too outrageous to be brought into the sanctuary. Burlesque is fast becoming the liturgy of the pragmatic church."

In many churches today, it is seemingly no longer 'positive' enough (in the modern TV-marketing sense of the word) to e mphasise the cross, deep repentance, holiness, "death to self" and all the other meaty elements of basic Christianity whi ch the New Testament emphasises again and again. And so we change everything (even the very essence of the gospe I itself) to fit the spirit of the age in which we live.

"People don't want to hear about all that negative 'sin' stuff any more," we reason. "We'd better preach things that win th em over in a positive, modern way." Thus, the epidemic of preachers who seem to sound more and more like TV comm ercials every week: "Come to Jesus, He will make you happy, He will fulfill the desires of your heart, He will comfort you, He will satisfy you, etc, etc."

There is almost no difference here to the sentiments expressed in your average toothpaste commercial, but the most ala rming thing of all is that many preachers seemingly wouldn't care even if there was. They cannot see what an enormous effect this marketing approach is having on the very nature and content of the gospel they preach, and thus on the lives of the Christians all around them. Their attitude often seems to be:- 'Whatever brings them in the door is OK by me.' This is the very attitude that has led to what I believe is a crisis of colossal proportions amongst toda

As I have said, today much of this error is flooding into the church under the guise of "relevance". In the name of 'relevan ce' we are rushing around desperately trying to make our music "cool" and our leadership style "cool" and our gospel "co ol" and our youth events "cool", etc, etc,- all in an effort to attract the world on it's own terms. None of this is of God at all . It relies almost entirely on the 'arm of the flesh'. It is really nothing less than worldliness and compromise in a new and very subtle (yet deadly) form.

Instead of "holier than thou", it seems like we are now expected to be "cooler than thou". Our whole effort is aimed at pro ving to the world that Christianity is just as cool, just as much shallow fun, just as much of a party, as the world has to off er. And so, to prove all this, we have to entertain and entertain and entertain. We feel we have to become just like the w orld, in order to impress the world on it's own terms. Thus, we now need to be seen in fashionable (or better- still, 'hip' o r alternative) clothes. And our

youth events become an excuse for a "party". And our

y's Christian youth.

presentations become entertaining multi-media extravaganzas.

All in an effort to equal or "out-cool" the world. (Which is why you now see 'moshing' heads, slam-dancing and stage-divi ng at our youth concerts - matching the world on it's own mindless, hedonistic terms. "Lovers of pleasures more than lov ers of God"). Like I said, cool pride, worldliness and rebellion - all in the name of "relevance". JUST LIKE the WORLD in EVERY SENSE. Does this sound like God to you?

Speaking of the huge Christian Greenbelt Festival held regularly in England, musician John Allen stated: "It seems unde niable that most of the audience is there simply to enjoy the music, not to think hard about anything; and there is a real d anger of the emergence of the 'Greenbelt Christian', the semi-converted, shallowly committed teenager whose Christiani ty means little more than that he enjoys festival-going." What a tremendously significant statement! And the tragic fact is, that such 'Greenbelt Christians' are now found in their multiplied thousands right around the globe. For it is not just the large festivals that have succumbed to this spirit of entertainment. We now find this 'entertain-them-at-all-costs' approach everywhere, from local church youth groups right up to large regional gatherings. This spirit has perv aded everything, particularly those areas in the church that are connected with young people. In fact, it has become increasingly rare to find gatherings of Christian youth now in which these attitudes do not prevail.

What we are actually doing by trying to make our Christianity more worldly, is placing it at a great disadvantage. We are stripping it of the things that historically have made the Christian faith so appealing and powerful. I am also convinced th at more than anything else, today's jaded youth will respond to a CHALLENGE. In fact, I am convinced that the greater t he challenge, the more interest and the greater level of discipleship there will be. What today's "amused-to-death" young people need desperately is a cause worth fighting and dying for - a cause that calls them to deny themselves and to live a life of radical obedience to God. Jesus Christ is that cause. And if we don't provide such a challenge to today's jaded g eneration, then don't be surprised if some much darker cause arises to steal their allegiance. In many ways, today's yout h, raised for much of their lives in a spiritual and moral vacuum, are truly ripe for the picking. And the devil knows this ve ry well. If we are not willing to provide the youth with a cause worth dying for, then he surely will.

There has always been a 'social' aspect to the Western church that has attracted a certain 'club' membership. But this is different. This is an epidemic, and it is being encouraged right from the very top down. Many pastors and youth leaders have concluded that it is best to give the young people what they seem to want, just so they can get the numbers in the door. And the problem is growing worse, not better. Unless something drastic is done, all I can personally see on the hor izon is years and years of

such continual shallowness that we end up with churches full

of people who desire little else but 'ear-tickling', entertainment and crowd-pleasing (rather than God-pleasing) "worship". In actual fact, this is already a total reality on such a massive scale in today's Western church, that it begs the question of whether true, historic Christianity can even survive much longer without being utterly swamped by the prevailing hedonism and selfishness. Despite what we are being told, things really are that serious. True, historic Christianity is in terrible danger on many fronts. Unless something dramatic occurs, I see only years of increasing lukewarmness, shallowness a nd compromise ahead.

Surely the lament of Jesus found in Mt 15:8 is just as applicable today as it was then: "This people draw nigh to me with their mouth and honor me with their lips, but their heart is far from me." Where are those amongst today's youth ministri es who will stand up and be counted for the Lord and His truth in our day?

The problem sister is that even in 1986 to my own witness, in the AOG there were at least some young brethren who did stand against this nonsense. The pastors and some elders not only rejected what was being said to them plainly and wit hout equivocation, but they went on to empower the young people of that day with notions of ministry which are not mini stries at all and these same young people are now the middle aged brethren who will not let this rubbish go. In less than three decades I have seen traditional pentecostal churches go from gospel preaching beacons, into babylonian madnes s. These now middle aged brethren cannot even bear to hear a word of warning, always asserting that such warnings ar e of the devil. I am very serious about this. I wrote to pastors and spoke with numbers of elders in the year of 1986 when I first saw this slide into confusion and was openly rebuked and cut off for my efforts. Elders shared with me (men doubl e my age), that they felt as though their positions had been taken from them as young people embraced the "ministry" th rough such mediums as dance, drama, and a host of other insane presentations of Christ. There was no comprehension that the gospel cannot be communicated in this way and that attempting to do so would inevitably give an opening for th e wicked one to impute his poison into the presentation. I even went as far as to explain why particular drama presentati ons were unsound and how in them were notional concepts which even denied the very sovereignty and authority of Chr ist. No one listened and no one wanted to listen. I even remember the very day when the change took place in my own f ellowship from an elder and pastor led ministry, to a youth led ministry. I reached over to one brother who was an elder a nd asked him, "brother do you not comprehend that your very authority is being taken away". He said he did understand it but that he could do nothing about it because he was just one among a number who had agreed to the change.

The latest phase of this slide into apostasy I witnessed just two years ago. A truly lovely and gentle pastor of some thirty years standing made the appalling mistake of appointing sisters to positions of eldership. Within less than one year thes e two sisters marched into his office ordered him to go home and to remain in isolation from the flock because he was u nder investigation. He did what what asked of him. Within 10 days he had been spiritually murdered, put out of his job, sl andered and publicly humiliated and tossed aside without so much as a last pay cheque. When I heard of this I cannot d escribe the righteous anger which came upon me. I went to his house and learned first hand what the substance of this situation was both the accusation, which was in any event false, and I learned how circumstances in his life brought abo ut by fear and the working of Satan whilst he was at bible college some thirty two years earlier had laid a foundation for t hese accusations to take on a seeming substance. There were five elders in this church and yet two sisters managed to destroy the lead pastor simply because he resisted their efforts to introduce a false gospel. If they had not been sisters I would have gone up against them without any doubting that they would have borne the consequences of their actions in their own bodies. Within days of this wickedness the church literally received a fresh coat of paint and the churches web site was changed so that not one single reference to Christ could be seen prominently, lest it offend. Today it simply say s "Building communities Changing Lives...Something for Everyone".

Sister there are no youth who will rise up and change that which has been in the making for seventy years or more. The end is upon us and unless we separate ourselves unto the Lord we will be hurt by what is to come. Andrew, I understand your evaluation of what has happened in your own church. I can bear witness to something similar in my own denomination which is Mennonite.

Back in the 50's there was a revival in our community. People turned to the WORD - there was a renewed interest in it, y oung people started reading the WORD, youth gatherings were marked by Bible Study. Bible Schools were formed and well attended. Young people went to the mission field. But, alas! Before too long legalism raised its head because people did not give place to the Holy Spirit as they should have. They hoped to maintain the fervor for God through legislation, but it only gave way to administration. Today, there are many in leadership who are more into administration then in discipling. Counseling has replaced shepherding. People have no clue what the voice of the Spirit sounds like. Their conscience has been seared.
