A Christian TV host this week called on God to consider a "military takeover― of President Barack Obama's government because it could be the only way to save the country from tyranny.

On his Monday Internet broadcast, Morning Star TV's Rick Joyner predicted that democracy was "doomed― unless the Lord imposed martial law.

"The balance of powers in the legislative and judicial branches were supposed to balance and keep in check, hold in check, the potential tyranny from the executive branch overstepping their bounds,― Joyner explained. "The people are not always right, it depends on what people they are. And another thing the founders warned about is this thing will only work for a moral and a religious people. You remove morality, you remove the religious influence, and it cannot work.―

"We're headed for serious tyranny, a terrible tyranny right now,― he continued. "But guess what? The kingdom is coming, the Kingdom of God is coming. And America is not the Kingdom of God. I think we have been used in some wonderful and powerful ways by God, we've been one of the most generous nations in history. We've done so much good.―

"That's why I appeal to the Lord: Don't let us be totally destroyed, please raise up those who will save us. And as I've been telling friends for a long time, no election is going to get the right person in there because the system is so broken.―

Joyner added that the "only hope is a military takeover, martial law.―

"And that the most crucial element of that is who to the martial is going to be,†he said. "I believe there are no ble leaders in our military that love the republic and love everything we stand for. And they could seize the government.â €

Not a few years but 76 years...and the he was murdered in Brussels which is in Belgium.. not in the UK..

In 1535, Tyndale was arrested and jailed in the castle of Vilvoorde (Filford) outside Brussels for over a year. In 1536 he was convicted of heresy and executed by strangulation, after which his body was burnt at the stake. His dying request th at the King of England's eyes would be opened seemed to find its fulfillment just two years later with Henry's authorization of The Great Bible for the Church of Englandâ€'which was largely Tyndale's own work. Hence, the Tyndale Bible, as it was known, continued to play a key role in spreading Reformation ideas across the English-speaking world and eventual ly, on the global British Empire.

His version worked prominently into the Geneva Bible which was taken to the New World to Jamestown, Virginia in 1607, and on the Mayflower in 1620.

Notably, in 1611, the 54 independent scholars who created the King James Version, drew significantly from Tyndale, as well as translations that descended from his. One estimate suggests the New Testament in the King James Version is 8 3% Tyndale's, and the Old Testament 76%.

The King James Version (KJV), commonly known as the Authorized Version (AV) or King James Bible (KJB), is an Engli sh translation of the Christian Bible for the Church of England begun in 1604 and completed in 1611. First printed by the King's Printer Robert Barker, this was the third translation into English to be approved by the English Church authorities. The first was the Great Bible commissioned in the reign of King Henry VIII, and the second was the Bishops' Bible of 15 68. In January 1604, King James I convened the Hampton Court Conference where a new English version was conceive d in response to the perceived problems of the earlier translations as detected by the Puritans, a faction within the Church of England.

In his weekly Prophetic Perspective on Current Events broadcast, Rick Joyner predicted the destruction of America' s republicâ€'maybe even during President Obama's second term.

Joyner prefaced the Internet broadcast entitled "Has Democracy Failed?†by warning viewers that he would say s ome things that may be shocking. The segment was filmed on the day before the government shutdown.

From Joyner's prophetic perspective, the republic of the United States of America is crumbling because of tyranny from the government and from the people.

"There's no way this republic can last much longer," he said. "It may not last through Obama's second term. There are a lot of people who feel it can't. There are forces at work right now seeking to undermine and destroy the republic. There's almost a glib and joyful disregard of the Constitution, a belittling of the Constitution. We can't make it without that. That's our foundation, our moorings. We're heading for serious tyrannyâ€'for a terrible tyra nny right now.â€

Despite his strong words, Joyner is not all doom and gloom. He believes the republic can be restored. His heart's cr y? "Don't let us be totally destroyed. Please raise up those who will save us.―

As Joyner sees it, no election is going to fix America's problems because the system is broken. He believes our only hope is a military takeoverâ€'martial law.

"l believe there are noble leaders in our military that love the republic and love everything we stand forâ€'and they c ould seize the government,†he said. "l am not advocating this. I am just telling you what could happen. They coul d seize it and help restore the foundations, help restore the Constitution.â€

Although Joyner is not calling for martial law, he is calling for a radical change. The housing market has made great strid es toward recovery, and the government is reporting some positive economic signs, but Joyner's still not convinced the worst is behind us. In fact, Joyner said the nation is "tottering over the abyss right now, and any little breeze could pu sh us over.â€

Still, he's not without hope for revival.

"There are many great signs of revival and awakening in Americaâ€'incredible things happening," he said. "I believe we're going to see a Third Great Awakening in America within the next couple of years. It's going to be massive. It's going to transform America. It could help restore us to the foundations.â€

Joyner also predicted an "inevitable†collapse of the U.S. dollar but said it could lead to a jubileeâ€'a new beginning if the right people are in leadership. His conclusion? We have to turn back to God as a nation.

Some are ridiculing Joyner for his prophetic prospective. What do I think? I don't have an opinion, per se, but I do have a

This raises a very interesting question at least for Americans. British and Canadians may have their own interesting p erspectives as well I suspect.

The question then is this -

Do you hold that the US War of Independence was then an unjust war and done in clear violation of God's Word in the R omans 13:3 verse earlier quoted?

Was the Declaration of Independence conceived in rebellion to God and the Revolutionary War and subsequent US Con stitution then based upon raw rebellion to God and His ordained authority?

Were the founders of the Republic also engaging in an "evil work" in your opinion?

I don't know that I really have a strong opinion myself. However on the surface it seems that however a person views on e might be how they have to view the other.

After all ... when it is said and done the US War for Independence from Britain was fought over taxes. It was a tax revolt pure and simple. The British believed that the colonists should foot at least part of the costs for garrisoning the troops th ere to protect them. These British troops were in the colonies at the colonists request. When asked to pay part of the cost of their expenses by a small set of very modest taxes the colonists revolted. British powers responded with force to "enforce" the taxes ... each side amassed arms... shots were fired at Concord ... and the rest is history, as they say.

Would people today feeling they were having a similar taxation set on them without just representation in their minds be in the same position as the colonists?
