Sindhi Sumra of Pakistan

The Sumra is a Muslim community of Gujarat named after Samara, a place in Iran, where their ancestor Mohamed Hane ef Ali had settled. They had migrated to Kutch and then to Saureshtra in Sindh. Stories of their migration are recalled in t heir folk lore and oral traditions. Traditionally, they were warriors but at present they are involved in business, agriculture , government and private service. Marriages between first cousins are preferred. Widow remarriage is allowed. The marr iage rituals start with a betrothal ceremony at the bride's residence as per Islamic traditions. The dead are buried and Zi arat is performed for three days. The Sumra belong to the Sunni sect of Islam.

Ministry Obstacles

The culture and religion of most Muslim groups is tightly bound together. To change religion is like tearing apart your cult ural identity.

There are a wealth of good resources available in the Sindhi language, including a full Bible. Pray for workers to take the se to the people.
