Jeff, This can be easily accomplished on your iphone using the itunes software.

- 1. open itunes and select EDIT->PREFERENCES and then select the check box marked "Tones"
- 2. download the following ringtone that I created from the Revival Hymn, it has been converted to m4r format to work as a ringtone. I just randomly selected about a 15 second portion from the beginning where Ian Paisley shouts "wake it up y ou sleepy Christians..." By the way, I used the free program Audacity to grab the portion that I wanted and convert it to m4r. Nice little app for working with audio including creating your own compilations.

- 3.Once you have saved that file to a folder on your hard drive, simply double click it and itunes will open and you will find the file under the "Tones" section of your library.
- 4. Connect your iphone to your computer and once itunes has recognized it drag the ringtone from your library to the iph one. done.
