And he said unto his lad, Run, find out now the arrows which I shoot. And as the lad ran, he shot an arrow beyond him. And when the lad was come to the place of the arrow which Jonathan had shot, Jonathan cried after the I ad, and said, Is not the arrow beyond thee? And Jonathan cried after the lad, Make speed, haste, stay not. And Jonathan n \hat{a} €[™]s lad gathered up the arrows, and came to his master \hat{a} € (1 Samuel 20:35-38).

Consider for a moment Davidâ€[™]s journey leading up to this difficult point in his life. It must have seemed an ordinary d ay as he tended his fatherâ€[™]s sheep out in the field. All of a sudden he was called inside to meet with the prophet Sa muel, who took a vial of oil and anointed David to be the next king of Israel. Before taking the throne, David began to win some marvelous victories in secret, followed by an incredible victory in public against a giant called Goliath. Davidâ€[™]s heart must have burned within him as he walked in an anointing that produced such faith and boldness in his life.

?Shortly after, Saul took David in as his attendant, and David began to worship the Lord with songs that drove the darkn ess out of Saulâ \in TMs life. David continued to fight the battles of the Lord, all the while experiencing the supernatural pow er of God, as seemingly no enemy could stand against him. Eventually, however, Saulâ \in TMs heart turned against David f or no apparent reason other than envyâ \in ² which brings us to our passage in 1 Samuel. Saulâ \in TMs son, Jonathan, says to David, â \in cel am going to talk to my father. Hide out in the field, and I will come back and shoot an arrow. If I say to the la d with me, â \in The arrow is beyond you,â \in TM that means you must flee, for harm is determined against you.â \in Here is how I see this situation: God was trying to speak to David, but David was only partially listening. The Lord was te lling him, â \in cel have a plan for your life that will fulfill all the desires I have placed in your heart. A transition is coming fro m a system that failed under Saulâ \in TMs leadership to something that will usher in a season of renewal in Israel, and you are going to lead it. But until that day comes, I am going to take you through some dark places. You must follow Me thro ugh these mountains and valleysâ \in ² even though you will not be able to understand them fully.â \in

That is what I believe to be the deeper meaning behind $\hat{a} \in \hat{c}$ the arrow is beyond you. $\hat{a} \in I$ is a sign and a reminder from God that His ways are higher than ours, and all He asks is that we follow Him!
