Â Â Â America is no exception!Â I declare to you â€ we need God, and we must have God, if our problems are to be s olved.Â We need a general humbling and crying to God.Â From the least to the greatest, we need to repent!Â The gre at need of the hour is Samuels, Daniels, and Pauls who have an unquestioning, undaunted faith in God and who will fast and pray until God breaks through, until sin is Â-uncovered and uprooted, and until lives are converted, purified, and em powered by the Holy Spirit.Â

A National Crisis

Â Â Â Look at conditions in the days of Samuel.Â He came on the scene in one of those desperate and checkered hour s of Israelâ€™s history.Â Worship had sadly degenerated.Â The nation was given to perpetual sinning of the worst kin d.Â It was poisoned with idolatry.Â Even in the high places, immorality had become a rotting stench.

Â Â Â Here and there could be found one or more who still had a flickering faith in Jehovah, and at Shiloh, the forms of r eligion were kept up after a fashion.Â But nationally, their faith in God had become formal and dead.Â The whole natio n was lying and wallowing in the slime and filth of a long period of backsliding.

Â Â Â Israelâ€™s hereditary enemies, the Philistines, had beaten them in battle.Â Hophni and Phinehas, the evil offspr ing of a great line, had perished in the Â-struggle.Â The ark, the sacred symbol of Godâ€™s presence, had been captur ed by these hated foes, and now the whole land was under a galling yoke.Â The national glory was gone; the pride of ra ce was crushed; true faith in Jehovah was dying.Â Surely it was a dull, dreary, and burden-laden hour.

Â Â Â The need was desperate!Â What was to be done?Â Things in which men had trusted had now failed.Â

An Effectual Solution

Â Â Â We discover that during the time of Israelâ€™s pitiful plight there was an effectual solution.Â What was it?Â It w as a great national prayer meeting! (1 Sam. 7:5-6).

Â Â Â Samuel was a mighty man of devotion and prayer.Â He was faithful in this task of prayer and faithful in teaching t he people that they must come back to God.Â Finally he saw the signs of an awakening, and he called a great nation-wi de meeting.Â He could read the signs of the times, and he told the people that if they would gather together at Mizpeh t hat he would pray for them, and the whole nation gathered to hear him pray.

Â Â Â It was a time of fasting and a time of prayer with a nation upon its knees, brought there by the praying of one earn est man.Â James says, â€œThe effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth muchâ€ (Jas. 5:16).Â The people of Israel needed a strong man, and at this time of need, they looked to one who was able to really pray.Â The Philistine s heard of this great gathering of Israel and thought that these subjects might be planning some kind of an offensive; so t hey came up against Israel with tremendous power.Â The Israelites saw this and they began to look to Samuel and said , â€œCease not to cry unto the Lord our God for us, that He will save us out of the hand of the Philistinesâ€ (1 Sam. 7: 8).

Â Â Â Here they were â€ terror stricken, despairing, and almost ready to give up.Â All they could do, and the thing the y did, was to build their hopes on the prayers of this man.Â The Word tells us that when Samuel prayed unto the Lord th at he was heard (v. 9).Â His prayers were mightier than the armies of the Philistines.Â The enemy was defeated.Â Isra el came back to God, and God was glorified.

Â Â Â Immediately someone will say that surely that was a wonderful prayer that Samuel offered.Â Remember, it was n ot only the praying he did in that moment, but it was all the praying and the godly living that had preceded it that brought

results. Prayers like those of Samuel are not forgotten by God. They are treasured in the golden vials full of odors which are the prayers of the saints.

In this time of crisis, there was a perfect understanding between Samuel and his God which had been produced by years of fellowship and walking together. Samuel knew God, and better still, God knew him. Surely it is a wonderful thing when the man who prays and the God who must answer are well acquainted.

Are You Ready to Pray for America?

We can howl about the corrupt political situation in our nation. We can rant on about the immorality. But I wonder how you stand before God? Are you really and genuinely a child of the Lord? Have your sins been forgiven? And are you walking the high, white line of a holy, righteous life?
