C L Parker was principal of the UK AoG Bible College but was 'demoted' to head of OT studies due to a doctrinal conflict. He was always spoken of very highly by the students. He followed Finney's line on 'hereditary sin' that is to say he denied it, but it was his embracing of 'universalism' which caused the AoG authorities to remove him from his position of prime influence in the bible college.

Certainly this tune has blessed me immensely, as it gives that sense of victory-in-spite-of-everything which I believe we are meant to pick up from the verses in Isaiah 43, on which the words by George Keith are based.
