Yes this is my question.

Here is my answer, with my personal testimony.

The only criteria for being Born again is to believe in Jesus, his death and resurrection. And to repent from their past life, acknowledging their sins.

Since most of you are in some way brought up in a Christian environment or with some knowledge of Jesus, it is easy to realize his love and to respond back (when born again). So for you, love of Jesus and salvation cannot be separated, b ased on personal experience.

But I was raised in a Hindu family. I had no clue about Jesus and his love for me. All I knew about Jesus before I was born again was that He was a God worshiped by Christians!

Now when I heard the Gospel and started reading Bible. I found that I wanted the life that Jesus lived and willing to offer me. I wanted to be free from the burden of my sins. Hence I accepted Jesus as a savior for what he was offering me. I will not say I did not love Jesus but definitely my love for Jesus was not on par with most Christians surrounding me. I ev en acknowledged it publicly many times as I was honest about my spiritual condition!

In India we have the concept of arranged marriage, in which the parents arrange marriage for their children. Now the hu sband and wife in this case are united without any love for them. They marry because their parents wanted them to mar ry each other. Now does that mean this married couple will never learn to love one another? NO NOT AT ALL. Or does that mean they are not married because there is no love? NO NOT AT ALL. The more they get to interact with each oth er, they start to appreciate one another and then fall in love.

The same way, I came to Jesus because I liked what he offered to me. But the more I lived with him, I started to appreci ate his love for me and started responding back. Just because I did not love Jesus the extent I wanted to love Jesus, do es that mean I was not born again? Not at all. I had total assurance that my sins were forgiven. I wanted to live the life t hat Jesus wanted me to live. I was clearly born again! But the love was still lacking in me. All most all things I did as a Christian, was not motivated by the love for Jesus.

Rev 2:4 states that Ephesians Church lost their first love for Jesus. Does that mean they lost their salvation? I am sure most people here will not agree with this. So it was possible for the believers in Ephesians to suffer for Jesus, identify fa lse apostles but without motivated by love for Jesus.

Jesus also warned that because Lawlessness will abound in end times, the love of many will grow cold (Matt 24:12). Do es that mean many will lose their salvation? Or is it a false warning given by Jesus because a Christian can never lose his love? These are some questions for us to ponder upon.

I think it is very dangerous to go on in that line.

First, when a man is convicted of his sins and comes before God with a contrite heart, repenting of his sin and asking for forgiveness - God forgives and cleanses and regenerates this man. This man does not receive forgiveness because he all of a sudden has started to love Jesus, no! Neither because he wept much and felt so sorry about his situation. He is saved through faith in Christ! The expression of that faith is coming to the cross and through that faith he receives

forgiveness of his sins and eternal life in Christ.

From this we can conclude that first the salvation of a man has nothing to do with his love for Christ, but rather with his faith in the love of God!

"In this was manifested the love of God toward us, because that God sent his only begotten Son into the world, that we might live through him. Herein is love, not that we loved God, but that he loved us, and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins." 1 John 4

Now when a man is truly born again, born from the Spirit of God, his heart is changed and because of that also his life! He can no longer continue to live the way he lived before - "...for his seed remaineth in him." Before we were haters of God (Romans 1:30), or we ignored God, were proud against him and now we are "new creature".

"Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new. " (2 Corinthians 5:17) "...the new man, which after God is created in righteousness and true holiness." (Ephesians 4:24) Can there be any true holiness without love?

There are many places in the Bible that speak of love - God's love toward us, our love for Him and God as Love Itself! Af ter regeneration, love toward God and your fellow men (as well as other believers) fills your heart!

"Whosoever believeth that Jesus is the Christ is born of God: and every one that loveth him that begat loveth him also that is begotten of him." 1 John 5:1

John goes on to explain that you cannot say: "I love God!" while you hate your brother. We know also that the first comm andment is to "LOVE THE LORD YOUR GOD". The promises are also for them that love Him:

"But as it is written, Eye hath not seen, nor ear heard, neither have entered into the heart of man, the things which God h ath prepared for them that love him." 1 Corinthians 2:9

And Jacob speaks of "the crown of life, which the Lord hath promised to them that love him." (1:12)

There are many other places in Scripture and the sum of it is that in Heaven will be those who love Christ!

"He that loveth not knoweth not God; for God is love." 1 John 4:8

1 Peter 1:6 says that the joy itself is "in" the truth that Peter is telling us about the work of Christ. It says, "In this you gre atly rejoice." And what is "this"? It is the truth that 1) in "His great mercy God has caused us to be born again to a living h ope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead;" and 2) we will "obtain an inheritance which is imperishable and undefiled and will not fade away;" and 3), we "are protected by the power of God through faith for a salvation ready t

o be revealed in the last time" (1 Peter 1:3-5). In this we "greatly rejoice with joy inexpressible and full of glory." We kno w something. In this we rejoice! The experience of unspeakable joy is a mediated experience. It comes through knowled ge of Christ and his work. It has content.

Quite impossible to experience unspeakable joy and gladness outside of the "knowledge," of Jesus unless that knowled ge is a mere head knowledge. Having only head knowledge we do not posses Jesus, we possess a philosophy. Jesus, of course is no mere philosophy, He is a living reality and when we encounter that reality through the hope that is in Him, we are transformed by the power of God. Unless we are not. Unless all we have is a mental assent to an abstract truth which is devoid of love and is measured by intellect in which we know that the wisest man in the world, at least in his ow n eyes, is as a fool unto God and may the Lord have mercy on the souls of those devoid of Love in their birth and in their lives......bro Frank

(Revelation 2:5) So this is very serious here! I will transfer it to the individual believer... if you begin to grow cold, lukewarm God says: "I know thy works, that thou art neither cold nor hot: I would thou wert cold or hot. So then because thou art lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will spue thee out of my mouth." And Christ says: "... repent."

God calls such people to repentance!

I hope that helps as explanation. Just as an advise: Please don't try to separate one's life and love for Christ because th ey are very connected! Christ Himself said: "But that the world may know that I love the Father; and as the Father gave me commandment, even so I do." We know that Christ died for us because He loves us but think also of this thing He lo ves the Father, to do His will is His delight. Therefore came He and died on the cross.
