23 hits ^ (Strong's_Concordance)\ #3900^ From G3895; a side slip (lapse or deviation), that is, (unintentional) error or (willful) transgression: - fall, fault, offence, sin, trespass. (Galatians 6:1)
parabasis

7 hits ^ (Strong's_Concordance)\ #3847^ From G3845; violation: - breaking, transgression.
asebeia

6 hits ^ (Strong's_Concordance)\ #763^ From G765; impiety, that is, (by implication) wickedness: - ungodly (-liness). (Romans 1:18)

4 hits ^ (Strong's_Concordance)\ #265^ From G264; a sin (properly concrete): - sin.

Hebrew

The Old Testament uses 6 different nouns and 3 verbs to describe sin:
rÃ¢?Ã¢h

This term is used more than 600 times and is most often translated as "evil" or "bad" (^ (Strong's_Concordance)\ #7451^). It carries the implication of something that is contrary to God's nature.
cha??Ã¢'Ã¢h

This term is used almost 300 times and is most often translated as "sin" or "offense" (^ (Strong's_Concordance)\ #2403^). It carries the implication of that which is deserving of punishment.
rÃ¢shÃ¢?

This term is used more than 250 times and is most often translated as "wicked" (^ (Strong's_Concordance)\ #7563^). It carries the implication of something that is morally wrong.
?Ã¢vÃ¢'n

This term is used more than 200 times and is most often translated as "iniquity" (^ (Strong's_Concordance)\ #5771^). It carries the implication of being perverse, crooked or twisted.
pesha?

This term is used almost 100 times and is most often translated as "transgression" (^ (Strong's_Concordance)\ #6588^). It carries the implication of rebellion.
'Ã¢sham

This term is used more than 30 times and is most often translated as "guilty" (^ (Strong's_Concordance)\ #816^). It carries the implication of offense or trespass.
tÃ¢?Ã¢h

50 hits ^ (Strong's_Concordance)\ #8582^ A primitive root; to vacillate, that is, reel or stray (literally or figuratively); also causatively of both: - (cause to) go astray, deceive, dissemble, (cause to, make to) err, pant, seduce, (make to) stagger, (cause to) wander, be out of the way.
pÃ¢sha?

41 hits ^ (Strong's_Concordance)\ #6586^ A primitive root (rather identical with H6585 through the idea of expansion); to break away (from just authority), that is, trespass, apostatize, quarrel: - offend, rebel, revolt, transgress (-ion, -or).
shÃ¢gÃ¢h

21 hits ^ (Strong's_Concordance)\ #7686^ A primitive root; to stray (causatively mislead), usually (figuratively) to mistake, especially (morally) to transgress; by extension (through the idea of intoxication) to reel, (figuratively) be enraptured: - (cause to) go astray, deceive, err, be ravished, sin through ignorance, (let, make to) wander.

Hello Dominic, Thank you for sharing those verses with us however, the portion of your post that I have quoted above doesn't quite ring true. I have not heard anyone use the word "separation" as a definition of sin but certainly as a consequence of sin. If this were not so then why would there be a need for a ministry of reconciliation?

And all things are of God, who hath reconciled us to himself by Jesus Christ, and hath given to us the ministry of reconciliation;

To wit, that God was in Christ, reconciling the world unto himself, not imputing their trespasses unto them; and hath committed unto us the word of reconciliation.

Now then we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God did beseech you by us: we pray you in Christ's stead, be ye reconciled to God.

For he hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him. (II Corinthians 5:18-21)

Deuteronomy 32:22
