It's very easy to look intelligent in front of university students when given a platform, and it's easy for people to just take the presenter's word for it without researching themselves. My issue is why are we lying for God in order to preach the Gospel? It is quite personal for me when it came to the Ravi Zacharias situation because I almost lost my faith over this. I looked up to this man to not just be an intelligent spokesman for Christianity, but an example of how to live as a Christian in a dark world. After finding out about this stuff a few years ago, I wondered, "Everything that Ravi preaches, is it true? Is he a charlatan? Do any of his arguments have merit? How do I know Christianity is true if this man is not telling me the truth about it?" The last few years I was pretty disappointed over this. Even after he died and I watched his funeral service, I had my disappointment because many will lift him up on a pedestal and remain in a sort of deception over their "hero" so to speak.

I know now not to look to man in public ministry, but looking to the Centrality of Christ as my all in all.

Regarding accusations against public figures (especially Christian leaders)...it's tricky. Some people automatically believe any accusations they read, and some automatically go into denial. Neither are appropriate. I'm hesitant to automatically believe because I know, from experience, people lie about leaders.

Just last year a hateful, spiteful, evil relative of mine got angry with someone else in our family and decided to get revenge by slandering me (since I'm somewhat of a public figure). They contacted some strategic persons they thought c

ould ruin me and told a ton of outlandish lies.

Thankfully, no one they contacted believed any of it, and I had backup from some of my family who was willing to explain the situation. It was a spite crime.

I know if certain bloggers had picked up the "story" many would have believed the slander because some of accusations can't be falsified, and some people just want to believe the worst, especially about conservative Christians.

So it's tricky. I always want to believe the victim, but I know some people just lie and slander and aren't truly victims. Not everyone who tells a story is telling the truth.

As the person being slandered, all you can do is fall on the mercy of God. It's a helpless feeling to know you can't (in some cases) do anything to preserve your reputation. I hate that. You can work your whole life to represent God well and then have it taken away in a moment because someone wants to destroy you. With social media, lies can spread like wildfire.

A couple of years ago, a lady claimed I said something I didn't in a keynote message at a conference (she claimed I said God forbids women from homeschooling!). She posted it in a large private FB group she moderates and banned me from the being able to join. Most of the women in the group believed her lie and made vows to never buy or read any of my books. I couldn't respond or defend myself! The audio recording was public and anyone could have fact checked it, but most people don't bother. They just believe the slander.

So, there are real victims, and we need to avoid being in denial about the potential of leaders to live a double life. But after my post yesterday, I just wanted to give the flip side as well. Sometimes the true victim is the one who is being slandered by a vile person for spiteful reasons. We need wisdom and discernment. And God's grace to help us if we are ever the ones falsely accused.

I went through the final report skipping the parts where they mentioned about his sexual misconducts. I was only interested in knowing how they validated their findings. I was not interested in knowing another man's sins. Looks like the validation was based on his phone records, pictures and videos in it. Also most allegations matched with his travel records. There were also videos of the CA women in his phone who initially complained in 2017 that Ravi asked for nude pictures. Few take away from the report.

1. Normally when we hear a man in ministry fall, it is normally adultery or affair with a woman other than his wife. But in his case it appears like the concerned person has lived a life of adultery. Having illegal relationship with multiple women. How can someone live a life of adultery and still claim to serve God? Not that occasional slipup is fine, but that is understandable due to weakness of our flesh. But a life of adultery with multiple women like a famous Golf star had, is really shocking.

The answer I came up with is, he was convinced that this life of adultery is a reward for his ministry from God as stated in the report.

2. Even after the escape of 2017 allegations by the Canadian women, he still continued in the same path based on phone records. There were videos of nude women whom he has met dated until 2019. This shows he did not yield to the first warning. Even though he promised in his letter after the first allegations that he will be careful with women in online chats, Chat records were found till 2019. So that letter meant nothing at all? I was personally very encouraged by that letter. I thought it was well written.

3. In one place of the report, it was mentioned that Ravi had clear protocols on how he travelled. He always had a male partner. Since he came up with these accountability protocols, it was also easy for him to find a way out of it. This shows our accountability should primarily be with God not with man. We can easily cheat any of our own accountability rules. But if we practice to live under the presence of God, we cannot fool ourselves. A good lesson for us to learn.

The reality is that one has to hurdle the 'rules of evidence'. The courts look for and validate evidence not the absolute truth. In criminal cases, someone has to prove the offense beyond reasonable doubt.
