A word from the Lord I received: Mary, Abraham, and Sarah are 3 witnesses. They all had a word from God, Mary's word Isa. 7:14 a virgin shall conceive and bare a son, Abraham's word Gen. 17:5 for a father of many nations have I made thee, Sarah's word Gen. 18:10 thy wife shall have a son. What God said came out of their mouth from their heart, Mary said to the angel, "Be it unto me according to thy word" and in verse 45 it says, And blessed is she that believed; Abraham's name change (meaning father of many nations) was his word and Roman 4:20,21 says he was strong in faith and fully persuaded that what God promised He was able to perform; Sarah's name change was her word (meaning princess of the multitude) and Hebrews 11:11 says, through faith Sarah received strength to conceive seed. The words they spoke from their hearts changed their bodies. And the same thing can happen for you if you put the right things in your heart/spirit. When you speak out of your heart what God says about your healing Proverbs 4:20-23 will kick in and your own words will be healing, medicine, cure to all of your flesh 20 My son, attend to my words; incline thine ear unto my sayings. 21 Let them not depart from thine eyes; keep them in the midst of thine heart. 22 For they are life unto those that find them, and health to all their flesh. 23 Keep thy heart with all diligence; for out of it are the issues of life. The words you let into your heart and the words you speak out of your heart are of vital importance. Because, what you put in your heart in abundance will come out of your mouth (Luke 6:45) and it is creative. That's why you've been warned to guard your heart with all diligence. Because, death and life are in the power of the tongue and you will eat the fruit of it (Proverbs 18:21). So, don't ever think you can't be helped. Just because a man can't help you doesn't mean you can't be helped. So, don't ever think that you are at the mercy of some condition. I thank God for that word.

Notice, the power of the word of God it causes everything contrary to line up with it. God told Abraham that He made him the father of many nations and told Sarah she would have a son while his body was dead and her womb was dead totally contrary to what He said. The word is always able to perform what it says. Look at Mary, we know it takes a man and a woman to produce a child and yet God said, "Behold a virgin shall conceive and bare a son." All of them dared to believe God's word and speak according to it and not the conditions. When the word is spoken out of your heart it is creative, the word created an entire body. What does the word call Jesus in John 1:14, the word made flesh. When your words are in line with God's word then your words will be health to your flesh (Proverbs 12:18). The word health is translated as medicine, remedy, healing, and cure. In Acts 14:7-10 it tells of a man that sat and heard Paul preach, he was a cripple from his mother's womb, when Paul perceived that the man had faith to be healed he simply told the man, "Stand upright on thy feet" and the man leaped and walked. What caused that healing, the word that the man let take root in his heart. The word did the healing then and the word will do the healing now.

I noticed you often post similar posts. I agree with brother havok that God still heals and I have experienced it myself, too. I prayed for sick people and they got healed.

There is a great danger in believing that I can release healing through God-on-demand, say the word, name it, claim it and receive it. This Word-of-faith teaching lead thousands astray. It reduces God to a healer and does not pay due honor to God. Jesus came to save and he used healing and miracles to demonstrate his love, power and authority. It is still the same, it works by faith, but the sovereignty is still in God's hand, not ours. Faith is not what I can get out of God, but my surrender to his will and power. It is not that I am in control and God has to deliver on demand. Healing and miracles are signs that FOLLOW believers but they do not run ahead of them.

Suffering is appointed to the church and every saint will take a share. Suffering can come in all sorts of forms, persecution, sickness, exclusion, slander, betrayal, violence, imprisonment, verbal abuse and the like.

Perhaps it was an oversight, but there was one effect of sin that was not mentioned - "death" that came to every man, because all sinned. The physical death of our body was not healed by the atonement of Christ.

For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory that is to be revealed to us. 19 For the anxious longing of the creation waits eagerly for the revealing of the sons of God. 20 For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of Him who subjected it, in hope 21 that the creation itself also will be

et free from its slavery to corruption into the freedom of the glory of the children of God. 22 For we know that the whole creation groans and suffers the pains of childbirth together until now. 23 And not only this, but also we ourselves, having the first fruits of the Spirit, even we ourselves groan within ourselves, waiting eagerly for our adoption as sons, the redemption of our body. 24 For in hope we have been saved, but hope that is seen is not hope; for who hopes for what he already sees? 25 But if we hope for what we do not see, with perseverance we wait eagerly for it.

Because our bodies have been subject to corruption like the rest of creation, we will groan as long as we live in these physical tents. Outwardly we all waste away, yet inwardly we are renewed day by day. Our outward man perishes, the atonement did not heal this effect of sin on our bodies. All the people Jesus healed went on to die physically, even Lazarus. This is not a problem, because flesh and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of God and there will be a body of another kind.

Divine healing is a gift of the Spirit, a manifestation for the common good of the church. Like all other workings of the Spirit it is intended to glorify the Name of our Lord Jesus. Divine healing was never meant to keep our physical bodies from wasting away.

I know this is a descriptive text but there is quite a bit of information given to us here.

Read Acts 3 and 4.

The book of Acts could be called the book of Acts of Peter and Paul. The first half is about Peter and then Peter fades and then the second half is about Paul. The original poster wrote about Paul healing a man who had the faith to be healed. Note there are some parallels between Peter and Paul in the book of Acts. I believe this is one of them. Peter's version of healing the lame man is found in Acts 3 and 4. Both men were lame and they were lame from their mother's womb.

The man that Peter healed. Here is the information we can gather from the text:

1. He was lame from his mother's womb (Acts 3:2).
2. He sat daily at the gate of the temple which is called Beautiful to ask alms (Acts 3:2).
3. He was above forty years old (Acts 4:22).
4. All the people knew who he was including the rulers (Acts 3:9-10, 4:14-16).

5. The purpose of his healing was to glorify God (Acts 4:21).

Here lies the problem. Jesus was alive just a few months prior to this healing and he surely passed by this man and knew of this man (for all the people knew who he was). The man was more than forty years old and sitting at the gate every day. The text indicates he must have come and sitting at the gate for a long time or his entire life even. The question then is how come Jesus did not heal him?

This is a difficult subject I will admit I'm somewhere in the middle but I am against the word of faith movement. Even some of the verses presented here are grossly taken out of context of their intended meaning.

On the other hand what do you do with this text that was mentioned in this thread:

James 5:14-15 - Is any sick among you? let him call for the elders of the church; and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord: And the prayer of faith shall save the sick, and the Lord shall raise him up; and if he have committed sins, they shall be forgiven him.

I have two systematic theology books. One is by Wayne Grudem the other one is by John MacArthur. Both are noted theologians and I respect them both.

I did a quick search through both of the books.

Grudem wrote on page 1043 (kindle location 26840):

"And James expects that healing will occur at the hands of the elders in all the churches to which he writes (see James 5:14-16)"

Sorry I can't copy and paste the entire paragraph but Grudem is writing (from my understanding) that James himself is expecting there to be healing if James 5:14-16 is carried out. The phrase "prayer of faith" is used so one of the conditions then must be that it has to be done in faith.

Couldn't find anything on MacArthur's systematic theology about that passage in regard to healing but then again I did a quick search. I'll look more thoroughly and post if I find anything.

"For those that believe in the gifts of the spirit obviously you believe in deliverance and casting out demons one question I have how many demons do we have the authority over just some of them, or all of them if we have authority over all the demons that cause sickness that means every single demon that causes sickness we have the authority cast out, now if sin is the reason that let the demons in, then repentance and the deliverance of that demon will heal that person period ,now we know the demons cause much sickness so at least we should be able to agree on that but we have authority only because Jesus had the authority and he commanded us who believe in the gifts of the spirit and who believe his words to cast out demons to heal the sick freely you have received now freely you give and you'll be a blessing on the poor and the sick and upon our brothers who are oppressed don't deny them this."

I've seen an instance of this myself. One lady had depression and was unable to come out of her house. I was with a friend who does deliverance and the lady ended up leaving her house to come pick something up from him. It turned out it was actually a demon and he cast it out of her and she was healed as far as I know. We even heard barking noises following us in the car drive going home.

However it should be noted that the same guy could not heal his family member who had I believe it was lung cancer. And in that deliverance ministry not everyone gets healed or there are partial healings. And if I recall they had a harder time with casting out some demons than others.

Btw the lady was worshipping Christ plus idol(s). Once she repented and gave her life exclusively to Christ he was able to cast it out of her. The demon was crying and weeping because it didn't want to leave the woman's body.
