Tho to be honest, none of us really knows what it will look like (future scriptural fulfillment) and as such we te nd to attempt to fit it within our preselected framework and while that's understandable, it's nonetheless where we appear to diverge from one another.

I can say this with confidence... if this isn't a fulfillment of scripture (with the stage being set),it would be hard to ima gine the church withstanding much more without a great falling away. Wether the virus, lockdowns, restricted movement and access to goods and services, the political collapse of several national governments, the natural disasters, the socia
