The "iPod Shuffle" would be an excellent choice. For between $\$ 99$ and $\$ 129$ you can carry around up to a gig of audio in a player that is smaller then a pack of gum! It's designed to randomly select tracks or can be set to play them in a seque nce you set up on your PC. (Or Mac.)

I wouldn't recommend an iPod Shuffle as it has no display screen. I would go with an iPod Mini if I were you, though I d on't own one. I've heard Apple are bringing out a flash-based player soon which will mean longer battery life.

Of course mp3 players are not designed for listening to sermons and unfortunately you cannot fast-forward to the middle of the sermon for instance (correct me if I'm wrong). The only way to get around this would be buying a PDA like the Pal $m$ LifeDrive which you can listen to your sermons on and skip to different parts just like on your computer.
