This was serious non-repeatable business for The Lord Jesus, and, later, Paul, but we only have to sing the song and we've accomplished the same, time and time again. Painlessly

What's a "Worship Leader" anyhow? I've never met one who could define what "Worship" meant. A prerequsite for the jo

b must be a complete disregard for Theology. Last week I heard a "Worship Leader", say, "The theology in this song I wr ote is probably terrible, but I don't care."

I went to a Thai church 2 Sunday's ago primarily to bring my friends who needed ministry in their native tongue. The church is run by women who minister to prostitutes, so there are a lot of new converts from that lifestyle. My friend's need was so urgent, and there was a 2 day legal deadline looming. In attendance were about 50 women and some young Thai guys in the band. The lone male pastor lives 2 hours away and wasn't there that day.

No high church this... and no visible authority structure. I asked If I could introduce my friends and their problem, as som ebody, knowing Thailand better, might have a solution, or at least prayer. They said, NO I stayed, my friends left. They w ere very upset at how they were dealt with. Abused, they never want to return. She's undergoing postpartum depression, and he has lost everything recently. I was doing spiritual first-aid all week. This is the second church that has abused the m. The pastor/dictator of the Lighthouse threw them out because they were my friends. I disagreed with him (privately) b ecause the Lord's Supper shouldn't be used to cast out spirits. I disagreed a second time about Baptizm and was manha ndled out the door. He also called the police (his friends). My aforementioned friend stopped by later to find out what hap pened, and was thrown out too. The dictator/pastor called the man's wife at home and threw her out even though she ha dn't said a word. She was already 9 months pregnant at the time. Nice shepherding!

Back to the women's church. As it turned out, later in the service there was a call for anyone to speak through the mic, a nd they had a mass prayer where 95% of the people went forward for prayer or to pray. But my friends had gone. We clo sed with songs of how much we love Jesus and are willing to do anything for Him.

The new mother has been isolated from other women since she came to the Lord. I have tried to find a nice Thai Christi an "older sister", asking dozens of women. No luck! Sorry, I don't actually believe in luck, but I do believe in Satan, and he seems to be making a pretty good assault against this new Buddhist convert, her 2 month old baby, and her recently c onverted Sikh husband. The thing is, Satan's got a two-front war going on. The two directions of attack are her Buddhist family, and the "Christian" church.

It is a little difficult to confirm to them that God is Love and wants us to be conformed to that image of Love when the only examples these people have to learn from in their own language are not exactly brimming over with it. Indeed, the opposite has been all they've seen. Yesterday they said "God hates us!"

How can we claim to love God, whom we haven't seen, when we don't love out brothers and sisters, whom we have see n?

her mother, the evil city of Pattaya, Thailand in general and even, perhaps, solicit a little prayer for myself. Face it, we all need prayer!

Sister, you don't know the half of it. I'm in Pattaya, arguably the most decadent place in Thailand. I have non-Christian a cquaintances who blurt out a few words about what goes on in these places before I can stop them. They have brought me to tears in the past. Some folks love to inflict on the unwary tales of what goes on in these places - every type of vile debasement of the woman's body in the name of fun, or entertainment... and all for money. No wonder both the women and their customers have to get dead drunk afterward to anesthetize their consciences.

The worst "pimps" of all take newborns, then cripple or blind them. Then they take care of them (right!) for a few years u ntil they can set them out to begging, bringing a constant source of profits home. Their Judge awaits.

Sony Singh, an Indian Sikh, who was married to a Thai Buddhist wife, came to the Lighthouse Church last summer. He had just had his business stolen by his Thai partners. They also either wanted him off their island of Ko Samui, or dead, so they sent young thugs on 3 occasions to stab him. He then went back to India, where he still had some property he c ould cash in on. In the years since his last visit home, his Sikh brothers had documents altered and stole his land. He ret urned to Thailand and soon after found that his wife had become pregnant during their trip. Now they were having a bab y, that his wife's family was trying to influence her to abort, and they were dead broke. He resorted to going into a church for help.

The aforementioned Dictator/Pastor and I were sitting around after the service and he was trying to convince me that the Lord's Supper was useful to deliver people of demons. My mistake, I felt the Lord's Supper was for baptized believers to celebrate and remember the Lord.

Sony had been to that church several times in previous days, and I had just heard his story, though I'd never met him. W ell, Sony came in that day and said that his wife was going to kill herself unless he donated one of his kidneys on the bla ck market for money. I knew this was a super-manipulative ploy on his part, but eventually I felt that God was calling me to disciple him and help him out for his wife's and baby's sake.

To this day, I'm not 100% sure he is a Christian. That's to be revealed by God. Wanpen, his wife, seems more sincere, a nd likes to pray. I can't understand her Thai, and almost all the instruction she's received has been from me, though und oubtedly improperly translated, due to Sony's poor English.

Wanpen is going through a nasty postpartum depression exacerbated by fhe fact Sony owes about \$7,000 (a huge amo unt here) The man he owes is a slippery ex-brother-in-law, who has positioned himself to throw Sony into prison and ste al Wanpen's Mother's house, I'm seeking the Lord to intervene because the man is evil and he will do this if he doesn't g et his money. He offered to cancel the debt in exchange for Serafina. Sony's and Wanpen's beautiful 2 month old daught er - Why? To make her a slave? a prostitute? a crippled beggar?.

Serafina's always in my heart. Everything I've done I've done for her, and to a lesser extent, for Wanpen and Sony. I real ize the parents could be taking advantage of me, so I set some ground rules. I paid for an apartment for them, food, and medical and hospital costs for the delivery of Serafina, which gave them a little breathing room. Now, if Sony shows sinc ere, we'll buy and sell used cars until he can repay the Snake and become independant.

Serafina was the name I gave the baby after being asked to by the parents. It's not Thai. It's Hebrew - from the Serapim or 'Fiery Ones'. The angels who are continually in God's presence.

A little child shall lead them? The very existence of this child has brought the Mother and, I believe, the Father to Christ. Other's are considering the fact that while many seek to do harm to the child and her family there is a Christian witness t hat stands and cuts them at a conscience level. This baby has been under a major Satanic attack since conception.

Did I mention that she's beautiful? She was dedicated to God before we knew she was a she. Many will be drawn to Go d's fire through her fire. This is my belief, and why I named her after the Seraphim - "Fiery Ones".

But the attack continues. If her mother doesn't find a good Christian lady to talk to she'll wither. The Father is obstinate a bout church, having been so often abused.

Not knowing what else to do, I'm setting up my house as a home church, perhaps that will draw some more fervent belie vers.
